General Notes

- Friday's attendance at Hard Rock Stadium: 63,912
- Tennessee's all-time record improved to 867-410-53 with Friday's win.
- Friday marked the 20th meeting all-time between Tennessee and Clemson, marking just the second in the 21st century and first since the 2004 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.
 - After Friday's win, Tennessee leads the all-time series 12-6-2 and has won eight of the last nine meetings.
- With Friday night's victory, Tennessee secured its first 11-win season since finishing 11-2 in 2001.
 - The Vols finished with an 11-win season for the ninth time in program history.
- Head coach **Josh Heupel** led Tennessee to its sixth ranked victory of the season on Friday night, tying the program record for single-season ranked victories with the 1998 National Championship team coached by Phillip Fulmer.
- Friday marked the Vols' first victory in a "New Year's Six" bowl game (2014-pres.) and their first win in the Orange Bowl since defeating Oklahoma back in 1939.
 - With the win, UT snapped a three-game losing streak in the Orange Bowl and improved to 2-3 all-time in the game.
- Friday's game marked Tennessee's 56th bowl appearance in program history, which ranks fifth most among FBS programs.
 - The Vols' 30 bowl victories rank seventh in the FBS.

Vol Captains/Coin Toss

- Tennessee's team captains for Friday's game: P/PK **Paxton Brooks**, DL **LaTrell Bumphus**, OL **Jerome Carvin**, QB **Hendon Hooker** and DE **Byron Young**
- Clemson won the toss and elected to defer, defending the west end zone. Tennessee received the opening kickoff.

First Time Starters

- Redshirt sophomore DL **Bryson Eason** made his first career start in the Orange Bowl against Clemson on Friday.
- This year, the Volunteers have produced seven first-time starters. Eason became the first defensive lineman this year to make his first career start (**Da'Jon Terry** logged his first start at UT against LSU, but made two starts while at Kansas).

Records

- Tennessee had already set single-season records in total points and total offense entering Friday's Orange Bowl. Following Friday's contest, the Vols finished the year with single-season program records in the following offensive categories:
 - Total Points: 599 (Previous Record: 511 in 2021)
 - Points Per Game: 46.1 (Previous Record: 42.8 in 1993)
 - Total Offense: 6,832 (Previous Record: 6,174 in 2021)
 - Yards Per Game: 525.5 (Previous Record: 482.8 in 1997)
 - Passing Touchdowns: 38 (Previous Record: 37 in 1997)
 - Rushing Touchdowns (tied): 40 (Previous Record: 40 in 1951)
- PK **Chase McGrath** booted through four PATs in the contest, upping his season total to 70, a new program record, breaking his own mark of 66 set a season ago.
 - McGrath tied the record for single-season points scored by a kicker, scoring 118 in his final collegiate year.

Team Offensive Notes

- **Josh Heupel**-led teams have scored 30+ in 54 games (33 at UCF, 21 at Tennessee), ranking second among head coaches since 2018. UT scored 30 or more points in 12 of 13 games this season.
- The Vols outscored the Tigers 7-0 in the first quarter and finished the season with a 141-72 first-quarter scoring margin.
 - The Big Orange have scored a touchdown in the first quarter in 24 of their 26 games under **Heupel**.

Joe Milton III Notes

- QB **Joe Milton III** completed 19-of-28 passes for 251 yards and a career-high tying three touchdowns with no interceptions.
- Playing 80 miles from his hometown of Pahokee, Florida, the redshirt senior signal caller was named the 2022 Capital One Orange Bowl MVP.

Aaron Beasley Notes

- LB **Aaron Beasley** made a habit of getting in the backfield, he finished the day with a game-high 12 tackles and logged a career-best four tackles for loss and two sacks.
 - In the first half alone, the senior tallied six tackles, four TFLs and two sacks and a pass breakup. Entering the game, his career best for TFLs and sacks were 3.0 and 1.0, respectively. His four
 - **Beasley's** four TFLs tied a Tennessee bowl record held by Corey Terry (1997 Citrus Bowl vs. Northwestern) and Reggie McKenzie (1984 Sun Bowl vs. Maryland).
 - **Beasley** notched his fifth career game with double-digit tackles and has done so twice this season.

Jabari Small Notes

- Junior RB **Jabari Small** made his 13th start of the year and finished with 13 carries for 38 yards and a touchdown.
- With a 2-yard rushing touchdown with 9:03 remaining in the second quarter, **Small** moved into a tie for sixth in program history for single-season rushing scores with 13. He is the first Vol to rush for at least 13 touchdowns since Montario Hardesty in 2009.

Other Individual Offensive Notes

- WR **Squirrel White** reeled in a 50-yard pass from Milton in the second quarter, setting up Small's rushing score. The reception marks his third reception of 50-plus yards in the last four games. For the season, White has four catches of 50 yards or more.
 - **White** hauled in a 14-yard strike from Milton with five seconds left in the third quarter for his second touchdown score of the season.
- RB **Jaylen Wright** finished as the Vols' top rusher, scampering for 89 yards on 11 carries. The performance marks his seventh game this year as UT's leading rusher.
 - **Wright** broke off a 42 yard rush in the third quarter, marking his sixth rush of the season of 20 or more yards.
- WR **Bru McCoy** finished the night with four catches for 48 yards and a touchdown on the Vols' second possession of the game. **McCoy**, who will return to Tennessee next season, concluded his first year on Rocky Top with 667 receiving yards and four scores.

Team Defensive Notes

- Tennessee held the Clemson offense without a touchdown in a half for just the second time this season. The last time the Tigers did not reach the end zone was in the first half against Notre Dame on Nov. 5.
- After forcing a pair of turnovers in Friday's victory, the Vols finished the year by generating multiple takeaways in eight of their 13 games and only losing the turnover battle twice all year.

- UT finished with 22 total takeaways this season and a plus-11 turnover margin after forcing just 16 turnovers with a plus-three turnover margin in 2021.
- The Vols intercepted Clemson QB Cade Klubnik twice on Friday night, marking the third time this season they have picked off multiple passes in a game.

Individual Defensive Notes

- LB **Solon Page III**, in his final collegiate game, recorded a career high in tackles with 10. It marked his first career game with double-digit tackles.
- DB **Wesley Walker** made his first career interception to seal the victory with 1:42 remaining on the clock.
- STAR **Tamarion McDonald** bookended a strong junior season with a pick midway through the fourth quarter. **McDonald** finished the year with two interceptions, making his first on the first play of the season and finishing the year with a late takeaway.

Special Teams Notes

- Clemson missed three field goals in the game. It marks the first time a UT opponent missed three or more field goals in a game since Sept. 25, 2010 when UAB went 2-of-7 in Neyland Stadium.
- K **Chase McGrath** connected on all four PATs and drilled his only field goal try of the game from 32 yards out. He caps his collegiate career with 60 made field goals, hitting 28 as a Vol.
 - He was near automatic from inside 40 yards, converting 21-of-23 (91.3 percent) inside 40 yards.
- Freshman **Dylan Sampson** made his first appearance returning kicks. The true freshman made a 24-yard return in his first try with 10:24 on the clock in the third quarter.

CLEMSON GAME NOTES

- Clemson finished the season 11-3. The 2022 season was Clemson's 11th 11-win season in school history and its eighth in the last 11 years.
- Clemson's 11 wins in 2022 tied for the seventh-most in a season in school history.
- **Dabo Swinney** coached his 200th career game as head coach to join Frank Howard (295) as the only coaches in school history to coach 200 career games at Clemson.
- **Swinney** joined Florida State's Bobby Bowden (227) and Virginia's George Welsh (223) as the only coaches to lead an ACC program in at least 200 career games.
- **Swinney** is 161-39 through 200 career games, tying Oklahoma Bob Stoops and Tennessee's Robert Neyland for the fifth-most victories through 200 games in FBS history.
- **Swinney** completed his 15th season (and 14th full season) as the second-winningest coach in FBS history through the first 15 seasons of a career (161). Swinney ranks second behind only Urban Meyer (165). Swinney's win total includes his interim season in which he only coached seven games.
- **Swinney** made his 19th bowl game appearance to break Bobby Bowden's ACC record (18) for the most career bowl appearances leading an ACC program.
- Clemson produced a season-high 34 first downs. It was Clemson's most first downs since recording 34 first downs against Miami (Fla.) in 2020.
- Clemson's 34 first downs were a school bowl record. Clemson's previous bowl record for first downs was 32, set against LSU in the 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl.
- Clemson dropped to 31-3 since 1950 in games in which it has recorded 30 or more first downs. The game was Clemson's first loss in a contest in which it recorded 30 or more first downs since 2016 against Pitt (33).
- Eleven of Clemson's 14 drives crossed midfield. Clemson scored on three of those possessions.
- Clemson ran 101 plays, the most in Clemson bowl history, surpassing its 100 against LSU in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. It was one shy of the school record in any game (101, 2012 vs. NC State).
- Clemson's 101 plays were an Orange Bowl record, surpassing Clemson's 90 plays against Oklahoma in the 2015 Orange Bowl and Nebraska's 90 plays against Notre Dame in the 1973 Orange Bowl.
- Clemson 34 first downs and 101 plays were both the most in a loss in school history.
- Clemson's 56 team passing attempts set an Orange Bowl record and tied the Clemson bowl record set against Mississippi State in the Peach Bowl to end the 1999 season, the 2002 Tangerine Bowl against Texas Tech and the College Football Playoff National Championship Game against Alabama to end the 2016 season.
- Clemson forced five Tennessee three-and-outs. The Tigers also forced the Volunteers to punt a season-high eight times. Tennessee's season high in punts entering the game was six at Pitt in September. Tennessee punted 19 times in eight SEC games in 2022 and 14 times in two games against ACC opponents.
- Quarterback **Cade Klubnik** made his first career start and completed 30-of-54 passes for 320 yards. Klubnik's 54 pass attempts were an Orange Bowl record, surpassing Florida State's Chris Weinke's 51 passes against Oklahoma (and quarterback) Josh Heupel in the Orange Bowl to end the 2000 season.
- **Klubnik** also rushed 20 times for 51 yards with a touchdown. His 20 rushing attempts were the most by a Clemson quarterback since Kelly Bryant's 20 rushing attempts against NC State in 2017.
- **Klubnik's** 74 plays of total offense (combined rush attempts and pass attempts) were the fifth-most by an individual in Clemson history and Clemson's most since Deshaun Watson's 77 against Alabama to end the 2016 season.
- **Klubnik's** 74 plays of total offense were an Orange Bowl record, surpassing the 65 by Northern Illinois against Florida State to end the 2012 season.

- **Klubnik** became the first Clemson quarterback since the modernization of Clemson's quarterback position in 1953 to make his first career start in a postseason game.
- In facing No. 6 Tennessee, **Klubnik** became the first Clemson quarterback to make his first career start against an AP Top 6 opponent since his offensive coordinator, Brandon Streeter, did so against No. 5 Florida State in 1997.
- **Klubnik** became only the eighth true freshman to start at quarterback for Clemson since the NCAA instituted permanent freshman eligibility in 1972, joining Steve Fuller (1975), Willie Jordan (1975), Patrick Sapp (1992), Nealon Greene (1994), Deshaun Watson (2014), Trevor Lawrence (2018) and DJ Uiagalelei (2020).
- **Klubnik** rushed for his second touchdown of the season and his second touchdown in as many games on a four-yard carry in the fourth quarter.
- With **Klubnik's** rushing touchdown, Clemson has now scored at least one rushing touchdown in a national-best 68 of its 69 games since the start of the 2018 season. Clemson has rushed for a touchdown in 26 consecutive games.
- Running back **Will Shipley** scored Clemson's fourth two-point conversion of the season in the fourth quarter. Clemson's four two-point conversions this season are Clemson's most since 2012 (four).
- **Shipley** rushed 17 times for 72 yards. Shipley finished the year with 1,182 rushing yards, 11th-most in a season in Clemson history.
- Wide receiver **Joseph Ngata** caught a career-high eight passes for 84 yards.
- With four catches for 49 yards by **Davis Allen** and three catches for 29 yards by **Jake Briningstool**, Clemson's tight ends finished the year with 67 catches, 748 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 67 catches exceeded the group's 65 in 2011 for its most under Dabo Swinney.
- Defensive tackle **Ruke Orhorhoro** ended Tennessee's first drive with a third-down sack, adding to his single-season career high with his fourth sack of the season.
- Defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** pushed his season sack total to 3.5 with a second-quarter sack.
- Defensive tackle **Tyler Davis** recorded a sack on a third down late in the first half. It pushed his season sack total to 5.5, tying his single-season career high from 2019, and pushed his single-season career high in tackles for loss to 9.5, surpassing his 9.0 in 2019.
- Linebacker **Barrett Carter** pushed his season sack total to 5.5 with a third-quarter sack, Clemson's fourth sack of the game.
- Clemson has now recorded at least four sacks in five consecutive games for the first time since a six-game streak across the final three games of 1990 and the first three games of 1991.
- Linebacker **Wade Woodaz** recorded a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Cornerback **Nate Wiggins** recorded his 13th pass breakup of the season to tie the Clemson sophomore record for pass breakups in a single season shared by James Lott (1987) and Justin Miller (2003).
- Placekicker **B.T. Potter** appeared in his 69th career game to tie Clemson's program record for career games played shared by James Skalski, Will Spiers and Will Swinney. Potter's 69 career games are the most of any active player at any level of NCAA football.
- **Potter** made his 54th career start at placekicker to add to his Clemson position record set in the ACC Championship Game.
- **Potter** scored in a 54th consecutive game to break the Clemson record set by Chandler Catanzaro (53) from 2010-13. Potter scored in every game since earning the starting placekicking job prior to the 2019 season after serving as the team's kickoff specialist in 2018.
- On a 40-yard third-quarter field goal, his second field goal of the game, **Potter** (73) passed Nelson Welch (72 from 1991-94) for the Clemson record for career field goals.
- **Potter** finished his collegiate career with Clemson's records for field goals of 40 yards or more (34) and 50 yards or more (nine).

- Clemson faced its second AP Top 10 opponent of the season and has now faced multiple AP Top 10 teams in a season seven times in the last eight years.
- Clemson faced Tennessee for the 20th time in school history, a series that dates to John Heisman's Tigers facing the Volunteers at Knoxville's Chilhowee Park in 1901.
- Clemson played its eighth night game of 2022, tying the 2017 and 2019 campaigns for the second-most in a season in Clemson history.
- Clemson dropped to 4-3 all-time in Orange Bowl play.
- With a win in the ACC Championship Game prior to the Orange Bowl, Clemson entered the game having won a postseason game (conference championship, bowl game and/or national championship game) for 12 consecutive seasons. Clemson's current 12-year streak is the longest active streak in the country and passed 1985-95 Florida State for the longest streak on record back to 1980, according to Stats Perform.
- The defeat ended Clemson's 16-game winning streak in December games, a streak that dated to Clemson's 2011 ACC Championship Game victory against Virginia Tech. Clemson dropped to 27-14 all-time in December games, including postseason play.
- Clemson finished the season 4-1 against AP Top 25 opponents (at kickoff) this season.
- Clemson played its 154th consecutive game since losing back-to-back games in a single season. Clemson's 154-game streak dating to 2011 is the nation's longest active streak.
- Clemson voted on its permanent captains for the 2022 season prior to the contest. Clemson's captains for the game and season were tight end **Davis Allen**, defensive tackle **Tyler Davis**, defensive end **K.J. Henry**, offensive tackle **Jordan McFadden** and safety **Jalyn Phillips**.

JOSH HEUPEL: First, I said it during the course of the week, but thank you to everybody involved with this entire setup. The Orange Bowl committee, South Florida, the hospitality has been second to none. This has been a special game for me in my past, and I've always been treated the right way here. A fantastic week for our staff and for our players, great experiences for them, and obviously it culminates tonight with a great win for us. Thank you to Vol Nation for showing up in the way that they did, fun to see them fly in from all across the country and come and help us go compete tonight. I appreciate everything that they've done, not just tonight but on our entire journey this season.

It was awesome, fun to see so many VFLs, former players show up during the course of the week four days prior to game day and they started showing up in droves out at practice, around the hotel. It was great to get an opportunity to connect with you guys.

You guys have built an unbelievable legacy here, and it's something that we're continuing to strive to go chase and embrace every single day. Thank you for the legacy that you've left.

All season long we've talked about learning how to compete and finish at the end. This month the message was really consistent with that, as well. It was about finishing our season, finishing this legacy, for the guys that have been here the last two years or whenever they came in, I'm not sure a group has done more in a shorter amount of time to help revive a prominent program the way this



group has.

So proud of the players and the staff, the connection that we have, being accountable to one another, loving to compete and doing it together every single day.

Tonight was a lot of fun. Unbelievable defensive performance. Special teams were rock solid, and Joe and the offense were able to find a way to make a bunch of big plays and get the ball into the end zone. Great night for Tennessee. The best is yet to come, but really excited about what happened tonight.

Q. Coach, what do you say to people who insist still that bowl games don't matter, and what was the significance of the win tonight?

JOSH HEUPEL: Man, bowl games matter. You watch them every single day, you can see the energy, effort, strain, the excitement, the disappointment on the other side. They matter. It doesn't mean that everybody has everybody for the ballgame. That's just the nature of where we're at during the course of bowl season.

But it matters for everybody that shows up. It matters to the head coaches, the assistants. It matters to the fans. It matters to the players. These guys are prideful. Clemson is prideful. When you line up and compete, man, you're going to compete with everything that you've got. These are rare opportunities. 21 years ago, whatever it was, I got an opportunity to play here inside of this stadium, and the memories that I have from that, I don't talk about my playing days a lot with these guys. I'm old enough that some of them weren't even alive, but I think they bought into that, that these moments matter, and it's something that they will remember for the rest of their lives.

Q. The significance of it?

JOSH HEUPEL: Yeah, it continues to put our brand, the style of football, and it's a legacy moment for the guys that are here that are graduating, but it's a springboard for us moving forward.

Again, our brand is out in front of everybody. I think we've

beaten three out of the last four national champions during the course of this season. 11-win season, which hasn't been done since 2001. There's so many positive things, so much momentum inside of our program that the entire country, our players, our fan base, recruits, can see the trajectory of where Tennessee is and where it's going.

Tonight is a big night.

Q. Joe, you're such a cool, calm guy. It doesn't ever seem like anything rattles you. Tonight you had it all on display. What were the emotions like for you when you're making those passes?

JOE MILTON III: Pretty much just got to stay calm. That play is going to happen. When it happens, it's going to happen. When you come to the sideline you've just pretty much got to stay equal headed. The next play got to happen. You have to move on to the next play. The last play you can't go back and change it after it's done. After those couple footballs that was thrown downfield, I was pretty much just humbled, as I always am, pretty much just -- I smiled a couple times, but it's fine.

Q. Aaron, for you, big game tonight, had a couple sacks in the first half, several tackles for loss. Talk about your growth as a player as you continue to hone your craft at linebacker.

AARON BEASLEY: Yeah, just buying into the coaches, listening to the coaches, loving on my teammates. My teammates push me. I couldn't do it without my D-line and my back end. Just shout out to them, shout out to the coaches. They keep me going.

Q. Joe, you're coming from Pahokee Florida, representing South Florida here tonight at the Orange Bowl and being the MVP, how does it feel doing it in your own backyard?

JOE MILTON III: It feels great. I've pretty much been talking about it the whole month ever since we figured out we were coming down here. It was a statement game for Tennessee but also a statement game for me playing at home.

Q. For Josh, Joe was sort of filling in for Hendon, Squirrel for Jalin, Aaron making plays that Jeremy would make during the year. You have three guys here that all stepped forward. What's the philosophy that you have where you can plug and play and still stay at this elite level?

JOSH HEUPEL: Next man up. You can phrase it however you want to. That's not coach speak. We talk about it. We

live it every day. We talk about competing the right way and preparing for your opportunity. You don't know when it's coming.

We've got young guys that continue to get better. I like the fact that our guys love being in the building. They love learning and growing. They enjoy who they're doing it with. It allows us to continue to take strides, individually and then collectively as a football team. Where we started and where we are now in that way is so different.

We've got good young players. We're losing some really good veteran guys, obviously, but the future is freaky bright for Tennessee football.

Q. Joe, it looked like you were looking for Hendon there on the stage and then he gets up there and shares that moment with you. I know some of this process he's been Zooming in meetings, Joe was talking about in the locker room how you did the call sheet together. What's this been like leading into this bowl game sharing this with him, kind of his presence still a part of this team even though he's been hurt?

JOE MILTON III: For me, me and Hendon lived together for this whole semester of school, so just watching film together every day, just enjoying these moments that we have. Any play can be your last, so we pretty much just every time we go home, pretty much just talk the game plan out. After we talk it out, he'll come back to my room probably at like 1:00 and say something like I don't really like that read, how do you feel about it. We'll talk about it. It doesn't matter what time it is. We'll get up in the morning for meetings --

JOSH HEUPEL: I think you're in bed at 10:30 every night; what are you talking about?

JOE MILTON III: But other than that, it just felt special having him up there. He put in a lot of work for this. If you want to be truthful, he got us here. I had to get it done for him.

Q. Can you talk about why your defense was so effective tonight and what some of the game plan was that you executed?

JOSH HEUPEL: Obviously there was a ton of pressure, multiple in our fronts. I thought we did a good job against the run game. End of the first half got a little bit tired, they hit some on us, a little bit in the third quarter. But multiple coverages on the back end, and we played better gap integrity. We tackled better in space, and we were better in our coverage, not perfect. Obviously the PIs were disappointing on our part, but continued to fight and

compete.

Great red zone defense, situational football tonight. You've got to get points when you're in the red zone, you need to get sevens, and defensively we found a way to tighten up when they were on the plus side of the 50, and on the field goals they didn't make many of their attempts, and found a way to get off the field. Created turnovers, too.

Q. Kind of going off of that, the Tigers were held without a touchdown for just the second time this season in the first half. Obviously a lot has been made about Clemson's top-notch defense. Do you think people kind of counted you guys out in that way?

JOSH HEUPEL: I think our defensive players continue to grow. We had guys that were playing in the middle part of our defense, more reps than they had been during the course of the season. It's a prideful group. We continue to get better. There's some youth back there.

The fact that we had more health in the secondary with more opportunities to practice allowed those guys to go out and play in a better way. Throughout the course of the season, training camp, last spring, just those guys didn't -- they missed a lot of opportunities to improve, and I thought they got better during the course of this last month after the end of the regular season.

Q. Squirrel, I'm not going to let you get off easy on this one. When you found out Jalin and Cedric weren't going to be playing in this game, how did you embrace stepping up and taking on a larger role?

SQUIRREL WHITE: Yeah, I just went like to Bru, Ramel and just stayed in the building extra and just worked on my game and stuff, extra film, and I knew I had to step up and stuff.

Q. Squirrel, back-to-back for you here. Overall, just to touch upon that, can you just talk about the receiving corps just the talent of it overall, and in your opinion what stands out about the receiving corps of this team?

SQUIRREL WHITE: Yeah, I feel like we're the best, like all of us come to work every day and we just ball out and stuff.

Q. On the field afterwards I heard you say the best is yet to come. That seems to be a mentality you've had throughout your tenure here. How often do you preach that to the guys in the room, and where do you think that comes from for you?

JOSH HEUPEL: Well, I just know that where we started,

where we've gotten to, but there's so much left out there for us. It's in individual habits, it's in us continuing to improve in communication as coaches, refining what we're doing inside of our building, as we continue to develop depth inside of our program, recruit.

One of the great lessons, I said this to the football team after the game tonight, is two years ago there was so much outside noise that wasn't necessarily positive, and none of those guys paid attention to it. They decided collectively and individually to go accomplish something, and they worked for it.

If you set your mind to something and you work, you really can go up and accomplish anything. That's a great lesson for this football program, but it's a great lesson for these guys as they move into life.

As we continue to move forward, everybody inside that locker room understands there's a whole lot left out there for us that we can improve upon, that we can control, that can help us continue to climb as a program.

Q. Josh, Hendon Hooker Zooming in for meetings as he had his knee looked at and being a presence here, what has that meant and what has he meant in the last two years?

JOSH HEUPEL: Well, the fact that he's committed to this program and to his teammates, to Joe in some ways, that he wants to be a part of this experience, that he wants to finish his legacy here the right way, I think it speaks to everything of who he is. This program has climbed -- this is not taking away from anybody else inside of the building, me included, this doesn't happen without Hendon. I say that meaning -- these guys would say it, too. He's special. As you build a program, you've got to have somebody that's selling your message from inside that lives that message every day and gets the locker room headed in the right direction, and Hendon wasn't the only guy that did that, but he certainly was spearheading it.

There were a lot of guys that started moving us in the right direction from the inside out.

Q. Josh, when you describe it as freaky bright a few minutes ago, what does that look like to you? You have those freshmen, whether it be Squirrel, Josh Joseph, Elijah Harris, played a lot more reps and snaps tonight. What's that future look like in your mind?

JOSH HEUPEL: Yeah, playing electric football on the offensive side of the football field, scoring a bunch of points, defensively being aggressive, fearless, ferocious,



and being the best defense in the country, and having that same mentality on special teams. Like we're just getting started in what we're developing here.

I love coming to work with these guys every single day. We continue to recruit, man. Tonight our brand is in front of everybody again on a national stage. It was a primetime game, and they got a chance to see who we are, how we play, how we compete together, the connection, the energy, and man, I think someone wants to play an exciting brand of football and have more fun than they can imagine, man, this is a great place to come compete on Rocky Top, and an unbelievable fan base.

Q. Squirrel, I talked to Joe the other day, and he said that you guys kind of developed a relationship when you first arrived, and he just really trusts throwing it to you down there. How much has he helped in your development over the last year?

SQUIRREL WHITE: Yeah, when I first got here, I was rolling with all the twos and stuff, and Joe would be my quarterback. He was just like hitting me and stuff and trying stuff and just found like a --

Q. Was the ball coming hard, Squirrel?

SQUIRREL WHITE: Yeah, absolutely knocked me off my feet, yeah.

Q. Aaron, what was different defensively for you all until Clemson got to scoring range and once Clemson got to scoring range? It looked like two different defenses in some ways.

AARON BEASLEY: When they got in the red zone and stuff? I just feel like -- I don't know, I just feel like we played better when the pressure was on and they were about to score. We didn't want them to score. I feel like that played a part in our schemes and stuff like that.

Q. Squirrel, kind of a funny one, but have you realized that your name is buzzing on social media because your name is Squirrel?

SQUIRREL WHITE: Yeah.

Q. You looked it up already?

SQUIRREL WHITE: No, no, no.

Q. Joe, you said this was a statement game for you. What kind of statement do you feel like you made?

JOE MILTON III: The Vols are back on top.

Q. Josh, what do the next few weeks look like for you? After the season is over, a lot of changes, you've got hires to do, rosters, who's coming back, that kind of stuff. Can you walk us through that?

JOSH HEUPEL: Yeah, I was going to try to enjoy this one. Thanks for ruining it. (Laughter.)

I want to enjoy a couple days with my family while I push forward on some of the problems or the issues that you already talked about. We've got recruiting the 4th through the 8th and we'll move forward on staff and all those things here as the beginning of January unfolds.

Q. Josh, you said that getting back in the rhythm of calling plays wasn't going to be an issue. Was it?

JOSH HEUPEL: No. First of all, we've got a great staff. Joey Halzle does a fantastic job, Glen Elarbee does a fantastic job. Those guys have been with us forever. Tonight we probably weren't in great balance early on, but some of that was what they were doing on the defensive side of the football.

Q. Let's talk about some of the greatest memories that you have from this season because there are a lot of them.

JOSH HEUPEL: Yeah, man, you think back about this season with this group of guys, finishing it the way that we did here will certainly be a great memory. Some of the huge wins during the course of the season, inside Neyland Stadium, Florida, Alabama. As much as anything, though, you really do remember just the daily interaction and the journey that you're on with these guys every single day, in the meeting rooms, out on the practice field, eating dinner with these guys.

I talk to them a lot about it because in my playing days, when I look back on those days, it's not just the playing that you remember. A lot of it's just the small interaction, the moments that you get a chance to hang out with your brothers. It's been a really special journey here with these guys this year.

DABO SWINNEY: Well, first of all, congratulations to Tennessee. They did what they needed to do to win the game, earned it. Two teams had really good years, both teams earned their way here tonight, and they earned the win on the field tonight. We did not.

Incredibly disappointing. Just name of the game; a lot of missed opportunities, simple as that.

First half, I think we had six scoring opportunities out of seven drives, and we got one field goal out of it.

Against the No. 1 scoring offense in the country that you know at some point is going to hit an explosive or two, you have to capitalize. The one thing that we've been probably the most consistent at all year and have probably done the best is red-zone scoring, and we just did not take advantage of plus-territory opportunities. Again, seven drives, we had one punt first half, sky punt, seven opportunities, six scoring opportunities, and we come away with one field goal.

Really disappointed with the missed opportunities there. We had 101 plays and 480-something yards, and you don't get any points for yards. That's why on the stats, name of the game is points. Just like I tell the receivers, you don't get any points for getting open. You have to finish and execute.

We did not do that.

I will say this. I thought our guys competed their butts off.



I have a great respect for how they competed. They never backed down, either side. I thought both teams competed hard. Our guys fought. It was very frustrating with some missed opportunities, but they continued to compete all the way.

I thought defensively they gave us a chance really most of the night, and then when we got a one-score game right there in the fourth, they popped a couple runs there, and that was probably the worst defensive possession that we had.

Good football team, and a lot of missed opportunities.

Then obviously missed kicks, too.

Took some sacks, made some mistakes. My man Cade who's not in here yet, you can easily see how talented he is and what a great player he's going to be. He made a lot of great, great plays, but he also had some just mistakes, simple as that. Just took some sacks on some hots, took a sack on a sprint out, obviously the situation right there at the end can't happen.

These are all things he'll learn from. But what a great opportunity, what a great moment for him to be able to go and play and compete.

Again, did a lot of good things. Made some big-time throws.

Didn't go our way tonight, but definitely -- it's always sad when it comes to an end. It really is. It's always a sad situation because it's kind of the last time you're going to be with a lot of these guys, especially when it doesn't go your way. But even when you win it's sad because you've got some relationships that aren't going to be in the room next year.

But I'm thankful for our seniors. I love those guys. I'm proud of how they competed.

I'm better and Clemson is better because of those young men who spent the last four, five and in some cases six years as a part of our program. Very thankful for that.

Again, didn't end the way we wanted to tonight, but an excellent year, 11-3 and ACC champs, especially coming off a very challenging year last year and a lot of transition and a lot of change.

We're not anywhere near where we need to be or going to be, but we got better. That's something that we can take away from it.

Again, congratulations to Tennessee and Josh. Man, I thought, again, they did some good things. What a great year for them.

We'll take your questions with that.

Q. The decision on that opening drive to go for the fake field goal instead of -- the 44-yard field goal, was that something you saw on film, or was it more of a feeling, the respect for Tennessee's offense and the fact that you needed to score a touchdown?

DABO SWINNEY: All of the above. We knew field goals wasn't going to win the game, and we came into the game, we felt like we had it there, and want to go and look at it as far as how we executed it.

But just to come out and be aggressive, and again, knew especially early that a field goal was not going to be the difference in the game.

Then obviously we ended up missing three and made one, so just the plan coming in.

Q. Tennessee had a lot of pressure on you guys, on Cade. What did you see in terms of the pressure they were able to get? Was that anticipated in what they were doing to create pressure in this game?

DABO SWINNEY: Well, a couple things. He took a couple sacks on a couple hots where we don't have somebody for that guy. So those are things we'll learn from. Then there was a couple times where I know we got beat one time, just got beat outside at right tackle, got ran by him, and then there was a couple times where we've got to scramble a little bit better and help our tackles a little bit.

There's a lot of things. But hey, they got some pressure for sure. We've got to give them credit for that.

Q. Cade, how overall do you rate your performance, and what kind of motivation does it give you for this off-season?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, just super proud of these guys

right here. We gave it all we had until the very last play. There's a lot of plays that I want back, but just super proud of how everybody competed. Just thankful for these seniors. Man, there's so many guys that they all just don't get to see every single day that just have such an impact on me, from everybody, Coach Swinney, Hunter Johnson, Chip, K.J. There's so many times that I need help and they're there for me, and just so thankful for these guys. Wish we could have sent off these seniors with a win, but I think we gave it all we had until the very last play.

Q. Will, you really battled it out throughout the whole game. There was one play that really, really stood out, you had that acrobatic play in the first half. Let's talk about the athleticism and how you just always will yourself every single play no matter what.

WILL SHIPLEY: Yeah, I'll just start off by saying I do it for the guys around me. I wouldn't want to play for any other university. I love my brothers. That's truly who I do it for.

I go out there, make a couple plays, but I missed a couple, as well, that I wish I could have back. 4th-and-1 earlier in the game, missed a signal. I shouldn't have those mistakes, especially mental errors.

But at the end of the day like Cade said, we competed, and there's absolutely no doubt about that. But there's a lot of improving to do on my end and just all around, but I love these guys, and I'd truly do anything for them.

Q. Cade, a lot of people are going to talk about the missed field goals. Do you feel like not being able to score touchdowns when you were on the other side of the field, when you were making progress and moving the ball up and down the field, do you think that was an issue that kind of eventually started to wear on you guys a little bit?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I mean, the name of the game is points, and you get points by scoring touchdowns. We needed to score touchdowns, and we weren't doing that.

Part of that was on me. I took a sack on third down. There was just a lot of missed opportunities.

Tennessee did a great job on disguising and disguising their blitzes and their coverages, and there was a lot of opportunities we had, especially in the red zone. But just we needed to finish. That's what we needed to do.

We were driving on them every single drive. Like we just were. For some reason when we got inside the red zone, we just couldn't finish it.

Q. K.J., I know this one hurts, but I imagine at some point you'll look back on the season, the fact that you won the ACC Championship. Will the way this game went factor at all into your decision whether you come back?

K.J. HENRY: Not at all. That decision time will be made at a later date. Right now it's just about appreciating, like you said, what we've done this year. Coach Swinney said it in the locker room, 11 great days and three bad ones, and we'd be fools to really just focus on the bad three. As competitors, that's what we're going to do because we just want to win them all. But I'm really proud of this group of players, this coaching staff, really everybody -- we was counted out at the beginning of the year. I look back at some photos I had taken, one commentator picked us to win the ACC and probably nobody had us finishing in the top 10.

Really just happy. Happy the way these guys fought until the end, and regardless of the outcome, I wouldn't trade one play or one coach for what I was able to be a part of this year. Really was special. I got to appreciate every moment.

Q. K.J., what did you think of Tennessee's offense, what were your impressions of going up against them?

K.J. HENRY: Yeah, great group. First, shout-out to our coaching staff. I definitely feel like we were prepared for at least the tempo aspect of it. Obviously a great focus that Tennessee does a great job stressing their opponents. I felt very comfortable in that aspect.

But with that being said, obviously a physical, big up front. I thought we did a good job from a front seven standpoint of really holding the line and not too many big runs given up, and when there were, it wasn't a matter of physicality, more just us being outside of our gaps. They're good enough to capitalize on our mistakes, but also obviously Joe is a great player, and that's kind of what I said before the game. A lot of people haven't gotten to see that because he hasn't gotten to play a lot this year, but I was very aware of what he could do.

It was a good night, I think, on the defensive side. Obviously could have been much better, but they did a great job of capitalizing on some of the mistakes that we had, and we'll just have to learn from it.

Q. Cade, you ran the ball an awful lot tonight. Was that an opportunity that presented itself within your reads?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I think it just happened during the

game. I think there was just plays to be had, and I don't think that was really the game plan coming into it, but ended up running some more inside zone, some more zone read, and just kind of happened.

Q. People will say the Clemson program is slipping compared to where it was just a few years ago. What would you say to people who would look at your program after tonight and say that it has fallen from the elite?

DABO SWINNEY: Well, I mean, I can't really -- I don't really know what to say to them. We're 11-3. Sure, I wish we were undefeated, but we've won the league seven out of the last eight years. I think that's only happened one other time, and that was in the '70s by Alabama.

We've been pretty consistent, and we're going to continue to be consistent and keep trying to do everything we can to be undefeated around here.

I think we won 11-plus games -- in 1981 we won 12. I think we went 31 years before we won 11 games again at Clemson, and we did that in 2012, and I think we've done it eight times in the last 11 years, so I think we've been incredibly consistent.

Disappointing tonight for sure, but hey, we've got high -- nobody out there has higher expectations than what we have. I promise you that.

Again, we'll keep battling. We'll keep working. There's a lot of great days ahead. A lot of great days ahead. People say what they want to say. Always have, always will. We're just going to keep doing what we do. I've heard all those things before.

We're off to a good start this decade, and if you look at the totality of our program, we've done a lot of great things.

Then on top of that, we had 90 guys make a 3.0 this semester. 90. That's a school record. We had 17 guys make a 4.0 or better. For some people, it's all about the scoreboard; for our program, it's about really developing them in all areas. We've been able to do that consistently. Nobody has been more consistent than us.

We're not perfect; we work hard and try to win every game. These guys bust their butt. Y'all saw what this kid has got the ability to do. He's got some plays -- we all got plays we'd like to have back, but you got a chance to see how special he can be, and you see the heart of these guys. You've got a freshman, a sophomore and a senior sitting up here, and they are three of the greatest ambassadors that any university could ever have.



Again, you want to win every single game, and when you're a competitor, that's what you strive for. But at the end of the day, seasons come and go. Every year is a new journey. We got better this year. We didn't get where we wanted to go, but we got better, especially coming off of a very challenging season last year.

Man, I'm, again, thankful for the opportunity that we had to get here, and a lot of young guys to learn. I appreciate our fans that drove. We had a lot of fans come and support us, and really appreciate them and also appreciate the Orange Bowl people in making it a great week.

We're all disappointed. My focus is on the young men in that locker room and making sure that we learn from this and that we keep getting better, keep moving forward.

Q. Dabo, how do you encourage the players not only in a winning situation but also in a losing situation? How do you keep them all together, the whole team?

DABO SWINNEY: Well, you're honest. We all take ownership. We stay together. You win and you lose together.

When you step into a competitive arena, especially one like we compete in, you're going to win and you're going to lose. That's going to be part of it. You have to just keep -- you've got to manage the success and you've got to manage the failure, as we always say.

Obviously we failed tonight. We've got to manage that. We've got to own that. But we also have to create the right perspective, because at the end of the day we're teachers. We always have an opportunity to teach.

Like always, you watch the tape, you apply the lessons, and now that the season is over, you're going to study everything about our season, and we start back over in January. January the 13th we'll have our first team meeting, we'll reset, and the 2023 journey will be upon us.

We'll get back in the fight and go back to work. We hit three out of our five goals this year. If we hit five out of five, you win the National Championship. We'll get back to work and see if we can have a better year next year, see if we can keep getting better.

You just try to keep them together, be honest, and keep a good perspective.

Q. K.J. and Will, as two of the leaders on this team all year long, how will you sum up the season and what are the things you will remember?

WILL SHIPLEY: Yeah, I think the toughest part about it is you just remember the relationships and kind of what you got from those. I think about K.J. and what he's done for me. He took me under his wing right when I got here, and I've learned more from him than I could ever ask.

I think that's the biggest thing for me is just the relationships. I'm going to miss all the seniors, but we're coming back hungry. There's no doubt about that.

Looking overall on the year, it's not where we wanted to get, not where we wanted to be, not where we wanted to finish. But there's no doubt that we competed. I think we've got a bunch of dudes on this team who are hungry, hungry to come back next year and prove something.

We've got to keep our heads down, got to work in the off-season, get right back to it, but there's no doubt that we've got what we need in that locker room to get where we want to go.

K.J. HENRY: As for myself, when it comes to this year, like Coach Swinney said, just want to look back and know we got better, know we grew in the right direction. Been a part of a lot of great teams here, and this will go down as one of them, just inside out.

Like Ship said, all the relationships and all the great moments we've had, the love that had been shared on this team was probably the best and the most genuine out of all my time here. I'll remember all the free popcorn that I could have (laughter) when we had movie nights before the game. I love popcorn. I really appreciate Coach Swinney for allowing that for the team. It's really been a blessing for my life.

Yeah, there's just been a lot of great times, and I'll have a lot of time to look back and really enjoy and think about those times.
