## **POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010**

QUARTERBACKS - Jeff Ballard (PS#44) won 90.5% of his sts ('05-'06) and set numerous school and MWC records. Marcus Jackson (PS#74) filled in well for Ballard when he was injured early in '06 throwing for 386 (59%) with a 2-1 ratio. In '07 rFr Andy Dalton (PS#74) beat out Jackson. Dalton threw for 2,459 (60%, 10-11), broke TCU's single season comp record (Max Knake '93) and was bowl MVP. Jackson threw for 368 (51%, 3-1). In '08 Dalton missed 2 sts (inj) but still had solid numbers throwing for 2,242 (59%, 11-5). Jackson threw for 372 (56%, 3-2) with 384 rush (5.5). Even with this school producing QB's like Sammy Baugh and Davey O'Brien, Dalton entered '09 as the #3 career passer. Last year they added true frosh VHT Casey Pachall (PS#27, IFS but RS). Jackson spent time at both S and QB (2 pass, 18 rush att). Yogi Gallegos (6'1" 205 So, PS#91) inj'd his knee and played in just 2 (1 rush). Dalton att 371 passes in '07, 307 in '08 and 323 LY and set a new career high with 2,756 yds (61.6%) with an outstanding 23-8 ratio and 512 rush (4.4). Dalton is 29-7 as a starter (Baugh 29-7-2, 1934-'36). Dalton was overlooked by his hometown for the Davey O'Brien Award (not even a semifinalist) but is a sure bet to make it this year. Gallegos and Rick Settle (5'10" 185 rFr) add depth.

RUNNING BACKS-TCU's most famous alum is LaDainian Tomlinson, who rushed for over 4,000 yards in his last 2 yrs here and went on to NFL stardom. Joseph Turner (PS#163) led in '07 (597, 5.2), '08 (577, 4.0) and once again in '09 (754, 5.1). Both Matthew Tucker (PS#96, 676, 6.4) and Ed Wesley (PS#183, 638, 6.3) topped LT's frosh numbers (538, 4.3). This year they lose 0.3) topped to 3 flosh infinites 355, 4.3). This year they lose Turner (12 st) and Chris Smith (51, 3.9). Adding depth are Dwight Smith (IFS), Jercell Fort (5'11" 195 Jr, 99 yd LY), Jai Cavness (5'8" 175 Jr, PS#173, 58 yd), Aundre Dean (6'0" 215 So, PS#6, UCLA trans) and FB's Luke Shivers (6'0" 220 Jr) and Ryan Hightower (5'9" 215 Sr). It's unusual to say, but with 2 frosh who averaged 6.3 ypc in '09 returning, despite replacing their 3 year leading rusher, TCU could be just as good.

RECEIVERS - In '08 the top WR by far was Jimmy Young who had 988 (16.7) earning my 2nd Tm MWC honors. Young set a school record with 226 vs WY. Walter Bryant (6'4") who had 337 (12.5) in '07, was #3 with 298 (11.0). TB Ryan Christian was #2 with 321 (10.7). Last year they had 2 st'rs ret but 1st Tm MWC KR/PR Jeremy Kerley led with 532 (12.1). Young was #2 with 517 (15.7) and Antoine Hicks, who orig sign with Texas (PS#38), was #3 with 478 (20.8). Not listed in the PSL are Garrett Winsett (5'9" 180 Jr), Alonzo Adams (6'0" 190 Sr), Sam Shutt (6'0" 178 So), Billy Pizor (6'0" 180 Sr), Michael Berry (5'11" 185 So), John Brown (6'3" 200 Sr) and TE's Walker Dille (6'4" 242 So, PS#73) and Robert Deck (6'4" 255 Jr). This year they only lose Christian (4 st, 24 rec). Keep an eye on Skye Dawson, who was rated the fastest man in Texas (10.5 100M) in HS and had 111 (8.5) rushing as a true. This is TCÙ's best receiving corps in some time.

OFFENSIVE LINE - HC Gary Patterson has done well with few returning st'rs. In '06 TCU had to replace 4 st'rs but surprisingly improved to 4.5 ypc rush while allowing a MWC low 15 sks (4.3%). They had just 2 st'rs back in '07 and rushed for 165 ypg (3.7) with 23 sks allowed. In 2008 with 4 st'rs back they improved to 220 ypg (4.5) with 18 sks (4.9%). Last year they had to replace 3 st'rs but this time improved to 240 ypg (5.2) while allowing just 12 sks (3.7%). This year they lose 1st Tm MWC LT Marshall Newhouse (12 st, 3Y st'r, #5DC GB) and LT Nic Richmond (1 st, 16 car st). They have 4 st'rs back including two 1st Tm MWC players C Jake Kirkpatrick and RT Marcus Cannon. Since they are more exp'd, they could even top last year's fine numbers. Not listed below are Michael Rosner (6'3" 295 So), Trevius Jones (6'3" 310 So, PS#221), Kirby O'Meara (5'11" 208 rFr) and Daniel Shelley (6'1" 210 So). **DEFENSIVE LINE** - Patterson always fields a top-notch

D-line and they have yielded 2.9 or less ypc rush in 10 of the

last 11 yrs. The only year they did not was '04 when they had to replace all 4 st'rs (still only 3.2). In '07 Kelly Griffin became the first true frosh under Patterson to start every game. Surprisingly in '08 he lost his job leaving them with 2 st'rs back and they still led the NCAA allowing just 47 ypg rush and a paltry 1.7 with 43 sks. The star the last 2 years has been DE Jerry Hughes, who led the FBS with 15 sks in '08. Hughes was the lone ret starter and was the focus of most offenses but still earned 1st Tm AA for a 2nd straight yr. Despite losing 3 st'rs (although Griffin won his job back) the numbers only dropped to 80 ypg (2.6) with 33 sks. This yr they lose Hughes (MWC DPOY, #1DC IND) but have 7 of the top 8 back. This is a more exp'd D-line but Hughes had 11.5 sks (35% of tm) and the returning 7 comb for 14.5. The top returnees are DE Wayne Daniels 1st Tm MWC (5.5 sk) and 2nd Tm MWC DT Cory Grant (2.5 sk). Not listed below are Sean Cady (6'3" 220 rFr) and Jon Koontz (6'2" 230 rFr).

LINEBACKERS - TCU runs a 4-2-5 and all of their safeties are legitimate S's but I'll list the SS here as I limit the DB's to 4 positions. Last year they had to replace their #1, #2 and #3 tkl'rs and all 3 were NFL DC's! I noted that despite the inexp I liked the talent and forecasted that Daryl Washington would be the team's leading tackler. Tank Carder had the best Aug of any Frog and won a starting job (1st Tm MWC). This year they lose 3rd Tm AA SLB Washington (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 11 tfl, #2DC ARZ) but have 5 of the top 6 back. Adding depth are Logan Sligar (5'10" 225 So), Clay Hirt (5'11" 190 rFr), David Stoltzman (6'0" 205 So) and Christopher Cisi (5'9" 195 rFr). This is a more experienced unit and as usual, one of the nation's best



**DEFENSIVE BACKS**-TCU has recorded 4 straight Top 10 finishes in my PDR (#4 in '06 w/1 ret st'r, #9, #2 and #5). Coming into last year, CB's Rafael Priest and Nick Sanders each started 39 consec gms (most exp CB duo in FBS). The Frogs allowed just 47.4% with a 10-14 ratio. This year they lose 1st Tm MWC CB Priest (11 st, 18 tkl, 8 pd), 1st Tm MWC CB Sanders (11 st, 29 tkl, 3 pbu) and WS Corderra Hunter (9 tkl). They signed PS#28JC Malcolm Williams (orig Okla PS#35) last year but he only had 10 tkls. FS Tejay Johnson earned 2nd Tm MWC. Not in the PSL are Evan Kern (5′1Ó" 175 Jr) and James Miller (5'9" 180 rFr). Even with the loss of two 4 year starting 1st Tm MWC CB's they could record their 5th straight Top 10 pass D finish but are down a few notches.

SPECIAL TEAMS -TCU almost always produces a topnotch ST unit under Patterson. In the last 9 years they finished in the Top 35 seven times (#2 in '07). They have had a 1st Tm MWC returnman for 5 straight years. In '08 they had to replace PR Brian Bonner (2nd Tm MWC) but Patterson said Jeremy Kerley would be even better. Kerley had 25 PR (13.9). Aaron Brown was my 1st Tm MWC KR in '08 (29.2). The '08 unit had to replace both their outstanding P and K. Ross Evans was the only frosh on the Lou Groza semifinalist list hitting 12 straight FG's (16-20 long 50) but he missed 6 xp's. TCU finished #18 in '08 and despite losing

KR Brown, moved up to #11 last year. Kerley ended a TCU 89 game stretch without a PR TD (7th longest NCAA). Kerley was the top KR (26.6) and PR (14.4, 2 TD, 563 PR yds school rec) and was the MWC STPOY. Greg McCoy added 10 KR (35.9) & TCU's 29.2 avg was #1 in the NCAA. Evans hit 15-18 FG's (long 48) and Kevin Sharples had 5 TB on 80 KO. Anson Kelton (260 lbs) only had a tm net of 34.8. This unit returns intact with the exception of 2x Unsung Hero Awd winner LS Clint Gresham and will contend for #1 ST honors.

**COACHES**-Gary Patterson has done a tremendous job since taking over when Dennis Franchione bolted prior to the 2000 bowl. Patterson was named CUSA's COY in '02 and the MWC COY in '05 & '09. His 85-28 (75%) record is the 4th best % among active coaches. Last year he led the Frogs to a 12-0 reg season (#4 AP) and earned a BCS bowl bid and was the Walter Camp and FWAA Eddie Robinson COY. Last year Patterson lost 11 year OC Mike Schultz. He elevated Jarrett Anderson (13Y here, WR cch 8Y prior) and Justin Fuente (RB cch 2Y, QB cch TY) to co-OC. Patterson had been an asst under DC Dick Bumpas at Navy and hired the solid DC away from WM. Bumpas (7th year) was a Broyles Award finalist the last 2 yrs. Patterson, who is a hot topic in rumor mills each year, is the longest tenured coach in the MWC.

# PHIL'S FORECAS

Despite not getting the most highly touted HS recruits, TCU has a great weight training program which builds bigger, stronger and faster athletes. Almost 75% of the roster can bench 400 lbs and each year they appear to be the fastest team in the MWC, especially on defense. After being a member of the SWC, TCU has had some outstanding seasons incl 10-2 ('02 in CUSA) and flirted with an '03 BCS bowl berth before losing a late game at S Miss. They have been to a bowl in 11 of the last 12 yrs. In '05 they moved into their 4th conf in 10 yrs. They had to replace 25 lettermen (MWC's highest) and ret just 12 st'rs. They were picked 6th in the '02 CUSA media poll and 6th in the MWC '05 poll and won both titles. In the '05 opener they knocked off #7 Okla on the road (highest rated opp beat S/61). They ended Utah's 18 gm win streak and achieved their fourth 10 win season in 6 yrs and first outright conf title since 1958 (SWC). That was their 3rd diff conf title in 8 yrs and they finished #11 AP (#9 Coaches). In '06 TCU opened 3-2 but won their final 8 to finish #22 TCU was the preseason pick to win the MWC in '07 and their preseason goal was 12 wins and a BCS bowl. Unfortunately they lost 2 key DL's and struggled to a 4-4 start but rebounded to go 8-5. Despite a 4-4 MWC record, they were +107 ypg (2nd best). From '05-'07 they beat five Big 12 teams. In '08 TCU was arguably the best non-BCS team despite their 2 losses. One loss came against Okla (played Nat'l Title gm) only being outFD'd 17-16. They whipped the MWC's preseason conf favorite BYU 32-7. The Frogs were at a disadvantage having to face Utah on the road on a short week and despite a 416-275 yd edge, missed 2 key 4Q FG's and Utah got a TD with :48 for the 3 pt win. Facing an undefeated Boise in the bowl they had a 472-250 yd edge and should have won easier than the 17-16 final. They won their 4th consec bowl for the 1st time school history. TCU had their highest finish (#7) since 1959 (#7 in '59, #6 in '55, #1 in '38). They had a school record 437 pts and 56 TD's. They were +211.4 ypg in the MWC which was double that of unbeaten Utah (+100.8). TCU had just 10 ret st'rs last year. They had to play Virginia, Clemson and BYU on the road but 5 of my 9 sets of power ratings called for them to go unbeaten. At 2-0 they went into Death Valley and won 14-10 with Clemson getting inside the TCU20 twice in the 4Q but coming up short. The Frogs dominated their opp's the rest of the reg season with an average win of 43-12 (484-229 avg yds) but lost the bowl rematch vs undefeated Boise in the Fiesta Bowl. TCU faced 6 teams that went to a bowl in '09 and all 6 of those teams won their bowl game. TCU was ranked #3 when they lost to #6 Boise 17-10. TCU returns 16 st'rs (most MWC) and will be ranked in the preseason Top 10 for the 4th time (#9 '52, #7 '56 and #8 '58). The Frogs have ranked #1 in

the FBS in def 4 times the last 10 years! They outgained MWC foes 9 sets of power ratings call for the Patterson's best team yet!
