

OKLAHOMA SOONERS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - Jason White became the first OU QB to win the Heisman in '03. In his final two years he threw for 7,051 (63%) with a 75-19 ratio. In '07 I projected rFr Sam Bradford (PS#20) to start (3-way battle) and he had a phenomenal season (#1 FBS in pass eff). At 6'4", he became the tallest QB to start at OU and has a powerful arm. He threw for 3,121 (70%, 36-8). In '08 he set an FBS record for pass eff in a season (180.8) and won the Heisman. He threw for 4,720 (68%) with an amazing 50-8 ratio. Last year Bradford opted to return but injured his shoulder in the opener. While he ret'd vs Baylor (389 yds), he was lost for the year vs Texas. Another rFr, Landry Jones (PS#3) took over and threw for 3,198 (58%, 26-14). Jones had his ups and downs being int'd 5 times in the loss to Neb, before rebounding the next week to throw for 392 and 5 TD's vs A&M. He threw for 418 in the bowl and eclipsed Bradford's OU Fr passing mark. It took Jones until mid-August to beat out true frosh Drew Allen (PS#45) for the bkp role. Normally a position is weaker with the loss of a #1 DC (STL) but Bradford only played 8Q's in '09 and Jones (now exp'd) will be one of the Big 12's best.

RUNNING BACKS - Allen Patrick (PS#50JC) had 761 (4.5) and Chris Brown added 343 (4.9) backing up Adrian Peterson (#1DC) in '06. Patrick and Brown ret'd in '07 but rFr DeMarco Murray (PS#5) was the leading rusher (764, 6.0) when he was lost for the season vs TT. Patrick finished with 1009 (5.8) while Brown added 611 (3.9) and Mossis Madu (6'0" 200 Sr, PS#149) had 232 (5.8). Patrick was a #7DC in '08 and Murray was leading with 1,002 (5.6) and 14 TD's until he missed the last 2. Brown finished #1 with 1,220 (5.6) and 20 TD's while Madu added 475 (4.1). All 3 ret'd in '09 (Madu moved to WR). Murray had hamstring surgery and was not 100% until Miami, FI but then was inj'd again. Behind an inexp'd O-line Brown led with 749 (4.1) while Murray had 705 (4.1) and rFr Jermie Calhoun (PS#2) added 220 (4.9). True frosh Jonathan Miller (6'0" 190 So, PS#58) had 130 (7.2). Not listed below are FB's Brandon Crow (6'1" 221 Sr, PS#69) and Princz Jones (6'0" 205 Sr). This year they lose Brown and FB Matt Clapp (2 st, 0 rec) but with a healthy Murray and Calhoun both back, this unit could resemble '08 with a pair that totalled 2,222 (5.6) as opposed to '09 where the top 2 comb for 1,454 (4.1).

RECEIVERS - The Sooners had an excellent receiving corps in '08 but had to replace their #1, #3 and #5 rec's (#3, #7 DC). Then in Aug, OU lost the NFL's top TE prospect in Jermaine Gresham (inj). Brody Eldridge the top TE saw plenty of action on the O-line starting 9 (5 at OL, 4 at TE). The unit was banged up with soph Dejuan Miller the only full time player to play in all 13 and he was #3 (434, 12.1). Despite suffering a shoulder injury Ryan Broyles (PS#41) led with 1,120 (12.6). Broyles tied an OU single season rec with 15 TD rec's (Mark Clayton '03). The #2 rec was RB Murray. Brandon Caleb (PS#27) missed 2 and had 408 (15.7) and Adron Tennell (PS#3) had 297 (12.4). This year they lose Gresham (#1DC CIN, 0 gm '09), Tennell (5 st) and Eldridge (2 rec, #5DC IND). This group is much more exp'd (top 3 return), add in 2 VHT frosh, incl spring star Kenny Stills plus 3 other HT's and should remain healthier.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '08 OU had the best OL in the country with 130 career st (#1 FBS) and all 5 st's were NFL prospects. Surprisingly OU's numbers only climbed to 199 ypg (4.7) with 13 sks (2.5%). Last year the losses were heavy replacing #2 and #5 DC's along with 4 and 3 yr st's plus 2 bkps. Stoops called the unit out after winter conditioning but could not pull off the magic of '06 when he had 4 st's lost but actually had better offensive numbers. As expected the #s dropped to 135 ypg (3.6, lowest S'01) but they allowed just 15 sks (2.9%) despite starting 10 different OL lineups due to

inj and ineffectiveness. This year they lose LT Trent Williams (12 st, 3Y st'r, #1DC WAS), OL/TE Brody Eldridge (2nd Tm B12) and LG Brian Simmons (7 st). This unit is a much more experienced unit and 8 have starting exp incl 4 VHT's.

DEFENSIVE LINE - The Sooners always have an excellent D-line. In '08 they only had 2 st's back and slipped some allowing 116 ypg rush (3.5) though the D had 42 sks (tied #3 FBS). Last year DT Gerald McCoy turned down being a #1 DC and they had all 4 st's back. As you would expect, the rush D improved to 93 ypg (2.8). Jeremy Beal became the first Sooner to record 3 sks in 2 diff gms in the same year and led with 11 sks. McCoy occupied a lot of double teams which freed up the others to make plays. This year they lose McCoy (1st Tm B12, 13 st, 34 tkl, 15.5 tfl, #1DC TB), DE Auston English (9 st, 23 tkl, 4 sk, HM B12), DT DeMarcus Granger (3 tkl) and DT Cordero Moore (3 tkl). This will once again be a top-notch DL but is less experienced and loses the #3 overall pick in the draft.

LINEBACKERS - Last year the Sooners not only ret'd 5 of their top 6 LB's, but also got back Ryan Reynolds (PS#3) who was their top def player prior to his injury in the '08 Texas loss. Travis Lewis was the B12 Def FPOY in '08 and broke Brian Bosworth's OU frosh record for tkl (144). He continued his strong play earning 1st Tm B12 LY. The Sooners allowed just 14.5 ypg, their best since '01. This year they lose Reynolds (12 st, #3 tkl'r, 8 tfl, HM B12) and Keenan Clayton (12 st, #4 tkl'r, 5.5 tfl, #4DC PHI). Lewis returns along with Austin Box (6 car st, 69 tkl) and PS#6 Ronnell Lewis who started the bowl as a true frosh (22 tkl). Naturally the 3 deep is made up of 8 VHT's and while less experienced, it will still be a top-notch group.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Sooners always fare well in my PDR and in '08 despite replacing 3 st's, still finished #11. Last year they had to replace 2 st's (1st & 2nd Tm B12). It surprised me that 3 of the starters were not VHT's but the Sooners still finished #3. This year they lose 1st Tm B12 CB Dominique Franks (13 st, 47 tkl, 2 int, 5 pbu, #SDC ATL) and 2nd Tm B12 CB Brian Jackson (12 st, 47 tkl, 4 int, 8 pbu). Adding depth are Zach Brown (5'10" 165 Jr, OKSt transfer) and Javon Harris (5'11" 196 So, PS#61). They add in 2 VHT rFr in Gabe Lynn (PS#10) and Kevin Brent (PS#18) as well as true frosh Tony Jefferson (PS#6) and could be even stronger.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Stoops' first 9 years his ST units were a strength with six top 13 finishes. Surprisingly in '08 they plummeted to #101 with a 33.7 net punt avg and allowing 4 KR TD's. Last year they only had to replace their P and I expected the unit to move back to its usual spot at the top and they did (#12) despite not settling on a FG kicker. Jimmy Stevens hit 11-13 FG's but then lost his job to P Tress Way (1-6). Walk-on Patrick O'Hara hit 6-9 (long 47, miss 50+) in the L/4. Way was #5 in the FBS with

a 40.3 net. ST coor Wilson said the KR coverage was an emphasis and would be better. While Matt Moreland had just 6 TB on 81 KO they trimmed it to 20.2 per KR with 1 TD. From 1997 to 2003 the Sooners avg 12.1 on PR's but then went through a 5 year stretch of never topping 9.0 for a season. Last year they were back in form as Ryan Broyles and Dominique Franks had a Stoops era high of 16.3 per PR. This year only Franks departs and with improved FG's, the Sooners will contend for the #1 ST spot.

COACHES - Prior to Bob Stoops' arrival, Oklahoma had five consec non-winning seasons. Stoops won a National Title in his second season then played in the National Title game again in '03, '04 and '08. OU's 110 wins the last 10 years are more than any other BCS team. Kevin Wilson, who was the OC at Northwestern from 1999-'01, has been the co-OC at OU since '02. Jay Norvell was brought in as co-OC in '08 after serving as the OC at Neb from '04-'06 and at UCLA in '07. Co-DC's Brent Venables and Bobby Jack Wright (6th year as co-DC) enter their 12th year here.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 2000 Okla did not have a single starter miss a single game due to injury. They stunned the nation winning the National Title despite not being ranked in the preseason Top 20. Thanks to a regular season ending loss to Okla St in '01, the Sooners did not get to the Big 12 Title game. In 2002 they won the Big 12 Title and played in the Rose Bowl. In 2003 the Sooners lost the conf title game and then the National Title game (vs LSU). OU had probably their most talented and exp'd team yet under Bob Stoops in '04. They went 12-0 getting to the Title game vs USC but were embarrassed 55-19. In '05 they had just 9 ret starters and topped my NFL Draft Day Party Hangover list with 41 pts. They were #12 in my experience ratings in the B12. They struggled through a 7-4 season even needing 2 OT's to get past Baylor, but did knock off #6 Oregon in the Holiday Bowl. Their offense had amazing balance with 2,130 rush and 2,131 pass. In '06 they suffered some tough losses (Oreg & Boise) but still took home the Big 12 Title. In '07 they only had to replace 10 lettermen yet only 2 preseason magazines called for OU to even win the South. They whipped #1 ranked Missouri in the Big 12 Title game, 38-17. WV manhandled them 48-28 in the Fiesta Bowl and they finished #8. Despite winning the Big 12 they were just +35.5 ypg (5th best in '07). Heading into '08 four of OU's last 7 losses had come on the final play. The Sooners blew an 8 pt 3Q lead vs Texas when their star LB Reynolds was inj'd and they lost. They still made it to the Big 12 Title game where they blasted Missouri 62-21 and it was their 6th straight game of 58+. There was much debate as to whether OU or Texas deserved to be in the Title game but OU got the opportunity to play Florida and lost by 10, Stoops' 5th straight BCS bowl loss. The Sooners have the nation's longest home winning streak at 30 (66-2 under Stoops). Last year QB Bradford, TE Gresham and DT McCoy all turned down probable #1 DC's to return. OU was also coming off a year where they benefitted from +23 in TO's. The season did not go as planned. Gresham was OFY in Aug and Bradford was inj'd at the end of the 1H of the opener vs BYU and they lost 14-13. The D took over recording consec shutouts vs Idaho St and Tulsa (combined 109-0). They led Miami 10-0 but lost 21-20. After dispatching Baylor in Bradford's ret, he was KO'd for the year vs Texas and the Sooners lost a HT lead in the 16-13 loss. A few games later they suffered another tough loss when Jones threw 5 int vs Neb and despite a 23-7 FD edge, they lost 10-3. They failed to score a TD for the 1st time in the Stoops era as in 6 trips inside the NU's 33 they missed 3 FG's, had 1 blk, were SOD 2x and threw an int. After destroying A&M they surprisingly were manhandled at TTech 41-13, by far their worst game of the year. They shutout rival Okla St 27-0 (367-109 yd) and then vs Stanford had a 477-262 yd edge in the bowl but only won by 4. The Sooners had 3 net close losses and this year have 8 ret starters on offense (4 in '09). They also had 42 sts lost to injury (tied #3 FBS) and played a Stoops record 9 true frosh. Despite their 5-3 Big 12 record, the Sooners' +133 ypg was the league's best. The Sooners get my call to go from 8-5 back to the National

Title game despite facing 9 teams that were in bowls last year.

Sooners are 4-0 vs the Aggies and have scored at least 49 pts in every gm (avg score 58-7). In their last meeting ('07) OU lead 54-3 after 3Q's before pulling its starters (617-153 yd edge). OU is 4-1 (only loss in '65) vs FSU as 4 of the 5 meetings were in bowls. #1 OU beat #3 FSU in the '00 Orange Bowl 13-2 to claim its last National Title (last meeting).

In their only meeting ('01) OU won 44-3 w/a 149 yd edge holding the AF rush attack to 137 yds (2.6). Under Stoops into 2010 OU is 34-6 in reg season non-conf games.

WR Broyles set the OU Fr rec with 141 yds (20.1) in the schools last and only meeting in '08. Stoops is 2-4 at OU in non-conf BCS AG's (reg ssn) including LY's 1 pt loss to Miami.

Only 2 of the L/12 RRR's haven't been decided by DD's. LY OU never trailed till UT kicked what turned out to be the GW FG w/12:08 4Q. OU's L3 drives ended w/SOD, int at T20, int at T37).

OU has dominated ISU going 38-1-1 w/11 straight wins & in 9 of L/12 meeting held ISU to 10 pts or less. In the last game ('07) ISU held OU to just 99 yds at HT and lead 7-0 till mid-3Q.

Under Stoops, OU is 7-0 vs Mizzou with the L/2 being in B12 Title gms ('07 & '08). OU amassed a B12 Title record 627 yds in '08. OU finished LY with B2B away conf losses (1st time S/98).

OU is just 2-5 hosting CU S'89. In L/meeting ('07) OU lost 27-24 after leading 24-7 late 3Q, then allowed 20 unanswered as CU kicked a 45 yd FG as time expired.

OU has now won 7 straight vs A&M and LY Landry Jones passed for a career high 392 yds and the Sooners had ssn highs in pts (65) & yds (640). Oklahoma is 22-4 since 2003 in Nov.

The home team has won 6 straight meetings. Stoops is 10-1 in home finales. LY OU played its worst gm in the Stoops era vs TT as they allowed ssn highs in pts, FD's & yds.

Stoops' OU squads have outscored Baylor on avg 42-12 (19-0 all-time, 11-0 w/Stoops). Bradford threw for a combined 1,114 yds in his 3 gms. BU was only B12 opp QB Jones DN face LY.

Most lopsided series in the nation featuring 2 tms from the same state (OU is 81-16-7 incl 7 straight). LY OU DN allow a FD in the 2H & the 109 yds allowed was the 6th best mark in the series.

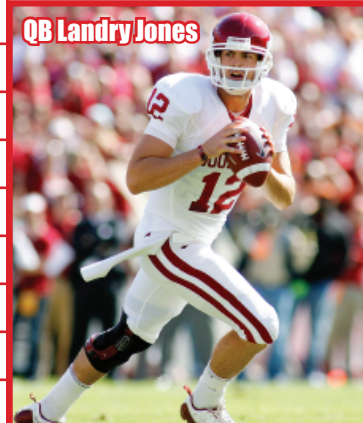
