

FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - Drew Weatherford (PS#15) was a 3 year str who threw for an avg of 2,470 (57%) with just a career 39-32 ratio. RfR Christian Ponder (PS#22) played in one (8-18-105, 2 int) game in '07 when Weatherford was inj'd. Surprisingly Weatherford was #3 QB in '08 with Ponder the clear-cut starter. Ponder was the Off MVP and threw for 2,006 (56%, 14-13). Ponder had a tremendous spring in '09 (0 int until spring gm). He threw for 2,717 (14-7) and his 68.8% was 2nd best in FSU history. He was having the best season here since 2000 (Chris Weinke) but unfortunately was lost vs Clemson. RfR EJ Manuel (PS#4) got his first start vs WF (15-20-220) but struggled in his next 2 sts (1-5 ratio). He said he was not 100% healthy but still earned the Bowl MVP. Last year was the first time FSU completed over 60% since Weinke's Heisman season of 2000 (only 5th time S/93). Adding depth will be Will Secord (6'1" 214 Rf, PS#116), Ridge Read (5'10" 191 So, PS#248), Andrew Nowels (6'2" 216 Jr) and Brandon Parks (5'11" 205 Jr). Ponder should be one of the best QB's in the country and Manuel is an excellent backup.

RUNNING BACKS - With all of the VHT's and NFL caliber talent former HC Bobby Bowden compiled at the RB position, it's amazing that FSU has not had a 1,000 yard rusher since Warrick Dunn ('96). In '05, FSU had their worst ypg (94, 3.3) rushing S/47 and "improved" to just 97 ypg (3.5) in '06. In '07 Antone Smith (PS#4) rushed for 819 (4.3) and FSU jumped to 128 (3.7). In '08 Smith had just 792 (4.5). Jermaine Thomas (PS#81) was not cleared until late Aug but he had 91 in the opener, 130 vs GT and 94 vs Clem where he suffered turf toe (49 over final 4, 482, 7.0). Thomas was the expected starter last year but was banged up and rushed for just 77 (3.0) in the first 5 (inj). Thomas became the first RB here S/02 to record 3 straight 100 yd gm incl 186 vs NCSU. Prior to MD he had his sights on 1,000 but finished with just 832 (5.1). Ty Jones (5'10" 211 Jr, PS#197) finished #2 with 251 (4.9). The unit got a boost late from true frosh Lonnie Pryor (156, 5.8). True frosh Chris Thompson (PS#29) added 120 (5.2). They lost their top 2 FB's prior to '09 then starting FB Daniel Gard (5'10" 204 Sr) missed 8 so they did not use a FB often (Pryor did st 4). Not listed in the PSL is FB Matthew Dunham (6'1" 258 Sr, PS#28). This year the unit returns intact, adds some talent and should have their best RB production in several years.

RECEIVERS - The FSU rec corps was hit hard by susp and inj's in '08 and in fact had its lowest ypg avg in 24 years (S/85). The top 2 WR's combined for just 914 (11.6). Last year they had to replace the top 2 and the top 3 returnees were Taiwan Easterling (PS#310, 322, 10.7), Bert Reed (295, 12.8) and Rod Owens (PS#68, 183, 12.2). In '09 Owens was #1 (729, 12.0) and Reed, who became more physical, was #2 with 710 (11.8) despite just 3 sts. Soph Jarmon Fortson (PS#75) had 610 (13.6) and Easterling had 442 (12.6). Richard Goodman (miss 5) had 355 (13.1). TE Caz Piurowski was lost after 6 sts (182, 14.0). This year they only lose Owens (13 st), Goodman (5 st) and Piurowski. Not listed below are Cameron Wade (6'5" 215 Jr, PS#144), Gerald Rogers (5'8" 139 rFr) and TE Anthony Porterfield (6'3" 218 rFr). With 3 of the top 4 rec's back, this unit is more experienced.

OFFENSIVE LINE - The OL struggled in '05 and '06. In '07 they had to replace 3 st's but brought in OL coach Rick Trickett who had outstanding success at WV. Two frosh and 1 soph started. At one point Trickett was down to just 7 healthy OL's (8 diff st's) but they still improved, avg 128 ypg rush (3.7) while allowing 22 sks (4.7%). In '08 they had to replace 4 st's (24 car sts ret, 5th fewest FBS). Trickett trimmed down a once hefty O-line (0 players 300+) and despite being very inexp'd, the unit improved to 179 ypg (4.8). Last year they had 89 career sts ret (#22) and only lost 3 sts to injury. Under those circumstances, I expected significant improvement but they avg'd just 150 ypg

rush (4.6) with 20 sks (4.6%). LG Rodney Hudson did win the Jacobs Blocking Award while earning 1st Tm AA. This year they only lose LG Brandon Davis (2 st) and should be one of the top O-lines in the country (146 car sts ret, #2 in FBS).

DEFENSIVE LINE - FSU almost always has a tough rush D and in '08 they had to replace 3 DL (19 st) and allowed 133 ypg (worst S/95, 3.8) but the D did have 39 sks. Last year they had to replace 2 st's (#2 DC). FSU almost always had 1 or 2 super pass rushing DE's but have not had one recently as LY their DE's comb for 4 sks (big focus in spg '10). The unit was hit hard by inj's (1 DL 12 st). The #s were amazing as they allowed an ACC high 205 ypg and 5.4 ypc (26 sks), their worst total S/76. This year they lose DE Kevin McNeil (9 st, 19 tkl, 2 sk), NT's Kendrick Stewart (6 st, 12 tkl), Justin Mincey (4 tkl) and Budd Thacker (3 st, 16 tkl). I expect a much bigger impact from PS#1DL Jacobbi McDaniel (2 st as true) and this unit can only improve.

LINEBACKERS - Last year the Noles had to replace their top 2 tkl's and a bkp with 4 sts. It was the first time in a few years they did not have to replace an NFL DC and they returned their #4, #7 and #13 tkl's. Kendall Smith (PS#21) finished as the #2 tkl'r and Nigel Bradham (PS#4) was #1. This year they lose 2nd Tm ACC SLB Dekoda Watson (12 st, #4 tkl'r, 6.5 sk, #7DC TB), Ricardo Wright (16 tkl) and Maurice Harris (1 st, 15 tkl). SLB Mister Alexander had just 17 tkl's but did have 5 sks. With the additions of true frosh Jeff Luc (PS#4, IFS) and Christian Jones (PS#2) they have 7 VHT's in their 3 deep. I look for improvement after the D yielded 30.0 ppg, their worst since 1973.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - FSU always used to rank at the top of my PDR (4 top 2 finishes, 16 yr). In '05 they had their worst finish ever at #74 and the next 3 yrs were a mediocre #43, #50 and #60. They had to replace 2 st's and a bkp with 7 sts. They had 3 ret with 19 combined sts in '08. FSU had their lowest finish ever at #102. This year they lose 2nd Tm ACC CB Patrick Robinson (12 st, 52 tkl, 11 pbu, #1DC NO), ROV Korey Mangum (11 st, 34 tkl) and FS Jamar Robinson (13 st, 74 tkl, 4 int, 6 pbu). They return Ochuko Jenije (PS#47), who had 4 int and Greg Reid (1st Tm Fr AA) who had an outstanding spring at CB this year. Seven in the 3 deep are VHT's including true frosh Lamarcus Joyner (PS#2) and PS#43JC Mike Harris. While they lose 3 st's, they have 16 sts back which is close to the '09 version. They can only improve.

SPECIAL TEAMS - FSU normally ranks in the Top 25 of my ST rankings. In '08 Graham Gano had a phenomenal season. He won the Lou Groza Award hitting 24-26 FG (long 53), had 9 TB on 37 KO and avg 42.7 (36.4 tm net) on punts. Gano set the school record with 13 straight FG's (Bill Capece '80). KR Michael Ray Garvin (30.1) and PR Tony Carter (14.1) helped them to a #3 finish. Unfortunately all 3 had to be replaced last year. Exciting true frosh Reid (PS#9) was the top KR (25.5) and

PR (18.4). New K true frosh Dustin Hopkins (PS#1) had a 65 yd FG in practice in HS and hit 19-27 FG's (long 52) and was #5 in FBS with 24 TB on KO. Soph P Shawn Powell avg 41.6 (36.1 net). Battling at LS are Chris Revell (6'0" 203 rFr) and Franklin Nicholas (5'10" 195 rFr). The unit finished #26 and should be near the top again this year.

COACHES - College Football Hall of Famer Bobby Bowden reluctantly retired #2 in the FBS for career wins (389 in 44 yrs) after 34 seasons at FSU. In '07 OC Jimbo Fisher came over from LSU (OC 7 yrs) but surprisingly the team had its lowest ppg (23.3) since 1981 (21.8). In Fisher's 2nd year the team improved to 33.4 and he was named Bowden's successor and took over many duties, even some on game day. He now is tasked with replacing a legend and has made many staff changes. The new OC is James Coley who also coached FSU's TE coach and was recruiting coor the last 2 yrs. Coley was the OC at FIU in '07 and was an off asst with the Miami Dolphins prior. DC Mickey Andrews (26 yrs) also retired and the new DC is Mark Stoops. Stoops spent the last 6 years as the DC at Arizona under his brother Mike. Greg Hudson has been named asst HC of Defense after 5 years as the DC/DL/LB cch at East Carolina.

PHIL'S FORECAST

FSU had an amazing run of 14 straight years of finishing in the Top 5 in the final polls but has not been back since 2000! In '05, they had an inexp'd and injury-plagued squad that got as high as #4. FSU was 7-1 but then suffered 3 straight losses for the first time S/83. At the time their 3 ACC losses were the most ever, but they still took home the Atlantic Title and upset VT to win their 12th ACC Title (only +28.5 ypg, 6th best). FSU was the only team in the country to appear in a Jan bowl 15 straight years heading into '06. In '06, they "earned" 39 points in my Draft Day Party Hangover (pg 308). FSU opened #11 but went just 6-6 including their first-ever shutout loss at home (WF 30-0!) under Bowden (31 yr). They had a big 4Q in the bowl to rally past UCLA to squeak out a winning season. After having just 9 scholarship Sr's in '06, they had 18 in '07 and with the infusion of new coaches, things looked to be on the rise. Surprisingly FSU finished just 7-6 after a bowl loss with 20+ players susp or inj'd. They finished 4th in the Atlantic. In '08 they had 15 ret st's, the most since the '99 Nat'l Title team. FSU basically had 8 HG's but had some key players susp'd the first 3 and lost to WF again. The Noles rose to 6-1 (#16) when they fmb'd into the EZ for a TB vs GT and lost by 3. They did beat Wisconsin 42-13 in the Champs Sports Bowl and finished 9-4 (#21). Last year they had 13 ret st's and were the media preseason favorite to win the Atlantic (I had Clemson). They ret'd just 47.6% of their total tkl's from '08. They also faced my #2 toughest schedule. Their final pass into the EZ was dropped in a Monday night loss to Miami. On a short week vs an FCS opponent, FSU trailed Jax St but scored twice in the final :35 to escape. They were a large underdog to #7 BYU but made it a "sod" game and won 54-28. USF was playing without starting QB Matt Grothe but backup frosh BJ Daniels (from Tallahassee) led the Bulls to a 17-7 upset. BC had Gameday on hand and on a rainy day, beat FSU 28-21. FSU scored all 5 times they had the ball in the 1H vs GTech (403 yd) and led 35-28 but couldn't hold serve in the 2H and lost by 5 falling to 2-4 (their worst mark to open S/76 - Bowden's first yr). On a Thurs night they trailed NC 24-6 but rallied for a 30-27 win. They had their smallest home crowd since 1993 and got a TD with 1:36 left to get past NCSU. Ponder had 4 int and was inj'd in a 40-24 loss to Clemson. Manuel led the wins over WF and MD. The Terps led 26-22 with 4:29 left and although FSU was int'd at the MD40 with 2:57 left, they still won. After an expected loss to Florida, Bowden was basically forced out and the team sent him out on a winning note with a 33-21 win over WV in the Gator Bowl. Jimbo Fisher steps into a good situation as this team has not had DD wins since '03. FSU has been to 28 consec bowl games. They are loaded on offense with 9 ret st's and Christian Ponder

figures to be one of the top QB's in the country. They get most of their toughest ACC foes at home and 7 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for a double digit win season.

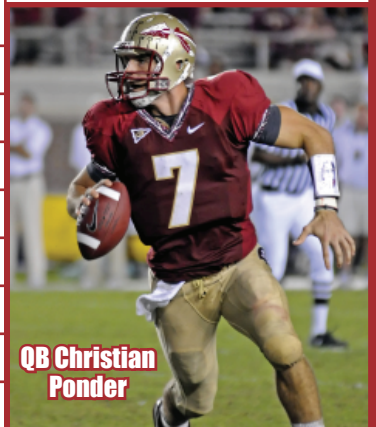
