- With Saturday night's 39-10 win over No. 23 North Carolina, ninth-ranked Clemson claimed its 21st ACC football championship and its seventh in the past eight seasons. It is the Tigers' eighth overall ACC title under 15th-year head coach Dabo Swinney.
- Clemson's 21 ACC titles are the most in ACC history. Florida State is next with 15.
- Clemson now owns 27 total conference titles all-time, with four SIAA titles and two Southern Conference championships preceding the formation of the ACC. Clemson's 27 championships across four conferences are the most of any current or former ACC member.
- Swinney's eight conference championships as the Tigers' head coach ties the legendary Frank Howard for the most in Clemson history. Howard also led the Tigers to eight titles, including six ACC championships.
- Clemson has now won a postseason game (conference championship, bowl game and/or national championship game) in 12 consecutive seasons. That is the longest streak on record dating back to 1980, according to Stats Perform.
- Clemson improved to 8-1 all-time in ACC Football Championship Games. The Tar Heels slipped to 0-2, with the previous loss also coming against the Tigers in 2015.
- Freshman QB Cade Klubnik, who entered the game on Clemson's third series, was voted the recipient of the John D. Swofford MVP award. Klubnik completed his first 10 pass attempts of the game and finished the first half 10-of-11 for 149 yards. He finished the game 20-for-24 for 279 yards with one TD.
- Klubnik's first-quarter touchdown pass to Davis Allen was the second scoring strike of his collegiate career and his first since a 3-yard TD pass to Will Taylor in the Tigers' 41-10 season-opening win over Georgia Tech on Sept. 5.
- Klubnik made his first college reception later in the opening period, a 19-yarder from running back Phil Mafah that set up Clemson's second touchdown of the game. He later scored his first collegiate rushing touchdown on a 1-yard keeper that put the Tigers up 21-7 with 6:02 remaining in the first half.
- The 52-yard field goal by Clemson kicker B.T. Potter to close the first half was the longest in the history of the Subway ACC Football Championship Game, breaking the previous mark of 51 yards set by Notre Dame's Jonathan Doerer in 2020. It also matched the longest field goal of Potter's career and made him the first player in ACC history to score at least 100 points in four different seasons.
- The 98-yard interception return by Clemson cornerback Nate Wiggins for a third-quarter touchdown was the longest in Subway ACC Football Championship Game history, bettering the 73-yard return by Pitt's A.J.

Woods last year versus Wake Forest. Wiggins also blocked a field goal and broke up two passes in the end zone in Saturday night's game.

- With his three quarterback sacks in Saturday night's game, Clemson linebacker Jeremiah Trotter Jr. set a Subway ACC Football Championship game record. Three players shared the previous record of two sacks.

- With three receptions for 101 yards, Clemson freshman Cole Turner became the first Tiger this season to eclipse the century mark in receiving yardage.

- UNC junior Josh Downs had 11 receptions for 100 yards and became the third receiver in UNC history with at least 200 career receptions (now 202). He trails only Ryan Switzer (244) and Quinshad Davis (205).

- Downs' 11 receptions on Saturday night were the third-most in the history of the ACC Subway Championship Game.

- With 268 yards passing on Saturday night, North Carolina quarterback Drake Maye set the ACC record for single-season passing yards by a freshman with 4,115 yards. Maye surpassed the previous record of 4,057 yards set by Florida State's Jameis Winston in 2013.

- Maye's 4,115 passing yards are the eighth-highest single-season total of any player in ACC history regardless of class, and his 4,768 yards of total offense are the fifth-most in a single season.

CLEMSON POST GAME NOTES: 2022 ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

- Clemson became the first program to win 21 ACC titles. Since helping form the conference in 1953, Clemson leads the ACC with 21 titles all-time, including 20 outright.
- Clemson earned its 27th conference championship all-time, including four SIAA championships and two Southern Conference championships prior to the formation of the ACC. Clemson's 27 conference titles across all conferences are the most of any current or former ACC member.
- Clemson moved past Colorado (26) for sole possession of the 11th-most conference titles among current FBS programs.
- Clemson has now won a postseason game (conference championship, bowl game and/or national championship game) in 12 consecutive seasons. Clemson's current 12-year streak is the longest active streak in the country and passes 1985-95 Florida State for the longest streak on record back to 1980, according to Stats Perform.
- Clemson became the first program in an active Power Five conference to win seven outright conference titles in an eight-year span since Alabama won eight SEC titles in nine seasons from 1971-79.
- Clemson improved to 8-1 all-time in ACC Championship Games.
- Clemson improved to 2-0 all-time in ACC Championship Games against North Carolina, including a 45-37 victory in the 2015 ACC Championship Game. Clemson has faced Virginia Tech and North Carolina twice each in conference title games and faced Georgia Tech, Miami, Pitt, Virginia and Notre Dame once each.
- Clemson produced its 11th 11-win season in program history, joining the 1948, 1978, 1981, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 seasons. It is Clemson's eighth season of 11-plus wins under Head Coach Dabo Swinney.
- Head Coach **Dabo Swinney** won his eighth conference championship to tie Frank Howard for the most in Clemson history. Howard won two Southern Conference titles (1940,48) and six ACC titles (1956,58,59,65,66,67) in his 30-year run with the Tigers.
- **Swinney** (eight) joined Bobby Bowden (12, including 10 outright) as the only coaches in conference history to win eight career ACC titles.
- **Swinney** improved to 19-8 all-time in postseason play, including both conference championship games and bowl games. The win improved him to 8-2 in 10 postseason contests since 2018.
- **Swinney** improved to 35-3 all-time against teams from the state of North Carolina.
- **Swinney** improved to 18-4 in games played inside North Carolina state limits.
- Clemson improved to 39-19-1 all-time against North Carolina.
- Clemson earned a fifth consecutive victory against North Carolina, starting with a 59-38 victory in 2011. It is Clemson's fifth winning streak of at least five games in series history (seven from 1986-92 and six from 1958-63).
- Clemson won its 16th consecutive December game, dating to Clemson's 2011 ACC Championship Game victory against Virginia Tech. Clemson (16-0) is one of three schools to be undefeated in December since 2011 with a minimum of five games played, a list that also includes Alabama (13-0) and Penn State (7-0).
- Clemson improved to 27-13 all-time in December games, including postseason play.
- Clemson won a 12th consecutive game against conference opponents, dating to last season, taking sole possession of Clemson's fourth-longest streak against conference opponents since the formation of the ACC in 1953.
- Clemson finished 37-9 against opponents historically from the ACC Coastal Division, including postseason play, under Head Coach Dabo Swinney in the ACC's divisional era, which concluded with this game. That figure includes games against traditional Coastal opponents in a divisionless season in 2020. The win made Clemson 22-2 in its final 24 games against Coastal Division teams since 2015.

- Clemson (100-12 since 2015) became the second program in the nation to win 100 games since the start of the 2015 season (Alabama).
- Clemson improved to 4-0 against AP Top 25 opponents (at kickoff) this season.
- Clemson (four) tied for its second-most wins against AP-ranked teams in a single season (four in 2011, 2015 and 2018) and pulled one shy of the school record (five in 2016 and 2017). (Note: Clemson's 2017 team also had a win against a South Carolina squad that was ranked No. 24 in the College Football Playoff poll but was unranked by the Associated Press.)
- Clemson has now won at least four games against AP Top 25 teams in a single season for the sixth time in school history, joining the 2011 (four), 2015 (four), 2016 (five), 2017 (five) and 2018 (five) seasons.
- Clemson improved to 8-2 all-time at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte. Clemson's 8-2 mark in the facility now includes a 7-0 record in ACC Championship Games.
- Clemson improved to 27-5 in night games since the start of the 2018 season. The Tigers are now 46-8 at night since 2015.
- Clemson improved to 48-10 in games away from home, including neutral-site contests, since 2015.
- Clemson improved to 33-16 under Dabo Swinney in games when both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25. The win made Clemson 27-6 since 2015 in games between ranked teams.
- Clemson's 2021 and 2022 recruiting classes won their first ACC title. Every Clemson signing class in Head Coach Dabo Swinney's tenure (recruiting classes of 2009-22) has earned at least one conference title in their four years at Clemson. The championship was the third ACC title for Clemson's 2019 class and the second for its 2020 class.
- **Swinney** (161) passed Oklahoma's Bob Stoops (160) for sole possession of the second-most victories in the first 15 seasons of a head coaching career in FBS history.
- Clemson improved to 31-7 in games following a loss under Swinney, including season openers following a loss in the previous season finale. Clemson has not lost back-to-back games in the same season since November 2011.
- Clemson played its 153rd consecutive game since losing back-to-back games in a single season. Clemson's 153-game streak dating to 2011 is the nation's longest active streak.
- Clemson improved to 32-6 under Swinney in games in which the Tigers enter ranked lower in the AP Poll than they did in its previous contest.
- Clemson is now 127-3 since 2011 when leading after three quarters.
- Clemson has won 106 of its last 107 games when holding teams under 23 points (dates to 2010).

GAME NOTES

- Among Clemson's victories in each of its last eight ACC Championship Game berths, Clemson has won each of its last five ACC Championship Game appearances by at least 24 points.
- Quarterback **Cade Klubnik** entered the game on Clemson's third possession and completed 20-of-24 passes for 279 yards and a passing touchdown and added seven carries for 30 yards and a rushing touchdown.
- **Klubnik** engineered a nine-play, 71-yard touchdown drive on his first series of the game. He accounted for 58 yards of total offense on the drive, including completing 5-of-5 passes for 50 yards and rushing once for eight yards.

- **Klubnik** ended his first possession with a one-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Davis Allen**, Klubnik's second career touchdown pass and his first since Clemson's season opener at Georgia Tech.
- **Klubnik** recorded a 19-yard reception on a pass from running back **Phil Mafah** in the first quarter, the longest reception by a Clemson quarterback since DeChane Cameron's 37-yard reception against Virginia in 1991. Mafah's pass was the longest by a Clemson running back since Travis Etienne's 23-yard pass to Justyn Ross against Florida State in 2019.
- **Klubnik** recorded his first career rushing touchdown on a one-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.
- **Klubnik** opened the game 10-for-10 for 149 yards prior to his first incomplection late in the second quarter.
- With his 12th touchdown reception, **Allen** tied John McMakin (12 from 1969-71), Dwayne Allen (12 from 2009-11) and Brandon Ford (12 from 2009-12) for the second-most career touchdown receptions by a tight end in Clemson history.
- **Allen** set a new single-season career high in touchdown receptions with his fifth touchdown reception of the season.
- Clemson's tight ends have now combined for 10 touchdown receptions this season, tied for the unit's most under Dabo Swinney (10 in 2011 and 2012).
- **Mafah** scored his career-high fourth rushing touchdown of the season on a four-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.
- Wide receiver **Cole Turner** recorded his second career reception on a 68-yard pass from **Klubnik**. The long gain setup **Klubnik's** one-yard touchdown run on the ensuing play.
- The 68-yard reception by **Turner** was Clemson's longest play of the season from scrimmage, surpassing 59-yard passes against Florida State and South Carolina.
- **Turner** recorded 101 yards on three receptions, becoming the first Clemson player to record 100 receiving yards in a game since Beaux Collins against Wake Forest last season.
- Wide receiver **Brannon Spector** caught a career-long 43-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Running back **Will Shipley** scored his 15th rushing touchdown of the season on a two-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. He has now produced only the seventh individual season in Clemson history with at least 15 rushing touchdowns. He is now one touchdown shy of tying Travis Zachery (16 in 1999) for sixth-most rushing touchdowns in a season in Clemson history and three shy of a three-way tie for third.
- **Shipley** rushed for a touchdown in a sixth straight game to tie Woodrow Dantzler (six straight games in 2000) and Travis Etienne (six straight games from 2018-19) for the 10th-longest streak of consecutive games with a rushing touchdown in school history. It pulled Shipley's current streak one game shy of his career-long streak of seven, set across the 2021-22 seasons.
- Three different Clemson players rushed for a touchdown. Clemson rushed for a touchdown in a 25th consecutive game. Clemson has scored at least one rushing touchdown in a national-best 67 of its 68 games since the start of the 2018 season.
- Clemson has also rushed for multiple touchdowns in four consecutive games for the first time since a 28-game streak across the 2018-20 seasons.
- Defensively, **Clemson** recorded the game's first takeaway, as defensive tackle **Ruke Orhorhoro** fell on a missed quarterback exchange for his second career fumble recovery.
- The fumble recovery was **Orhorhoro's** first since Sept. 25, 2021 at NC State.
- Linebacker **Jeremiah Trotter Jr.** recorded a career-high 3.0 sacks and nearly doubled his career-high season sack total to 6.5.
- **Trotter's** third sack set an ACC Championship Game record, surpassing the 2.0 sacks produced by Florida State's Lawrence Timmons, Florida State's Jeremiah Attaochu (2012) and Clemson's Dexter Lawrence (2016).
- **Trotter** became the first Clemson player to post at least 2.0 sacks in back-to-back games since Clelin Ferrell in 2018 against Texas A&M and Georgia Southern.

- **Trotter** also became the first Clemson player to record 3.0 sacks in a game since Ferrell against Syracuse in 2017 (3.5).
- **Trotter** has now recorded a sack in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- On Clemson's fourth sack of the game, **Trotter's** third of the evening, Clemson (40) reached 40 sacks for the ninth consecutive year. Clemson is the only program in the country to record at least 40 sacks in every year since the inception of the College Football Playoff in 2014.
- Clemson has now recorded at least four sacks in four consecutive games for the first time since last season against Florida State, Louisville, UConn and Wake Forest.
- Linebacker **Barrett Carter** and defensive tackle **Tyler Davis** split a sack in the second quarter.
- Cornerback **Nate Wiggins** recorded two pass breakups and an interception, which he returned for a touchdown.
- **Wiggins** recorded his first career interception in the third quarter and returned his pick of Drake Maye 98 yards for a touchdown.
- **Wiggins'** 98-yard interception return was the longest play in ACC Championship Game history. It was the second-longest interception in Clemson history, trailing Don Kelley's 102-yard return vs. Duke in 1970.
- **Wiggins'** return for touchdown tied for the seventh-longest play in Clemson history and the longest for the Tigers since Derrick Hamilton's 100-yard kickoff return against UNC in 2003.
- Clemson, which scored its first defensive touchdown of the season last week, scored another defensive touchdown to give the Tigers multiple defensive touchdowns in 13 straight seasons. The last time Clemson had fewer than two defensive touchdowns in a season was 2009, Dabo Swinney's first full season as head coach, when the Tigers supplemented a single defensive touchdown with six special teams touchdowns.
- Clemson scored a defensive touchdown in consecutive games for the first time since a three-game streak in 1990 against NC State (Dexter Davis fumble return), Wake Forest (Arlington Nunn interception return) and North Carolina (Davis interception return).
- Clemson recorded multiple takeaways in four consecutive games for the first time since the middle of the 2020 season.
- **Wiggins** recorded the first blocked field goal of his career in the second quarter.
- **Wiggins'** field goal block was Clemson's fifth overall blocked punt or placekick this season, Clemson's most in a season since 2016 (five). It was the Tigers' third field goal block of the season and its first since Oct. 8 at Boston College.
- Cornerback Jeadyn Lukus recorded Clemson's third takeaway of the game with his first career interception in the fourth quarter.
- **B.T. Potter** made his 53rd career start at placekicker to take sole possession of the Clemson record at the position shared currently with Chandler Catanzaro (52 from 2010-13).
- **Potter** appeared in his 68th career game to pull within one game of Clemson's program record for career games played (69, shared by James Skalski, Will Spiers and Will Swinney). Potter's 68 career games are the most of any active player at any level of NCAA football.
- **Potter** scored in a 53rd consecutive game to tie the Clemson record set by Chandler Catanzaro from 2010-13. Potter has scored in every game since earning the starting placekicking job prior to the 2019 season after serving as the team's kickoff specialist in 2018.
- **Potter** recorded a career-long-tying 52-yard field goal on the final play of the first half. It was his fourth career field goal of 52 yards, matching 52-yarders against LSU (2019) and Wake Forest (2020 and 2022).
- **Potter's** 52-yarder added to his Clemson records for career field goals of 40 yards or more (33) and 50 yards or more (nine).
- On the 52-yarder, with his fourth point of the game, **Potter** (103) became the first player in ACC history to score 100 points in four different seasons.
- **Potter's** 52-yarder was also an ACC Championship Game record for longest field goal, surpassing a 51-yarder by Notre Dame's Jonathan Doerer against Clemson in 2020.

- Holder **Drew Swinney** scored his first career points on a successful two-point conversion attempt in the third quarter. It was Clemson's third successful two-point conversion of the season, its most since 2016.
- After producing 15 giveaways over the last five games, Clemson produced its first giveaway-free game since an Oct. 15 game at Florida State.
- Clemson won the turnover margin, 3-0, to end a five-game streak of losing the turnover margin, Clemson's longest under Dabo Swinney. Clemson now has a 71-4 record when winning the turnover margin since 2011.
- Clemson finished plus-three in the turnover margin for the first time since Sept. 17 vs. Louisiana Tech.
- Clemson did not allow a sack and is undefeated since 2011 in games in which it does not allow a sack.
- Clemson made its ninth all-time ACC Championship Game appearance, adding to the Tigers' ACC record (2009, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020).
- Clemson represented the Atlantic Division in the ACC Championship Game for the eighth time and did so in the final year of the ACC's divisional format. That total does not include Clemson's appearance in 2020 in which the conference's top two regular season teams faced off in the conference title game.
- Clemson and North Carolina met with both teams ranked in the AP Top 25 for the fifth time in series history. Clemson is 5-0 in those contests, including previous wins in 1959, 1981, 1982 and 2015.
- Clemson played its seventh night game of 2022, the fourth-most in a season in Clemson history.
- Captains for the contest were tight end **Davis Allen**, defensive end **K.J. Henry**, wide receiver **Joseph Ngata** and safety **Jalyn Phillips**.

- Redshirt freshman quarterback Drake Maye completed 26 of 42 for 268 yards.
- Maye became the 10th different QB in ACC history to throw for over 4,000 yards in a season. His season total now stands at 4,115 passing yards. It's the eighth-highest single season total in league history.
- Maye had the most completions by a freshman in an ACC Championship game with 26 completions.
- Maye recorded his seventh rushing touchdown of the season on the opening drive. He has rushed for a touchdown in six games this season.
- Maye was 5-of-6 passing for 47 yards plus three rushing attempts for 18 yards on the Tar Heels opening drive. His rushing touchdown was the only the second opening drive touchdown scored on Clemson this season.

Josh Downs

- Wide receiver Josh Downs entered Saturday leading the ACC in receptions and 11 receptions to bring his season total to 94.
- Downs is the third UNC receiver to have over 200 career receptions. His career total stands at 202.
- Downs is the first ACC receiver to have over 1,000 receiving yards in consecutive seasons since Dyami Brown did it in 2019 and 2020. He has 1,029 receiving yards this season.
- Downs is the eighth Tar Heel receiver to have 1,000 receiving yards in a season and only the second Tar Heel to do it twice.
- Downs moves into fourth on the Carolina career receiving yards list with 2,483 yards.

Defense

- Junior linebacker Cedric Gray continues to lead the ACC and all Power Five conferences in tackles with 138. He added seven against Clemson.

- True freshman defensive back, Will Hardy, made his first career start and recorded a game high and career high 13 tackles.
- Another true freshman defensive back, Marcus Allen, made his first career start and recorded a career high five tackles.
- Sophomore defensive back Legond Cavazos started his second game of the year and recorded a career high five tackles.

Miscellaneous

- The Tar Heels opening drive touchdown was their ninth opening drive score of the season (seven touchdowns and two field goals).
- Clemson's Nate Wiggins FG block in the second quarter was the first Carolina FG that was blocked since 2019 against Virginia Tech

DABO SWINNEY: Well, man, that was fun. It was a fun night. Really proud of our team and these seniors and for these guys to have an opportunity to roll out of here, we've got some guys six years that are leaving with five of these, and guys with four years leaving with three and guys with five leaving with four.

So this is a great night for us. I'm really proud of this team and I'm proud of the consistency of our program.

But tonight was special. I mean, it really was. It's hard to win. No matter what happened tonight, we had a good year, but anytime you can win 11 and you win your league, you had a great year.

This was a culmination of a great year and a lot of good things that happened tonight. First of all, we didn't turn it over, and we got takeaways. We were plus 3 in the margin. Defensively we got after the quarterback, had four sacks, and then probably the biggest thing is -- because they moved the ball, but we got stops in the red zone, something we have not been doing well.

So we got -- held them to field goal, held them to downs, got the pick six in the red zone, and we blocked the kick.

There were a lot of good things that happened in the red zone for us which was a huge difference, and then obviously offensively we really played well. Cade came in and we went into this game with him coming in the third series no matter what.

DJ did not play well the first two series and didn't know what he was going to do, and then he came in and really

played well.

We rolled the rest of the way. So a lot of guys made some plays. It was good to get Cole Turner back in there tonight. We talked to him all year about, hey, listen, we're going to need you to win a championship. Didn't know it was going to quite be like that, but it was really awesome. He really don't even know what he's doing yet, but he's going to be a great player, and he really doesn't even know he's good.

Super excited about just our future and a lot of things that I saw tonight. But man, Trotter was awesome. He had three sacks. And again, the third week in a row we've scored on defense.

And then BT Potter, once again, I mean, I think he became the first ACC player ever to have four seasons with 100 plus points.

So all in all, all three phases did some good things and probably played our best game for sure since the Miami game.

Happy for our guys. We're excited to go back to the Orange Bowl. When we won this thing back in '11 we hadn't been to the Orange Bowl in 30 years, and now we're going back for the fourth time in 12 years. I'm really happy for our guys to be able to have an opportunity to experience that.

The guys get this week off. We've got a lot going on. We've got one more week of class and then we've got finals. All of us got to hit the road. We've got recruiting, we've got a lot of to do, and we'll start our prep sometime next weekend and get ready. We've got one goal left, and that's to win the closer.

Just super excited about what these guys were able to do tonight and to win our seventh one in eight years. And again, I didn't know this until tonight, but that hasn't been done since the '70s at Alabama. I know people think this is supposed to be easy to be done. It is not.

To win one, but to be consistent like we have been as a program and to get the start that we had this decade -- we

had a great decade in the teens, but we're off to a better start in the '20s.

A bright future ahead, and you saw a lot of that tonight. We got one senior offensive lineman; got a lot of young talent back; and then you saw what Cade could do tonight. Man, he's worked his butt off all year to get ready.

Thought he might take it in the Notre Dame game; it didn't work out, but he's just kept grinding and kept preparing, and then tonight, man, he took it and didn't look back.

Again, I'm proud of DJ and the leader he is and just the man of character that he is, and the reality is we would not have won the Atlantic and been here tonight without him and wouldn't have won the ACC Championship without Klubnik.

It was a great team win and great to be a part of, and, again, look forward to putting a good plan together and going down and competing in the Orange Bowl.

Q. Dabo, you said you had made a decision before the game to go with Cade on the third series. First of all, why had you made that decision to do that? And will he start in the Orange Bowl?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, yeah, we made the decision Sunday. I called Cade last Sunday and kind of told him what we were going to do. It's kind of one of those things that it could have happened earlier, and guys got to earn it.

I've got a quarterback coach that's coached some great ones, and he's coached the best of the best. Cade will be the first one to tell you, he really wasn't ready early, but he kept getting ready and he kept doing what he needed to do.

Again, I thought the Notre Dame game maybe it would happen. We struggled there. Again, DJ led us to the longest winning streak in the country, and after the Syracuse game we're like, okay, and then obviously he goes in, throws a pick, and then we put DJ back in and he really played well.

Really played well down to finish that game, and then he played two of his best games against Louisville and against Miami. Going into those games, knowing that a change was there if he didn't play well.

Then obviously this past week he gets all the blame and stuff, but he wasn't the reason we lost that game. Everybody just said, oh, he was this or this, but we had five drops. We had fumbles. We gave up 360 yards passing. He took his share of it.

But certainly he didn't do some things well, either, so we went into this game and he knew it, too, that here's where we are. And you saw the first two series. He missed some easy plays.

We already knew he was going in, and then Cade went in and played well, and it happened. That's how it goes.

But again, we don't win the Atlantic without DJ, and there's no doubt about that. Appreciate who he is. He's one of the most respected young men that's come through this program. His teammates love him. You know, things have to happen the way they're supposed to happen, and tonight that's the way it went.

Cade was ready, and you got a chance to see what he can do. He played in rhythm. Guys made plays for him, and you see he's really, really fast. He can really make plays with his legs. I think he might have been -- we didn't really rush the ball very much, but I think he might have been the leading rusher on top of that.

It was a great night, and again, a glimpse of our future and what it looks like at Clemson. I'm really happy for him, and yeah, definitely has earned his opportunity to go start.

We've got a few weeks here to get ready to play for whoever we play in the Orange Bowl, and excited to see him continue to build on it, and again, have a great finish and build some momentum going into next year.

Q. How about the game Nate had? Really coming full circle since the terrible game he had at Wake Forest, and tonight he has the two PBUs in the end zone, the blocked field goal, and ACC record 90-yard pick six.

DABO SWINNEY: Wow, I didn't know that was a record. That's awesome. He's been close. He's missed on about three of those pick sixes during the year where he's really been there, but he's a great player, and he's just really matured. He's gotten more focused. He's gotten more detailed as the year has gone on.

I'm really proud of him. He's a very, very talented young man. He's a guy that early on just a little rough around the edges, a little immature when it comes to really doing what you need to do programatically, and man, he's just come full circle. He really has.

The players love him. He's a great teammate. He really loves to play. He loves football, and I love that about him. It's important to him. But I love how he's grown from a detail standpoint. He's had a bunch of pass breakups, but tonight was awesome.

Again, we got pressure on Drake and were able to make him hold the ball longer than he wanted to a few times and make him get rid of it a little earlier than he wanted to a couple times, and that was just a great play right there and an unbelievable return.

He can really run, so that was obviously a huge play, and just really happy for him. Again, just a sophomore; got a lot of good football in front of him.

Q. How rewarding is it for this group of seniors and fifth-year seniors to end their careers with winning an ACC Championship and going to an Orange Bowl, and how exciting is it for you as a coach and a father to see your son, Drew, score on that two-point conversion?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, it was great. We knew we had that. That put us up -- instead of three touchdowns, it was three touchdowns and a two-point, so it was a good play. He had a couple nice plays. Drew is a guy we've got a lot of confidence in. He's steady. He's consistent. He knows what to do. He's tough. He catches it.

Every opportunity he's had this year he's taken advantage of it. He's one of the most respected guys on this team, too. He's a great leader and unbelievably committed.

I'm really happy for him and proud of him for the game he had and for these seniors, yeah. I mean, this is what you do it for, to have an opportunity to win a championship. It's a goal in our program, and everybody -- the class of '21 hadn't won one yet and then obviously our freshman that just got here this year, the class of '22, so every signing class we've had since February of '09 has won a championship or multiple, and that's a huge part of what we want for our guys to experience.

Again, Luke Price rolling out of here with five out of six years; KJ and those guys leaving with four out of five; TD leaving here with three out of four. That's something they'll never forget. I don't know that they really can kind of grasp that right now, but 20 years from now that's probably one of those things where, yeah, man, they make it look easy, but it's not. It's not easy.

Q. Coach, after that opening score by North Carolina, seemed like the defense just settled in and just played a heck of a ballgame for the next three and a half quarters. What does that tell you about Coach GoodWin and his preparation and how he kept the guys focused throughout the ballgame, even getting down 7-0 early on?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, we've made a lot of strides

defensively this year, and obviously we had some guys in and out. Didn't have Mickens the first half and we've had some guys beat up. Mukuba has been beat up all year. I'm proud of him. It was a huge challenge, and they stepped up.

That No. 11, I mean, he's a great player, and they get him the ball every which way you can think of.

But Maye is special, so to be able to just -- we knew we were not just going to stop him, so we had to try to turn him over. We had to try to affect him, not let him have a lot of run game, him included because he's their leading rusher, but then really win in the red zone, and we were able to do that.

I'm proud of those guys, Wes and Mick. They've grown a lot this year, and it's been fun to watch them really settle into their role.

We've got a lot of guys back on defense next year, too, so I think we've got a bright future over there.

Q. Cade, I wonder what your single favorite moment of tonight was.

DABO SWINNEY: You wanted the throw back. You were begging for that all week.

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I told him on the way I wanted the throw back with Phil and I was like, let's do it early. That was pretty fun. I wish we would have scored on it, but that was definitely pretty fun.

But I really loved to see Cole Turner kind of show out tonight. That was really awesome. Dude is just kind of a silent worker. He is more of a quiet guy but also just a great dude, but he can fly. Like he can run, and he catches the ball.

Like Coach Swinney was saying, he's still new to receiver. He's only played one year of football, this being his second year of football, right --

DABO SWINNEY: One year as a receiver.

CADE KLUBNIK: So he's just an athlete. He went and showed what he can do tonight, and I'm excited to see what he can do.

I think my favorite moment was probably scoring the first touchdown, and I actually just kind of saw my family up in the stands. I didn't know where -- I just found them, and that was a pretty cool moment for me.

Q. Coach, given how spectacular Cade was, I wonder if you regret not using him in the South Carolina game at all.

DABO SWINNEY: I've got a lot of regrets from the South Carolina game, but not really. Again, DJ is not why we lost. But hindsight is always 20/20. There's a lot of things I wish we could have done over like 4th and 1 and not fumbled the ball.

There's a lot of things I wish we had a chance to do over, but you don't get a chance to do that. It's all about what's next for us.

Q. Cade, after the first touchdown drive, the ABC broadcast said that you said to the guys on the sideline, we're just getting started. Could you expand on that and what you said to them after that?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I think I just went and talked to the offensive linemen and the receivers like, man, this is just the start. Like let's keep on rolling. We had a great first drive, and I was just -- I really just tried to encourage them, like don't be satisfied with this, don't be satisfied with one good drive. Let's go get five or six more.

That was my kind of encouragement to them was just, we're just getting started.

Q. Saw KJ put his arms on you on the TV set there after the game. How much has it meant to you to have the love and support of those upperclassmen, those veterans on the team, you know, even though this has been DJ's team up until now? It was obviously an unusual situation with DJ being the starter all season long and then you coming in.

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I'm going to miss our seniors. I really am. Just getting here in January, the impact that they've all had on me, from J-Mac to Davis and Luke. Luke Price, but definitely KJ for sure. He's in our little locker section, and he's been awesome. And JP. I'm definitely going to miss those dudes. They've meant a lot to me, and just super thankful for all of them.

Q. Cade, I wanted to know, knowing that you knew that you were going to come into this game on Sunday, I believe Coach Swinney said, what was your mindset leading up to this game? And looking back in hindsight leading up, how happy are you with the way it turned out?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, with the preparation from kind of that standpoint, Coach Swinney and Coach Streater told me all year long, prepare every week like you're going to

play, and that's been my mindset. I've learned so much this year. I'm just super thankful for me just kind of getting to sit back and watch.

I feel like I've learned so much, so much about quarterback and offense and the defenses and protections. It's been awesome. I think that this week I've really been able to just dial in on North Carolina and just -- I think we had our best week of practice all year. I really do. I think that that kind of showed out tonight, offense and defense.

But from a preparation standpoint, I think just kind of prepared like every other week, and that's just how it went.

Q. Cade, could you kind of go through that first drive, and especially those first couple of passes and how that kind of maybe grew some confidence or made you more comfortable? Could you go through that?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I mean, I've actually said this a couple times already, but I think this was Coach Streater's best game, without a doubt his best game. I absolutely loved it.

He's been doing a great job all year of play calling. I mean, I can't imagine that being your first time -- I know he did it at Richmond, but your first time at Clemson play calling. He's been in the program for a long time, but just super thankful for him, just the way that he's been able to prepare us and all the quarterbacks.

I'm super, super thankful for him, the man that he is and the guy -- the way the guys just kind of draw towards him. He talked about yesterday and today, the word for today was just love, and just loving on these guys and loving for each other, and I think that really showed out in this game.

I think there was more love throughout this game than there has been all year, and when it comes to kind of the drive itself, I think we just kind of did what we do in practice all week, and that's all up to the coaching staff, and they had a great plan this week.

It just felt like practice out there. It really did.

Q. Cade, Coach had mentioned something earlier about he thought you may have kind of took the reins a little bit earlier but you had a couple opportunities that you may not have taken full advantage of. When you came off the sideline today you looked determined. It looked like you had extra pep in your step. Did you feel like this was your time and that it was essentially a position you weren't ready to give back maybe as you might have done in the past?

CADE KLUBNIK: Yeah, I think I had a little bit of a different mindset today. I'm not exactly sure what it was, but I was pretty pumped. I just came ready to play free and just trust in God's time with everything.

I think that's been what I've learned most over the past six months really, is just trusting God's time with it and just having peace in that and having joy in that, knowing that I didn't know how the game was going to go. I really didn't. But I knew just that God was in control of the whole thing from the very start, from the first snap to now, and it's been awesome just to see what he's been doing. Just to be able to honor him through that has been awesome.

Q. You didn't rush either Deshaun Watson or Trevor Lawrence into being starters. You picked their time and you didn't know how it was going to turn out, but obviously it turned out well. Do you sense this is a turning point maybe in your program knowing what you know about Cade and his abilities and what he might do moving forward?

DABO SWINNEY: Well, I mean, one game doesn't make a career. He's got a long way to go and a lot of consistency ahead to kind of be there. But we recruited him with certainly high expectations, and he's coming in here, he's never lost a game as a starter, and he won three state championships in high school.

Now he's coming here as a freshman and got MVP of his first championship game. So he's a special talent, and we knew that. We also knew he needed to develop some, and he's really put the work in. He's worked on his body. He's not quite 200, but he's right there, and he's really grasped things from just an offensive standpoint.

But I think he's got -- he certainly has all the capability and all the tools to really be a great one. That's what we felt like him coming into this program.

Sometimes you can put a guy out there too early, but you also have to have -- it's got to be a situation where a guy earns it. It happens when it happens.

Tonight it kind of turned and he took it and ran with it. Again, he's got to keep it going. As soon as he has a bad game and we get the next guy in there, we'll probably want that backup to come on in. He's got a ways to go, but it's a great start for him for sure. A huge confidence boost.

I love our young guys that we got. Beaux had a great year, and man, obviously he's missed some games, too, with injuries, but Beaux and Antonio and Adam and Cole, I think we've got a really great nucleus of guys that we can build around there.

Obviously we've got great backs and really good tight end there and young tight ends in Brynny, in Sage, and only one good senior lineman in J-Mac.

I think collectively as a group, they saw tonight what they're capable of doing as they move forward in the future. Again, hopefully we can build on it.

Q. I'm wondering how DJ took the news when you told him that Cade would be coming in for the third series. And also, with Cade starting in the Orange Bowl, what does DJ's future look like here at Clemson?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, DJ, he's a special person. He handles everything the right way. He handles everything with class. He understood and knew -- Streeter and I talked to both of them, as well.

We hoped that he'd play well, but he didn't have a great series, especially the first series there. But we stuck with the plan, and then the rest is history. You've got to give credit to Cade for that. He kind of came in and took it, and it happened.

Moving forward, Cade will be the starter going in and DJ will be the backup. We'll keep moving forward, and I'm sure there will be plenty of conversations -- he graduates in a week or so, so he's got a bright future. He's got a bright future. Obviously it didn't end tonight the way he would like, but he's got a bright, bright future as a football player.

He's a guy that always have a special place in my heart because nobody has ever worked harder, nobody has ever been more respected in this program. These guys love DJ, and I do, too.

Q. Trotter put together three unbelievable games in a row now. Does it remind you a little bit of the way Kevin Dodd came on it at the end of I think it was 2016, or is there another player who has really taken it to another level at the end of the season like he has?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, I wouldn't say Kevin Dodd because Trotter just came in way ahead of a Kevin Dodd. Kevin, his fifth year he was special, but he didn't really have a great football foundation when he showed up; whereas Trotter, his football instincts, his football savvy, his football IQ, through the roof from the moment he got here.

Obviously last year with Skalski and Baylon Spector, you had two high veteran dudes that he had a chance to really learn from. But you're right, he's really settled in down the stretch here and has played some elite football, and his -- honestly, the biggest part is he's started to emerge as a

little bit of a vocal leader.

He was one of those guys that you just kind of saw, you didn't really hear, but he's really taken some ownership and he's come out of his shell a little bit as far as being that quarterback that we need him to be.

And then obviously Barrett Carter, that's been a nice transition for us. You saw we used Trenton is a little bit different way tonight, bringing him off the edge some, and also playing him out in space. He did a great job spying the quarterback a little bit, ran him down.

But Trotter, he's awesome. That whole group, that's the group I kind of challenged because they hadn't really won anything yet, Trotter, Barrett Carter, Nate, kind of that group of guys, so it was good to see them be able to be a champion tonight.

But he's a great one.

Q. Going back to the youth, obviously all these freshmen and sophomores that made a bunch of big plays. What does it say about them not just making those plays but doing it in an ACC Championship in an NFL stadium?

DABO SWINNEY: It means our future is bright for sure. We've got a bright future. Antonio has had a great year. I know he had a tough game last week, but he's had a really special year.

These young backs have had great sophomore seasons, Shipley and Mafah, Brynny has had a really good sophomore season, kind of paired up there with a veteran like Davis Allen. I'm excited, Marcus Tate as a sophomore had a great year for us. Obviously he got hurt and is out, but he had a great year, really took a big step forward. Putnam, moving to center and coming back next year. Walker Parks and then freshman Blake Miller starting at right tackle for us all year long.

Again, there's been a lot of those guys that have done some good things on that offensive side for sure.

Q. Had you noticed a big jump in consistency in practice from Klubnik this past month since the Notre Dame game?

DABO SWINNEY: Yeah, I think so. Street felt good about it. He's practiced well. I thought he had a great week this week. He got a little bit more work with the ones this week.

But he's taken advantage of his opportunity again tonight. He was ready, and it was good to see guys -- right out of

the gate we put a little RPO -- we kind of loaded him up with some RPO stuff that's very natural for him, and he did a great job with his decision making as far as his give, his pull, his throw.

The first one was just an RPO throw that he threw out there to Antonio and got a little rhythm going, and you saw what he could do with his legs. And a beautiful throw to Cole and then great catch, great play by him, as well.

MACK BROWN: Good for us to get here; now we've got to learn how to play. Got to learn how to win. We've got to learn how to win. Thought they tried hard but, you're one out of five in red zone touchdowns. You have two turnovers that lead to 14 points. You have a blocked field goal. You're not going to win many games.

We've got to score more points in the red zone.

Questions?

Q. What can you pinpoint that went wrong today that was a connection to the last two weeks?

MACK BROWN: Well, let me repeat the opening statement: We were one out of five in touchdowns in the red zone. If you're going to do that, you're not going to win games.

We felt like with DJ we were going to make him beat us. We were going to stop the run, so we stocked the box. They put in Cade, and Cade played great, so we had to adjust and try to come after him with really young secondary people in the second half.

So that really put us in a bind.

And we had two turnovers that let to 14 points, one at the 24 yard line, one an interception for a touchdown. You're not going to beat a good team with those circumstances.

Q. More specifically what are the problems in the red zone that's connecting there to the last three weeks?

MACK BROWN: If I could answer that tonight I'd be making more money than I am coaching. We'll have to go



back and look at it tonight and see what it is. It's been a consistent problem the last three weeks, and it wasn't the first 10, so I don't have any idea.

They've got a really good defense. I know that. And they were hard to block and they brought a lot of pressure, but not many people scored many points against them.

Q. Mack, did expectations get unfairly high on this team before the last three games?

MACK BROWN: I don't have any idea what they were. We want to win every game. As I've said, this team has been in the championship game twice ever since 2012, so that's a really, really good accomplishment.

We lost seven games last year and we won nine this year, so that's a tremendous amount of progress. We're playing one of the best teams in the country that unless they lost by one point last week they would be in the Final Four.

So it shows you where we are and we're making progress, but it also shows you what we've got to do to get better.

Q. Mack, was Clemson playing both quarterbacks and Klubnik pretty much the entire rest of the game after those first two drives? Was that something that you were looking for coming into this game or did that catch you off guard?

MACK BROWN: No, Cade had played very little all year and when he went in at Notre Dame I think he threw an interception, so we totally thought we would see DJ because they hadn't changed all year.

We stopped them the first two, three times. DJ was struggling. That is exactly what we thought would happen and we were hoping would happen, because he's played good at times.

But he didn't play well last week and he was really struggling. They weren't trying to run the ball. We thought they'd try to line up and run it down our throat like Notre Dame did, and then Cade came in and hit 20 out of 24 and 10 out of 11 the first half and really played great.



Q. Mack, it's kind of piggy-backing off that, it's been the backup quarterbacks for Georgia Tech and NC State. How difficult is it and how much changes from -- you guys prepare for one thing and you have to kind of change in the middle of a game? How does that change how you --

MACK BROWN: Well, it's very difficult, and we've got to do a better job of it. The other thing is we've got a sophomore and two freshmen starting in the secondary, and you don't want to blitz, because if you do, you leave them out there by themselves.

That's what we had to do the second half and gave up some big plays.

Q. What was your message to your team on the sidelines following the pick six?

MACK BROWN: Pick it up. Go back to work. This is really difficult. It's a hard thing when you're going in to score and cut the score to 24-17, and all of a sudden it's 31-10 when you're 3rd and goal from the 4.

But that's part of life. When things happen bad you've got to pick it up and go back, and I didn't think we did very well there. I thought we need to mature. I thought we had our head down, which most people do, and then I didn't think we played as well in that stretch and then they came back and kept trying, but we didn't have the same confidence.

Q. What lessons do you think Drake Maye can take from this game tonight?

MACK BROWN: Drake is the reason we're in the game. He's playing the best defense we've played all year by far. It's one of the best defenses in the country, and we'll all grow from playing a great team. When you play a team that's been in the playoffs every year for about six out of the last eight, I think, it shows you what you've got to do to get where we want to go, and we're not there yet.

We're better than everybody else because we got here, but we weren't better than they were. This was kind of like the Notre Dame game. They were physically better than we were and they whipped us.

Q. On the pick six seemed like a huge moment in the game. What did you see on that play and what did you talk to Drake about after the play?

MACK BROWN: I thought he was trying to throw it to Copenhaver, and it just got out of control and we got a little high, and then he tried so hard to tackle him and just, he

couldn't. John tried to tackle him and that's just a freakish play that changes games, just like just Omarion's fumble. We are right in the game, we're moving it, and we fumble it at the 24-yard line.

I mean -- and we're not built yet to walk in there and shut it down like we'd hope we will be at some point. But that's what I saw.

I knew we hadn't done well in the red zone, he was trying to make a play, and I think it just got out of his hands and slipped out of his hands and went over his head.

Q. You've addressed the fumble, the blocked field goal, the problems in the red zone. Are those the biggest takeaways, the biggest lessons to try to apply for next season for you and your staff and the players that are going to be coming back, just those big moments in games, those little moments in games? Where does the evaluation do you think begin?

MACK BROWN: Yeah, well, it begins after every game, so we've got to get better for the bowl game, and we'll play a top-15 team somewhere. They'll be really, really good.

Secondly, we reevaluate after every year, and red zone touchdowns were one of the major things last year. We wanted to limit tackles for loss, wanted to limit sacks, wanted to do a better job on 4th downs, which we've done, and we wanted to do a better job in the red zone with touchdowns, which we did until three weeks ago.

And we've been playing really good defenses. When you play great defenses you're not going to do as well. So we've got to do better against great defenses, and really Georgia Tech had a really good defense for our league; NC State was one of the best defenses in our league; Clemson is by far the best. Clemson rolls in two deep that's as good as anybody else's ones.

Q. You might have addressed it earlier, missed some of your earlier comments, but the way you were able to get the start going with the two stops on defense and then the opening drive, what did you think changed for you guys or what did Clemson adjust do you think? Did they just decide to bring more pressure?

MACK BROWN: They did, but they brought pressure the whole game. I think momentum changed when they brought Cade in, and he had an easy score, and the fumble really hurt us because it led to a quick score. That changed momentum in the game.

Then we got down there again and had the blocked field goal, which we haven't had all year, and they brought two

off the outside, and the guy made a great play. Then we get down there again and have to kick a field goal.

We just kept having negative things happen throughout the game, and I thought we lost some confidence.

Q. You mentioned the bowl game; what are you going to say to the guys to pick them up after this, which could be a demoralizing loss? What are you going to say to reset, refocus for the bowl game which is going to be against a good team?

MACK BROWN: You know, every loss is demoralizing because you want to win so bad. You want expectations. Say people get mad when you lose. Now that's good, because they didn't care when we got here. There wasn't anybody in the stands and nobody cared and we won five games and lost 18 in two years. I'm really glad people are mad. That's a positive.

Secondly, I told the guys we've got to get better. You've got to learn from it. You've got hard things that happen in life and you've got to take negatives and turn them into positives. We knew this wasn't going to be easy. If we'd have asked everybody in here nobody in here would have picked us. We had our chances to play better. We had our chance to be in the game in the fourth quarter, and that's what we needed to do.

In the third quarter, 1st and goal from the 10, we had a chance to cut it to 24-17. We got to a point where we had our chances. We just didn't cash in on them, and that's what we've got to do better.

Were there a lot of great things tonight? Yeah. Were we awful? No. Should we have gotten beat this bad? No. We allowed things to happen that let the score get out of what it should have been.
