

# BOISE ST BRONCOS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - Boise has had some fine QB's that excelled in their system in recent years with Bart Hendricks being the Big West Off MVP twice ('99 & '00) and Ryan Dinwiddie becoming the career leading passer (9,819) from '00-'03. Dinwiddie broke Danny Wuerffel's NCAA record for career pass eff (168.9). In 2006 Jared Zabransky (3 yr st'r) threw for 2,587 (66%, 23-8). Four QB's battled for the job in 2007 but Taylor Tharp won and had a fine season in his only year as a starter throwing for 3,340 (68%, 30-11). Michael Coughlin was 2nd string in '07. Bush Hamdan (16 car att) was the most exp'd of the 4 QB's battling in '08 and that included VHT rFr Kellen Moore (PS#24). Hamdan led out of the spring but I projected Moore as the starting QB and he narrowly won the job in Aug. Moore was the first frosh to start the season opener for Boise at QB and showed how much success a VHT could have in this system. He threw for 3,486 hitting a super 69% with a 25-10 ratio. Moore had a sensational 2009 season finishing #2 in the FBS in pass eff (161.5) throwing for 3,536 (64.3%) with an amazing 39-3 ratio. Coughlin played in 8 (12-19-50). Joe Southwick (6'1" 195 rFr, PS#41) was #3 and Mike Tamburo (5'11" 192 rFr, PS#77) ran the scout team until tearing an ACL. Moore is one of the best QB's in the country but it will be tough to top last year's stats.

**RUNNING BACKS** - Ian Johnson wrapped up his 4 year career in '08 as the school's #2 career rusher. He became the first Boise RB to have B2B 1,000 yard seasons ('06-'07) since '01-'02 but in his senior year, had just 766 (5.1) and was only 2nd Tm WAC. Spelling Johnson were Jeremy Avery (6'14, 5.5) and DJ Harper (265, 4.8). Harper (4.43 spd) stepped to the forefront last year and led with 284 (6.5) after just 3 but tore his ACL. Doug Martin, who had 107 (4.5) in '08 and moved to DB, was moved back to RB to split duties with Avery. Avery led with 1,151 (5.5) and Martin added 765 (5.9). RFr Matt Kaiserman (6'0" 185 So) played in just 4 (150, 4.5). This year they return 100% of their rushing yardage and not listed below are Raphael Lambert (5'7" 202 So, PS#76), Malcolm Johnson (5'10" 188 rFr, PS#91), Jarvis Hodge (5'9" 205 Sr, 102, 4.9), Carlo Audagnotti (5'7" 168 So), Drew Wright (5'9" 200 So) and FB's Jake Hess (5'10" 227 So, PS#220), Dave Wilson (6'1" 231 Jr) and Joey Paul (6'0" 226 rFr). They do lose FB Richie Brockel (4 st). This deep unit should be one of the top RB corps in the country.

**RECEIVERS** - VHT Jeremy Childs (PS#39) set a school record with 82 grabs (12.7) in '07. True frosh Titus Young (PS#152) and Austin Pettis (PS#127) finished #2 and #3 with 639 (14.5) and 465 (10.1), respectively. All 3 ret'd in '08 but Young played in just 3 (susp) and had 168 (16.8). Jeremy Childs and Vinny Perretta combined for 1,380 (12.8) and 9 TD's. Last year they had to replace 3 of their top 4 rec's with the top returnee being Pettis (567, 11.6). Pettis had 855 (13.6) but fractured his leg and

missed 1. Young led with 1,041 (13.2) and TE Kyle Efav was #3 with 444 (14.3). Tyler Shoemaker (missed 2) had 345 (16.4). Not in the PSL are Geraldo Hiwat (6'4" 197 rFr), Derek Hill (5'11" 158 rFr), Tyler Jackson (6'0" 198 So, PS#87), Aaron Burks (6'2" 189 rFr) and TE's Chandler Koch (6'2" 242 So, PS#54), Sean King (6'3" 244 Sr) and Gabe Linehan (6'3" 229 rFr, PS#44). This year the unit returns intact and should remain healthier.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In '06 with 3 st'rs back (lost #2DC) this unit paved the way for 5.1 ypc, their best IA ypc ever. The '07 unit featured their most exp'd line this decade (4 st'rs ret) and they allowed just 4.1% sks. Boise's ypg rush did drop to 185 (4.6). In '08 they had their least exp'd O-line of the decade as 5 of the top 6 were gone (lost 101 car sts). Their one returnee was 1st Tm WAC LT Andrew Woodruff. They used 9 different OL combos and as expected, the numbers dropped again to 152 ypg (4.4) with 13 sks (3.0%). Last year they had to replace 2 st'rs and had 40 career sts ret (#101 FBS). The more exp'd unit improved to 186 ypg (5.1) and allowed a paltry 5 sks (1.1%, #1 NCAA). This year they lose RG Kevin Sapient (12 st, 2 yr st'r) but return 1st Tm WAC LG Nate Potter. Their 88 career sts (9 w/st exp) ranks #28 in the FBS although Cory Yriarte (2 st '08) is not expected to play TY (2nd ACL tear). Not in the PSL are Matt Paradis (6'1" 269 rFr) and Jake Broyles (6'4" 268 rFr, PS#210). Boise has a Top 20 O-line (see pg 13).

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Boise had 7 of their top 8 DL's back for the 2nd straight year in '06 and allowed just 89 ypg rush (3.2), their best since joining IA. They had to replace 2 st'rs and 3 bkps in '07 and slipped to 131 ypg (3.8), their most since 2000. They had to replace 2 st'rs (1 bkp) in '08 and improved to 118 (3.2) and DE Ryan Winterswyk earned 1st Tm WAC. Last year they had to replace 4 DL (comb 34 sts) but returned Winterswyk. The numbers slipped but only to 120 ypg (3.8) while the sks dropped (34 to 26). This year they have their most exp'd front in a long time as the entire 2 deep returns and they add PS#39JC Tyrone Crawford. Not in the PSL are Ricky Tjong-A-Tjoe (6'3" 301 rFr), Greg Grimes (6'0" 273 So, PS#149) and Justin Jungblut (6'4" 255 rFr, PS#164). Winterswyk was 1st Tm WAC again (9 sk) and DT Billy Winn earned 2nd Tm WAC and Boise could top 2006's dominant rush D totals.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '08 Boise ret'd all 3 st'rs who were then their #1, #3 and #4 tk'lrs and all veteran seniors. One of the 3 lost his job. Last year they had to replace 2 st'rs (#3, #7 tk'lrs). The one returnee, Derrell Acrey, lost his job. PS#99JC Daron Mackey won a starting spot but was lost to an ACL after 8 sts and Acrey started 4. This year the entire 2 deep returns (8 w/st exp) with 4 having been full-time starters including 2nd Tm WAC Winston Venable. Last year they incorporated the NB into the D, which I include with the LB's. They add in PS#30 Byron Hout, who moves back from DE. Adding depth are Allen Mooney (5'10" 219 rFr, PS#107), Dustin Kamper (6'0" 219 rFr), Tommy Smith (6'1" 227 So), Billy Derome (5'11" 191 rFr) and John Michael Davis (6'0" 210 rFr).

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Boise always finishes strong in my pass D rankings. In fact, over the last 8 years ('02-'09) they have been #8, #6, #15, #52, #15, #20, #4 and #11. Last year they had all 4 st'rs back including CB Kyle Wilson (2nd Tm AA). This year they only lose Wilson (13 st, 43 tk, 3 int, 4 pbu, #1DC NYJ) and Garcia Day (3 tk). Not in the PSL is Quaylon Ewing (6'0" 183 rFr, PS#313). They return 5 with starting exp including 2-time 2nd Tm WAC SS Jeron Johnson (#1 tk'lfr). Despite the loss of their top guy this unit could be just as strong.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Boise has always had a top-notch ST unit and from '99-'08 they finished #32, #23, #28, #28, #2, #4, #19, #59, #10 and #2. All of their key players were back last year and I had them rated as the number #1 ST

unit in the country in the preseason and they did not disappointment me, finishing in my #1 spot. Kyle Brotzman has had exceptional nets in each of the last 2 years (39.6, '08 & 38.3, '09) and hit 18-25 FG's (long 52) LY but had just 7 TB on 97 KO (Trevor Harman may take over KO's). Kyle Wilson saw his PR avg drop from 14.2 in '08 to 10.4 in '09 and rFr Chris Potter avg 12.9. Titus Young led in KR with a super 26.9 (2 TD's). While they lose Wilson, Brotzman is back and this is one of the top ST units in the country once again.

**COACHES** - When Dirk Koetter left for Ariz St (after '00), asst Dan Hawkins took over as HC and went 53-11, achieving the school's then-highest finish ever in the AP poll in 3 consecutive years including #12 in '04. When Hawkins left for Colorado in '06, Chris Petersen (OC prev 5Y) took over. Petersen was a Broyles finalist (top asst) twice and his offenses, in a 3 year stretch from 2002-'04, avg'd 45.8 ppg. In his first year as HC Petersen achieved a 13-0 record and #5 finish. **He has a remarkable record of 49-4 with 3 undefeated regular seasons in his 4 years!** Last year Petersen's Broncos finished 14-0 (#4), and he became the first coach ever to win the Paul "Bear" Bryant COY Award twice. Petersen has turned down numerous offers from other schools. He will remain at Boise and signed a 5 year extension in Jan. His OC is Bryan Harsin, who is in his 10th season on the Bronco staff (grad asst '01, TE from '02-'05) and played here from '95-'99. DC Justin Wilcox left to become the DC at Tennessee and Petersen elevated DL coach Pete Kwiatkowski to DC for 2010.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Boise St dominated the WAC from 2002-'04 with a perfect 24-0 record in league play (+208.4, +176.4 and +191.3 ypg). In '05, Boise had the fewest lettermen lost in the league (13). For the first time Boise was ranked in the preseason coaches' poll (#18). Not bad for a school that was in just its 10th year of IA ball. They had their streak of 31 straight WAC wins end at Fresno (27-7) and saw their home win streak end at 31 in their loss to BC in the bowl. Their 4 losses (3 vs rank tms) were the most in 5 years. Boise still became the first team since BYU (1989-'93) to win 4 straight WAC Titles. Boise was +70.1 ypg vs WAC (3rd best). I pointed out that the last time they were -8 in turnovers, they rebounded with a 12-1 record (2002). **In 2006's magazine I projected Boise St to earn a BCS bowl berth.** I had to sweat out a couple close games (WY and SJSU) but Boise ran the table and then beat Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl. They finished #5 in the AP (5th straight WAC Title). In '07 they had to replace their QB and had just 5 ret off starters. Boise came into '07 ranked #24 but a loss to Wash moved their record to 0-13 on the road vs BCS schools and stopped their win streak at 14. In the battle for the WAC Title they lost to UH on the road by 12 and then dropped their bowl (also in Hawaii) to EC by 3. They were without RB Johnson (inj'd after 4 att) and top WR Childs (susp). Boise outgained WAC foes by 136.4 ypg. In '08 I was surprised Boise was picked 2nd in the WAC by the media (behind Fresno) as I had Boise my clear #1. They received a brand new blue surface on their field. They rolled to a dominating 12-0 season and ended their streak of road losses to BCS schools by upsetting #17 Oregon 37-32. At that point, they finally entered the polls at #17. Their only close game was Nevada, a 7 point win but they did lead 24-3. They made a point in the finale to wax Fresno 61-10. Boise outgained WAC foes by 188.3 ypg (better than their 13-0 team in '06) winning by an avg of 43-12. They did lose their bowl to TCU by 1. **Last year I listed Boise as the #1 non-BCS team** despite having to replace their top RB and WR and they did not disappoint me. Boise crushed Rose Bowl bound Oregon in the opening game, not allowing a FD until 7:07 was left in the 3Q. They did have a couple of close games but went undefeated and landed another Fiesta Bowl bid vs #3 TCU. After being outgained by TCU 472-250 in '08 they were the stronger team this time and won 17-10 and finished #4, their highest finish ever. Boise has now made 8 straight bowl appearances. Last year's squad had just 11 returning st'rs and this year 20 of 22 return. They were +144 ypg in the WAC (#2). They had only 8 sts lost to injury LY and were +21 in TO's. Boise figures to be AP Preseason #3, has not lost a reg season HG since 2001 and is now 68-4 in WAC play (62-2 since '02). Last year's squad had the fewest scholarship seniors in the country (4) with the next fewest being 9. If Boise beats Virginia Tech in the opener, they will be a National Title contender.

Played at FedEx Field home of the Redskins. The Broncos have beaten 4 of their last 5 BCS opp's including 2 wins the last 2 years (both over Oregon).

## BONUS: Coming into 2010, BSU is an amazing 36-0 in WAC home games!

BSU is 4-0 vs WY (1st gm in '02) but the L2 have been close as BSU was actually outgained in '06 & in the last matchup ('07) led just 7-0 at HT & finished w/only a +41 yd edge (FD's even).

BSU is 2-4 vs OSU but the home team has gone 5-1. The Broncos won the L/gm ('06) 42-14 w/a 407-263 yd edge. Boise St is 11-1 in home openers incl 8 str wins (4 vs FBS tms).

The L3Y BSU has outscored NMST 149-7 (2 shutouts) & outgained them on avg 548-143. LY BSU led 42-0 after 3Q's & the only NMST score came after a Broncos fumble on their own 17.

First meeting. Into 2010, BSU has won 20 straight non-conf gms on the blue. BSU is 7-3 vs current MAC teams and in the last 10 years they've won all 6 meetings by 30 ppg.

The Broncos have won all 10 vs the Spartans with an avg score of 45-16. LY BSU and SJST were tied mid-Q2 7-7 but Boise ended the gm on a 38-0 run holding SJST to just 87 yds.

Last year Boise St was up 27-7 at HT w/a 235-82 yd edge but allowed LT to get within 2 (30-28) early 4Q. Eight straight series wins & the four at home have been by 36 ppg.

BSU is 8-1 vs UH & have never dropped a home contest to the Warriors. L2Y BSU has handcuffed the UH offense holding them to 18 pts & 58 yds below their avg in '08 & 14 pts & 131 yds LY.

Since 2001 these instate schools have played for the Governor's Trophy and the Broncos have never given it up (9-0). Boise has dominated the last 6 years winning by 38 ppg.

Boise St is 8-1 vs Fresno St in WAC meetings & at home has gone 4-0 w/the avg MOV by 35 ppg outgaining the Bulldogs in each by at least 200+ yds (avg +235 ypg).
