

LSU TIGERS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - At the start of the spring '08 the Tigers appeared to be in great shape at QB with Ryan Perrilloux (PS#1) having plenty of experience. However, Perrilloux was dismissed, leaving the starting battle to rFr Jarrett Lee (PS#13) and Harvard transfer Andrew Hatch. Lee, a pocket passer, was banged up so Hatch started the first 3 until suffering a concussion. Lee took control and started 8 (1873, 53%) but had a 14-16 ratio with 7 IR TD's. They had planned to RS 6's Jordan Jefferson (PS#9, most mobile). When Hatch suffered a broken leg vs UGA, they burned Jefferson's RS and he played in 7, starting the last 2 (bowl Off MVP) throwing for 419 (49%, 4-1). Last year Jefferson was the clear-cut starter but Lee, who was booed often in '08 was greeted with cheers in his first 2 HG's. Jefferson added 17 lbs and got stronger and faster throwing for 2,166 (61.5%, 17-7). He was injured vs Ala (3Q) and Lee hit just 4-10 for 44 yds. Lee started vs LT and hit just 7-22 for 105 and was booed again. True frosh Russell Shepard (PS#1) was used in the Wildcat formation (#3 rusher). This year Jefferson gives them their most exp'd QB since OC Crowton's first year ('06) when they threw for 252 ypg (66.6%). Not listed below are Chris Garrett (6'4" 235 rFr, PS#29), Barrett Bailey (6'4" 192 rFr, PS#83) and TC McCartney (6'3" 226 Jr).

RUNNING BACKS - In 2008 they had to replace #1 rusher Jacob Hester (1103, 4.9). Charles Scott (PS#7) led with 1,174 (5.4) and 18 TD's while Keiland Williams added 417 (5.0). Richard Murphy (PS#27) had 186 (4.2). Last year all 3 ret'd. Unfortunately Murphy was lost after 2 then Scott was lost after 9 sts (inj) and had just 542 (4.7). Williams started 2 but then was also injured (368, 5.3), so Stevan Ridley (PS#36) started the last 2 and had 180 (4.0). This year they lose Scott (9 st, #6DC PH). Williams and Trindon Holliday (126, 4.7). They almost took the RS off of true frosh Michael Ford (PS#11) last season. Not listed below are BJ Wilson (5'8" 169 So, PS#400) along with FB's Thomas Parsons (6'5" 294 So, PS#670L), Kellen Theriot (6'1" 227 So, PS#115) and James Stampley (5'10" 240 Jr). While this group is a lot less exp'd, it could easily put up better numbers than '09's injury plagued unit.

RECEIVERS - Last year the Tigers had 3 of their top 4 receivers back in Brandon LaFell (929, 14.7), TE Richard Dickson (324, 10.5) and Terrance Toliver (257, 11.7). They had arguably the best WR duo in the SEC and 6'3" LaFell (PS#36) led with 792 (13.9) and Toliver (PS#2) had 735 (13.9). Dickson was banged up (157, 7.5). True frosh Rueben Randle (PS#1) had 173 (15.7, 4 st). This year they lose LaFell (13 st, #3DC CAR), Dickson (10 st), RJ Jackson (1 st, 11 rec) and Chris Mitchell (3 st, 10 rec) but have PS#1 QB Russell Shepard at WR full-time. Not listed below are Ian Harding (6'1" 203 Jr, PS#359) and TE's Chase Clement (6'5" 258 So, PS#25, moved from DE) and Ronnie Turpin (6'4" 214 So). I think the Toliver/Randle/Shepard combo will be among the SEC's best. However, this unit is a little less exp'd with their top guy gone.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In 2007 LSU had to replace 2 OL st's and 2 bkps and 1 returning starter played in just 3. Surprisingly they opened holes for 214 ypg rush (4.9), their best since 1997. In '08 they only had to replace one starter but with the inexp'd QB's the numbers dropped to 167 ypg (4.4) with 28 sks (5.6%). Herman Johnson became the first LSU OL to earn AP 1st Tm AA since 1997. Last year they had to replace 2 st's incl Johnson (#5DC) and 2 bkps but had 79 career sts back. Miles was high on the unit in August saying that it could be as good as an O-line as he has fielded here in his five years. The unit did not live up to that billing, however, with the team only avg 123 ypg rush (3.7), their lowest ypg since 1999 while allowing 37 sks (tied last SEC, 11%). Some of the dropoff was due to RB inj's and QB Jefferson holding the ball too long. This year they lose RG Lyle Hitt (13 st, 3Y st'r) and 2nd Tm AA LT Ciron Black (13 st, 4Y st'r) who took home the

SEC's Jacobs Blocking Trophy. T-Bob Hebert (11 st C) was susp indefinitely in May. The career sts drop to 52 but this unit (8 of top 10 ret) should improve after underperforming in '09.

DEFENSIVE LINE - The Tigers had to replace 3 NFL DC's in '06 but still yielded just 97 ypg rush (3.2). Surprisingly the last 3 years the rush D totals have gone up as they yielded 106 ypg (3.2) in '07, 110 (3.4) in '08 and 133 (3.5) in '09. Last year they had to replace 5 who combined for 38 sts (13.5 sks) including the 3rd overall pick in the draft and a #7DC. At least one LSU DL has been picked in each of the last 7 drafts. This year they lose DT Al Woods (13 st, 33 tkl, 1 sk, #4DC NO), DE Rahim Alem (12 st, 34 tkl, 4.5 sk) and DT Charles Alexander (13 st, 29 tkl, 1 sk). Including true frosh, the Tigers have 11 VHT's in the 3 deep and despite the heavy losses, figure to be at least as good as last year when they also had just one starter back.



LINEBACKERS - In '08 they pulled a LB on many passing plays, but new DC Chavis did not do that as much in '09. They had to replace 2nd Tm SEC MLB Darry Beckwith (5 sk tkl'r) but they not only ret'd their #2 and #3 tkl'r's, but added SS Harry Coleman (13 st, #1 tkl'r) and he earned Tm MVP honors at LB. This year they lose Coleman (13 st, #3 tkl'r, 9 tfl) and WLB Perry Riley (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 4.5 tfl, #4DC WAS) and Jacob Cutrera (1 st, #4 tkl'r). Kelvin Sheppard was the #1 tkl'r and turned down an early shot at the NFL and naturally they have 5 VHT's in the 3 deep. This is a quality unit but is less exp'd than '09.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Tigers finished #6, #1, #5, #5, #1 and #3 in my pass D rankings from 2002-'07. They had a very inexp'd unit in '08 and dropped to #33. Last year they had to replace 2 st's as SS Coleman moved to LB but ret'd 5 players who had a comb 40 sts in '08 (8 at NB). LSU moved back up to #19. Patrick Peterson (PS#1) earned 2nd Tm SEC in his first year as a starter. This year they lose 2nd Tm SEC FS Chad Jones (13 st, 74 tkl, 3 int, 6 pbu, #3DC NYG), CB Chris Hawkins (11 st, 43 tkl, 2 int, 7 pbu) and S Danny McCray (2 st, 49 tkl, 4 pbu). While they have less ret st's they have Craig Loston (PS#1) who RS LY (inj) and Jai Eugene (9 st '08, 2 st '09) battling for the starting FS job. This has the makings of an outstanding secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Les Miles' Okla St teams finished #3, #18, #3 and #11 in my ST rankings. He inherited a LSU ST unit that was #23 in '04 and after an expected #10 finish in '05, with everyone back they, surprisingly dropped to #80 in '06 and then #81 in '07. In '08 they were back up to #12 but had to replace their P and K last year. Their replacements did well. The new P Derek Helton has great hangtime and Josh Jasper handled the pooch punts (37.4 tm net). Jasper had 2 punts that pinned Ala at the 1. Jasper had just 3 TB's on 67 KO's but had good hangtime (17.5 KR avg all'd). Jasper hit 17-20 FG's with a long of 52 (2-3 50+). Trindon Holliday was the top KR (24.4) and PR (18.1). This year they lose Holliday (#6DC HOU) but return their specialists and should have another strong finish (#7 '09).

COACHES - Les Miles did a fine job at Okla St with his resume including 2 big upsets over rival OU and 3 bowls in 4 yrs. Miles owns a National Title at LSU, but is coming off B2B seasons without an SEC West Title, so he will be on the hotseat in '10. In '07 he lost OC Jimbo Fisher and brought in Gary Crowton who was the OC at Oregon ('05-'06) and the BYU HC from '01-'04. Under Crowton's guidance the team avg a school rec 38.6 ppg in '07, but fell to 30.9 ppg in '08 and an alarming 24.8 ppg in '09 (#76 FBS). Last year Miles brought in 14 year Tenn DC John Chavis and the defense improved from allowing 24.2 ppg in '08 to 16.2 ppg in '09.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Phil Steele's College Football Preview Magazine was the ONLY magazine to forecast LSU to win the SEC West in '03. I called the Tigers my #2 surprise team and they took home the BCS National Title when they upset Oklahoma. In '04, despite three road games in 4 weeks vs Top 15 foes, LSU was 9-2 but suffered a last play bowl loss to Iowa. In '05 the Tigers had to replace HC Nick Saban and unfortunately suffered major disruptions from Hurricane Katrina. The only reg season loss was when they blew a 24-7 lead in the 4Q vs Tenn. They were #3 but were whipped by Georgia 34-14 in the SEC Title game. An angry LSU squad plastered Miami 40-3 in the Peach Bowl. 2005 was the first time LSU defeated Aub, Ala and Fla all in the same season. They had 11 ret st's in '06 and it was the first Tiger team since 1982 to beat two Top 10 foes on the road in the same year. In the friendly confines of the Sugar Bowl, they destroyed ND 41-14 and finished #3. In '07 they were #2 in the preseason and the only FBS team not to lose a game in regulation (both losses 3OT). The Tigers were also the first team to make it to a BCS Title game with 2 defeats. At midseason, LSU moved to #1 in the AP poll for the first time in 48 years. LSU lost their reg season finale at home in 3OT to Ark but they had a myriad of upsets go in their favor. After LSU beat #14 Tenn 21-14 in the SEC Title game, they whipped Ohio St 38-24 for a 2nd National Title in 5 years. Some negative factors heading into '08 were that they benefitted from +20 in TO's and 2 net close wins. They had just 12 ret st's (3rd fewest SEC) and lost 29 pts in my NFL Draft Day Party Hangover (pg 308). While LSU was bowl eligible for a school record 9th straight season, it was an up and down season. LSU had the most losses ever by a defending BCS National Champ (5). At 7-5 and off 5 losses in their final 8, LSU was an underdog to GT but thrashed them 38-3 in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. After outgaining SEC foes by 132.2 and 81 ypg in '06 and '07, LSU went 3-5 in SEC play (-3.7 ypg). Last year I caught some slack from LSU fans as they entered the year #11 (AP) but I had them at #17. LSU lived a charmed life for a good portion of the season. They were outgained by Wash and Miss St but still opened 5-0 thanks in part due to a controversial celebration penalty against Georgia, which set up their game-winning TD. Versus Miss St they needed a 4th down stop at the footline and won 30-26 despite being outFD'd 21-12. Against Florida they were outgained 327-162 and lost by 10. They played their best game in a 31-10 rout of Auburn and after beating Tulane were back at #9 (7-1). After a 9 pt loss to Alabama, they were outgained by LT 322-246 but won and were outgained by Ole Miss (426-290) but only lost by 2 due to poor clock management at the end. In their home finale, they got a 41 yd FG with :04 left to force OT and pulled out the win over Ark. They were outgained by Penn St (340-243) in the bowl, but PSU needed a FG with :57 left to pull out the win despite dominating the 1H. LSU finished #17 in the AP poll. LSU had less yds than their opp's in 4 of their 9 wins last year. Last year they had fortunate ypp's on both offense and defense (see pg 299) and despite their 5-3 SEC record were -33.4 ypg (4th worst) in SEC play and on the season were outgained by an avg of 328-305. Miles is 33-4 vs unranked foes and 18-11 vs ranked opponents at LSU. LSU has just 10 ret st's (tied 2nd fewest) and draws N Car and W Virg in their non-conf slate and has road trips to Florida, Auburn and Ark in the SEC. This is a talented squad but probably won't match LY's 9 reg season wins.
