## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2014

**QUARTERBACKS** - BYU has almost always had an outstanding passing QB and in '12 it was unusual as Riley Nelson, an undersized mobile QB was at the helm and threw for just 2,011 (59%, 13-13, 196 rush). Tayson Hill (PS#26) was originally at Stanford in '09 but after a mission enrolled here in '12. He became the first true frosh QB to start here s/88 (Heisman winner Ty Detmer). He led the win over Utah St (24-36-235) was originally at Stanford in '09 but after a mission enrolled here in '12. He became the first true frosh QB to start here s/88 (Heisman winner Ty Detmer). He led the win over Utah St (24-36-235) but when BYU could have taken a knee on the last play, Hill ran it (sideline miscommunication) and was OFY with a torn ACL. He was still the #2 rusher (336, 6.1) despite missing the final 7 gm. In '13 Hill was ? over the summer but surprisingly showed even more mobility. He became the 7th FBS QB to ever throw for 400 and rush for 100 in a game (Houston). OC Anae says he "looks like an NFL safety" (athletic). His 259 yds rushing vs Texas were the most by a QB s/Vince Young had 256 w/Texas in '05 but didn't top BYU's single gm rushing record of 272 (Eldon Fortie '62). In the first 3 Hill completed 35.1% but in the final 10 hit 60.1%. He rushed for 1,344 (5.5 & 10 td) and threw for 2,938 (53.9%, 19-14). Backup Ammon Olsen played in 4 (3 att) but trans to S Utah in spg. Billy Green (PS#117) and Christian Stewart will battle for the backup job TY. As long as Hill stays healthy, I expect him to have even better numbers TY.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In '12 the Cougars had to replace their #1 rusher and then FB Michael Alisa (#2 '11, 455, 5.4) broke his arm in gm 5 (222, 3.8). The unit got a boost from true frosh Jamaal Williams (PS#90) who rushed for 775 (4.7, 315 rec) despite just 83 yds in the first 4. LY Williams left the Utah gm on a stretcher after a helmet-to-helmet hit (missed MT). He had 5 games where he topped 100 including 219 vs Nev on just 15 carries. He rushed for 1,233 (5.7, 125 rec). FB Paul Lasike, was #3 with 350 (5.9) and Algeborn Brown was #4 with 234 (4.9). Adam Hine (PS#79) added 224 (5.9). TY Alisa (2 st, 4 gm inj, 99 yd) moves to LB but everyone else returns. Williams (0 fmbals lost on 383 career att's) should be one of the top RB's in the country.

**RECEIVERS** - In '11, BYU had an exp'd unit and even added in Texas transfer r/Ross Apo (PS#30). The WR's had unusual size and speed for BYU. 6'4" soph Cody Hoffman led with 943 (15.5) and 6'3" Apo was #2 (453, 13.3). In '12 they ret'd their top 3 WR's. Hoffman was the go-to man (1248, 12.5). RB Williams was #2, Apo was #3 (311, 10.0) and TE Kaneaku Friel was #4 (308, 10.3). RM JD Falslev (5'8") added 274 (7.4). LY the unit returned intact. With BYU running the ball 159 times more and passing it 51 times less, Hoffman's numbers dropped to 894 (15.7) and Apo became a bkp (204, 14.6). Walk-on Skyler Ridley was #2 (469, 12.0). Mitch Mathews was OFY after 9 but was #3 (397, 17.3). TY they lose their star 3x 1st Tm Ind Hoffman (11

st), Falslev (4 st, 313, 9.2), Ridley (12 st), TE Friel (7 st, 128, 11.6) and TE Richard Wilson (1 rec). This is a much less exp'd unit but they do add in VHT Nick Kurtz (PS#46JC, 1301, 15.0, 2Y), VHT Oregon transfer Devon Blackmon (PS#71), Stanford transfer Keanu Nelson (5'11" 184 Sr, PS#98) and Jordan Leslie who had 1,585 (16.7) L2Y at UTEP playing under his stepfather who is also the new rec c/h here.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - LY BYU lost a 1st Tm Ind C/RG, 2nd Tm Ind RT and 2 others (comb 8 st) and ret'd just 44 car sts ret, their lowest in yrs. LT Ryker Matthews moved to RG and after injuring a hip and only st'd 4. They used 3 diff RT and 4 diff RG but, thanks in part to a mobile QB destroyed the school record avg 267 ypg rush (218 ypg, '01), and while they did avg 5.2 ypc, they also allowed 38 sks (8.5%). BYU probably has the oldest O-line in college football with so many ret'd missionaries and TY they only lose LG Manaaki Vaitai (9 st '12, 2 st '13). They now have 87 car sts (10 OL w/sts) and make my list of top OL's in the country (pg 20).

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '12 BYU had to replace a 2nd Tm Ind NT and 3 DL (comb 7 st, 34 tk). True frosh Bronson Kaufusi (PS#32) was off a mission and it took him a while to work into form. The true Newcomer POY was Ezekiel Ansa who 3 yrs prior didn't know how to put on pads but turned into an elite NFL prospect. Ansa led the DL with 62 tkls, 4.5 sk, 8.5 tfl, 9 pbu! He was a big reason the Cougars improved to 87 ypg (2.7, 34 sk). Unfortunately, LY they had to replace Ansa (#1DC), a NG and DE. They did return DE Eathyn Manumaleuna (13 st '11, 4 st til inj '12) who slid to NT plus Kaufusi. BYU still had a solid D, they just couldn't match '12's extraordinary numbers (160, 3.9, 24 sk). TY they only lose 1st Tm Ind NT Manumaleuna (13 st, 48 tk, 7 tfl) and Kaufusi moves to LB so they are on par with '13's unit.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '12 BYU had to replace 3 LB's (comb 19 sts) but still ret'd their #1, #2 & #4 tk'l's. Kyle Van Noy (PS#38) earned 3rd Tm AA and was a one-man wrecking crew in the bowl (2 td's, a ff, fr, int, blk'd punt, 3.5 tfl, 1.5 sk) and turned down the NFL. LY they did have to replace 2 st'r's (#1, #7 tk'l's) and the top 3 ret tk'l's were only #5, #6 & #12. Spencer Hadley, (13 st '12) was susp 2 gms then OFY WK #9 (Mendenhall called 1 of best players at time). BYU went from allowing 14 ppg to 22.1. TY the losses are heavy. Gone are 2x AA Kyle Van Noy (13 st, #3 tk'l, 4 sk, 13.5 tfl, #2DC DET), Hadley (5 st, 36 tk, 3.5 tfl), 1st Tm Ind Uani 'Unga (12 st, #1 tk'l, 7.5 tfl), Tyler Beck (7 st, #10 tk'l, 2.5 tfl) and Austen Jorgensen (4 st, #9 tk'l, 1 tfl). They move in DE Kaufusi to WLB so the top 3 returnees were #6, #12 & #17 tk'l's making the unit less exp'd once again but hopefully they'll stay healthier. They do add in RB Alisa (11 car st), Zac Stout (PS#46) and Troy Hinds (PS#19).

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - BYU always has a solid pass D. In '11 they had to replace 3 st'r's but still finished #17 (58%, 13-13) in my PDR. In '12 they had to replace 2 st'r's and a bkp and their FS was susp'd after 8 sts. The unit still got their 4th Top 25 finish in 6 yrs (#22, 57%, 12-12). LY they had to replace their #3 tk'l'r and their FS (8 st, 33 tk). They then lost 1st Tm Ind CB Jordan Johnson (12 st '12, 15 pbu) to an ACL in Aug as well as their other proj'd CB, Cameron Comer. They finished #32 (56.9%, 19-13). Four diff ply'r's shared the CB spot opposite Robertson Daniel. Gone are Mike Hague (4 st, #12 tk'l'r), 2x 1st Tm Ind KAT Daniel Sorensen (13 st, #5 tk'l'r, 2 int, 12 pbu) and Blake Morgan (1 st, 33 tk). They return 1st Tm Ind FS Craig Bills, 2nd Tm Ind Daniel and add in ND transfer Chris Badger (PS#62), Trent Trammell (PS#120JC, ACL '13) and top cover CB Jordan Johnson (1st Tm Ind '12). They also bring in Neb trans S Harvey Jackson (6'2" 210 Sr, PS#165) who had 3 sts (33 tk) LY. After slipping out of the Top 25 LY, I look for the Cougars to get back in it in '14.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - BYU was #54 in my ST ratings in '12. LY they lost their outstanding P Riley Stephenson (41.0 net) but did have K Justin Sorensen back in full health (37TB on 80KO) and he hit 21-26 (L/45, 2nd Tm Ind). New P Scott Arellano avg 41.0 but the tm net ranked #107 (34.6). Adam Hine was their top KR (843, 27.2, 1st Tm Ind). BYU slipped all the way down to #102 TY. They lose their K and top PR JD Falslev (9.7, 1st Tm Ind). Despite the losses, I expect a rebound season.

**COACHES** - Bronco Mendenhall (DC New Mexico '98-'02) came here in '03 as the DC and became HC in '05 after then-DC Crowton resigned. He took over a team that had 3 straight losing seasons and went 6-6 in his 1st ssn but has now taken them to a bowl every yr since. OC Robert Anae was also OC here ('05-'10) and OL c/h/run gm coor at Arizona for 2Y before ret in '13. Mendenhall had been his own DC with the exception of '08 and LY he promoted from within as Nick Howell (DB, ST cch) took over as DC with Mendenhall continuing to call the plays.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

BYU had 3 phil's losing seasons prior to Bronco Mendenhall taking over in '05 and he went 6-6 his first year and has now had winning seasons 8 consecutive yrs (5w/DD). They had finished #16 AP '06, #14 '07, #25 '08 and #12 '09. In the LY BYU has been ranked just 1 wk overall (wk 3 '12). In '11 they finished 10-3. In '12 they had 29 Sr's and 13 ret st'r's but had benefitted from 3 net close wins in '11. Due to being an Ind they were taking on a tougher sked and slipped to 8-5 despite a dominant D (14.0 ppg, 266 ypg). They lost to 3 ranked tms but 2 were a comb 4 pts incl a 3 pt loss to Notre Dame who later played in the BCS Champ game. LY they only had 11 ret st'r's. With just 3 st'r's back, the D slipped to allg 379 ypg. Part of that was due to a more up-tempo offense as their D faced 1,028 plays LY after just 790 in '12. BYU got 1 vote in the preseason AP poll (#44). In the opener, in pouring rain, they had a 362-223 yd edge vs Virginia but lost 19-16. They shredded Texas for a school rec 550 yds rushing and UT fired their DC after the game. BYU had a bye prior to playing Utah and caught the Utes off a conf OT loss and traveling but BYU surprisingly lost at home 20-13. After an expected win vs MT, Utah St lost QB Chuckie Keeton in the 1Q down 10-7 and the Cougars rolled 31-14. Mendenhall knows how to shut down the option and they whipped GTech at home 38-20 giving up a td w/53 left. They rolled up 681 yds vs Houston on the road coming out of the 1 pt win. Boise hadn't lost in Oct s/01 but BYU rolled to a 37-20 win. Wisc did lead 27-10 and had the advantage of UW HC Gary Andersen being the Utah ST HC in '12 and BYU pulled within 10 with 3:12 left but got no closer. They had 22 seniors play their FHG and blew out Idaho St, 59-13. It was ND's FHG played in snow and 30 mph winds and the Irish won 23-13. NV got a td with 2:42 left to pull within 28-23 but BYU ran out the clock. In the bowl, the Cougars had a 473-319 yd edge vs Wash but settled for 4 fg att (made 3) and gave up a 100 yd KR td and lost 31-16 for a 2nd straight 8-5 record. TY they have 14 ret st'r's and I like the talent that is on hand. The schedule is more manageable and they will contend for the top record of the Independents and top LY's 8 win total (will play in inaugural Miami Beach Bowl if elig).
