

GEORGIA BULLDOGS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - Last year I pointed out that Mark Richt was hoping for a season like '05 out of his QB's. In '05 UGA had to replace their career leading passer, David Greene (#3DC). DJ Shockley (PS#3) was lightly tested but led UGA to the SEC Title earning 1st Tm SEC and throwing for 2,588 (56%) with an outstanding 24-5 ratio (322 rush) in '05. Matthew Stafford was the QB the next 3 yrs and in '08 threw for 3,459 (61%) with a 25-10 ratio (#1 overall pick NFL). Joe Cox's stats last year were eerily similar to Shockley's as he threw for almost the identical yds (2,584), comp % (56) and same amount of TD's (24, 1 off UGA record). The 3 areas that were different were the rush yds (-28), int (+10) and no SEC Title. The 17 total QB int were the most at UGA since 1984. Cox started all 13 and his bkp was soph Logan Gray (PS#19) who was more mobile. Gray was expected to move to WR TY leaving the battle between 2 rFr in Aaron Murray (PS#6) and Zach Mettenberger (PS#24), but Mettenberger was dismissed in spring (Gray is considering a transfer). Even though they are less exp'd than LY, they are not replacing a #1DC and UGA's comp % and ratio could improve in '10.

RUNNING BACKS - Surprisingly heading into '07 UGA had just one 1,000 yd back since '92! In '07 rFr Knowshon Moreno (PS#14, 1334, 5.4) was the first 1st Tm SEC RB here since Garrison Hearst in 1992. In '08 Moreno became the 2nd back in UGA history (Herschel Walker) to have B2B 1,000 yd efforts (#1 SEC, 1400, 5.6). RFr Caleb King (PS#7) rushed for 247 (4.0) but after missing a key block had just 1 att over the L4 gm. True frosh Richard Samuel (PS#10) had 133 (5.1). Moreno opted to leave early (#1DC DEN) and King was the frontrunner into Aug last year but injured his hamstring (miss 1st 2). The speedy Samuel led in rushing in each of the first 3 (104 vs Ark). They also used DB Brandon Smith (4.3 spd) in the Wildcat package (208, 12.2). Samuel had an 80 yd TD in the Ark game but lost 2 fmb and his PT decreased as King ret'd. King was #2 with 594 (5.2) in 5 sts. They took the RS off Washaun Ealey (PS#3) with 7:07 left in the 3Q vs LSU (Wk 5). Ealey went on to lead with 717 (5.7). Samuel finished with just 395 (4.5) and moved to LB in spring. This year the unit returns intact and not listed below are Carlton Thomas (5'7" 180 So, PS#35), FB's Kevin Lanier (5'11" 209 So), Charles White (6'1" 224 Jr, PS#45) and Cameron Allen (6'1" 209 So, PS#419). UGA had a pair of 100 yd rushers vs GT (Ealey and King) but just three 100 yd efforts all year and I look for significant improvement.

RECEIVERS - In 2008 the Bulldogs ret'd their #2 rec Mohamed Massaquoi (PS#5, 491, 15.3 in '07) and added exciting true frosh AJ Green (PS#3). They formed the best duo in the SEC with Green leading with 963 (17.2) and Massaquoi adding 920 (15.9). Michael Moore (PS#15) had 451 (15.6). Last year they had to replace Massaquoi (#2DC) and Green was inj'd (miss 3) so his numbers dropped to 808 (15.2). RFr Tavarres King (PS#6) was a distant #2 with 377 (20.9). Moore's numbers dropped to 249 (10.0) and true frosh Rantavious Wooten (PS#40) had 197 (19.7). Richt has sent four TE's to the NFL since his arrival here, but LY projected starting TE Bruce Figgins (PS#23) RS. TE's Aron White (PS#12), true frosh Orson Charles (PS#2) and Arthur Lynch (PS#4) combined for 38 rec's (15.5). This year they only lose Moore (5 st). Figgins returns and Green is back to full health making UGA my #2 receiving corps in the NCAA (see pg 13).

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '07 UGA had to replace 3 s'trs who were 1st and 2nd Tm SEC and a #6DC. Three frosh started including 2 true but the Bulldogs surprisingly improved to 177 ypg rush (4.5) while trimming their sk total to 15. In 2008 they lost two s'trs and then LT Trinton Sturdivant was lost in Aug (knee inj). That made it a very young group again and in the 2H of the yr, the OL consisted of 2 soph and 3 frosh. The numbers slipped to 148 ypg rush (4.5) with 17 sks (4.3%). All 5 s'trs ret'd LY and they got back Vince Vance (6 st until inj '08) and Sturdivant giving it the potential to be the best OL here since '05. Unfortunately Sturdivant

tore his ACL again in Wk 1 and RT Josh Davis missed the first 6. UGA only improved to 161 ypg rush (4.7) but led the SEC with just 12 sks (3.5%) allowed. They avg 243 ypg (5.9) rush the L5 gms after a slow start (110 ypg, 3.6 first 8). This year they lose LG Vance (4 st) and bkps Casey Nickels (11 gm) and Kevin Perez (3 gm). This unit has an amazing 155 career starts (counting Justin Anderson who moved to the DL in spg) which is #1 in the FBS (my #1 OL unit) and includes 2nd Tm SEC LT Clint Boling and 2nd Tm SEC C Ben Jones with 11 VHT's in the 3 deep.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '07 UGA had to replace 2 starting DE's and 2 DT's (comb 8 sts) but only allowed 110 ypg rush (3.3) and led the SEC in sks with 42. In '08 they had to replace their top sack man, then lost DT Jeff Owens in Wk 1. The unit was banged up all year and surprisingly dropped to #8 in the SEC in sacks (18 reg ssn) and the rush D slipped to 122 ypg (3.6). Last year they had to replace 4 DL (comb 25 sts) but got Owens back. DE Roderick Battle was lost after 2 sts (ACL), but they actually improved to 3.4 ypg (126 ypg) with 30 sks. This year they lose DT Owens (13 st, 32 tkl, 1.5 sk, #7DC PHI), DT Kade Weston (10 st, 29 tkl, 2.5 sk, #7DC NE), 2nd Tm SEC DT Geno Atkins (3 st, 36 tkl, 3 sk, #4DC CIN), Battle (3 tkl), Montez Robinson (2 sk) and Brandon Wheeling (7 tkl). They are switching to a 3-4 and the 3 deep has 7 VHT's. DC Grantham's system is similar to New England and Bama and requires a massive NT (called nose). Last year they basically had 2 s'trs back to a 4 man DL and this year have 1 back to a 3 man line.

LINEBACKERS - This has been an inj plagued unit the last 2 years. Last year they lost their starting MLB (9 st) but ret'd 3 who had 8+ career starts including their top 3 LB tkl'sr. The star of the unit was clearly Rennie Curran (#1 tkl'r 10 of 12 gm). This year they lose 1st Tm SEC Curran (12 st, 130 tkl, 5 tfl, #3DC TEN), SLB Darius Dewberry (6 st, 23 tkl) and MLB Marcus Washington (9 tkl). They shift to a 3-4 so 2nd Tm SEC DE Justin Houston, who is the top returning sk man in the SEC is now a LB and they move RB Richard Samuel (PS#10) in giving them 6 with starting exp and 8 VHT's in the 3 deep. Even with the loss of their star, provided this unit stays healthier, it should be stronger.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UGA had a veteran unit in '08 but after finishing #8 and #17 in my PDR the previous 2 years, they surprisingly dropped to #57. LY they had to replace 2 s'trs (#3DC) and once again had a lower than expected finish at #74. This year they lose CB Prince Miller (13 st, 42 tkl, 2 pbu), SS Reshad Jones (13 st, 73 tkl, 4 int, 7 pbu, #5DC MIA), FS Bryan Evans (13 st, 50 tkl, 3 pbu), and Makiri Pugh (2 tkl). They add PS#4JC Jakar Hamilton (IFS) and true frosh Alec Ogletree (PS#5) and while they should move up in the PDR, this is a less exp'd unit and my biggest concern on the 2010 team.

SPECIAL TEAMS - This unit is always strong under Richt. From '01-'08 they had six Top 24 finishes including #5, #6 and #2. Last year they had to replace their outstanding P Brian Mimbs (37.5 net) and their top KR. Drew Butler (PS#21), whose father

Kevin is the only K in the CFB HOF, simply took home the Ray Guy Award for best P in the country with an amazing avg of 48.1 (net 41.9). Blair Walsh hit 15-23 FG's (long 52) in '08 but Richt was unhappy with his KO's. Walsh improved with 17 TB's on 75 KO's holding off JC Brandon Bogotay and almost setting a UGA single season FG accuracy record (missed 55 yd FG in the wind vs GT). He hit 20-22 FG's (long 53, four 50+). The new LS was rFr Ty Frix whose father was a LS here in their magical 1980 season. Brandon Boykin became the 2nd SEC player to have 3 KR TD's in the same season (Willie Gault, UT, 1980). This year they only lose PR Miller (11.9) and with the best K/P/KR combo in the country, they could improve upon '09's outstanding #6 ST finish.

COACHES - Mark Richt was the SEC COY in '02 and '05. In '08, Richt received a pay raise bringing his salary to \$2.8 mill per year through 2013. Richt turned the playcalling over to Mike Bobo prior to the GT game in '06. Bobo, who was a QB here, became the youngest coor in the SEC (32) when he was promoted to OC in '07. Richt was forced to part ways with DC Willie Martinez (5 yrs) as UGA's defense went from allowing 17.6 ppg in '06 to 20.2 in '07, 24.5 in '08 and 25.9 in '09. After an exhaustive search, the new DC is Todd Grantham. Grantham has 11 yrs of NFL coaching experience most recently as the DL coach with Dallas the last 2 yrs. Prior to that he was the DC of the Browns from '05-'07.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 2002 Mark Richt led Georgia to their first SEC Title in 20 yrs and set a school record with 13 wins and finished #3. They had just 9 s'trs back in 2003 and despite a spate of inj's and susp, were 11-3 and outgained SEC foes by a league best 121.8 ypg finishing #7. In '04 Richt had his most veteran squad yet and finished 10-2 (+105 ypg in SEC play). They also beat Florida for the first time since 1997. In '05 they had 12 senior s'trs but had to replace 6 NFL DC's. My publication was the ONLY one in the country to call for UGA to win the SEC East as everyone else had them finishing 3rd! They nearly went undefeated but QB Shockley was injured and they lost to UF by 4 without him. With Shockley not 100% the next wk, they lost to Aub by 1. They throttled LSU in the SEC Title game but came up short in the Sugar Bowl to finish 10-3 and #10. Only UGA and USC finished in the Top 10 each year from 2002-'05. UGA's D finished in the Top 20 for 7 straight years from '01-'07. Richt became just the 5th SEC coach to win 10+ gms in 4 straight years (Bryant, Dooley, Fulmer, Spurrier). In 2006 they had just 9 ret s'trs and struggled at QB. They opened 5-0 (up to 9) but lost 4 of their next 5. They won their final 3, all vs ranked tms to finish #23. In '07 they once again had just 9 ret s'trs. They were picked #3 in the East by the media. Mine was the only magazine to pick them to win the SEC East as I had them tying for the Title. UGA went 6-2 and tied Tenn for the SEC East Title. I had them ranked 11th which was higher than any other publication and the Bulldogs finished #2. UGA won their final 7 including a 42-30 whipping of Fla and they crushed Hawaii in the Sugar Bowl 41-10. In 2008 they had the most veteran unit in the SEC (15 ret s'trs) and were tagged #1 in the preseason AP poll. Of the 14 sources from football.stassen.com, 10 had UGA either #1 or #2, but I had the Bulldogs 2nd in the SEC East mostly due to a killer schedule including a brutal 4 game road trip. UGA finished 10-3 and ranked #13. They were +73.8 ypg in SEC play, 4th best. Last year they had to replace QB Stafford, RB Moreno and WR Massaquoi but were coming off a year in which they had 44 sts lost to inj. UGA entered #13 in the AP poll but their QB's tossed 17 int's. They dominated the first 29:00 but St but lost on the road 24-10. They rebounded with wins vs SC, Ark and Ariz St. The next week vs LSU they suffered a questionable celebration penalty which set LSU up for the game winning TD. They were pounded by Tenn 45-19 (not even scoring an off TD) and fell to 3-3 and Richt was under fire. They beat Vandy 34-10 and were talking revenge vs Fla but were pounded again 41-17. After expected wins vs Tenn Tech and Aub at home, they had a 487-260 yd edge vs UK but lost by 7 due to 4 TO's. They took advantage of the fact that GT had the ACC Title game on deck with a 30-24 win. In the bowl, UGA was not as impressive as the 44-20 win (outgained 471-366). They had 2 net close wins and were -21.0 ypg in SEC play (-16 in TO's). This season they have 15 ret s'trs (3rd most SEC) and have had 13 consec 8+ win seasons. I will call for UGA to top LY's 8 win total as they are a prime contender in the SEC East. My main 2 sets of power ratings call them the #7 and #8 team in the NCAA.

Richt is 8-1 in season openers, losing for the 1st time LY 24-10 at Okl St. The Bulldogs are 38-4 vs non-conf opp under Richt and 8-0 vs the SunBelt (avg score 45-12).

Georgia has won 7 of the last 8 meetings incl 4 straight in Columbia by an avg of 16-8. The winner has scored 20 pts or less in 7 of the last 9 years (but LY UGA had 41).

LY UGA broke a 3 gm losing streak in conf home opener. UGA is 9-3 vs Ark with Richt 5-0 in his career. LY UGA trailed 35-34 into the 4Q but QB Cox threw 1 of his 5 TD passes for the win.

Georgia is 16-5 vs Mississippi St and has won the last 9 in this series. They won the 4 in Starkville by 15 ppg. UGA escaped with a 27-24 win in Athens in the last meeting in '06.

UGA is 15-8 vs current Big 12 tms incl 1-1 LY. In the only previous meeting, UGA escaped with a 14-13 win in Athens in '06. Into 2010, Richt is 33-6 in opp's home stadiums.

LY Tennessee dominated with a 472-241 yd edge and held UGA without an off TD. UGA KR Boykin tied an NCAA record with his second 100 yd KR TD of the season.

Georgia has dominated this series winning 14 of 15 with Vanderbilt's last win in '06. In the last 7 meetings UGA has outgained UV by 144 ypg holding them to 267 ypg.

UGA's 487 yds vs KY last year were the most in a loss in SEC play in Richt's 9 yrs. UGA is 16-3 in this series since 1991 but the Bulldogs have lost 2 of the last 4.

UGA leads the series 46-39-2 and all but 10 of those gms have been in Jacksonville. UGA has been outscored 90-27 the L2 yrs vs Florida but only outgained by 63 ypg.

First meeting. The Bengals went 1-10 in 2009 including a 50-3 loss to Ariz St & a 64-0 loss to Oklahoma. UGA is 6-0 vs FCS teams under Richt winning by an avg of 45-14.

The Bulldogs have now won 4 in a row by 29 ppg in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry. Last time here UGA scored a 4Q TD then held Auburn on a 4th & 1 at the GA14.

BONUS: Georgia is 18-6 off a bye under HC Richt.

UGA has won 8 of the last 9 in this rivalry, ending the reg ssn vs GT in 56 of the L57 years. LY Georgia rushed for 339 yds, the most ever under Richt in a 30-24 win.

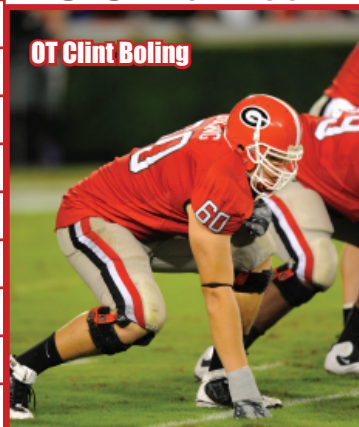
