

# AUBURN TIGERS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - When former OC Tony Franklin took over prior to the '07 bowl, he played true frosh Kodi Burns (PS#17), who rushed 13 times (69 yds, 1-4 pass). In '08, looked like Burns was the perfect fit for the Auburn spread offense. They added Chris Todd (PS#37) who had played in 5 in TT's spread offense in '06 (25-35-241). Todd had a sore shoulder in the spring so Burns was the leader. Burns started the opener but was injured and Todd started the next 5 (better passer). Burns started the last 6 when they went back to more of a run-based offense (Franklin fired). Burns threw for 1,050 (53%, 2-7, #2 rusher). Todd threw for 903 (55%, 5-6). Neil Caudle (PS#14) had 5 pass att. Last year all 3 ret'd and I said they could only improve upon '08's 54% and 7-13 ratio. Burns moved to WR and 3rd string QB Barrett Trotter (PS#44) suffered a torn ACL. Todd finished with a school record 22 TD passes (20, Pat Sullivan, Jason Campbell). Todd also broke Campbell's single gm comp % record vs Furman hitting his first 14 passes (17-18). Todd threw for 2,612 (60.4%) with an outstanding 22-6 ratio. Caudle played in 5 (170 pass yds). Wildcat QB Burns hit 5-15 pass and rushed for 175 (3.1). This year they lose Todd. Caudle is 6'3" and a rhythm QB with a very good arm. He'll have to beat out Cameron Newton (orig signed at Florida, 6 gm there) who led Blinn JC to a Title LY. Tyrrik Rollison (6'0" 194 rfr, PS#7) is a good fit for the offense but was not with the team in spring and is expected to transfer over the summer. Clint Moseley (PS#40) and Trotter are also in the mix. Despite the loss of their starter, this unit has almost equal the experience and could actually have improved numbers.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In 2004, Auburn had the best set of RB's in the country in Cadillac Williams and Ronnie Brown who combined for over 2,000 yards rushing and were both taken in the first five picks of the '05 draft. In '05, Kenny Irons rushed for 1,293 (5.1). Irons was leading the SEC in '06 but missed 4 and finished with 893 (4.5). True frosh Ben Tate had the best ypc of the backs (392, 7.3). In '07 they had to replace Irons but added Mario Fannin (PS#16). Tate led with 903 (4.5). In '08 Tate led again but with just 664 (4.2) while Fannin had 238 (4.4). The Tigers' 137 ypg rush was their lowest since 1999. Last year Tate rushed for 1,362 (5.2). True frosh Onterio McCalebb (PS#69, tm's fastest) became the first Auburn frosh with 100 yards (148) rushing in the opener since Bo Jackson ('82). In game 2, McCalebb and Tate became the first Auburn duo to rush for B2B 100 yd games in school history. McCalebb was inj'd in the 2Q vs Ball St. and was really not 100% afterwards (miss 2). He was #2 with 565 (5.4). Fannin rushed for 285 with an impressive 8.4 ypc. This year they lose Tate (#2DC HOU) but joining McCalebb and Fannin will be Dontae Aycock (5'10" 218, rfr, PS#51) who was impressive in practices and PS#2 Michael Dyer. Not in the PSL are Davis Hooper (6'0" 207 Jr) and LaLiece Crayton (5'9" 210 Sr). This looks like a very talented unit once again and RB coach Luper predicted a 1,000 yd season for Fannin.

**RECEIVERS** - In '08 the top 2 rec's combined for just 609 (11.3). Tim Hawthorne was the top WR returnee with 203 (25.4). 6'3" soph Darvin Adams (PS#67, 3 rec true) led with 997 (16.6) and 10 TD's. Terrell Zachery (PS#18) was #2 with 477 (18.3) and TE Tommy Trott (PS#6) had 144 (13.1). DeAngelo Benton (PS#3, 21 yr old true) had 88 yds vs Furman but none in any other game. This year they lose TE Trott (10 st) and Hawthorne (1 st). Not listed below are Philip Pierre-Louis (5'8" 150 So, PS#191), Travante Stallworth (5'9" 180 So, PS#89), Ralph Spry (5'10" 167 Jr), Nathan Taylor (5'10" 180 Jr), Derek Winter (6'0" 205 Jr, PS#148), Jay Wisner (6'2" 191 Sr, 2 st) and TE Robert Cooper (6'4" 210 rfr). There is a lot of talent and it is the 2nd year of the offense.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '08, Auburn had 4 st's back on the O-line but was learning a new offense with more pass blocking. The ypc dipped for a 3rd straight year to just 3.5 (137 ypg). Last

year they had to replace 2 st's and after trimming down the O-line the last few years under former HC Tommy Tuberville, they had the players bulk up. As you would expect, the numbers improved to 212 ypg rush (5.0) with 21 sks allowed (5.8%). This year they lose RT Andrew McCain (13 st) and 2 bkps (comb 5 gm). The unit has 4 multi-year senior st's including 1st Tm SEC LT Lee Ziemba and 2nd Tm SEC C Ryan Pugh plus they add 2 VHT JUCO's. Their 111 career starts returning rank #5 in the NCAA and they are now in the 2nd year of the new blocking schemes. This is my #5 rated O-line in the FBS.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '08 Auburn had to replace 2.5 st's (#2 and #3DC's) and slipped allowing 139 ypg (4.1), the worst ypc since 1995 (21 sks). Last year they lost 1.5 st's (#2DC) but Antonio Coleman turned down an early shot at the NFL and was 1st Tm SEC with 10 sks. Surprisingly, Auburn allowed 156 ypg rush (4.1). This year they lose Coleman (13 st, 49 tkl, 16.5 tfl), NG Jake Ricks (13 st, 38 tkl, 1.5 sk) and DE Gabe McKenzie (3 tkl). Their 26 returning st's are only 4 less than they had in '09 but they lose their star. Not listed below are Chris Humphries (6'2" 225 So, 8 tkl) and Robert Hill (6'1" 239 Jr, 1 tkl). The ypg rushing allowed has increased each year since '03 but they may be able to stop that slide this year.

**LINEBACKERS** - Tuberville's LB units always emphasized speed over size. Last year HC Gene Chizik inherited a group that had to replace 1 st'r (#3 tkl'r) but did return their #4 and #5 tkl'rs. Two backups left over the summer and 3 were injured early giving them just one scholarship backup LB in true frosh Jonathan Evans (PS#97). This year they lose Adam Herring (4 st, 12 tkl) but return all 3 st's (#1, #2 & #11 tkl'rs) and add 4 true frosh including 2 VHT's and S Daren Bates (#4 tkl'r, 13 st) making this unit vastly more exp'd and deeper. Not in the PSL are Watson Downs (6'0" 213 So) and Patrick Butler (6'0" 244 Sr).



**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Auburn was #37 in my PDR in '08. LY they had to replace a #3DC (7 of 8 back). SS Mike McNeil (12 st '08) broke his leg in April, and one of the 2 ret st's remaining (Zac Etheridge) was lost after 9 sts. Projected starting CB Aaron Savage tore his Achilles in July. The Tigers finished at #36. This year they lose CB Walter McAdams (13 st, 46 tkl, 6 int, 10 pbu, #5DC OAK) and Harry Adams (6 tkl). McNeil, Savage (15 st '06 and '07) and Etheridge are expected back, and '09 starting SS Bates (now LB) could return to the secondary if necessary. This is a deeper, more veteran unit. Not listed below are Woody Parramore (5'8" 178 Sr), Tyler Mickens (5'10" 184 rfr) and Drew Cole (5'11" 193 Jr).

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Tuberville almost always fielded outstanding ST units. He had finishes of #18 in '01, #39 in '03, #19 in '04, #31 in '05, #3 in '06 and #11 in '08. Last year K Wes Byrum hit an outstanding 15-16 FG's (5-6 40+). P Clinton Durst (37.6 net '08) saw his net drop to 35.7 partly because Chizik used a lot of walk-ons for ST and the coverage units were poor. Morgan Hull had 4 TB on 67 KO. Chizik went through 4 different PR with all 4 at one time either bobbling or outright fumbling returns. He said

that recruiting a PR would be a high priority. Auburn dropped to #83. This year they lose Durst but with an improved return game and an excellent K, should contend for Top 25 honors.

**COACHES** - Auburn fans were not thrilled when former DC ('02-'04) Chizik was hired to replace Tuberville as he was coming off 2 unimpressive years as HC of Iowa St (5-19). However, Chizik smartly assembled a dream team coaching staff headlined by OC Gus Malzahn who had a one year stint at Ark ('06) as OC and then directed Tulsa's explosive offense for 2 years ('07-'08). Malzahn turned down an offer to become HC of LA Tech this year. The DC is Ted Roof who is a former GT DC ('99-'01) and was the HC at Duke for 5 years (interim HC L/5 gms of '03). In '08 Roof took a Minn D that allowed 36.7 ppg in '07 and helped them yield just 24.8 ppg. Asst HC/WR coach Trooper Taylor and RB coach Curtis Luper are some of the top recruiters in the country.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Tommy Tuberville's teams won or shared the SEC West Title in 5 of his 10 yrs here. In '04, Auburn felt it was the best team in the country but was not allowed to play in the National Title game. They finished #2 in the polls at 13-0. Despite coming into '05 ranked just #16, many felt at the end of the season that Auburn was the best team in the SEC. They tied LSU atop the SEC West at 7-1 and had the best ypg (+118.6) and ppg (+17.5) in conf play but did not play in the SEC Title game (tough OT loss at LSU). The '05 squad had to replace four #1 DC's and had just 12 ret st's. The inexp hurt them in the opener with a loss to GT due to -4 TO's, but their only other regular season loss was the OT battle vs LSU. Their weakest performance came in the bowl vs Wisconsin (outgained 548-236). In '06 they had 12 st's back with 23 seniors (previous high for seniors was 18 in '04). All of their tough games were at home and Auburn appeared to have the schedule to run the table. The Tigers beat two Top 10 teams at home in '06 and were the only team to beat Nat'l Champ Florida as they finished 11-2 and #9. They benefitted from 6 net close wins in '06 and despite their 6-2 SEC record, were -33.4 ypg (4th worst). Auburn had to play a tougher schedule in '07 and had the least exp'd O-line under Tuberville. They opened just 1-2 but upset #4 Florida in The Swamp. They got a FG with :21 left to beat Ark on the road then almost upset eventual National Champ LSU yielding a 22 yard TD pass with :01 left. They did get their 6th straight win over Bama and won the Chick-fil-A Bowl and finished 9-4 (#15). In '08 they had 15 returning st's and were the favorite to win the SEC West. They suffered a tough loss vs Vandy with Tuberville firing OC Franklin the next week. After opening the season 4-1 and being in the top 10 each of the first 4 weeks, the Tigers lost their final 6 vs FBS foes including an embarrassing 36-0 loss to Alabama and Tuberville resigned. Auburn made my Most Improved List in '09 meaning I thought they would go from a losing record to a bowl. The Tigers opened stronger than most anticipated. At 2-0 they were home vs WV and despite being outgained 509-400, they were +5 in TO's and won by 11. At 4-0 they made their first road trip of the season in front of 100,000+ and beat Tenn (led by 10 until the last play). Auburn finally entered the rankings at #17 prior to Ark but was thumped 44-23. Kentucky was playing without its QB and top 2 CB's but upset Auburn at home 21-14. LSU played its best game of the season routing Auburn and Chizik, who was being toasted at 5-0, was now being roasted at 5-3. They upset #24 Ole Miss and dispatched Furman to move to 7-3. Auburn led both Georgia and Bama 14-0 but came up short in both. In the bowl vs Northwestern they were outgained 621-425 but came away with an OT victory to finish 8-5. This year the Tigers have 15 ret st's and are in the 2nd year of Chizik's system. Last year despite their 3-5 SEC record, they were +6.9 ypg in SEC play (6th best). They get 4 key SEC games at home and my main set of power ratings calls for an 11-1 season with an 11-0 vs 11-0 showdown vs Alabama in game 12. The Tigers will top LY's 8 win total.

Aub has won 4 str ssn openers after going 1-3. In LY's opener Aub had two 100+ backs (148 McCalebb, 117 Tate). McCalebb became 1st frosh 100 yd rusher in an opener since Bo Jackson in '82.

The Tigers have won 8 of the L9 in this series and have outgained MSU in all 9 by 163 ypg. LY QB/WR Burns had 4 TD's in the 49-24 Aub win, most pts for Aub vs SEC team S/'05.

These schools are less than 250 miles apart. Auburn is 33-11-2 all-time vs Clemson winning the last 13 including the last meeting a 23-20 win in the '07 Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Auburn is 6-1-1 vs SC with the only loss in 1933. The last meeting was a 24-17 win by Auburn in '06 as the teams combined for 7 drives that were 9+ plays incl a 17 & 18 play drive.

Auburn is 7-0 vs ULM and 15-0 vs current Sun Belt teams with an avg score of 41-8. Auburn has shutout ULM in the last 2 meetings 34-0 in 2008 and 31-0 in 2004.

Auburn has won 7 straight (6 by DD) in Lexington, with the last loss in 1966. Last year Auburn led 14-7 at HT and into the 4Q but Kentucky scored two 4Q TD's.

Aub OC Malzahn faces his former team. There have been 4 straight upsets in this series & Auburn's loss last year at Arkansas was the first in 5 years for the road team.

The home tm is 9-1 in this series but Aub has been outgained by 146 yds the L4. LY's 31-10 win by LSU was unusual as the previous 5 meetings had been decided by a total of 19 points.

Auburn has now won 9 in a row the week following LSU. Aub only outgained Miss 401-394 in LY's 33-20 win but a 3-1 TO edge was in Aub's favor. The visitor has lost 3 straight.

Auburn has won 18 straight Homecoming games, the longest streak in school history. Auburn is 20-0 vs Chattanooga winning by an avg of 35-6 (last meeting 1995, 76-10).

Aub has dropped 6 of the L8 in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry. LY Aub jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the 1Q but UGA came back winning 31-24 for their 4th str series win.

Aub has now lost 2 in a row in the Iron Bowl after a 6 gm win streak in the series from 2002-'07. LY Aub outgained AL 332-291 holding the Tide to a ssn low 73 rush yds.
