

OREGON DUCKS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - The Ducks have had a solid history of QB play from NFL Hall of Famers Norm Van Brocklin and Dan Fouts to the present with 8 NFL DC at the position since 1987 including three 1st rounders (see Hardcore Fans). Dennis Dixon (PS#10) was having a Heisman-type season (68%, 20-4, 583 rush) in '07 until he suffered a torn ACL. Three QB's tried to replace him including Justin Roper (PS#91), who led the Ducks to a Sun Bowl win. In '08 Nate Costa (PS#56, ACL '07) was the clear frontrunner but was lost in August (2nd ACL). Roper started but was inj'd in game 3 and late JUCO signee Jeremiah Masoli (5'11" 220) started the last 10 throwing for 1,744 (57%, 13-5) while rushing for a school QB record 718 (5.7, 10 TD). Two true frosh Chris Harper (PS#17) and Darron Thomas (PS#22) played vs Boise when Masoli was inj'd. Masoli had another fine year in '09 leading the Ducks to the Rose Bowl and throwing for 2,147 (58%, 15-6) and was the #2 rusher (668, 5.5). Costa started vs UCLA (Masoli inj) and for the year threw for 197 (60.6%). They were able to RS Thomas (4.5 spd) who played in 5 as a true (268, 49%, 3-1). Not listed below are Daryle Hawkins (6'4" 196 rFr, PS#161) and Dustin Haines (6'3" 210 rFr, PS#334). Masoli was susp for 2010 and I expect Thomas to beat out Costa but this unit is much less exp'd than '09.



RUNNING BACKS - Jonathan Stewart (PS#1) led with 981 (5.4) in '06 while Jeremiah Johnson (PS#68) added 644 (6.3). In 2007 my magazine was the only one to have Stewart on the Preseason AA Team and he lived up to the hype despite inj's, rushing for 1,722 (6.2) including a Sun Bowl record 253. Johnson was lost in Wk 6 (344, 6.4). In '08 they had to replace Stewart (#1DC) but Bellotti brought in LeGarrette Blount (PS#10JC). Johnson led with 1,201 (7.1) setting a Civil War record with 219 and Blount had 1,002 (7.3) and 17 TD's (2nd UO duo to each top 1,000). Remene Alston (5'8" 207 Sr, PS#149) had 161 (7.7). Last year they had to replace Johnson and then Blount was susp following the opener. That opened the door for LaMichael James (PS#41), who was the Pac-10's #2 rusher with 1,546 (6.7) and the Ducks most dangerous weapon (P10 OPOY). Kenjon Barner (PS#115) moved over from DB and rushed for 366 (6.0). Alston had 133 (4.4). This year they lose Blount (1 st, 82 yds) and Andre Crenshaw (152, 3.0). While it will be tough for James to top last year's stats (susp for '10 opener), this unit is much more exp'd. They add in two VHT RB's including speedster Lache Seastrunk (PS#3) making this my #3 RB unit.

RECEIVERS - Last year the Ducks had to replace their top 2 WR's who had combined for 1,224 (14.2) but ret'd star TE Ed Dickson (#2 rec). They also returned WR Jeff Maehl (421, 10.8) but two WR's including VHT Chris Harper (PS#17) left

prior to August. Dickson broke the TE school record for career rec's topping Josh Wilcox ('93-'96) and was #2 again with 551 (13.1). Maehl led with 696 (13.1) and DJ Davis (PS#21) added 233 (10.1). This year they lose Dickson (#3DC BAL, 1st Tm P10) and Jamere Holland (2 st, 13 rec). Not in the PSL are Will Murphy (6'2" 176 So) and TE's Brian Teague (6'3" 240 rFr) and Sam Doman (6'4" 220 Sr). While the Ducks lose, arguably, their top player from this unit, I look for more production from the WR's and they have some solid additions (see below).

OFFENSIVE LINE - Then-HC Bellotti called 2007's O-line the best in school history and they paved the way for 252 ypg rush (5.3) while allowing 24 sks (5.8%). They had to replace 2 st's and 2 bkps in '08 but actually improved to 280 ypg rush with an FBS high 6.2 ypc (20 sks, 5.4%). Last year they had to replace 4 st's (#2, #5 DC's) and 2 bkps. They returned just 20 career sts (#118 FBS). The unit outperformed my expectations with 232 ypg rush (5.5) and just 13 sks (3.8%). Not in the PSL are Ramsen Golashin (6'4" 280 Jr), Justin Fritz (6'3" 277 Sr) and Lance Barker (6'1" 265 So). This year the entire 2 deep is back (85 car sts) and this should be one of the nation's top offensive fronts.

DEFENSIVE LINE - After an inexp'd D-line allowed 4.3 ypc rush (worst S/'97) in '06, they had to replace 2 st's in '07. Nick Reed led the Pac-10 in sacks (12) and UO improved to allowing 133 ypg rush (3.6) with 38 sks. They had an exp'd unit in '08 and Reed was 1st Tm AA with the Ducks improving to 119 ypg (3.1) with 39 sks. Last year this unit was a major question mark as they had to replace 3 st's. I called for Kenny Rowe (PS#19) to have better production (18 tkl, 1st 2 yr) and he wound up leading the P10 with 11.5 sks (3 in bowl). It was surprising to me that the numbers only slipped to 129 ypg rush (3.4) while the D had 36 sks. This year they lose DT Blake Ferras (13 st, 37 tkl, 2 sk), 2nd Tm P10 DE Will Tukufu (13 st, 36 tkl, 2.5 sk, 7.5 sk '08) and DT Simi Toeaina (11 tkl). This time 2 st's return plus they add in a JUCO, a VHT true frosh and Dion Jordan moved over from TE earning raves in the spring. The unit is still undersized and did struggle vs bigger OL's but is much more exp'd than in 2009.

LINEBACKERS - For years the Ducks have listed themselves in a 4-2-5 but their SS was basically an SLB and in '08 they changed to that terminology. Last year their #2 and #6 tkl's ret so they only had to replace one st'r (#5). They added in PS#7JC Bryson Littlejohn. This year Kiko Alonso (16 tkl) is sups for the season and Eddie Pleasant (4.46 spd), who led the P10 in FR moves to S but 4 of the top 6 are back. They return their #2, #3, #12 and #14 tkl's and add in a VHT rFr. This is one of the Pac-10's better LB corps.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Ducks had 4 straight Top 20 finishes in my pass D rankings from 2004-'07. It was surprising that in '08 with 3 ret st's, they dropped to #47 ('08/'07). Last year they had to replace 2 st's (both #2DC's). Injuries took a toll on the 2 returning st's as TJ Ward missed 5 and CB Walter Thurmond was lost after 4 (ACL). Backup Willie Glasper was lost after 2 sts. It was surprising that the Ducks rose to #25. This year they lose S Ward (7 st, 68 tkl, 5 pd, #2DC CLE), Thurmond (3 st, 17 tkl, 1 int, #4DC SEA) and CB Glasper (11 tkl). They return 3 full-time starters plus Cliff Harris (PS#19) who had 2 sts as a true. They also add in LB Eddie Pleasant (12 sts). FS John Boyett (PS#39) started 10 earning 1st Tm Fr AA honors. This group is clearly a lot more exp'd and should get another Top 20 finish. Not in the PSL are Scott Grady (5'11" 180 So, PS#116) and Brian Jackson (5'10" 192 rFr).

SPECIAL TEAMS - In 2007 UO had to replace their P and K but brought back their excellent ST coor Tom Osborne. In his previous 6 yrs here ('95-'00), they finished #30, #22, #4, #15, #13 and #47 in my ST rankings. So far in his first three years back the Ducks have been solid finishing #32, #27 and #21 as Osborne uses their abundance of team speed very well in this unit. Last year they had to replace their P, K and top PR. They lost their top PR Thurmond (15.0, 1 TD) early and had a

true frosh P in Jackson Rice (PS#9, 36.2 net). K Morgan Flint hit 16-19 FG's (long 43) while Rob Beard missed a 51 yarder vs UCLA and had 10 TB's on 87 KO's. The Ducks had a crucial blk'd punt for a TD and converted a fake FG vs UW and finished +3 in the TD/blk category. This year they lose Flint and Thurmond but Osborne should field another top-notch unit.

COACHES - Mike Bellotti had the most wins (116-55) of any Pac-10 HC when he stepped aside prior to spring practice last year. He is the school's all-time career win leader (12 bowl, 14Y). New HC Chip Kelly was the OC here S/'07 and previously was the OC at New Hampshire ('99-'06). Kelly was named the Pac-10 COY after becoming the first HC in league history to win an outright cot title in his debut season. DC Nick Aliotti (12th year) was the architect of the "Gang Green" D that started the UO revival and ret'd to the school in '99 after being the DC at UCLA in '98. OC Mark Helfrich joined the Ducks after spring practice last year after previously being the OC/QB coach at Colorado ('06-'08).

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 2004 UO had a streak of 10 straight winning years snapped (5-6). In '05 I had UO as my #4 Most Improved Team and also listed them as one of my Surprise Teams. They nearly made it to a BCS bowl despite being unranked in the preseason and losing their QB to injury. The team avg 487 ypg with starting QB Clemens and just 371 ypg without him. They came very close to playing in the BCS Title game but were relegated to the Holiday Bowl where a disappointed 10-1 team (#6) lost to unranked Okla. They benefitted from +13 in TO's and 4 close wins and in '06 had just 13 ret st's and slipped to 7-6. That squad was -10 in TO's. In '07 the Ducks were once again unranked to start and for the 2nd time in 3 years I called them one of my Surprise Teams (darkhorse National Title contender). Had QB Dennis Dixon stayed healthy, he not only would have likely won the Heisman Trophy but UO would have played in the Title game despite being picked 6th in the preseason P10 media poll. The Ducks had climbed to #2 when Dixon and his backup were injured. With the QB mess, the Ducks lost their last 3 reg season gms before rebounding to knock off USF (#23) in the Sun Bowl. In '08 the Ducks had 5 P10 road games but 7 of my then-8 sets of power ratings called them the 2nd best team in the P10. Despite the tough schedule I gave them a shot at topping 2007's 9 win total. They had to play a 5 string QB at home vs Boise St and lost 37-32 but finished a solid 10-3 including a 42-31 win over Okla St (#13) in the Holiday Bowl. Last year they had just 9 ret st's (fewest P10) and unlike most years where I had the Ducks ranked higher than everyone, I actually had them rated lower than most. They entered the season #16 AP and my forecast looked pretty good as they were destroyed by Boise St in the opener, not getting their first FD until 38:00 into the gm (outgained 361-152 yds). The next week they barely survived stopping Purdue's 2 pt cony with 1:01 left. They got past Utah at home by 7 (Utah int'd at 8 less 2:00 left). UO was a rare HD to #6 Cal but destroyed them 42-3 and their season turned around. Against UCLA with bkp QB Costa starting, they trailed 3-0 at the half but got KR and IR TD's plus a fumble set up another TD drive giving them 21 points in the first 3:44 of the 2H and they won 24-10. Autzen Stadium turned into a house of horrors for opp's as they destroyed USC 47-20 and Ariz St 44-21 sandwiched between their lone conf loss at Stanford, 51-42. Against Arizona they trailed 24-14 but got a 43 yd FG that hit the crossbar and went over to tie it at 24. Ariz led 31-24 but was int'd in the EZ and with the AZ fans surrounding the field ready to celebrate, the Ducks got a TD with :06 left to force OT and pulled out the win in 2OT. With the Rose Bowl on the line in the Civil War, they trailed 30-21 in the 3Q but rallied for the win. In the Rose Bowl they were out FD'd 26-12 and outgained 419-260 in their 26-17 loss. The Ducks do have 17 ret st's. They were +159.1 ypg in P10 play which was 80.4 ypg better than #2. UO benefitted from 4 net close wins. They would have been preseason #4 this year but QB Masoli was susp. Last

year's team had some good fortune but this year's team is stronger in every area except QB and TE. They have just 4 Pac-10 HG's but 8 of my 9 sets of power ratings call them the best team in the Pac-10.

First meeting. The Ducks are on a 30-2 run at home vs non-conference opponents. Oregon is 15-1 in home openers with the loss coming vs Indiana in 2004.

First meeting. Oregon is 3-4 against SEC opponents. The Ducks have won 3 of 4 away games vs non-conference BCS teams including beating Miss St 42-34 in 2003.

The Ducks are 12-0-1 vs current Big Sky Conference teams including 3-0 vs the Vikings (last met in '06, 55-12). PSU went 2-9 last year including a 34-7 loss to Oregon St.

Oregon RB LaMichael James ran for 150 yds and 3 TD's as Oregon beat Arizona St for the 5th straight time (avg score of 42-19). Oregon held ASU to just 70 1H & 211 total yds.

Prior to last season's 51-42 loss at Stanford (1,075 combined yards), the Ducks had topped the Cardinal 7 consecutive years by an average score of 39-17.

Ducks have won 9 of the L/12 vs WSU including going 6-2 in Pullman (last loss 2006). Oregon has outgained the Cougars by an avg of 524-248 over the past 3 ssns.

Trailing LY's meeting 3-0 at the half, Oregon returned the opening KO of the 2H for a TD and had 2 more TD's set up by UCLA rush's. The Ducks have won 7 of 9 vs the Bruins.

Ducks put up a ssn high 613 yds (391 rush) in LY's 47-20 defeat of USC. It was USC 1st loss by more than a TD in 7 yrs. Also most pts scored vs USC in all 56 mtgs (34 pts in '87).

The Ducks have won a school record 6 consecutive meetings against the Huskies by an avg 42-17. They have outgained Washington by 285 ypg the last 2 at home.

Last year the Ducks held a Cal offense that was averaging 49 ppg to just a FG. Oregon has won 9 of 13 vs the Bears but have dropped 3 straight in Berkeley by 11 ppg.

In LY's 2OT victory over the Wildcats in Tucson, RB LaMichael James broke the Pac-10 record for rushing yds by a Freshman. UO & UA have avg a comb 93 ppg the L2Y.

114th meeting of the "Civil War." Oregon earned a trip to the Rose Bowl in last year's victory. Teams combined for 2,035 yds in last 2. Last time here OU scored 5 TD's of 40+ yds.

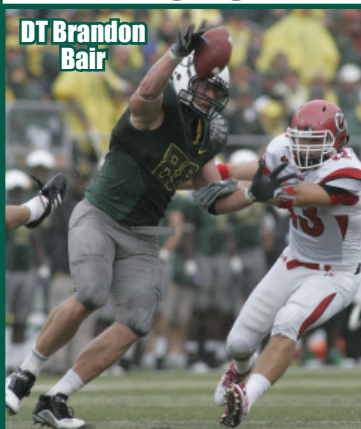
