

# PENN ST NITTANY LIONS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - Darryl Clark was the backup in '07 and showed some promise in the Alamo Bowl rushing for 50 yds on QB draws. In '08 Clark battled soph Pat Devlin (PS#5). The job was rated as a toss-up but Clark won it and had a 1st Tm All B10 year throwing for 2,592 (60%) with a 19-6 ratio (#3 rusher). Devlin led the game winning TD drive vs OSU when Clark was injured but opted to transfer to Delaware prior to the Rose Bowl. Last year Paterno brought in Kevin Newsome (IFS) who played at Hargrave. In just 2 years as a starter, Clark finished with 6 PSU records including season passing yards (3,003) and TD's (24) as well as career passing TD's (43) and rushing TD's. He completed 60.9% (24-10) and was the #3 rusher with 211 (2.5). Newsome played in 10 hitting 8-11 for 66 yds (95 rush, 4.8) with most of his work vs E Illinois. The knock on Clark was his inability to win big games but it was nice to see him leave the field a winner in the bowl vs LSU. This year's true frosh Paul Jones (PS#7 IFS) and Robert Bolden (PS#5) have a shot but the top 2 QB's in the spring were Newsome and former walk-on Matt McGloin (PS#171). Naturally going from a two time 1st Tm Big Ten QB to a unit with 13 career att's, there figures to be a drop off.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In 2007 Rodney Kinlaw became the 11th Lion to top 1,000 rushing with 1,329 (5.5). RfR Evan Royster (PS#18) was the power back rushing for 513 (solid 6.3 ypc). In '08 they had to replace Kinlaw but Royster improved his speed. RfR Stephon Green (4.29 spd) rushed for 578 (5.5) while Royster rushed for 1,236 (solid 6.5) despite being injured in the bowl and he actually led the FBS in ypc after 9 games. Last year Royster struggled with the flu early but got back into form and finished with 1,169 (5.7). He turned down a shot at the NFL and is likely to finish his career as PSU's all-time rush leader (needs 481). Green was injured early and Brandon Beachum (6'0" 218 Jr, PS#14) took the #2 spot. Beachum had just 113 (4.7) before he was lost to an ACL vs Indiana. Green finished #2 with 319 (4.5). Not listed below are Shaine Thompson (6'0" 211 Jr, Hykeem Brodie (5'11" 223 So), spring star Curtis Dukes (6'1" 238 RfR, PS#40) and FB's Pat Zerbe (6'1" 240 RfR) and Michael Zordich (6'1" 225 So, PS#15, susp'd spg). They also add in 2 VHT true including Silas Redd (PS#10, IFS). There figures to be more of an emphasis on running the ball with an inexp'd QB and with everyone back this unit should have improved numbers.

**RECEIVERS** - In 2005 Paterno brought in an excellent class of true frosh and the 3 WR's were the top 3 rec's in all 4 of their seasons. Deon Butler (#3DC) departed as PSU's #2 career rec leader, Derrick Williams (#3DC) was PSU's MVP in '08 and Jordan Norwood finished #3 in career rec yds. This unit was a major question mark prior to '09 but performed beyond expectations. Those 3 comb for 1,932 (14.6) in '08 while last year's top 3 including TE Andrew Quarless combined for 1,921 (14.2). Derek Moye is 6'5" (4.38 spd) and led with 785 (16.4) while former walk-on Graham Zug (6'2") had 600 (13.0). Quarless had 8 rec in the bowl and added 536 (13.1). Chaz Powell (PS#48) had 366 (13.1). This year they must replace Quarless (13 st, #5DC GB) and TE Mickey Shuler (4 st, 11 rec, #7DC MIN) and Powell was moved to CB but could play both ways. Also keep your eyes on WR Devon Smith who is one of the B10's smallest players, but is also one of its fastest (4.19 spd). Not listed below are Christian Kuntz (6'4" 207 RfR, PS#121), Tariq Tongue (5'8" 164 RfR), Brandon Moseby-Felder (6'2" 170 RfR, PS#103) and TE Brennan Coakley (6'4" 241 Sr). There is plenty of talent available and this is a much more veteran unit.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In 2008 the Lions OL had 93.8% sts ret and they opened holes for 206 ypg rush (5.2) while allowing just 13 sks (3.4%). Last year they had to replace 3 st'rs including the Rimington Award winner, a 3rd Tm AA G and a 1st Tm B10 LT. They did shuffle the OL at times but the numbers only dropped to 170 ypg rush (4.7) with 17 sks (4.3%). This year they lose 3rd Tm AA LT Dennis Landolt (13 st, 3Y st'r), RT Ako Poti (8 st) and RT Nerraw McCormack (1 st). The Lions return their star 1st Tm B10 Stefan Wisniewski who moved back to RG (from C) in the spring. This is a more exp'd unit that will be stronger and 4 of the 5 proj'd st'rs are VHT's.



**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Penn St has not allowed over 94 ypg rush in the last 5 years thanks in part to this unit. Last year they had to replace #1DC Aaron Maybin (12 sk) and two others (comb 16 sts, 7 sk). DT Jared Odrick became PSU's 4th Big Ten DPOY and the league's first interior DL to win the award since 1993 (Dan Wilkinson, Ohio St). The Lions allowed just 90 ypg rush (2.8). This year they lose Odrick (#1DC MIA, 13 st), DE Jerome Hayes (7 st, 18 tkl, 4.5 tfl) and Tom Golarz (2 tkl). It's surprising to me that there are "only" 5 VHT's in the 2 deep. Last year they had 22 sts (6.5 sk) back from '08 and this year they have 31 sts and 18.5 sks back.

**LINEBACKERS** - "Linebacker U" had a surprising streak of 6 straight years without a LB drafted ('01-'06). They now have had 6 in the last 3 years including 3 in 2010 (#2, #3 and #7 DC's). Coming into last year PSU looked to have the NCAA's best LB corps. Soph Michael Mauti (PS#21) battled Josh Hull (#2 tkl'r '08) for 1 spot while they had 2 of the NCAA's best LB's (Sean Lee and Navorro Bowman) in the other spots. PSU allowed just 274 ypg and 12.2 ppg even though Mauti missed the season (ACL) and Bowman and Lee did not play together until wk 8 due to injuries. Bowman still finished as the #2 tkl'r and Lee #3. This year the top 3 tkl'rs depart in 1st Tm B10 LB Bowman (93 tkl, 17 tfl, #3DC SF), 2nd Tm B10 Sean Lee (8 st, 86 tkl, 11 tfl, #2DC DAL) and Hull (#1 tkl'r, 8.5 tfl, 13 st, #7DC STL). Mauti returns while Nate Stupar (PS#16) and Bani Gbadyu (PS#25) combined for 7 sts (68 tkl). Ten players in the PSL are VHT's and hopefully they stay healthier but with less exp, will be a notch or two below last year's lofty standards.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - PSU has had five top 10 finishes in my PDR in the last 13 yrs. In '06 they had to replace all 4 st'rs and just missed (#16). They only had to replace 1 starter in '08 and finished #24 (10-16 ratio). Last year they again had to replace all 4 st'rs (1st and 2nd Tm B10). I wrapped up 2009's analysis by saying that perhaps they could duplicate '06's (0 st'r back) performance. They very nearly did that as

they finished #23 (54.1% 10-14). This year they lose CB AJ Wallace (6 st, 36 tkl, 6 pd) and CB Knowledge Timmons (6 st, 21 tkl, 2 pbu). While they "only" have 5 VHT's in the 2 deep, this is a much more exp'd group.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - The Lions finished #17 in my ST rankings in '06, #36 in '07 and #4 in '08. Last year I was shocked as it was probably Paterno's worst ST unit ever (#115) with major gaffes in their losses to Iowa and OSU. They did have to replace their K, Kevin Kelly (20-24 long 52 in '08) and 1st Tm AA PR/KR Derrick Williams. Jeremy Boone avg 43.3 on punts but due to poor coverage units, had a net of just 31.7 (37.9 net in '08). Collin Wagner hit 15-22 FG's (only 1-5 40+) with 10 TB's on KO's. Their return game was also uncharacteristically below average (5.0 PR, 19.7 KR). This year they must replace their P which proved to be problematic in the spring with Fera being susp'd and WR Zug being the #2 punter. I cannot imagine the Lions having such a poor ST unit ever again under Paterno.

**COACHES** - Joe Paterno is the NCAA's IA all-time career win leader and has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. Paterno has won 2 National Titles ('82 & '86) and four other times has finished undefeated. He has won more bowls than any other coach (24) and has moved past Amos Alonzo Stagg for the longest HC tenure at one school. Impressively he's 2nd among active coaches in career win % (.752). The OC since 2004 is Galen Hall, who was the HC at Florida (1984-'89). The DC is Tom Bradley who is in his 32nd year at Penn St, 11th as DC. Since 1966 when Paterno took over, there have been 860 IA coaching changes.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

I would have to classify Penn St's 9-4 2007 season as a disappointment. They had a 427-336 yd edge at Illinois but had 4 key TO's and lost and they had a 24-7 lead vs Mich St in the 3Q but lost and were relegated to the Alamo Bowl. Paterno even said, "We should have been 10-2." While Penn St was just 4-4 in Big Ten play they were #2 in ypg (+38.1). PSU was #7 in the FBS in rush D for an amazing 3rd straight year in '07 and was 2nd in sacks (46). In 2008 PSU moved back to the spread offense that they used in their magical 2005 Big Ten Title season. Despite losing their top LB Sean Lee to injury, they had 16 ret st'rs. Surprisingly PSU was not among the top 3 in the Big Ten '08 preseason poll and I had the only publication in the country to have the Lions ranked in the Preseason Top 10. Out of the 14 sources documented by *stassen.com*, five did not even have the Lions RANKED (#22 AP). Penn St manhandled an Oregon ST team that finished #18 AP (45-14) and beat both Wisc and Ohio St on the road. They were 9-0 and #3 with a great shot at the National Title game and led Iowa 23-14 in the 4Q but ended up losing. They lost the Rose Bowl to USC to finish #8 at 11-2 but were by far #1 in the Big Ten in ypg in conf play (+124.2) and had 38 sts lost to injury (#16 FBS). Last year Sean Lee ret'd from injury. Penn St opened with 3 wins over cupcakes to rank #5 AP but leading Iowa 10-5 in the 4Q gave up a 53 yd blk'd punt for a TD and turned it over on each of their final 3 poss. They did not have Lee for the game and were beaten at home, 21-10. Penn St rolled over their next 5 foes including their first win at Michigan S'96 (35-10). They hosted Ohio St but Royster was injured in warm-ups and was not 100%. It was the first ever reg season game where the coaches had 600+ combined wins and OSU, aided by 2 long PR's, controlled matters dealing PSU a 24-7 loss. PSU won their last 2 to finish 10-2 and controlled the 1H vs LSU leading 13-3 but needed a FG in the mud with :57 left to pull out the Capital One Bowl win. PSU finished #9, their 3rd Top 10 finish in the last 5 years. This year they have just 13 ret st'rs and lose QB Clark as well as B10 DPOY DT Odrick and star LB's Lee and Bowman. They were #1 in the conf at +90.4 ypg despite tying for 2nd. This year the Lions become the first ever team to face THREE teams that won BCS bowls the previous year and all 3 are on the road (Alabama, Iowa, Ohio St). With that schedule they probably won't match last year's 11 win total but still have a shot at a double digit win season.

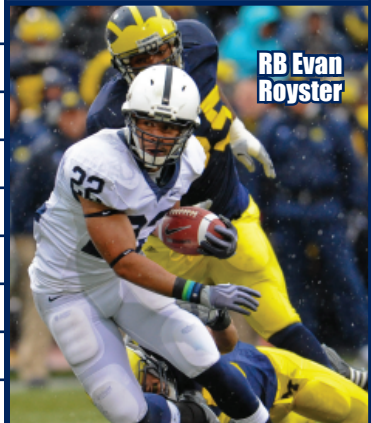

PSU has won 8 str home openers. PSU's only meeting vs LSU was in '06, dominating w/a 384 yd edge (+16 FD's). Penguins were 6-5 LY & this is the 4th str yr opening w/a FBS opp.

PSU is 5-8 vs Bama but the last meeting was in '90 (won 9-0 in Tuscaloosa). Lions are 3-9 S'01 vs schools ranked in the Top 10 but have won 10 of 12 away from home vs BCS schools.

PSU is 2-0 vs KSU and in their L/meeting ('03) won 32-10 holding KSU to just 184 yds. Into 2010 the Nittany Lions have won 19 str vs non BCS tms with an avg score of 43-9.

PSU is 35-3-1 vs TU (27-0 S'52). TU HC Al Golden played TE at PSU from 1987-'91 & was the LB cch in 2000. PSU has outgained TU by 268 ypg the L4Y including 2 shutouts.

PSU hasn't won in Iowa City since 1999 & are just 2-8 vs Iowa. LY PSU led 10-0 going 147 yds in 2 drives but was held scoreless with just 160 yds the rest of the way.

Penn St has won all 6 meetings at home vs Illinois. LY the Lions led 7-3 at HT but dominated the 2H including a 198-(-2) yd edge in the 3Q before all'g a TD w/42 left.

BONUS: Penn St went 4-0 LY in B10 AG's and are 7-1 the last 2 years. All 4 of PSU's true away games this year are vs opp's that went to a bowl last year.

PSU's shutout LY of UM was the 40th under Paterno. PSU has outgained UM the L3Y by 198 ypg. These schools have avg just 43 ppg in their 11 meetings & LY UM ran just 40 plays (PSU best S/77).

PSU has outscored UM by 27 ppg the L2Y but had dropped 9 straight prior by 12 ppg. Last year the Nittany Lions held the Wolverines to their season low 250 yards.

PSU has outscored NU by 21 ppg in their 10 wins & in their 3 losses have been outscored by 9 ppg. LY PSU trailed 13-10 at HT and was tied into the 4Q but then scored 3 TD's in 3:40.
