 - o Higgins has 155 tackles this season – the fourth-most in a single season in program history, trailing only Andre Jackson (171), Abdul Hodge (158) and Chad Greenway (156).
- DB Sebastian Castro had a career-high nine tackles.
- TE Addison Ostrenga had a team-high seven catches for 50 yards. It is his third game with five or more receptions this season.
- WR Kaleb Brown had five catches for 34 yards – his third straight game with three or more receptions.

- Michigan's league-leading 45th Big Ten Title also marks the first time in program history with three consecutive outright Big Ten Championships.
- The last stretch with three consecutive Big Ten titles for the Wolverines was 1988-92, when four-of-five Big Ten titles belonged to U-M outright (1988, '89, '91, '92).
- U-M is 3-0 in Big Ten Championship Games under head coach Jim Harbaugh, and 2-0 against the Hawkeyes. In the all-time series (63 games), U-M leads Iowa 45-14-4.
- Michigan has achieved its second consecutive 13-0 season and second ever 13-win season.
- The Wolverines have been victorious in 25 straight Big Ten games dating to 2021, the longest streak in program history and the third longest in Big Ten history.
- The Big Ten Conference does not recognize the 2021, 2022, or 2023 Big Ten championship games as conference matchups, so U-M is at 22 straight Big Ten wins by the league's record book. That figure surpassed the previous record, a mark held by Gary Moeller's 1990-92 teams (19).
- Mike Sainristil was named the game's Griffin-Grange MVP.
- The Wolverines have not trailed in the second half of a game this year and have at least three offensive touchdowns in every game.
- Karsen Barnhart got his first career start at right guard, giving him starts at four positions in his career (both tackle spots, both guard spots). Trente Jones started at right tackle, marking his 10th career start.
- Running back Blake Corum eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark in the game (had 976 entering), becoming the first Wolverine with back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons since Denard Robinson in 2010 (1,702), 2011 (1,176), and 2012 (1,266). The last U-M running back to post consecutive 1,000-yard seasons was Mike Hart in 2006 (1,562) and 2007 (1,361).
- Corum added to his already-established single-season record of 22 rushing touchdowns (entering) with two more scores, setting a new Michigan benchmark with 24 rushing touchdowns this season. He remains the only FBS player to score in each game this season.
- In quarterback J.J. McCarthy's 26 career starts, U-M is 25-1 for a winning percentage of 96.2, the best mark by any starting quarterback in at least the last 20 years. That winning rate ranks above those of Trevor Lawrence (34-2; 94.4), Tua Tagovailoa (22-2, 91.7) and Trevone Boykin (22-2, 91.7).
- McCarthy (5,718 career pass yards entering) passed Todd Collins (5,858 yards) for sixth on the all-time passing list at Michigan with 147 yards today.
- Corum (55 career rushing touchdowns) is tied with Anthony Thomas (55) for the most career rushing touchdowns in program history.

- The nation's leading scorer, Corum scored twice in the game. The Hawkeyes had allowed only two rushing touchdowns this season entering the game, the fewest in the nation, with both scores coming within the red-zone.
- Iowa's defense had allowed only nine touchdowns from inside the 20-yard line this season, tied with the Wolverines for first in the FBS.
- Michigan's field goal drive on its first possession is the first time Iowa allowed a point on an opponent's opening drive this season.
- Semaj Morgan's 87-yard punt return is the longest in the history of the Big Ten Championship Game and came on his first collegiate return attempt. It is also the longest return allowed by Iowa's Tory Taylor in his decorated career and the third-longest in modern-era (1948) Michigan history (Desmond Howard, 93 yards vs. Ohio State, 1991; David Brown, 88 yards vs. Colorado, 1974).
- Sainristil forced a second quarter fumble recovered by Kris Jenkins. It was Jenkins' second takeaway of the year (interception, Bowling Green) and the first forced fumble in Sainristil's career.
- It marked the 11th straight game that U-M has forced at least one interception, fumble or turnover on downs on the first series of an opponent's drive, and the 12th time in 13 games overall.
- Sainristil added a second forced fumble in the third quarter. He is the 10th player in U-M history with two or more forced fumbles in one game.
- Braiden McGregor forced a fumble in the fourth quarter, recovered by Kenneth Grant.
- Iowa failed to pick up a first down across its last four possessions in the first half and first of the second half, failing to pick up a first down in five-of-seven first-half possessions overall.
- In total, Michigan has forced 24 turnovers (16 interceptions, eight fumble recoveries) and forced two safeties, while having lost seven turnovers themselves. The defense had a streak of at least one interception in seven straight games (Bowling Green to Purdue) and has one in 10-of-13 overall.
- In addition to the three fumbles forced on Saturday, Michigan also forced three turnovers on downs, all in the second half.
- Michigan led Iowa wire-to-wire on Saturday. U-M has trailed for only 23:33 of cumulative game time in 2023, as opposed to 1:11:39 through 13 games last season. The Wolverines have not trailed at any point in the second half all year.
- Michigan's shutout of Iowa was the second in Big Ten Championship Game history (2014, Ohio State vs. Wisconsin). It was U-M's second of the season (Michigan State). The last time Michigan recorded two or more shutouts in a season was 2015 (Weeks 4-6).
- Across the last three Big Ten Championship games, U-M has allowed just nine second-half points (to Purdue, 2022).
- U-M excels in the second half defensively. Opponents have accumulated 33 total first downs in 13 third quarters played. Eleven (11) of 13 teams failed to reach 75 yards of offense in the quarter and four teams were held under 15 yards of total offense.

- The FBS-leading 4.8 points per half that U-M is allowing across second halves so far this season is the lowest rate nationally. No team has scored more than twice in any half this season.
- Iowa's 155 total offensive yards was the fewest the Michigan defense has allowed this season.
- Tommy Doman has five straight games with a punt at or inside the opponent's 12-yard line.
- James Turner is the first kicker in Michigan history with three field goal conversions of 50-plus yards in one season (50, 50, 50). Turner's 50-yard field goal in the fourth quarter is the longest in Big Ten Championship game history.
- Today's game marked the second in a row that Turner has converted three or more field goal tries in a game. Those four conversions match his career single-game best, and is his single-game best at Michigan.

THE MODERATOR: We will open up with a statement from Coach Ferentz.

KIRK FERENTZ: Somebody pointed out to me, it was 25 years ago when I started in this position, and I feel very fortunate about that. During that time we've had a lot of really good teams, and I've had the privilege to work with a lot of outstanding players. A lot of those guys were here tonight actually, so appreciate that.

But this group that we've worked with this year is about as good as we've had. Certainly amongst the most outstanding group that we've had. A lot of tremendous players, like Jay and a bunch of other guys in that locker room. Gotten great leadership, made great improvements, stuck together.

Tonight certainly wasn't our night. We knew we came in here needing to play pretty much a flawless game. Obviously didn't do that. Didn't do a great job protecting the football, and a couple of other situations.

But disappointing tonight. To me that doesn't overshadow the job that this group has done for the last 10, 11 months now.

Proud to be part of it. Proud to be their coach, and proud of the effort tonight. We'll go back to Iowa City, take a couple of days off and regroup and start figuring out a way to win our next football game.

I'll throw it out for questions.

THE MODERATOR: Questions for Coach or for Jay.

Q. This is for Jay and for Coach Ferentz. The defensive effort tonight, holding Michigan down to 213 yards to play, especially after the first series, I think only about 150. How in tune were you guys when it came to -- with Michigan's offense and being able to stop them repeatedly throughout the game?

JAY HIGGINS: I would definitely say just we understood how big this game was, and obviously Coach Parker, Coach Wallace prepared us. We had a lot of tape on these guys obviously being in Week 13. I just feel like my teammates went out there and they competed. That's all I can ask for. I mean, guys who were making plays when we needed them. You have to show up in big moments. I'm really proud of my defense.

KIRK FERENTZ: Guys have been playing great defense all season long, and tonight was no exception.

Tremendous amount of respect for our opponent's offensive football team, their entire football team. I said that during the week. That was sincere.

Both teams played got defensively tonight. I don't think it's a huge surprise, and credit to our guys. They gave us a chance and kept us in the game really until that turnover in the third quarter.

Q. You mentioned the turnovers, but even without those, obviously, not great numbers there for that offense. What do you attribute that to, and was there something that Michigan --

KIRK FERENTZ: I didn't hear the last part.

Q. You mentioned the turnovers, but what would you attribute -- the numbers overall offensively were not great, even without the turnovers. What do you attribute that to?

KIRK FERENTZ: So probably the two biggest plays, in my opinion, were the punt return and the turnover in the third quarter. Then we turned one over too, which cost us a field goal probably.

I would attribute Michigan's defensive performance or our offensive performance to their defense. They have a really good defense, and it's statistically proven. I think they give up ten points a game.

That's not our strength right now. We didn't match up well. That's the way it goes. We'll go back to the drawing board.

Q. You mentioned the third quarter sack. It was certainly disputed, the pass by Deacon Hill was ruled a fumble. Can you just speak to what they told you, what you saw, and why it got so heated on your side in terms of disputing that call?

KIRK FERENTZ: I've made it the last two months without getting fined. I'll try again.

I'm really struggling with our replay system. Really struggling with it, as I was after the Minnesota game. However many weeks after that is I'm still struggling on that one. Can't accept it.

Tonight what I was told, the arm was going forward, but the hand wasn't, which I'm not sure if that's possible mechanically. I was an English major, but again, I just think we're really taking a game that's relatively simple -- I'm old enough, okay, I was in the league when they started the replay. The whole concept, as I recall, was taking, obviously -- I don't want to say a blown call, but a wrong call. An official got screened, somehow an obvious mistake took place, and you correct it.

We've taken it to a whole different level, and we've been on the short end of two of them. Coaches get fired. Coaches get fired. If you want to talk about the extreme of it, coaches get fired. So I just think we have a system that needs to be readdressed, rediscussed. There's got to be a better way to do it. I feel bad for the officials on the field because they're the ones that have to explain to us a decision that gets made gets made somewhere else.

It doesn't make sense. It doesn't make sense to me. So to me the official on the -- who reviews it on the field should have full ability to make the decision or a centralized location because I just can't understand that it wouldn't be better to have one consistent voice.

You know, that's what it is, but that's an out-of-season discussion. But that was a big play in the game, obviously, once that happened.

Then the other component to that, on the field the whistle blew, and we got penalized a year ago for a guy trying to recover a fumble after a whistle blew. It's really tough to

coach your guys when a whistle blows, their guy recovered it. Our guys didn't. I'm not saying that cost us the game. I'm not sitting up here saying that, but it's a pivotal play. So it's just a little bit challenging.

Q. Coach, you mentioned that Michigan has a terrific defense. What elements of the defense tonight caused you the most problems?

KIRK FERENTZ: If you wanted to compare it to last year, this year's, those interior guys, they've got a big physical group of interior guys, and they're good at every position.

That's been Michigan for a long time. I started in '81. That was my first game being involved against them in person. So they've always had good players. They're very well-coached. They've got a lot of girth inside. It was tough to get anything going in the running game, and they rotate guys through. They have fewer, five, six guys that are pretty good in there.

Not that the other guys aren't, don't get me wrong. They're very veteran, very veteran on defense.

Q. How do you feel like this team stacks up with the elite teams of the Big Ten? You saw one tonight that's going if anything to be in the playoff, potentially win the national championship. How close is maybe potentially how far do you think the Iowa football program is to winning games like this?

KIRK FERENTZ: You know, on paper we've been close twice. I think I'm correct in saying that. In '02 there was no playoff, at least Ohio State went. We didn't. I guess it was two teams back then.

I think we would have competed well with them on the field. '15, if we had won that game, which we didn't, then we would have been there. Michigan State wouldn't have been.

I don't think people realize how tough it is to be one of those four teams. TCU was there last year. Didn't go so well this year.

To get there, sustain it, I mean, the facts are there's probably six, eight schools that are in that discussion on a routine basis. That's kind of the nature of college football.

One of my fears about the rules as they are now is that we may go back to more separation, whereas I would suggest in 2002 there maybe wasn't quite as much. Things are shifting a little bit right now, and that's a discussion for a different day too. That was my concern when the NIL began really in earnest a year ago.



Q. Jay, the two scoring drives you gave up are five yards and six yards. How do you walk away from this game feeling, I guess, as a team, as a defense, and what your coach said about you? Proud of the effort you guys gave?

JAY HIGGINS: Yeah, definitely proud of our defense. You know, just it's up to us to put the fire out. We practiced that sudden change. We trained for that all year. So we were definitely expecting to hold those guys to a field goal, and that's really what we were trying to do.

But we fell short on that end, but the Michigan offense, they did really good. I think they're a really good team all around. Obviously the offensive line, really good up front. Then when you have a running back, quarterback that can pull the ball at any moment, pop pass or good tight end, so we just had a lot to guard. I think Michigan did a really good job with their game plan.

Q. Apologies. I don't mean to look too far forward here, but mentioned the games being a little bit out of hand, and you mentioned the weakness of the offense. What needs to happen --

KIRK FERENTZ: Which game is out of hand? Tonight's game?

Q. And in 2021 here. You mentioned the offense, you want it to be stronger. I guess what needs to happen going forward in order for the offense to be where it's at and where you guys can be competitive in games like this?

KIRK FERENTZ: I still think we would have been better off this year if we had the quarterback we thought was going to be our starter playing. He's played in this game before as a winning quarterback.

Our two tight ends are our best offensive players. I think Jay would cosign that. That's a start right there.

We've been dealing with the reality of our situation. Couldn't be prouder of our gee. They've improved, they've scrapped, they've fought. We found a way to win the last four games, and I don't think many people saw that coming.

I look at it from the other lens. I just look at this team, what they've gone through and what they've done, how they persevered when most teams would have buckled, quite frankly, and we've had a lot of other stuff going on too.

You know, I get to work with these guys every day. I see

them internally. I see them at their best, at their worst. That's why I respect them so much because I've seen them at the low point.

Tonight is a low point. These guys laid it out there. This guy, plus a bunch of other guys, laid it out there. Everybody laid it out there. Didn't go our way, but they'll get back on their feet because that's the kind of people they are.

That's not a given. I've done this long enough. I've been around both ways too. We were 4-2 in 2012. Lost six straight. Hey, win them in November, all that stuff. Pep talk. That stuff doesn't always work. It happens because of people, and the people I get to work with every day are first class, top shelf. That's why I said what I said.

Worry about next year next year. We're worried about the next game. We have four weeks to get ready for it, give or take, whatever. We'll find that out tomorrow. That's our focus. I'm not thinking that globally right now.

IOWA QUARTERBACK DEACON HILL

On what happened:

"We lost. We made some mistakes and (Michigan) made less. The game didn't turn out the way we wanted it to."

On playing against the Michigan defense :

"They were a good defense. We had our game plan, we knew what kind of coverages that we were going to get going into the game. They were a good team."

Reflecting on the past month:

"It's been a wild ride. I was not expecting this when I first got (to Iowa), but it is what it is. We go to this point as a team, not just because of me. Our team is the reason we are here. Those guys are hell of a ball players."

On the relationships he built with the players

"I think the reason I got so emotional is just because each guy on the team I feel pretty close with, I love all of them to death. Guys like Cade (McNamara) and Erick (All) who wish 100 percent they were playing this game, I wish we had gotten the win for them. I mean all the seniors like Joe (Evans), Nick (DeJong), Jay (Higgins), all those guys, I'm pretty close with all of them wishing we could have got that for them."

IOWA DEFENSIVE BACK SEBASTIAN CASTRO

On the season overall:

"This was a fun season. We had a dog fight every game, but we all liked it that way. It was fun. It was just football, just grinding it out every week."

On executing in an environment like Lucas Oil Stadium:

"There's bright lights and a lot of distractions, but we had a good group of guys that were not distracted from all of the lights. We have coaches reminding us that it's just another game of football. "

On his growth after a difficult season:

JIM HARBAUGH: Just an incredible feeling. Great thrill of victory, great thrill of winning. Wonderful, wonderful feeling of winning. It's what our team had planned for, hoped for, worked for most importantly, and they stayed with it the entire time.

It was an incredible performance, and we're just going to enjoy this one. We're going to enjoy this one for a few days. The team will have a week off, but our mind will get on a one-track mind to move on to the playoffs and find out who we're going to play. Then the team still has more goals to accomplish.

THE MODERATOR: Questions, please.

Q. Coach, your defense, a few turnovers today. Can you talk about the overall effort, including that guy to the left of you right now?

JIM HARBAUGH: Just a playmaker. When a play has to be made, when the magic needs to happen, Mikey makes it happen. It's been game after game. Especially down the stretch here these final four games, he has been a stalwart. He intercepts. He makes the big hit. He makes the big hit in the fumble, causes a fumble. Just an incredible player.

He does it by always being in the right place where he's supposed to be, playing the right technique at all times, leading other guys to do the exact same thing. But he also



does it as a superior athlete. That combination comes together, superior athlete and a guy that does everything right. It's fun to watch.

Glorious defensive performance. Just tremendous, lights-out. Three and outs, I think we're maybe four on the game. Then one first down and out. Incredible shut-out. How many turnovers were there? Three or four -- three plus the four fourth down stops. That's, like, seven turnovers. And giving the ball to the offense in great position.

So just spectacular.

Blake, congratulations on tying the Michigan all-time scoring record for touchdowns, and congratulations to Mikey.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: Congratulations to you, Coach.

KIRK FERENTZ: I never left.

BLAKE CORUM: Great having your presence on the sideline.

Q. If you could all talk about what the significance -- I guess it's the first time three outright championships in the Big Ten. Talk about that significance if you could.

THE MODERATOR: Blake, we'll start with you.

BLAKE CORUM: It feels great. I didn't know we were the first three and out. But to have three back-to-back-to-back Big Ten championships, it's a wonderful feeling. We've kind of changed the narrative how people look at Michigan.

So back-to-back-to-back feels great, but like I always say, like Kobe Bryant said, the job is not finished. We set these goals at the beginning of the season, and we hold ourselves to such a high standard, we must accomplish those goals.

Today was a great stepping stone, but like Coach said, we're going to enjoy this one. We're going to enjoy this

one, and then we'll get back to the drawing page. But it means a lot to go back-to-back-to-back.

THE MODERATOR: Mikey.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: It just feels great. Guys like me and Blake, this is what we came back for, to have the success with this team, like the brotherhood that this team has is one that I wouldn't give it up for anything in the world, and this team is going down in history.

The way we go about our goals is you put everything into the next goal, and there's work -- there's more work to put in and more ways to get better.

Coach is probably going to say it. I'm going to say it first before he says it. The worm has turned around here.

KIRK FERENTZ: I was just about to say that.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: Blake just said it as well. The narrative has changed. For some odd reason, people look at Michigan and they'll say we don't play whoever, you know, we don't deserve to be wherever we are, but as we say, the only people -- the only things that matter is what happens inside Schembechler Hall.

JIM HARBAUGH: You took the words out of my mouth. You look at this whole group, and J.J., Blake, Mikey, so many others. The worm has turned. These are the guys. I mean, these Michigan football players, when you look back at the history of Michigan football, wrote the book on getting the worm to turn.

The worm is pretty slippery. That thing can start wiggling back and forth and turning back on you. The hook got put in it. The hook got put in the worm. They've written the book on how to do it.

It wasn't that long ago we were saying, I mean, we're going to do this or we're going to die trying. They just give everything they got. That's all we ask them is to give it their very best, but they give everything they have on a daily basis.

Am I going to pull guys back? I never have to talk them in. The amount of guys that were playing through something tonight, playing with something, could have easily taken a knee, didn't.

I heard Mike B. say it the other day, something that really resonated with me, I'm just ready to go out there and die, you know.

We never ask them to do that. Just go out and give it your

very best and give us everything you've got.

Every guy on this team does it that way, and not just on game days. It's every day.

How does it feel for you, J.J.?

J.J. McCARTHY: It feels great. Obviously to be back and do it again, just like Blake, Mikey, and Coach hit on, this was one of our goals, and it feels great to accomplish it.

What I'm feeling personally is I need to get better, and we need to get better as an offense and focus on the little things. It's going to be a great month of preparation.

Q. Can you sum up your thoughts, feelings on being on stage watching the Commissioner hand you guys the Big Ten championship trophy?

JIM HARBAUGH: Wonderful, wonderful, wonderful. Wonderful feeling of winning. Great thrill of victory. Yeah, I mean, how many more people can we get up here on the stage. They said three, four, five. Keep bringing them up. It's where we wanted to be. It's what we hoped for, what we worked so hard for, and then it happened.

It's the like kind of pinch yourself, but yeah, the way our defense was playing, the gutty performance, another gritty one by our offense, and then the special teams. James Turner kicking the four field goals, Semaj Morgan with the big punt return. Just so good.

You never know who exactly is going to be the guy, who is going to make the play. I mean, these three, they do it every week. But there's always somebody else that gets in there as well.

Kenneth Grant had a dominating game. So did Mason Graham and Kris Jenkins, Cam Goode, those interior guys. The edge guys were incredible.

But these three every week, it's every week these are the three guys. Then it's always a multitude of other guys that step up and make the magic happen.

Q. Coach, how special is this for you, especially in the town? Your name is up there on the stadium, but also you earned the title "Captain Comeback" here. How special is this for you and the guys tonight?

JIM HARBAUGH: It's the most special. I've gotten to the point in my life where -- I don't know when this happened. It was a while ago. Probably a couple of decades ago where it's not about me. I had plenty of success, but that your players know what it's like to be a champion, that their

families can know what it's like to be a champion. For my wife, my kids to have their dad be a champion. For my parents to have their son be a champion.

That's the great thrill. Friends and most especially my kids. They know what it's like that their dad is a champion, and mostly the players, that they get to feel what it's like to be a champion. That's a beautiful, wonderful thing.

Q. First question for Blake. Have you heard from many former Michigan players at all after tying the record? For Jim, at what point did you realize that Blake tying and potentially breaking this career rushing record was a possibility?

BLAKE CORUM: I haven't heard from any former running backs. Coach Hart obviously. That's my guy.

In terms of Anthony Thomas or anyone, no, I haven't. I haven't even checked my phone. I definitely might, but it feels great just being up there with the greats. You know, the greats, that's something I wanted to do when I came here.

Obviously I wanted to be a great football player, but I just wanted to honestly just leave an impact on and off the field, just be a great person. I feel like I've done that.

There's obviously more to do, but I haven't heard from anyone.

JIM HARBAUGH: I just think just how proud James Corum has to be. He's such a great man, such a good friend. Everything that he poured into Blake, the discipline, the work ethic, the toughness. Blessed from Mom, Dad, and God with the DNA.

Yeah, that's kind of where my mind goes. What it would be like to be Blake's dad, and J.J.'s dad. You know, Jim McCarthy, he's got to be -- gosh, you guys have made your parents so incredibly proud.

Q. Did you think Blake had a chance at the record?

JIM HARBAUGH: Yeah, there's nothing I don't think Blake can't do. No matter what people tell you you can't do, you just go back and think of all the things that you have done to get you this far.

That's the way these guys were raised by their parents, and I get to watch it daily, weekly, monthly, yearly with these guys. Pretty much everything I said about them is -- now everybody knows, and that's such a sweet thing. Just really sweet and good.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: For the record, I hosted Blake as a recruit.

BLAKE CORUM: He did. He did.

JIM HARBAUGH: Who was your host? Me; right?

MIKE SAINRISTIL: It was you. We went to the movies. We went to the movies.

Q. What did you see?

MIKE SAINRISTIL: I don't remember.

JIM HARBAUGH: We were at the bouncy place. I don't know if it's still there anymore.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: It was "Don't Breathe," with the blind guy, the Army guy.

JIM HARBAUGH: That's right.

Q. For Jim and if a player wants to answer too, you've been up here three times, and you always talk about the next step and what's next. Does it feel any different now this third time and what comes next? Do you feel you're better prepared or whatever?

JIM HARBAUGH: I don't have a great answer for that.

You guys got a good answer for that?

J.J. McCARTHY: In my eyes I look at it as act like you've been there before. Coach Harbaugh always hits on that, just like scoring your first touchdown like you've scored your hundredth.

And I feel like we scored our hundredth today, just being able to go out there and win for a third time. It's just like we've been here before, and we're ready to move on and get better.

JIM HARBAUGH: I would just add, to me it feels ten out of ten happy, like it did last year and like it did in '21. I can't remember. Oh, yeah, after the '21 game, I lost my wallet, and on my way to see Colston Loveland, to make a home visit to see him.

I was kind of bummed I lost my wallet, but then I woke up, and we're Big Ten Champions. I don't care about my wallet. You know? That's how I woke up last year. That's when it really sinks in to me, so it will probably really sink in tomorrow when I wake up.

If I lose my wallet, my phone, whatever it is, we're Big Ten

 . . . when all is said, we're done.®

Champions. It's an amazing feeling. Ten out of ten. Ten out of ten happy.

Q. For Jim and the players. I saw Zak Zinter getting wheeled out of the tunnel and going to see him go out on crutches for the coin toss. I would love to get reaction from all four of you of his presence there today, how much that meant to you?

THE MODERATOR: Mikey.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: Zak is a big piece of this team. And he's not a "woe is me" guy, even though he is hurt right now, but he is still going to lead. It felt great to have him out there. It felt great to see him.

I know you know me as a captain, the other guys will probably say it as well, that's somebody that guys on this team turn to. His words mean a lot, and his actions speak for themselves.

J.J. McCARTHY: Just like Mikey said, just his presence in general of being a leader on our team. He does so much for us because he enlivens all of us to play our best for him. When Coach made this game for him, we were doing it for him, it just brought another level of urgency and motivation to go out there and do it for him.

BLAKE CORUM: Seeing my guy Zak out there meant a lot. Because he didn't have to. He just you got out of surgery last week. I bet you he was still in pain, but he did it for the team.

Therefore, we did it for him. Just seeing him go out there on the coin toss on crutches, on the sideline, just his presence, just everything he brings to the team, he doesn't have to say much. Just him being there means a lot.

And I definitely miss my guy on the field. Like I told him, it's just a minor setback, man. You're going to come back better than ever, and I truly believe that.

Zak is one of the guys that came back, just like Mikey, just like myself, for what we call unfinished business. He is still here. He is still here. He is with the team, and he still brings a lot to the team even though he might not be able to be on the field pulling and blocking and protecting J.J. and myself.

His presence, it means a lot to us. He is still there. He is still on the ride. Blessed to have Zak.

JIM HARBAUGH: I would just add, it's definitely just how he was after he got hurt and the whole team lined up. I've seen it. I've seen it go one of two ways. You rally around

your teammate, or the other thing is just incredible sadness and worry.

I've seen a teammate get seriously hurt in high school and in college and in pro ball. It's sad. And he was in great pain too. I know what it's like to have a bone broken because they rub together, until they can get it really stabilized and isolated and get some kind of pain medication in you. Those bones are rubbing together. That's a pain you have never felt before.

Just how tough and stoic he was and signalling to his team. What he said at the hospital was he was going to make it here. Hey, if it's possible, we would love to bring that to life. He was here just like he said.

Yesterday was a super long day for him with the flight and moving around and everything. Yeah, the team wanted to dedicate the game to him.

What do we have to do when we dedicate a game to somebody?

PLAYERS COLLECTIVELY: Got to win it.

JIM HARBAUGH: And they did. They wanted him to accept the trophy at the podium. Just to see all those things come to life is beautiful.

Q. Earlier Coach Harbaugh said it wasn't that long ago where he said we're going to try real hard or we're going to die trying to be up on this stage. Three years in a row now, I mean, can you put into words what the journey has been like over the last three years, with the fight and coming together and all the joy?

J.J. McCARTHY: It's been beautiful. Just tremendous blessing to be able to be a part of it. Through all the ups and downs, through all the peaks and valleys, there's nobody I would rather go to war with every single day than these guys right here and be led by anybody else but Coach Harbaugh. It's just been so much fun.

So many valuable learning lessons just about life, just about being a better man came from all the three years.

So I'm just extremely honored to be a part of it, and I can't wait to see where it goes.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: This team is constantly maturing, getting better as men every single day. It's been a process, but it's been a very great process, a learning process, learning experience. I don't think that you could paint a better picture, but the picture also isn't done being painted.



I can't wait to continue this journey with these guys. Coach says he can't have it any better -- he has it better than nobody when it comes to players, and as a player, I don't think I could have it any better than a coach like Coach Harbaugh who loves us as his sons.

When you have a coach who loves you in that way, you're able to as a player then love your coach as well as love your players. We're direct reflections of how Coach Harbaugh treats us.

Q. This is for Blake. Just with you personally, your journey to get here last year, your absence, and then being the touchdown king tonight, kind of talk about that journey and trying to face the adversity and get through that to be back here tonight.

BLAKE CORUM: It was a beautiful journey, a journey that taught me a lot of things about myself. I remember on December 2nd last year I was going into surgery. It was probably around this time, California time.

Just how the whole 365 can change, you know what I'm saying? It was a beautiful journey. I went through some trials and tribulations. I found myself again and became a better man on and off the field, but to be back out here with my guys, you know, it felt great. It felt great.

It's been a heck of a journey, but the journey is not over. I'm super excited to see what this next month has to offer, this next game has to offer because I know it's going to be glorious. I know it's going to be great.

To summarize everything from what I've been through, last year to now, has been beautiful. I wouldn't trade nothing in the world for it.

JIM HARBAUGH: I would just add J.J. McCarthy, I I've said it before, I would follow him to hell and back. Again, tonight --

J.J. McCARTHY: Likewise.

JIM HARBAUGH: He made throws -- the one throw he made and it got called back for a holding call and some other great throws.

Uncharacteristically we had some drops and uncharacteristically we had some protection issues and things that we'll work on, and definitely Zak was mixed. I mean, he never hung his head. Never got on anybody. He has just got this demeanor, and the more you hit him, the more he is just motivated to come back, which is amazing.

Plus, he is 20 years old. I think he is the best quarterback in the country. Some will argue, but he's got to be the youngest of the best. I see some other guys that are reclassified and been around for forever, but he's just a kid. He's a 20-year-old kid doing the things that he's done, and the record he has speaks for itself.

But the things you don't see behind the scenes... you see the talent, but just the toughness and the dedication that he has for the team is unmatched.

And Mikey, you know, we've been talking about -- I think I mentioned it. My brother, we watched the Maryland game together, and he was blown away by Mikey and how he played and gave me a Lion spike to give to Mikey, which I did. Gift from my brother.

Then after the Ohio State game, he told me how much he's shooting up the draft boards. But what they all don't know is what Mikey will bring to your team from a leadership standpoint. His smile is infectious. It's the accountability that he holds himself to and holds others to. It's just so, so elite.

And Blake, you know Blake. I think you know how good of a player he is, but he's that good of a person as well on and off the field. As rock solid of a guy.

I remember being around guys myself. You make mistakes when you're that age. He's never made a mistake. He's never said a negative word. He's the most positive, hardest working, best guy that anybody could coach.

So this is just a thumbnail sketch. When I say it's like a walk in the park coaching these guys and who could possibly have it better than I do, the answer to that is nobody because of the kind of people they are.

BLAKE CORUM: I'll tell you this. I wouldn't want to play for anybody else, Coach.

JIM HARBAUGH: Love you guys.

J.J. McCARTHY: Nobody. Love you too.

MIKE SAINRISTIL: Love you too, Coach.

Q. Jim, just a few minutes ago alluded to maybe some things on offense that you might want to work on or look for. How do you feel and rate your performance this game, and do you feel that you left any meat on the bone as an offense?

BLAKE CORUM: First of all, Iowa has a good defense.

JIM HARBAUGH: Fourth in defense and seventh in scoring or seventh --

BLAKE CORUM: They're up there.

JIM HARBAUGH: Yeah. Or vice versa; right? Fourth in defense, seventh in scoring or fourth in scoring and seventh in defense? That's a dang good defense.

BLAKE CORUM: Great defense. Now, we made some mistakes. I wish I would have ran a little better. We had dropped passes, pass pro. There's just things we can clean up, but we have a month now.

We have a month to get guys healthy. We have a month to watch a lot of film. We have a month to practice a lot. So we have time. We can't waste our time, but we have time.

Today's performance, it wasn't our best, but there's nothing better than winning. It got the job done. Like I said, shout-out to the defense, special teams. Like I said, Iowa's defense was good, but we have things to clean up.

J.J. McCARTHY: Yeah, Blake just said it all. He couldn't have said it any better. Me personally, I just need to do better at staying in the pocket, not moving too early, and trusting my receivers down field all the time.

Just back to the drawing board. Like Blake said, that was a great defense, and can't wait to learn from a great defense. We'll get better from it and continue to tighten things down to make us the most dominant offense we can be.

JIM HARBAUGH: J.J., you didn't make a mistake out there tonight. There wasn't one play where you made a mistake.

J.J. McCARTHY: That husky throw I want back.

JIM HARBAUGH: Maybe the one you could have run on where you threw to Roman on the incomplection.

J.J. McCARTHY: Yeah.

JIM HARBAUGH: But that was it. It was a near perfect performance.

J.J. McCARTHY: Appreciate that, Coach.

JIM HARBAUGH: Blake, that goal line run from the 6 yard line, that was a great run.

BLAKE CORUM: Appreciate it, Coach.

JIM HARBAUGH: That was the best 6-yard run I've ever seen.
