

IOWA HAWKEYES

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - In '07 Jake Christensen replaced the school's #2 career passer Drew Tate. Playing behind an OL with 1 ret st'r Christensen was sacked 46 times in '07 and was last in the Big Ten in pass efficiency (2269, 54%, 17-6). Ricky Stanzi played in 2 (0-4 pass). In '08 Christensen started the opener but Stanzi took charge of the job. Stanzi threw for 1,956 (59%, 14-9). Christensen threw 63 passes and transferred to E Illinois. Stanzi was the clear-cut st'r in '09 and proved to be a clutch performer in the 4Q. In the 1Q of games he completed 51%. He improved to 53% in the 2Q, 57% in the 3Q and an outstanding 67% (pass eff rating 200.2) in the 4Q. Stanzi threw for 2,417 (56.3%) and while he had 17 TD's, he also had 15 int (4 IR TD's) including 5 vs Indiana. Stanzi was inj in the 2Q vs NW in Iowa's 1st loss of the season and James Vandenberg struggled in relief. Vandenberg got his first start vs an excellent Ohio St defense on the road with the Big Ten Title on the line and threw for 233 yds and 2 TD's but with 3 int's. He finished with 470 (48.3%, 2-5). This year both QB's return and adding depth are John Wienke (6'5" 220 So, PS#26) and Wyatt Sues (6'2" 200 rFr, PS#209). Stanzi should have a fine senior season.

RUNNING BACKS - In 2008 this unit was a major question mark as the top 2 RB's out of spg were Nate Guillory (PS#26JC) and walk-on Paki O'Meara (5'11" 211 Sr) and the leading returning rusher was a WR (19 yds '07). Guillory transferred and Shonn Greene made it back from JUCO to take over the starting job. Greene had a year well beyond expectations rushing for a UI record 1,850 (6.0) with 20 TD's and was the #3DC of NYJ where he had a terrific playoff run in his rookie year. True frosh Jewel Hampton (PS#186) had 463 (5.1) and O'Meara added 62 (3.0). Last year Hampton injured his knee over the summer so the position was back in the same state as '08. A couple of rFr in Jeff Brinson (PS#120) and Adam Robinson (PS#198) started getting reps as did true frosh Brandon Wegher (PS#5). Surprisingly Robinson, who got the last scholarship of his class and was tried at S in the spring, emerged as the st'r. He rushed for 834 (4.6) despite missing 2 (ankle) and wasn't 100% in others. Wegher was a late scratch vs Ohio St but finished with 641 (4.0). O'Meara had 35 (2.2). Brinson (3 gms, inj) transferred. Not listed below are Brad Rogers (5'10" 215 rFr, PS#77) and Jason White (5'10" 205 So). While they probably will not match Greene's '08 stats, this is Iowa's most exp'd unit in the last 3 years.

RECEIVERS - Last year the Hawkeyes had to replace 2 of their top 3 rec's but ret'd the #1 man in Derrick Johnson-Koulianos ("DJK") who had 639 (14.5) in '08. DJK missed one game and was 2nd string in 5 outings but still led with 750 (16.7). 6'4" Marvin McNutt (PS#43QB) was #2 with 674 (19.8) including the game winning rec vs MSU after moving over from QB in the spring. Trey Stross (PS#24) added 414 (13.4) and Tony Moeaki, who battled foot injuries in '08, added 387 (12.9) despite missing 3. This year they lose Stross (12 st) and Moeaki (10 st, #3DC KC). Not listed below are Steven Staggs (6'3" 195 So, PS#148), Ben Evans (6'0" 178 Sr), Nick Kuchel (5'11" 195 Sr), Don Nordmann (6'6" 211 Sr), Paul Chaney (5'9" 170 Sr, PS#89) and TE's Zach Furlong (6'5" 248 Jr), Jon Gimm (6'3" 240 So, PS#29), Dakota Getz (6'4" 230 rFr, PS#151) and Zach Derby (6'3" 235 So, PS#155). With the top 2 rec's back they have a little more exp than '09.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Kirk Ferentz was an NFL OL coach which means this unit is always one of his top priorities and he's had 10 OL drafted in his tenure. In '02 he developed what was arguably the best OL in the NCAA. They paved the way for 5.0 ypc rushing (just 13 sk). In '07 Iowa basically had one ret st'r (lost 2 DC's & a 1st Tm B10 OG). As you would expect, Iowa struggled with just 126 ypg (3.5) and 46 sks (12.2%). In '08 the

entire 2 deep ret'd and the more exp'd unit improved to 189 ypg (best S/'02) rush (4.8) with 27 sks (8.4%). Last year they had to replace 2 st'r's but had 99 career sts (#10 FBS). Surprisingly the numbers dropped (114 ypg, 3.3) with 29 sks (2.4%). Injuries hurt them (9 sts missed) and Bryan Bulaga wasn't 100% when he ret'd but this unit clearly underperformed. This year they lose the B10 OLPOY in Bulaga (10 st, #1DC GB), 2nd Tm B10 C Rafael Eubanks (13 st), 2nd Tm B10 T Kyle Calloway (12 st, #7DC BUF), G Dace Richardson (8 st), G Dan Doering (1 st, 5 gm) and G Andy Kuempel (5 gm). They have just 4 of their top 10 ret (36 car st). This group is a lot less exp'd (lose 128 car sts) and less talented but could produce better numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '08 Iowa had to replace both DE's (2nd Tm B10 and #4DC) but did have 6 of the top 8 back including perhaps Iowa's best ever DT combo of Mitch King (B10 DLPOY) and Matt Kroul (50 consec sts). That unit allowed just 94 ypg rush (3.1) but the team had just 19 sks. Last year they had to replace both of their star DT's and as you would expect, the rushing numbers increased to 124 ypg (3.5) despite DE Adrian Clayborn's emergence (11.5 sk). Clayborn turned down a shot at the NFL so the only loss this yr is DT Travis Meade (1 tkl). With 4 st'r's back who combined for 252 tkl's, 27 sks and 26 flt in '09, this is my #3 rated D-line.

LINEBACKERS - After having an inexp'd LB corps in '08, the Hawks ret'd their top six (#1, #2 and #6 tkl/r's all VHT). Last year it was one of the top LB units in the country but this year they lose 1st Tm AA Pat Angerer (13 st, #1 tkl/r, 5 flt, #2DC IND) and 2nd Tm B10 AJ Edds (13 st, #4 tkl/r, 4.5 flt, #4DC MIA). They return PS#13 Jeremih Hunter and in the one game he missed, Troy Johnson was the B10 DPOW vs Minny. This group has potential but it is clearly less experienced.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In '08, JC Amari Spivey beat out one of the Hawks 2 ret st'r's as UI finished #7 in my PDR (9-23 ratio). LY they had to replace 1 st'r (#3DC) and Jordan Bernstine (PS#11, proj st'r) broke his ankle in Aug. With 3 ret st'r's they were one of six teams in the country to allow less than 50% comp (49.6%) with just a 9-21 ratio (#6 PDR). This year they lose 1st Tm B10 CB Spivey (13 st, 56 tkl, 2 int, 8 pbu, #3DC DET) and FS Joe Konklm (1 st, 11 tkl, 1 int). Not in the PSL are Nick Nielsen (6'3" 210 So) and Justin Greiner (5'10" 185 Sr). While they have just 1 VHT in the 3 deep, they do return 1st Tm B10 SS Tyler Sash and 2nd Tm B10 FS Brett Greenwood and have 5 back who started in '09. This is the Big Ten's best secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Ferentz believes his ST unit should be the great equalizer allowing Iowa to contend with teams with superior talent. Heading into '06, Iowa had finished #2, #2, #18 and #20 in my ST rankings. They surprisingly finished #76 in '06, #62 in '07 and inched up to #48 in '08. Last year they only had

to replace their top PR. P Ryan Donahue (net 37.0 '08) had a 37.1 net. In '08 Trent Mossbrucker was the main FG guy hitting 13-15 (L/39) while Daniel Murray hit 6-9 (L/45). Murray hit 19-26 (long 48, 1 miss 53) in '09 (Mossbrucker RS). Murray also had 5 TB's on 66 KO's. DJK was the top KR (31.5) and true frosh Brandon Wegher was #2 (23.8). Iowa moved up to #27 and with everyone back should find itself back in the top 20 in '10.

COACHES - Kirk Ferentz is among the highest paid coaches in the NCAA and was named the Big Ten COY in '02, '04 and '09. In '02 he led Iowa to its first Big Ten Title since '90 and also the most wins in school history (11) which he tied last yr. NFL scouts feel this coaching staff is one of the NCAA's best and there has been little staff turnover. After another round of NFL rumors, Ferentz was given a contract extension through 2015. Ken O'Keefe has been the OC for 12 years. He was the HC at Fordham in '98 and at Allegheny from '90-'97. DC Norm Parker also enters his 12th year. Parker was named the SEC DC of the Year in '97 while at Vandy. He was also a finalist in both '04 and '05 for the Broyles Award.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Kirk Ferentz was 2-18 in his first 20 games but is 79-37 since that rough start. The record setting '02 team played in the Orange Bowl (8-0 B10) despite being out FD'd 102-66 in their first four Big Ten games. In '03 they slipped to 5-3 in Big Ten play but got their first Jan win since 1959 when they beat Florida in the Outback Bowl. In '04 they had just 9 st'r's back. They opened just 2-2 but rallied for a 10-2 record incl a bowl win over LSU. That marked their 3rd straight DD win season (#8 AP all 3 yrs)! The '04 Hawks benefitted from +13 in turnovers. In '05 the Hawks had 12 ret st'r's and were the preseason AP #11 but suffered through a disappointing year (7-5) incl an Outback Bowl loss. Heading into '06, Iowa was one of 4 teams to go to 4 straight Jan bowls. They ret'd 14 st'r's and had a veteran senior QB but surprisingly after their close bowl loss to Texas, had their first losing season since 2000. Their 31 TO's (-11) were the most S/89. In Ferentz's first 8 seasons just 32 true frosh played but he used 11 in '07. After going 20-4 vs the Big Ten from 2002-'04, they went just 11-13 from 2005-'07. Arrests and problems with players' Facebook pgs came up in '07 and '08. Iowa did suffer some tough losses in '07 and after a loss to WM, they fell to 6-6 with no bowl for the first time since 2000. While Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play, they were -89 ypg (2nd worst). In '08 they did not face Ohio St or Mich for the 2nd straight year. The Hawkeyes were actually inches away from contending for the Big Ten Title (see my 2009 mag). Over the '09 summer on philsteele.com I asked if they were this year's Alabama. In '07 Bama's 6 losses were by 3, 7, 7, 5, 7 and 7. The Tide, despite having 4 tough road games finished the '08 reg season #1 in the country (12-0). Iowa had 4 tough road games heading into '09 and their '08 losses were by 1, 5, 3 and 3 pts. Iowa nearly went unbeaten. They did block 2 game winning FG attempts at the end to pull out a win vs FCS N Iowa. After beating Iowa St and Ariz, they trailed Penn St in the 4Q but a blk'd punt for a TD and then 3 consec PSU TO's led to a 21-10 win. The next week, in a letdown spot they led 21-7 but gave up a 75 yd IR TD and only won by 3 vs Ark St. Against Michigan they were +4 in TO's but only won by 2. They trailed Wisc 10-0 in the 2Q but rallied for a 20-10 win. They needed a 7 yd TD pass on the last play to get past Mich St. At 8-0 #7 Iowa trailed Indy 21-7 in the 3Q. The Hawks got a huge break when Indy controversially had a TD overturned and then missed a FG and Iowa rallied for a misleading 42-24 win. The next week they lost QB Stanzi to injury vs NW and Vandenberg hit just 9-27-82 and they were upset. With the Big Ten Title on the line they travelled to Ohio St where they lost by 3 in OT as Vandenberg threw the game clinching int. After shutting out Minn the defense throttled a seemingly unstoppable G Tech offense in the Orange Bowl holding them to 155 yards and 9 FD's and the Hawkeyes finished 11-2 and #7. This year they

do have 14 ret st'r's and will be in the preseason Top 10. Despite their 6-2 record they were only +27.8 ypg (4th best) and did have 2 net close wins in '09. Iowa gets Penn St, Ohio St and Wisconsin at home and are a legitimate Big Ten contender.

First meeting. Iowa has won 9 straight home openers by an avg score of 40-6. Panthers finished 8-4 LY including a 52-3 loss to Penn St but made it to the FCS playoffs.

Iowa has held instate rival ISU out of the EZ for 14 straight quarters and the HT is 5-1. Last year Iowa trailed 3-0 but took advantage of 6 ISU TO's that resulted in 28 pts.

Iowa is 4-8 in true rd openers incl a 44-7 loss to ASU ('04) & a 35-11 loss to Arizona ('98). LY Iowa led 27-10 (all'd just 190 yds) before the Wildcats scored a garbage TD w/1:53 left.

In their only meeting ('05) Iowa cruised to a 56-0 home win with a 297 yard edge. The Hawkeyes are 18-2 vs current MAC tms but lost the last meeting in '07 (28-19 vs WM).

Iowa has upset Penn St in 5 of the last 8 meetings including B2B years despite being out-gained in each game. Last time here Iowa kicked the GW FG w/:01 left vs #3 PSU.

LY Iowa got a big interception stopping a UM drive at the UI31 w/46 left in the 2 pt win. Iowa has been shutdown running vs UM the last 4 meetings avg just 62 ypg (2.0).

Iowa has won the L/2 and 6 of the last 8 meetings. Last year the Hawkeyes trailed 10-3 at HT to the Badgers but held them to just 58 yds on 25 plays in the 2H shutout.

The HT had won 9 str prior to last year. Iowa has pulled the upset in 2 of the L/3 yrs (outgained in each). LY Iowa scored on the games final play on 48gl from the MSU7 for the win.

Iowa has won 5 of the last 7 meetings including B2B gms outgaining IU by 155 ypg. The Hawkeyes had season highs in points (42) & yards (480) vs the Hoosiers LY.

There has been an upset each of the L/5 meetings (Iowa has been upset 4x's). LY Iowa led 10-0 then QB Stanzi was hurt after a sk (fum TD rec for NW) changing the entire game.

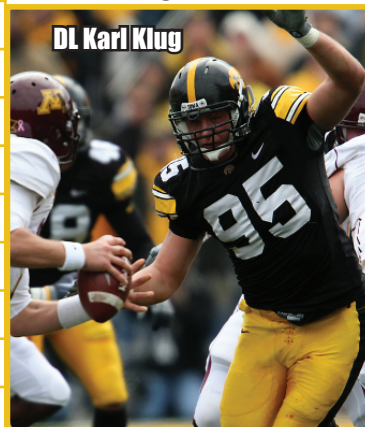
