POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2013

QUARTERBACKS - LY the big question was who would replace SU's all-time career leader in wins. Andrew Luck joined fellow SU QB's Bobby Garrett, Jim Plunkett and John Elway in being selected as the #1 pick in the draft. Three QB's battled for the job LY incl soph Brett Nottingham (PS#14) who ply'd in 6 (8 att '11) and Josh Nunes (PS#17, 2 car att). Naturally I called for a large drop off in the numbers. Surprisingly Nunes started the first 9 but comp just 52.8% (1643, 10-7) in 10 gms. Kevin Hogan had been running some Wildcat packages and took over the duties on the 3rd series vs Colo. Hogan went 5-0 as a str'r with 4 wins vs ranked tms (#1, #13, #15 & #17). His mobility gave D's something good to prepare for and he was also solid throwing on the run. He completed 71.7% (1096, 9-3) and was the #2 rusher (263, 4.8). Nottingham ply'd in just 2 (8 att). Battling for the bkp spot TY will be true frosh Ryan Burns (PS#12), Jr David Olson (PS#171), soph Evan Crower (PS#25) and rFr Dallas Lloyd (PS#24) as Nottingham transferred and Nunes retired w/inj. This unit is vastly more exp'd and could greatly improve upon LY's 200 ypg passing.

RUNNING BACKS - In '09 Toby Gerhart finished #2 in the closest Heisman race ever, rushing for an FBS leading 1,871 (5.5) and an amazing 28 td's. In '10 they had to replace Gerhart (#2DC) and the top ret RB was soph Stephan Taylor (PS#36, 303, 5.4 in '09). Taylor led with 1,137 (5.1). SU's 2nd best tfl ever while good-sized true frosh Anthony Wilkerson (PS#22) rushed for 408 (4.6). In '11 they only had to replace their FB (#4DC) and Taylor led with 1,330 (5.5). LY SU lost #2 rusher Tyler Gaffney (449, 6.1) who left for baseball. FB Geoff Meinken, at 256 lbs, was compared to John Riggins & Larry Csonka, but DNP (knee inj). HC Shaw felt Taylor was one of the best RB's in the country and he led again with 1,530 (4.8). Wilkerson was banged up and had just 224 (4.5) while rFr Kelsey Young (PS#29) added 160 (11.4). TY the unit loses its career leading rusher, Taylor (#5DC ARZ) and Meinken (retired) but does get back Gaffney and adds rFr Barry Sanders (PS#8, son of "the Barry") who looked good in the spring. Adding depth to the group are Remound Wright (5'9" 198 So, PS#25), Ricky Seale (5'9" 199 Jr, PS#38), Jackson Cummings (5'9" 189 Jr) and FB Charlie Hopkins (6'6" 269 So, PS#47DL). While clearly less exp'd, this is still a talented group with 6 VHT's!

RECEIVERS - Stanford had to replace its top 2 WR's (1296, 13.1) in '11. They had 3 outstanding TE's in Coby Fleener, Zach Ertz (PS#9) and Levine Toilolo (PS#5). LY they had to replace their top 2 WR's (1125 yds) and #2DC Fleener. It was once again a TE-led offense with Ertz being #1 with 898 (13.0) and

Toilolo #3 (393, 16.4). RB Taylor was #2 in rec's and the top WR was Drew Terrell (PS#62) who had 463 (14.0). TY Montgomery (PS#44) had just 213 (8.2) as he was banged up, starting just 4 gms. Jamal-Rashad Patterson (PS#25) did not sit his first gm until he was a Sr (7 st, 271, 16.9). TY they lose Patterson and Terrell but the biggest hit is that both of their TE's (Ertz #2DC PHI, Toilolo #4DC ATL) declared early for the draft. Not in the PSL are Conner Crane (6'4" 195 rFr, PS#104) and Jeff Trojan (6'3" 186 Jr). The departing players accounted for 18 of the team's 19 td rec's and the WR's will clearly have to pick up the slack.

OFFENSIVE LINE - SU's OL created holes for the top 4 rush totals in schl hist in '09, '10, '11 & '12. In '11 SU had to replace a 1st Tm AA C and a 2nd Tm P10 LG. Their 2 ret str's were a great foundation to build on in David DeCastro (#1DC) and Jonathan Martin (#2DC)! The Cardinal rushed for 211 ypg (5.3, 11 sk, 2.6%). LY they went from 50 car sts to 37 with the loss of those 2 DC's but added in PS#2, #4 and #7 true frosh, although those 3 comb for just 3 st. They also did not have Andrew Luck, who had the ability to elude sks. As you would expect, even with 3 str's back, SU slid to 174 ypg rush (4.4, 20 sk, 5.0%). TY they lose 3rd Tm P12 C Sam Schwartzstein (14 st, 2Y str) but have 9 of the top 10 back (84 car sts) incl 1st Tm AA & Morris Trophy (P12's top OL) winner David Yankey and 2nd Tm P12 RG Kevin Danser. I look for a much bigger impact from last year's VHT frosh as they are again one of the top OL's in the country.

DEFENSIVE LINE - SU allowed 4.9 ypc in '06, their worst in over 2 decades. They switched to a 4-man front in '07 and saw their rush D improve for 5 str yrs. In '11 they had to replace 2 str's (#3DC) but led the P12 in rush D (84 ypg, 3.0) and were #2 in sks (39) and tfl (89). LY they had to replace a DE (13 st, 2.5 sk) but had 2 str's back incl 1st Tm P12 Ben Gardner (4.5 sk) and one of the strongest players on the team, Terrence Stephens (11 tkl) who often occupied 2 blk'rs. Stephens st'd just 7 (inj, 10 tkl, 4 tfl, HM P12) but the Cardinal still only allowed just 97 ypg rush (3.0) with 57 sks (#1 FBS). TY Gardner turned down the NFL meaning the only loss is Stephens and they remain one of the P12's top D-line's.

LINEBACKERS - LY SU not only had their top 5 LB's back, but got the return of PS#11 Shayne Skov (ACL Wk 3 '11). As you would expect, SU had one of the best LB corps in the country. Trent Murphy earned 3rd Tm AA (10 sk, 8 tfl) and appeared to be bigger, stronger and more explosive this spg. Gone is 3x 1st Tm P12 Chase Thomas (14 st, #2 tkl'r, 7.5 sk, 7 tfl) and Alex Debnjak (24 tkl, 4 sk) but this may be the year that James Vaughters lives up to his PS#9 billing. Skov opted to return for his senior season as did Murphy (6 of top 8 back) so this group is loaded again (94 car sts) and ranks as my #2 LB unit in the country.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In '10 the Cardinal rose to #16 in my PDR, their best s/'96. In '11 SU slipped to #36 despite 3 ret str's. Of SU's 7 int, only 3 came from the CB's. LY they had to replace a 1st Tm P12 SS (#4 tkl'r, 10 st), their FS (13 st, #2 tkl'r) and a CB (13 st, #6 tkl'r). Shaw feels that Wayne Lyons (PS#10) will be one of the best CB's in the country while true frosh Alex Carter (PS#10) st'd the L/8 and surprisingly SU moved up to #11 (61.1%, 13-15). TY they lose CB Terrence Brown (#5 tkl'r, 1 int, 9 pbu) and Harold Bernard (6 tkl). Among the returnees are 3rd Tm AA FS Ed Reynolds (47 tkl, 6 int, 3 IR td) and 3rd Tm P12 SS Jordan Richards (14 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 int, 12 pbu). The Cardinal secondary should again be one of the better units in the FBS.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Shaw's first year SU finished #43 in my ST rankings. K Jordan Williamson hit 13-19 fg's (L45) but missed 3 w/inj and also missed 2 key fg's, either of which would have won the Fiesta Bowl. '10's P, Daniel Zychlinski (36.8 tm

net), lost his job to David Green (36.2 tm net). True frosh Ty Montgomery was their top KR (680, 25.2). LY they only had to replace Green so I expected them to improve, which they did to #26. Williamson hit just 17-27 fg's (L48, 2 miss 50+) with 32 TB on 75 KO. Zychlinski avg 43.1 (tm net 38.5). The team had a solid KR avg of 23.1. TY they lose Zychlinski and top PR Drew Terrell (12.1) and may slide back a little. Williamson, however, did hit about 90% of his fg's this spring.

COACHES - David Shaw was the OC here from '07-'10 before taking over as HC in '11. He spent the previous 10 yrs as an NFL ovt asst (PHI, OAK, BAL, SD). Shaw is also the 5th alum (4 at WR) to be a HC here and clearly had big shoes to fill. Shaw has taken the Cardinal to B2B BCS bowls and LY's 12 wins matched the school record ('10). OC Pep Hamilton left to join Luck in IND and OL chd Mike Bloomgren was promoted to OC. He was previously an asst with the Jets ('07-'10). Derek Mason was the DB chh in '10, the co-DC in '11 and now holds the DC spot to himself for a second ssn.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In the 7 yrs from '01-'07 the Cardinal had 4 different HC's. In '06 they were 1-11 and dead last in the Pac-10 in conf ypg (-169, 90 yds worse than #9). Their 11 str losses tied a SU rec (1959-'60). In Harbaugh's first ssn ('07) SU had 15 ret sts and improved to 3-6 in the P10 but were #10 (-176 ypg, 109 worse than #9!) for the 5th str yr. Stanford (15 ret sts) was picked #9 in the P10 media poll in '08 but improved to 5-7. In '09 they had 16 ret sts and 7 HG's. RB Toby Gerhart rushed for 1,871 (5.5) and helped SU to an 8-4 reg ssn (ranked as high as #14). In '10 SU had 15 ret sts incl QB Luck. Three of my 9 sets of power ratings called for an 11-1 ssn but Stanford exceeded my expectations. They had their first undefeated home ssn s/'77 and won 8 of their first 9 for the 1st time s/'70 (Jim Plunkett). SU also had 3 shutouts (1st time s/'69). #5 Stanford then walloped #12 VT 40-12 in the Orange Bowl and had their 6th ever Top 10 (#4) finish (1st s/'92) and 2nd highest in tm history (#2 in '40). Luck turned down the NFL but they did have to replace Harbaugh. Two of my 9 sets of PR's called for an unbeaten ssn but I said they wouldn't match '10's 12 win total. I must admit, Shaw did better than I expected as they went 11-2 only losing to Oregon at home 53-30 and #3 Okla St in the bowl (2 miss FG). Their +152 ypg was the best in P12 play. LY they had to replace Luck and had just 13 ret str's and drew USC (pressn #1) out of the South. Again Shaw did a remarkable job. While they were outgained 287-280 by SJSt, they pulled out the 3 pt win but fell from #21 to #25. They beat #2 ranked USC in Wk 3, 21-14 with a 47-280 yd edge. After a bye on a Thurs night, they held a 13-3 lead (0 off TD) vs Wash but UW got a 4&1, 61 yd td run to turn the game around and upset SU 17-13. On their next road trip two games later in rainy South Bend, SU again did not score an off td and lost 20-13 in OT. Three games later, Kevin Hogan took over at QB. They trailed Oreg St 23-14 in the 3Q but rallied for a 27-23 win. Oreg's DL was banged up and SU won in OT in Autzen, 17-14. UCLA did not play its "A" game and SU won 35-17 earning the right to host UCLA the next wk in the P12 Title game where they were outgained 461-325 and outrushed 284-170 but escaped. They won the Rose Bowl 20-14 over Wisc with a slim 344-301 yd edge. TY SU is much more exp'd at QB but they did benefit from 6 net close wins LY, were +9 in TO's and had beneficial off (13.4) and def (19.5) ypp's. Despite their P12 title, they were also only +78.8 ypg, 66 ypg less than Oregon. SU has a great shot at being 8-0 after October but in November, must face 3 potential Top 10 teams. They get 2 of those at home and are a legitimate National Title contender.

HT has won 9 str. LY SU led 17-3 at HT but the gm was 17-17 into the 4Q. SU kicked a fg w/13:15 left holding SJST to just 3/14pl combined L/4 drives. SU has won 5 str home openers by an avg 25 ppg.

The Cardinal are 5-5 vs the Black Knights. LTH ('76) SU lost 21-20 and the L/meeting was a loss in '79. SU is 6-2 on the road vs non-BCS conf schools but has dropped the L/2 ('08 at TCU & '06 at SJST).

SU has won 3 str in this series just once ('99-'01). Their L/gm was in '10, SU won 17-13. SU trailed 13-10 into the 4Q but went 85/10pl getting a 1 yd td run w/5:14 & then ran out L/3:58 after a ASU punt.

SU has won 5 str by an avg score of 41-14. In '11 SU led just 10-7 at HT but scored td's on 5 of 6 2H poss limiting WSU to just 2 yds before 2 4Q garbage drives. SU was 6-12 from '06-'09 in P12 AG's but 12-2 the L/3Y.

LY (Thur night) SU led 13-3 late 3Q after a 40 yd IR td. SU all'd a 61 yd td run & a GW 35 yd td pass w/4:53 left (SU was tied at W8 on final drive down 4). Into '13, SU is 20-3 hosting P12 foes (5-0 LY, MOV just 5 ppg).

The Cardinal are 3-2 vs the Utes but 2-0 in Salt Lake City. LTH ('95) SU won 27-20 (former HC Ty Willingham's 1st yr). In the three recent meetings the visitor is 0-3 ('89, '95 & '96).

85th meeting & SU has never won 5 str in this series. LY (reg ssn matchup) SU never trailed and with the gm tied 7-7 into the 2Q scored 28 of the next 31 pts holding UCLA to just 25 tld yds in that span.

The last time the Cardinal won 2 str Corvallis trips was in '92 & '94. LTH SU only led 17-13 late 3Q before 3 str td drives that amassed 201 yds. OSU was held to 79 yds the last 26:53.

SU the L3Y is 35-5 w/2 of those losses vs UO. LY UO came in #1 & SU down 14-7 late 4Q went on a 78/11pl td drive w/1:35 to force OT. UO missed a 41 yd fg (hit crossbar) & SU nailed a GW 37 ydr.

LTH SU tied gm w/38. After an exchange of td's in the first 2 OT's SU got a td & 2 pt conv to open the 3rd OT & USC from 1 & glg (S4). The 56 pts the Cardinal scored was the most ever in the series.
