Making History:

- In the first-ever meeting between Ole Miss and Penn State, the Rebels came away with a 38-25 victory, securing their first 11-win season in the program's 129-year history.
- Today's victory also represents the first New Year's Six bowl win for the Rebels under head coach Lane Kiffin.
- Ole Miss improves to 2-1 all-time in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. This represents the Rebels' first win in the game since 1971 (a 41-18 victory over Georgia Tech) and also their first-ever Peach Bowl victory inside Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- With his 136 receiving yards, two touchdowns and one two-point conversion, senior tight end Caden Prieskorn was named Offensive MVP - the first time a tight end has claimed the award in Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl history.
- With Penn State's loss to Ole Miss, this marks consecutive seasons that the program trying to be the first in college football history to win all six New Year's Six Bowls has lost the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, following Ohio State's loss to Georgia in last season's Semifinal contest.
- Penn State QB Drew Allar's 75-yard completion to TE Tyler Warren in the first quarter was Penn State's second-longest pass play in a bowl game. The 75-yard play is also the seventh-longest offensive play in Penn State bowl history.

SECond to None:

- The SEC improves its record in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl to 23-16-1 after winning its fifth straight appearance and its fifth in a row over the Big Ten, while the Big Ten falls to 3-8 all-time in the game.
- The SEC's 23 wins in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl lead all other conferences and the SEC now leads the Big Ten 5-1 in Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl matchups.
- Penn State falls to 10-10 vs. the SEC in bowl games (12-10 vs. current SEC teams), while Ole Miss improves to 2-1 vs. Big Ten teams in the postseason (3-1 vs. current Big Ten teams).
- The Nittany Lions now hold a 3-3 mark vs. the SEC in New Year's Six bowls, while Ole Miss won its sole New Year's Six matchup vs. a Big Ten team in this year's game.

Red-Hot Rebels:

- Ole Miss has now won 12 of its last 16 bowl appearances, moving to 25-15 overall historically in bowl games.
- The Rebels' .625 winning percentage in bowl games now ranks sixth best among teams who have played in at least 25 bowl games.

Ole Miss Outliers:

- Penn State was outscored 11-0 in the third quarter after entering the game with a 115-3 advantage in third-quarter points during the regular season.
- Ole Miss totaled 540 yards against a Penn State defense that led the nation with an average of 223.2 yards of total defense per game.
- The Rebels tallied 38 points and 394 yards through the air in contrast to Penn State's 153.6 average passing yards allowed and 11.4 points allowed per game.

- Today's win marks the second New Year's Six victory in Ole Miss history alongside a 48-20 win in the 2016 Sugar Bowl over Oklahoma State.
- Ole Miss is now 66-17 (.795) / 65-18 (.783) versus non-conference opponents dating back to a 38-0 win over Tulane on Nov. 12, 1994.
- Under head coach **Lane Kiffin**, Ole Miss is now 15-2 / 14-3 against non-conference opponents.

- The Ole Miss offense picked apart the nation's top defense, recording the most points (38), passing yards (394) and total yards (540) Penn State has allowed this season.

Dart is tied for 4th on the Ole Miss single-season list in 300-yard passing games with five (Shea Patterson, 2017) ... Dart is one of just five Ole Miss QBs to throw for 20+ touchdowns in multiple seasons (Matt Corral, Eli Manning, Jevan Snead, Bo Wallace).
- Dart finished the season with 3,364 passing yards and 22 passing touchdowns on 233-of-358 attempts with only five interceptions ... Dart ties the school record in fewest interceptions in a season, becoming the third Rebel QB ever to throw just five interceptions with at least 200 pass attempts (Matt Corral, 2021; John Fourcade, 1981).
- Dart caught his first career reception on a fourth down draw up for a gain of 15 yards. WR **Jordan Watkins** also earned his second career pass and completion on the play.
- TE **Caden Prieskorn** had a career day, hauling in a career-high of 136 yards with 10 receptions on 11 targets with two receiving touchdowns ... This is Prieskorn's second career multi-touchdown game, first as a Rebel ... Prieskorn's performance earned him offensive MVP of the 2023 Peach Bowl.
- His 37-yard touchdown reception marks his longest reception in an Ole Miss uniform.
- WR **Tre Harris** finished with 134 yards on seven receptions ... Harris now has 2,502 receiving yards in his overall career.
- Prieskorn and Harris become the third and fourth players to top 100 receiving yards against Penn State this season, joining Ohio State's Marvin Harrison Jr. and Indiana's Dequee Carter.

said there's more to come. What is that? What is in store for Ole Miss in the coming years?

LANE KIFFIN: I think it's really a cool time right now at Ole Miss. To win the most games in the history of the school and to have so many pieces already announcing that they're coming back, which I made sure a couple of them are still doing that after their performances today.

But I think it's a really special time. I said that when I got hired, we didn't come here to be good and win some decent bowl games and some matches. We came here to be great, win New Year's Six bowls like this, be a top ten program.

So to not just have so many players coming back, but I think it's been well publicized so many players around the country already joining in for next year. I just thought it was obviously extremely important to cap this thing off right because I felt like the last couple weeks so much focus was on next year.

These guys announcing they're coming back, all these great players around the country kind of coming together. Some of these guys joked about it being the last dance. Next year, and I was concerned there was too much focus on that.

Obviously they did a great job showing up today. Like I said, a really cool game to see them really win situations in the fourth downs and critical plays in really critical situations and taking advantage of offsides and different things. Those are proud things as a coach when these guys do that.

Q. You mentioned your guys dominating certain phases. You guys outscored Penn State for most of the second half, 18-0. What do you think it was that allowed your guys to create that separation in the third and fourth quarters?

LANE KIFFIN: I don't know. First off, John, are there any jobs open right now? Make sure you don't put something out on Twitter and screw up our day today.

Ole Miss - 38, Penn State - 25

LANE KIFFIN: First off, that's credit to Penn State of a big-time opponent and very well-coached and very classy program that I have a lot of respect for.

I'm very excited about how our players showed up today. To come in here and have a chance to do something that's never been done before in the history of the school, to win 11 games against a big-time program, big-time opponent, just really proud of how they did.

Like I told you, it's one thing to win some games -- if you win a game in the last second, a field goal goes in or it doesn't, that's one thing, but to play a game and in a lot of the phases of the game, these guys played extremely well. Kind of dominated certain phases of the game against -- I know they were a little short with opt-outs, but the No. 1 defense in the country.

So really pleased with our players to play a really clean, kind of penalty free. Did a good job in situations, the 3 for 3 on fourth downs, those are very critical plays in the game.

Really, really happy that four years ago I got this opportunity to come here for Chancellor and Keith to give me that opportunity to put the staff and players together. It's been a really cool journey and one I'm really grateful for.

Q. Lane, you mentioned taking this job four years ago, and you said you didn't come here to be good, but you came here to be great. Where would you measure this on the scale of greatness? Also, after the game you

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(Laughter).

That wasn't that funny.

(Laughter).

I really did think they did -- you said garbage. It's not garbage time. We need to close the game out better than we did. We didn't do a great job on four-minute offense there and then on defense. But that was really cool to come out in the second half like that, a game that we had the lead and really had a great, kind of dominant third quarter in a lot of phases of the game.

I don't have it in front of me, but I saw the drive chart up on the big screen before the end of the game there, the last couple series. There were a lot of touchdowns and scorers over here on our side in that third quarter and the first half of the fourth quarter and a lot of punts and then a blocked field goal on their side.

Q. Obviously you mentioned it's history for Ole Miss that this is your first 11-win season, but this here was also your first New Year's Six bowl win. Do you see this as a milestone for your time at Ole Miss or more of a sign of things to come?

LANE KIFFIN: Well, I said it out there. I really do believe we're just getting started. I think that we're doing something -- we're on our way to something really special.

This is really neat winning a New Year's Six bowl, and what an awesome bowl and week and Gary and the whole staff here putting together an amazing week for us, and that was awesome. But we really are. We're just getting started on something really special and a run here.

I normally say that's never been done before, but I guess we just did that, but to come back and do it even better and to continue to improve on what we've done so far.

Q. This is for Lane and Caden. Caden, big day today, 10 catches, 136, and 2 touchdowns. Anything specific Penn State was doing on defense?

Lane, game planning for Caden, the biggest game of the year, just curious what went into that?

CADEN PRIESKORN: I've got to thank my coaches, Coach Weiss and Coach Kiffin, for trusting me. And just the whole O-line, just blocking. I've just got to thank my teammates for just trusting me.

LANE KIFFIN: I don't know what you actually said, he was in that decision going out for the draft. These guys

announced they're coming back. He said, Coach, I'll come back, but you've better make sure I get ten catches in the Peach Bowl. That's what we've got to do nowadays. We've got to game plan to make sure they stay.

Q. For Caden and Jared, both of you came to Ole Miss through the transfer portal. Ole Miss is getting a lot of guys from the transfer portal this year. What does it say for you to be MVPs for your respective sides of the ball in a game like this? What does it tell other guys looking to find a new greener pasture in Ole Miss?

JARED IVEY: I think it speaks to the culture the guys had already when we got here and how they took us in and kind of showed us how things were supposed to be and how the coaches wanted things aligned. Yeah, just very thankful for Coach Joyner and Coach Kiffin just showing us the ropes and making us feel at home day one.

CADEN PRIESKORN: Yeah, I just think with the people that they already had here, a lot of the older guys like on O-line and quarterback and some of the defensive players, they had a lot of structure and they kind of brought us in using the portal. I feel like we brought a lot of older guys that wanted to come in and just compete and just test how Power 5 football is like. Kind of just showed up throughout the season, and we came together as a whole.

Q. Lane, what did you see in the first couple of series of your offensive series against Penn State's defense that affected how you approached the game after that? And was tempo a part of that, a part of trying to disrupt them?

LANE KIFFIN: Well, a couple things there. Just in studying and game planning, didn't really feel in that conference they had played much tempo. Obviously that's part of what we do, and we were able to -- that only works when you make first downs.

So we made some plays, and we were able to get into some tempo situations where they weren't aligned, and took advantage of that. But early on there was a little struggle there. Those guys have really good players. That No. 11 is an elite player. I'm sure he would have gone to the draft if he could because that guy's a special player.

So they gave us some problems there early, and really -- I mean, really kind of made it basic and said, okay, we're going to throw the ball quick because they've got really good rush, especially when they're blitzing him.

We said, we've got matchups -- we told them before the game last night. This game will be won on offense in the one-on-one matchups at wide receiver and tight end. You



guys are going to have to win the game on offense, making plays in the passing game, and they did it.

Q. If I could follow that up, then when you mixed -- Judkins is a really good back, but you really couldn't do too much with him earlier. Then it looked like in the third quarter you decided to mix him in when you had that air threat established; is that correct?

LANE KIFFIN: Yeah, that's kind of how it works. Once you kind of start winning outside the one-on-one matchups, you know, they got really good coaches, so they adjust and play some more zone and put a safety over the top of Trey and didn't play much more man on third down. So that's part of it. Then we go back to running the ball.

I thought our players did some really good things in those situations, like those fourth downs. Then a big thing those guys do is they blitz everybody and play cover zero as aggressive as anybody in the country in certain situations.

The guys were able with two speed options to pass to Quinshon for a touchdown, and then whatever you want to call it, Philly Special, Atlanta Special, Oxford Special. You know, it was another cover zero blitz speeder that these guys executed.

Q. Lane, so I promise not to ask you any Taylor Swift questions, but I wanted to ask you where does today's win like rank among your favorite moments from this season?

LANE KIFFIN: Well, this would be my favorite moment from the season because it's the pinnacle of everything coming together. Previously it would have been that LSU ending and that game.

But to do it on this stage when both teams have a month to prepare and you don't have a home-field advantage. You're not playing at home, so there's none of that. You're playing in a neutral site. This would be the best part of the year.

Again, not the last play of the game, which we've had a lot of those. These guys have done a good job finishing those games off. But to really come out in that third quarter and kind of dominate a really good team in phases was really special. That's what you really appreciate as a coach to see versus a ref's call or the ball hits the upright or something and you win or lose based off of that.

Q. Kind of a weird question, so I apologize, but there was a Twitter --

LANE KIFFIN: That's okay. Not as weird as her Taylor

Swift question the other day, and I had more time to think. So I would have said Anti-hero or Castles Crumbling. Go ahead.

Q. There's a Twitter account that you retweeted a couple of times this week that's believed to be maybe a troll account putting out fake Penn State player quotes. I don't know if you were aware of that or made aware of that at any point.

LANE KIFFIN: I was made aware of that. I'm glad we won so you wouldn't be bringing that up in the press conference and they'd be saying that motivated them.

I thought it was pretty funny actually because they discovered that it was Fisher Ray, one of our assistants, one of our student assistants. So Fisher is now kind of famous. But I thought it was really cool last night when he showed it to me, he's like, these Penn State fans now, they're into this. They researched his password and e-mail and were able to figure out which guy it was that started it. It was all in good fun. I hope the fans had fun with it.

Q. You were okay with him starting the account?

LANE KIFFIN: I'm not going to start making social media rules on people.

Q. Lane, obviously some considerable momentum with your program right now. What kind of role does that play in program building? And how does where you're at now feel compared to where you've been in your career previously trying to build something?

LANE KIFFIN: Well, I've never been anywhere four years. First off, I feel safe.

No. We talked about it this whole press conference. We're in a really good place. We're starting something really special. I think today's another message, which obviously you saw all these great players around the country the last month sign up to come join these guys. Today is another message as you look at the MVPs up here and the guys that came in here to do something special.

Today's another message for a couple more pieces that may be out there. Come on, join up.

Q. Jared, how cool is it for you to be playing in your home state and come out with not only a big win, but win the defensive player of the game award?

JARED IVEY: It was really cool. I had maybe 20-30 people come to the game today. It was awesome to just make history with my guys, and then even more special to



do it at home. So it was great.

Q. Coach, you kind of talked about in your opening statement about the opt-outs. With Penn State not having their two starting cornerbacks, how much does that change how you kind of call the game, and what do you think you guys were able to do more successfully because of that?

LANE KIFFIN: Well, they pay us a lot of money as coaches. So I would think that we wouldn't have been really good coaches if we didn't realize that and obviously go in and attack where there were new players at. That's coaching 101.

Again, the players have got to make the plays. I get way too much credit on these fourth down plays like they're asking afterwards. Our assistant coaches, Charlie Weis, they did a great job today of having some really unique plays. Like we talk about the Philly Special or speed option or Q versus the zero down the pipe.

Those guys did a great job of game planning to beat a very aggressive defense in those situations and to take advantage of different players in there is what you're supposed to do.

Q. Coach, with how last season started and then unfortunately finished for you and your team, just to be able to be here right now with your only two losses on the season being Alabama and Georgia, just what does that say about you, your team, and everybody else in that coaching room?

LANE KIFFIN: I think that's good perspective. I just talked about that in there. One year ago where we were and having the memory of a really poor locker room feeling. Whatever that was, I think we'd lost four or five or something like that.

Just went back to work and kept trying to add players, trying to grow as coaches, made some difficult changes, and it paid off this year, players and coaches. So really proud of those guys.

Q. Caden, Jaxson in there told me he kind of calls you the dad of the offense with the maturity and just experience you brought. How have you felt your role is with this offense, kind of not the Xs and Os, but just within the offense as a whole?

CADEN PRIESKORN: I'm definitely an older guy that's played a lot of college football, so I feel like my teammates trust me, trust what I say and what I do. I felt like today it showed just on the field and helping guys getting set and

stuff like that. I'm just thankful that they believe in me as well.

On what it means to be in his position:

"It's a blessing to be in this position. To even come out here to play this kind of game for our fans, we give all praise to God."

On transferring to Ole Miss:

"We were always taught to think big. It's kind of fun that we still got to do something that's amazing even though we didn't get to go to the national championship. We still made history and we'll always go down in history."

OLE MISS QUARTERBACK JAXSON DART

On the victory:

"I'm just really happy for my teammates, especially the guys who played their last game here. We did it for them. Obviously, we made history and left a legacy."

On the significance of the program's first 11-win season:

"I know that when you look at the statistics, the [Big Ten] conference, and the numbers that [Penn State] gave up in terms of rushing yards and passing yards, you wouldn't think we'd be successful in this game. But I think the time off and our preparation really paid off for us. I knew we'd be successful because we were really prepared and schemed them up as good as possible."

OLE MISS WIDE RECEIVER TRE HARRIS

On starting his collegiate career at Louisiana Tech and finding success at Ole Miss:

"I came a long way and give all the glory to God. Without him I am nothing."

On helping Ole Miss to first 11-win season:

"It's huge. We finished with a great season, but we still have more history to make. We want to continue making history and leave a legacy at Ole Miss. That's something everyone wanted to do. So proud of everyone. So proud of my teammates, coaches and the fans for supporting us through the season."

On reflecting on his journey:

"It has been a really fast pace this entire week. I know after this game I go see my parents, I just might break down because they see me at my lowest and they saw me grind to where I am now."

THE MODERATOR: Coach, we'll start with an opening statement and then go right into questions.

JAMES FRANKLIN: First of all, I want to thank the fan turnout. We had great turnout and great support, and we're appreciative of that. We don't take that for granted.

I want to thank the Chick-Fil-A and the Peach Bowl. We had a great experience and were treated in a first-class manner.

Specifically to the game, just too many moving parts with the staff and with the players against a good team. Too many moving parts, staff and players, to have the type of success that we wanted to have today.

I won't get into all the details. I thought the officiating was less than desirable. That first drive, we have the field goal, we run a slant, we get turned around, but I'll move on. I could list out a number of examples. That's a big play in that game at a critical moment, starting out with a touchdown rather than a field goal is significant. But I'll move on. But I'll move on.

Lack of turnovers. Again, we had two plays backed up in their area of the field that went to replay, but those two turnovers would have been huge in the game. I'm not even saying that they were judged right or wrong. I didn't get a chance to see it, but they were huge plays in the game.

Then we had a turnover. We've done a great job of creating turnovers on defense and eliminating turnovers on offense, and we didn't win the turnover battle today, which



has been a huge part of our success all year long.

A couple other things I would say is getting off the field on third and fourth down on defense and being able to convert and stay on the field on offense.

We've been great all year long in the third quarter, starting the third quarter with two three and outs on offense when the game was still very, very competitive at that point, that was significant.

Got to give Ole Miss credit. Got to give Lane and his staff credit. But I think ultimately too many moving parts, staff and players, to have the type of success that we want to have.

Q. The decision on fourth and one to punt, what went into that one?

JAMES FRANKLIN: We were backed up on our end of the field, felt like we needed to obviously punt the ball, pin them deep, and make them go the length of the field. We had not been moving the ball the way we needed to offensively. They had been moving the ball. So I felt like I needed to give our defense the best chance.

Obviously that was a big story in the game, them going for it on fourth down and having success. We did go for it on fourth down and scored a touchdown, but we did not go for it in that situation.

Q. From the first half to the second half, obviously the first half you go in with a three-point deficit, looked competitive. The second half, Ole Miss extended their lead.

What was the biggest difference that allowed Ole Miss to extend their lead from the first half to the second half?

JAMES FRANKLIN: A couple things. We had obviously the ability to move the ball in the first half not as consistently and not as explosive as we'd like to be, but in the third quarter, again, starting out with two three and outs. We had some injuries. We had some guys that had limited roles in the second half compared to the first half.

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All those things factored into it.

Q. Was Dante Cephas available to play today? If he was, what went into him not seeing the field?

JAMES FRANKLIN: Everything's an open competition every week, and the depth chart reflects that. Then obviously when you're in a bowl situation and you've got three weeks, there's a lot of movement that can occur in three weeks.

Part of that obviously is having Trey Harrison back that we had not had for about five weeks this year.

Q. Going off of that, how would you evaluate the end-to-end development and progression of your receiver room and what would you say sort of lead to it never really getting where you wanted it to be?

JAMES FRANKLIN: I actually thought during the bowl period that those guys had a really good bowl period. I thought that was a big part that we were excited about and we made a big deal about with the team.

It's a combination of things. I think we're really good at tight end. That's part of it. Then we've got to be able to make sure that we translate what we do in practice consistently to the games.

One of the things that I think can be challenging is you may not get an opportunity early in the game, but whenever those opportunities come, you've got to maximize them. You've got to maximize them, and we have not done that consistently enough this year.

Q. For KJ and Tyler, you guys have talked at times throughout the season how you've stuck together through adversity. This is another piece of adversity for you guys here at the end of the season. Coach talked about the transition upcoming.

Why is this a group that sticks together, and why do you think this has been a mark of the season?

KEVIN WINSTON JR.: I'll start it off. We go back to what we've been through together, all the hard work we put in together during the off-season, the workouts, the summer workouts. We reflect on those kinds of things and realize we get limited times, 12, 13 games to play with each other, and we make sure we stay together through it all.

We never break up on each other. That's the main thing, staying together through it all. When we were struggling in the workouts, that's the time we have to stay together. So we'd never let that break in the middle of a game.

TYLER WARREN: I'd agree with KJ on that, and then it kind of starts with our coaching staff and the culture they instill in us. Then as older guys on the team, make sure we keep that going through the highs and lows. So just doing that is important.

Q. James, the pace that they play with, the tempo, how challenging was that with some of the moving parts?

KJ, what was it like playing a team that goes that fast?

JAMES FRANKLIN: So the tempo is challenging early on in the game, where we were able to get negative plays, takes them out of their rhythm. But obviously when they're able to play with tempo and have positive plays and build on it, it is difficult to stop.

That also goes into the -- how the game is managed is also important. When the ball goes out on their sideline, that is a substitution, and we have the ability to match substitution. There was a couple times when we're trying to be able to substitute right there to affect their tempo and also to match personnel, and we weren't given the opportunity to do that a few times.

So tempo is challenging all the time, but you also need to make sure it's being managed correctly and consistently so we know when we can sub and when we can't.

KEVIN WINSTON JR.: I agree with Coach Franklin on that one. The main thing for me, and a lot of guys will say the same. Getting the play and make sure we're on the same page because, when we're doing hurry up, a lot of guys are just getting up from making a tackle or whatever they were doing on the play.

We want to have our cleats set and be on the same page, and sometimes hurry up causes disruption with that. That's the main thing that causes difficulty with that.

Q. James, you mentioned the moving parts. How do you think it affected you like emotionally, energy-wise? Can you comment on your team from that perspective?

JAMES FRANKLIN: I didn't feel like that was an issue from an energy and a focus standpoint. You guys can speak on that. I don't think that was an issue. We had significant players that have played all year long that weren't in that game.

I don't want this to come off the wrong way. I'm not criticizing, but it is what it is. It's the reality. I think about guys that did play in the game and how appreciative we



are, but not only appreciative, there's an opportunity to create value by playing in games as well.

Talking to some people, our guys playing against Ole Miss and playing well was also an opportunity, and these things -- obviously we need to have some discussions as a team in how we're going to handle these things moving forward, but it was different.

You look at last year's game and this year's game, it was different, and we need to have some healthy discussions about that as a staff and as a team and how we want to operate moving forward.

Q. Coach, you mentioned those two turnovers that were overturned on replay. You guys were disruptive early in this game defensively and seemed to do what you wanted to do defensively really early in this game.

What was the adjustment that Ole Miss made that gave you guys trouble kind of midway through the first quarter and in the first half?

JAMES FRANKLIN: Again, I think a couple things that I've mentioned already. I think obviously early on we were able to get some negative plays, whether tackles for loss, whether it's zero gain plays, whether it was sacks. Those things, when you're able to keep a team off schedule and not go tempo, those are powerful. Those are powerful.

Then I think also obviously our offense being able to answer some of those scoring situations and keep the game within a score or within a field goal is significant.

Again, we had some guys in the second half that weren't available, and I think they did a good job. If you watch their game plan, they went after some guys that had not played a ton of football for us this year, and it will be a great learning opportunity for those guys and for us moving forward.

Q. In the second half, specifically the third quarter, anything specific Ole Miss did on defense? I know you weren't able to score any points. Just curious about the Ole Miss defense in the third quarter.

JAMES FRANKLIN: Obviously I think they made some adjustments, but overall we weren't able to stay on schedule. You don't want to be in third and long situations.

So whether it was a drop or an incomplete or whether it was a rush of no gain, you get off schedule against a good team with that type of defensive line.

I think their length at the defensive tackle, they were able to bat down a few balls, which those may not be sexy

plays, but they're significant. That was probably the biggest thing. We weren't able to stay on schedule on third down.

Q. KJ and Tyler, I wanted to ask you, you've obviously had great New Year's Six bowl experiences, being at destinations, that type of thing.

Can you take us to next year when it's an actual playoff game and the result means you continue or you don't continue, how that may adjust or how that may feel differently starting next year?

TYLER WARREN: I think it's really not a huge change because we're coming into every game expecting to play our best game and try to win in the best way we can. I don't think it's going to change a lot.

Obviously it's a different platform, but really the way we approach it and the way we attack it as a team is going to be the same in every game we play in.

KEVIN WINSTON JR.: Like Tyler said, every game, no matter if it's a playoff game or a regular season game, we're coming in the same way, with the same approach no matter what. I feel like it will be nothing new to us. Just the label of the game will be bigger for us, but taking it the same as we always do.

Q. We've seen Drew struggle a little bit in these bigger games that he's had this year. What have you seen from him -- Michigan, Ohio State, today? It seems like he got the consistency late, but what has prevented him from finding that rhythm for a full four quarters, 60 minutes?

JAMES FRANKLIN: I think it's all of it, right? We've got to stay on schedule like we talked about. We've got to make plays for him when we have the opportunity to make plays for him.

I think there's some things that he can do and be more consistent as well, but I think the biggest thing, which I think was a question earlier, is we've got to be able to scare people and be a threat consistently on the perimeter.

That's something I think we've shown flashes of at times, but we need to be able to do that on a consistent basis.

So it's a little bit of Drew. I think it's a little bit of the offensive line. I think it's a little bit of the coaches. I think it's a little bit of the wide receivers. It's a piece of all of it.

We've got to make some plays for him, and he's got to make some plays as well.

On playing his final game:

"It's a bittersweet moment. I'm sad that I'm leaving, but I'm excited for the future."

On PSU's young secondary stepping up:

"I think those guys held their own. They probably gave up maybe two catches on the outside lanes and a couple on slants, which isn't too bad. It's definitely a learning experience getting to play in a big-time game. They'll be good moving forward."
