

# ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '08 Casey Dick was working with his 4th OC of his career but threw for 2,586 (57%, 13-14). The only QB returning with game experience here at Ark in '09 was rFr Tyler Wilson (PS#32) who hit 11-22 for 69 yds (2 gms) as a true frosh but RS. Ryan Mallett (6'7", PS#1) has an arm that has been compared to John Elway's. As a true frosh at Michigan in '07 he was 3-0 as the starting QB throwing for 892 (43%, 7-5). Mallett's 97 yard TD pass was the longest in UM history. He RS here in '08 and was the clear-cut starter in '09. Mallett broke a lot of Clint Stoerner's ('96-'99) records as he threw for a school record 3,624 (55.8%) with a 30-7 ratio. Wilson played in 5 (218, 61.1%). Bobby Petrino said he wanted Mallett to break Kevin Scanlon's 1979 record of 66%. If Mallett had played all of his games at home, he would have done it. At home, Mallett threw for 327 ypg (68.3%). On the road, he completed just 42.9% (223 ypg) but did face 4 top 20 pass D's. Amazingly he was the MVP of the Liberty Bowl despite hitting just 15-36 for 202 yds and Ark converted zero of 13 third downs. Not in the PSL are Brandon Mitchell (6'4" 230 rFr, PS#204) and Nick Petrino (5'11" 190 Jr, PS#190). I expect big-time improvement from Mallett on the road and he is clearly one of the frontrunners for the Heisman Trophy after turning down a shot at the NFL.

**RUNNING BACKS** - From 2005-'07 the Hogs had an amazing trio of RB's in Darren McFadden, Felix Jones and Peyton Hillis. In '08 they were all drafted by the NFL. They combined for an amazing 3,339 rush and 877 rec yds in '07. HC Petrino favors a bigger back so it was surprising to me that diminutive Michael Smith (5'7" 176) won the starting job in '08. Smith (370 bench) rushed for 1,072 (5.2) despite missing 2. True frosh Dennis Johnson (5'9" 213 Jr, PS#112, 4.4 spd) started vs LSU and was the #2 RB with 184 (5.1). Last year they got the large addition of 248 lb Broderick Green (PS#9) who had 168 (5.2) at USC in '08. They also added true frosh Ronnie Wingo (PS#12) and Knile Davis (PS#26). Smith only played in 8 (inj) and finished #2 with 396 (5.6). Green set a school record with a 99 yd TD run vs E Mich and led with 442 (4.2). Johnson had 107 vs Florida and was #3 (342, 6.0). Wingo added 319 (6.5) and Davis had 163 (4.9). This year they lose Smith (5 st), Brandon Barnett (46 yd) and FB John Durmon (2 st, solid blk'r). Not in the PSL are Ronald Watkins (5'9" 185 So, PS#380) as well as FB's Van Stumon (6'1" 266 Sr, PS#31LB) and Mitchell Bailey (5'11" 227 Jr, PS#399). Even with the loss of their top guy, I look for improved numbers from a very talented backfield.

**RECEIVERS** - The Hogs were a run-based team under former HC Houston Nutt. In 2007 their leading WR had just 203 (16.9). Lucas Miller was the top returnee in '08 (157, 13.1 '07). TE DJ Williams (PS#18) led with 723 (11.9) while Miller was #2 (490, 16.3) and true frosh Joe Adams (PS#25) had 377 (12.2). True frosh 6'3" Greg Childs (PS#48) had 6 rec in the opener but just 12 afterwards. True frosh Jarius Wright (PS#36) had 348 (18.3) and London Crawford (PS#57) added 311 (11.5). Everyone ret'd in '09. Childs led with 894 (18.6) while Wright added 681 (16.6). Adams suffered a mild stroke (miss 3) but was #3 (568, 19.6). Mallett preferred throwing the ball deep to WR's so Williams (top TE prospect NFL) only had 411 (12.8). Speedy true frosh Cobi Hamilton had 347 (18.3). This year they lose Crawford (5 st, 14 rec) and Miller (2 st, 7 rec). Not listed below are Austin Tucker (6'1" 195 Jr, PS#325), Ryan Farr (6'1" 190 So, PS#359), Price Holmes (6'3" 190 So) and TE's Jim Youngblood (6'2" 225 So, PS#21QB), Jovan Davis (6'2" 250 So) and Austin Tate (6'6" 246 rFr, PS#37). This is my #1 rated rec corps in the NCAA.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - The Hogs led the SEC in rushing in 5 of Houston Nutt's last 6 yrs. The one year they did not (2004) they had 0 returning OL st's and they were still #2! In '07 the

Hogs had only 2 st's back but avg 287 ypg rush (6.0) with just 13 sks (4.2%). In Bobby Petrino's first year ('08) they had to replace 4 st's. As you would expect in a new system (run blk to pass blk), their rush numbers plummeted to just 114 ypg (3.6) and they allowed 46 sks (2nd most FBS). Last year they had to replace 3 st's (#4DC) but had 5 back with starting exp. Naturally the numbers improved to 132 ypg rush (4.3) with 24 sks (5.5%). This year they lose 1st Tm SEC RG Mitch Petrus (#5DC NYG, 13 st, 2Y st'r) and T Matt Hall (11 gm). Adding depth are Clay Bembere (6'2" 295 Sr), Tyler Deacon (6'2" 295 So, PS#480) and Blake Gunderson (6'3" 290 So). They have 90 career sts (4 VHT 2 deep) and I look for continued improvement.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In Petrino's first year Arkansas had a fairly veteran D-line but the rest of the Hog D was inexp'd and they slipped allowing 171 ypg rush (4.4). Last year they had to replace 3 DL (comb 6 sts). Four of the team's top 9 tkl'rs in '08 were DL and they all ret'd. They improved to 153 ypg (4.0) with 29 sks. This year they lose DE Adrian Davis (12 st, 50 tkl, 5.5 sk) and 2nd Tm SEC DT Malcolm Sheppard (13 st, 33 tkl, 2.5 sk). Not in the PSL are Will Coleman (6'2" 247 rFr), Jared Green (6'0" 303 Jr, PS#419) and Ryan Calendar (6'7" 241 rFr, PS#267). Eight return who started last year (4 were frosh) and I look for continued strides in the Hogs' rush D.



**LINEBACKERS** - After having an inexp'd unit in '08, the Hogs ret'd their top 3 LB's last year including Jerry Franklin who as a rFr stopped Tim Tebow's streak of 203 passes without an int. TE Williams said the LB's were bigger, faster and better students of the game in '09 and the Hogs' D allowed 6.1 ppg less. This year they lose MLB Wendel Davis (11 st, #2 tkl'r, 8.5 tfl) but return their #1, #3 and #7 tkl'rs with all 3 having 7+ starts. Not in the PSL are Michael Villegas (6'4" 230 So) and Stephen Barnett (6'1" 227 Sr). I look for continued improvement from the Hog LB's.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Arkansas finished #26 in my PDR in '05, #11 in '06 and with a veteran unit in '07 was #1 allowing 45.5% with 20 ints. In '08 they had to replace all 4 st's and as you would expect, dropped to #59. LY they had to replace 4 DB (comb 17 sts) then lost CB Isaac Madison (11 st '08) to a torn ACL in Aug. CB David Gordon (fastest 200m in HS in '08) started 3 but was injured. The Hogs slid to #80 allowing 59.2% with a 22-13 ratio. This year they lose SS Matt Harris (10 st, 71 tkl, 1 int) and Jerrell Norton (2 st, 14 tkl) but have 7 back who started LY plus Madison and I expect more impact from Darius Winston (PS#4, miss 6 '09). Adding depth are Greg Gatson (5'10" 175 Jr, PS#467) and Dustin Cain (6'0" 190 Sr). This is a faster, deeper, more exp'd secondary that should make a large climb in the PDR.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Bobby Petrino's ST units at L'ville finished #70, #41, #63 and #39 in my ST rankings ('03-'06). He inherited a ST unit that finished #94 in '07 and only had to replace their top KR's. The unit struggled again finishing #94 and Petrino

hired John L. Smith (former HC at Mich St and L'ville) to oversee the unit. Alex Tejada, who lost his job at one point in '08 (4-9 FG's), hit a solid 16-22 (long 47, 2 miss 50+). He had only 4 TB's on 49 KO's (Cameron Bryan had 0 TB on 37). True frosh P Dylan Breeding avg just 38.7 (tm net 32.6) and KR Dennis Johnson was solid (25.8, 1 TD). The Hogs had just 127 yards on PR's (8.5). Adding depth at PK is Brandon Tierney (5'11" 185 So). The unit basically returns intact and should improve upon last year's #79 finish.

**COACHES** - HC Bobby Petrino had a great run at Louisville, guiding the team to 4 bowls and a pair of #6 AP finishes. He left for the Atlanta Falcons in '07 and was blasted by the media after quitting with 3 games to go. Arkansas struggled in the changeover in '08 going 5-7 but Petrino turned it around in '09 (8-5). OC Paul Petrino, Bobby's younger brother, chose to accept the OC position at Illinois to make a name for himself separate from his brother. The new OC is Garrick McGee (QB cch here L2Y). McGee spent 4 yrs at Northwestern prior (OC in '06-'07). Petrino's DC is Willy Robinson who was the STL Rams' DB coach ('06-'07) and enters his 3rd year as DC here.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Prior to '04, Ark went to six consec bowls matching a school record set by Lou Holtz ('77-'82) and Ken Hatfield ('84-'89). Unfortunately for just the 3rd time in 61 yrs ('52-'53 and '96-'97), they suffered B2B losing seasons in '04 & '05. Despite their 2-6 record in SEC play in '05, they were +31.3 ypg! They outgained #4 UGA 332-217 (lost by 3 road) and thanks to a pair of missed FG's, lost to #3 LSU by 2 in Baton Rouge. Ark used the most true frosh in the nation in '05 (18). In '06 they had the most ret st's in the SEC (18) and that had me very high on the Hogs. I picked the Hogs #13 in the country coming off a 4-7 season with the majority of the other magazines not even having them ranked. Ark did not disappoint me, in fact they made it to the SEC Title game and rose as high as #5 AP. Their losses in '06 were to the #6, #9, #4 and #6 teams. In '07 the Hogs had just 12 ret st's and were #21 in the preseason. They were a disappointing 7-4 when they stunned #1 LSU in Death Valley in 3OT. Surprisingly Nutt who was 53-17 at home, stepped aside and with an interim HC for the bowl they were whipped by Missouri 38-7. In '08 there were numerous factors pointing to a large downturn for the Hogs. They had just 9 ret st's, were switching schemes from a run to a pass based attack and they lost star RB's McFadden, Jones and Hillis not to mention their top 6 tkl'rs. I picked the team that had been to 2 straight NY Day Bowls and had 3 non-BCS foes on the schedule to have a losing season. The Hogs actually performed better than my expectations. They converted on 4th & 10 and got a game winning TD with 1:49 left to get past W Ill and trailed ULM 24-6 in the 3Q but won late. They trailed LSU 30-14 but got numerous key plays late in the 3Q and pulled out the win 31-30 and finished 5-7. Despite their 2-6 SEC record they were +0.1 ypg and at -9 in TO's almost made my Turnovers=Turnaround article. They were #3 in the FBS in sts lost to injury (47) and their 17 ret st's in '09 were the most in the SEC. Last year they had to face 2 Preseason Top 10 teams from the SEC West and drew both Florida and Georgia out of the East, but still made my Most Improved List for the 2nd time in 4 yrs. The Hogs were sky high for their home game vs Georgia and jumped out to a 21-10 lead but ended up losing 52-41. In a letdown spot they were blasted by Alabama 35-7. They trailed Texas A&M 10-0 early but routed them 47-19 and then blasted unbeaten Auburn 44-23 at home. A couple of questionable ref calls at the end cost them in "The Swamp" vs #1 ranked Florida and they lost by 3. After a loss to Ole Miss they rallied for 4 straight wins. In the season finale at LSU, the Tigers got an 87 yard PR TD and a FG with :04 left to force OT and Ark missed a FG and lost to drop to 7-5. They got past EC in the Liberty Bowl 20-17 in OT despite being outgained 393-283. Arkansas benefitted from +15 TO's and was -36.3 ypg in SEC play (3rd worst). They do have 17 ret st's (#1 SEC) including QB Mallett and Florida drops off the schedule (for Vanderbilt). Two of my 9 sets of power ratings actually call for a 12 win season! They do have to play Georgia, Auburn and SCar on the road but are a legit SEC West contender.

Bobby Petrino is 6-0 in season openers incl 2 wins vs FCS teams as a HC. First meeting. The Golden Eagles were 6-5 LY incl losses to Kansas St (49-7) & Georgia (38-0).

ULM's home game moved here for attendance. Arkansas is 26-0 vs Sun Belt teams including 8-0 vs ULM. Arkansas trailed 27-14 in the 4Q in 2008 but pulled out the win.

Arkansas is 5-2 at Georgia but has lost 9 of 10 LY QB Mallett tied the UA record with 5 TD passes but UA lost 52-41 despite leading 21-10. The Hogs are 2-7 in SEC openers.

The home tm has won 5 of 6 but Ark has dropped 3 straight. LY Ark only trailed 14-7 in the 3Q. They allowed a 1 play 50 yd TD pass & a 1 play 80 yd TD pass in the 35-7 loss.

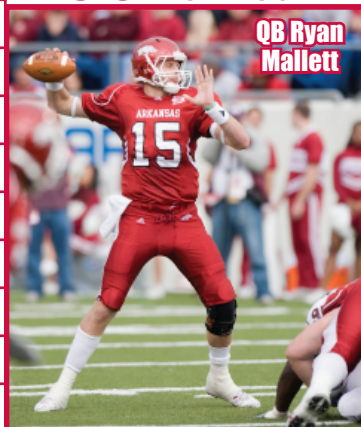
BONUS: Arkansas is 20-34 vs SEC East teams since 1992, the worst record in the West.
