

TEXAS LONGHORNS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

QUARTERBACKS - Vince Young had a memorable career here and became the first player in NCAA history to have 2,500 pass and 1,000 rush yds in a season ('05) and left 30-2 as a starting QB. In 2006 rFr Colt McCoy (PS#11) had a much better season than most expected. He set the school record for TD passes in a season (29). In '07 nobody expected a soph slump. While he narrowly missed the school record for pass yds in a season (Major Applewhite 3,357 in '99), he also nearly set the record for most int. McCoy dropped from 68% (29-7 ratio) to 65% (22-18). In '08 I expected McCoy to return to his '06 form and he did even better hitting an NCAA record 76.7% for 3,859 with a 34-8 ratio. He was also the #1 rusher (561, 4.1, Heisman runner-up). McCoy threw for 3,521 (70.6%, 27-12) in '09 but was injured early in the BCS Title game. True frosh Garrett Gilbert (PS#2) beat out Sherrod Harris (PS#23) for #2 and played in 10 throwing for 310 (45.5%, 2-4). Gilbert was tossed into the fire in the Nat'l Champ game and struggled in the 1H (1-10, 2 int) before leading a 2H comeback. Gilbert is firmly entrenched as the st'r after spring. Not listed below is John Paul Floyd (6'1" 188 So). McCoy departs (#3DC CLE) as the winningest starting QB in FBS history with 45 victories.

RUNNING BACKS - Texas has had a terrific RB tradition including Heisman Trophy winners Earl Campbell and Ricky Williams. Cedric Benson became just the 5th player in NCAA history to top 1,000 for 4 straight years including 1,834 (5.6) in '04. Jamaal Charles led the RB's for 3 consec yrs including 1,619 (6.3) in '07. In '08 Vondrell McGee was the top RB with a paltry 376 (4.3). Cody Johnson had 338 (4.4) and Foswhitt Whittaker (PS#18) had 284 (4.4). Last year McGee had 2 fumbles vs ULM (1st RB fmb1 in 17 gm) and then missed 2 (inj). He dropped to 300 (5.4). Tre' Newton (PS#29) led with 552 (4.8). FB Cody Johnson was the #2 RB (335, 3.9) and Whittaker added 212 (4.0). Not listed below are Jeremy Hills (6'0" 195 Jr, PS#19, 170 yds 2Y) and FB's Chris Whaley (6'3" 245 Jr, PS#14), Aaron Smith (6'2" 235 Jr) and Jamison Berryhill (5'11" 232 So). During the spring Brown admitted that the Horns could not have won a game just running the ball in '09. They used the I-formation with Gilbert under C instead of the zone-read option shotgun, which has been their bread and butter since Vince Young was the starter. UT avg'd just 148 rush ypg (4.0) LY, their lowest total S/'02 (the year before Young emerged) and I look for a feature back to finally break out of the pack.

RECEIVERS - In 2008 Jordan Shipley (PS#7) and Quan Cosby (PS#9), who comb for 1,097 yds in '07, became UT's first duo to each top 1,000. Malcolm Williams (PS#11) had 304 (17.9). In '09 they had to replace Cosby but Shipley was a Biletinikoff finalist and led with 1,485 (12.8). Malcolm Williams was #2 with 550 (14.1). James Kirkendoll (PS#28) was #3 with 461 (9.6) and conv QB John Chiles added 319 (9.4). Last year their TE's were wiped out prior to the season as PS#36 Greg Smith (worked with the OL) became the starter and backup DL Ahmad Howard (PS#29LB) was #2 (comb 6 rec). Not listed below are Brock Fitzhenry (5'9" 171 So, PS#79), and TE's Ian Harris (6'3" 250 Jr, PS#22), DJ Grant (6'3" 220 So) and Trey Graham (6'5" 242 Jr, PS#28). Gone are 1st Tm AA Shipley (#3DC CIN) and Dan Buckner (8, 442, 9.8). This unit is loaded with VHT's and should be fine despite the loss of UT's all-time reception leader Shipley.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In 2008 the Horns had 3 sts back but they avg just 167 ypg rush with their 4.3 ypc being their lowest since '02. Last year they only had to replace 1 starter and had 91 career sts back. Surprisingly the numbers dropped to 148 ypg (4.0) with 31 sks (5.7%) with UT running for a combined 99 yds (1.5) while allowing 10 sks vs Neb and Alabama. This year they lose 2nd Tm B12 C Chris Hall (14 st, 3Y st'r), 2nd Tm AA LT Adam Ulatoski (14 st, 4Y st'r) and HM B12 LG



Charlie Tanner (14 st, 3Y st'r). All 10 in the 2 deep are VHT's and while they only have 2 ret st's (47 car sts), they should be able to top '09's numbers which were their weakest since 2002 with the emphasis on downhill running.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '06 Texas had 3 st's back and had their best rush D S/'42 allowing 61 ypg (2.3). In '07 despite just 1 ret st'r, Texas allowed 93 ypg (2.9). In '08 they had to replace two DT's. DE Brian Orakpo earned Big 12 Def POY and won the Nagurski, Lombardi and Hendricks Awards. Texas allowed just 84 ypg (3.1) with an FBS leading 47 sks. Last year they had to replace 3 st's (#1, #3, #4 DC's) but LB Kindel moved to DE and they allowed just 72 ypg rush (2.2) with 44 sks. Kindel was the first player ever to be a finalist for both the Hendricks (DE) and Butkus (LB) awards. This year they lose 2nd Tm B12 DT Lamar Houston (68 tkl, 8 sk, #2DC OAK), Kindel (14 st, 70 tkl, 22 tfl, #2DC BAL) and DT Ben Alexander (4 st, 39 tkl, 7 tfl). Sam Acho had 10 sks and filling in the 2 open spots figure to be senior PS#1 Eddie Jones and soph PS#4 Alex Okafor. The Horns are used to restocking with more quality DL.

LINEBACKERS - Texas splits the playing time at their LB positions as sometimes the backups have more tkl's than the starters. Last year they returned their #1 & #4 tkl'rs. They lost Jared Norton early and Muckelroy moved to his MLB spot. This year they lose Muckelroy (2nd Tm B12, 13 st, 1 tkl'r, 11 tfl), who was only the 2nd Horns LB to be drafted in the last 15 years (#4DC CIN). Norton's return is ? as of press time. Look for some of the outstanding true frosh (PS#1, #7 & #19) to gain significant time and also watch for rFr Tarig Allen. Despite replacing a DC, this unit still makes my Top 10.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - After a #6 finish in my PDR in '05, the Horns yielded a school record 236 ypg passing and shockingly dropped to #63 in '06. In '07 they had to replace 3 st's (all DC's) including a Thorpe Award winning CB and finished #45 allowing a new record of 278 ypg (#109 in FBS!). In '08 they had to replace 3 st's again but moved up to #19. Last year they only had to replace one starter (2nd Tm B12). Earl Thomas had a 92 yd IR TD vs Colo (longest S/'36) and set a school rec with 8 int's (2 TD's). Texas climbed again to #4 allowing 55.4% and a 14-25 (180 ypg). Not listed below are Cody Hill (5'10" 177 Jr), and Jorge Martinez (6'0" 200 Sr, PS#315). This year they lose their star 1st Tm AA SS Thomas (14 st, 77 tkl, 8 int, 16 pbu, #1DC SEA), Deon Beasley (1 st, 15 tkl), Clark Ford (17 tkl) and Marcus Davis (10 tkl). Since they started 5 DB's, they return 4 full-time st's and 11 of 12 on the 3 deep are VHT's. This is a very exp'd group and is my #1 rated secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - With Brown's great recruiting classes, most of the bkps are VHT's and contribute here. Since 2000 they have finished #18, #10, #16, #15, #36, #1 (in '05), #12, #26, #10

and #3 ('09) in my ST rankings. Last year all of the top players were back and the unit accounted for 3 KR, 2 PR and 2 blk'd punts for TD's with Mack Brown saying that ST coach Duane Akina is the best in the country for setting up blk'd kicks. RFr DJ Monroe's first collegiate touch was an 89 yd KR TD (1st UT player 2 career KR TD) and he avg'd a super 33.6. Hunter Lawrence hit the winning 46 yd FG in the Big 12 Title game while hitting 24-27 (long 49, 1 miss 54) on the season. Justin Tucker had 14 TB's on 99 KO's and a 40.4 avg on punts (rugby-style), but they switched to John Gold (44.1). This year they must replace PR Shipley (13.0) and K Lawrence but once again should finish near the top.

COACHES - Mack Brown took over a team that had 3 winning seasons the previous 7 yrs (4-7 prior yr). He has now won or tied for 6 Big 12 South Titles and has had 20 consec winning seasons as a HC (18 st bowls). He is also the only coach to have 14 consec 9 win seasons. In '08 Mack Brown won the Bobby Dodd Nat'l COY. OC Greg Davis was with him at N Car and his offense has had 10 of Texas' top 11 seasons in passing yds. They've recorded 35 offensive team records and 41 fifty-point games in his tenure. They had co-DC's in '07 but after the D allowed 25.3 ppg (most S/'98), Brown made a tremendous hire bringing in Will Muschamp who was the DC at Auburn ('06-'07). He was also the DC at LSU ('01-'04) and the asst def HC with the Miami Dolphins in '05 under Nick Saban. He guided LSU's Nat'l Title D in '03 (#1 in the FBS). Muschamp will take over as HC when Brown eventually steps down and turned down an offer to become Tenn's HC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Mack Brown came into '05 with just a 1-12 record vs Top 5 tms but things changed in a big way. UT defeated #4 Ohio St on the road and after having lost 5 straight to Okla, won comfortably 45-12. They beat defending National Champ #1 USC in the Rose Bowl winning their first National Title since 1970. In '06 Vince Young left for the NFL and they had their 21 gm win streak snapped vs #1 Ohio St. They still knocked off Okla and were #4 with a shot at the National Title game when QB McCoy was inj'd and they lost B2B gms to K-St and A&M not even getting to the Big 12 Title game. They barely got past Iowa in the bowl to finish 10-3. They were 6-2 in the Big 12 but only +43.9 ypg (4th best), a big drop from 2005 (+211 ypg). UT had 13 st's back in '07 and while they had many unimpressive performances (dropped as low as #23), they ended up at #10. They started 0-2 in the conf for the first time S/'56 (1-9 SWC). After being upset by A&M in the finale, Brown was determined to win the bowl and said every starting job was open in bowl practices. Texas responded with a 52-34 wipe out of #12 Ariz St getting their 7th straight year of double digit wins. Texas had just 11 ret st's in '08 and drew KU and MO out of the North and had to play TT and Okla away from home. It looked like '08 would be a good year but '09 would be the year they contended for the Nat'l Title. At 5-0 Texas did trail #1 Okla by 8 in the 3Q but won. They knocked off #11 MO and got past #7 Okla St but then vs #6 TTech, gave up a TD with :01 left and lost. After routing their final 3 opp's, they were denied a chance to play in the Big 12 and National Title games thanks to the league's tie-breaker. A disappointed Longhorns team still beat #10 Ohio St in the Fiesta Bowl. Texas was +115.3 (3rd best) in the B12 (LY Texas ret'd 14 st's) and I projected them to get to the National Title game which they did. They were 5-0 when OU QB Bradford was inj'd in the 1Q and the Longhorns rallied for a 16-13 win. They rolled through the rest of the season but had a close call in the Big 12 Title game as McCoy's final pass was orig ruled OOB with no time left but :01 was put back on and a 46 FG snuck through the uprights. In the BCS Title game UT led 6-0 but unfortunately McCoy was inj'd (just 5 offensive snaps) and despite a 276-263 yd edge, 5 TO's did them in and they lost by 16 to Bama. Some signs are pointing down this year as Texas loses McCoy and has just 12 ret st's. They had only 8 sts lost to injury in '09 and were +9 in TO's. They had an incredible off ypg of 10.7 (see pg 299) and their +94.3 ypg was only 3rd best in the B12. This will be another outstanding year but I have them 2nd in the South and they won't match LY's 13 win total.

UT has beaten Rice 38 of 39 games incl 10 straight topping 50+ pts in each of the L/4, avg score 53-10. In '08 (L/gm) Rice led 3-0 but UT had a 600-318 yd edge in the blowout. Texas is 3-0 vs Wyoming but LY got off to a slow start trailing 10-6 late 2Q before "waking up" (UT held WY out of EZ). Longhorns are 10-0 in home openers with the avg MOV by 42 ppg. "Survival" is the word HC Brown described the victory LY vs TT as UT was outFD'd (-5) & outgained (-74 yds). Once again this gm will be played early to give a network an attractive B12 gm. This series is tied at 2, but UT hasn't beaten the Bruins S'71. Their L/meeting was in '98 (Brown's 1st yr & 1st loss as UT's HC) & UT was outgained 584-388 in the 49-31 loss to #6 UCLA. LY UT held OU to -16 rush yds, lowest ever in RRR history (9th best all-time by the Horns). After dropping 5 straight from 2000-'04, Texas has now won 4 of the L/5 in this series.

UT has won 8 of 9 vs NU incl 5 straight but 4 were decided by 3 pts or less. UT hit a 46 yd FG as time expired LY in the B12 Title gm as McCoy's pass prior hit OOB w/01 left. Texas has won 9 straight B12 HG's. Horns are 6-0 vs the Cyclones in B12 action. In their L/meeting ('07) UT held ISU to 58 yds, 3 FD's & 0 pts in the 2H of the 56-3 win. In the win LY vs BU, McCoy tied UGA's David Greene for a major college QB w/42 (following wk vs KU broke record). RB Johnson ran for a career high 109 yds (5.7) LY vs BU. UT has dropped B2B gms vs KSU & are just 1-3 in Manhattan. In the L/gm ('07) UT outgained KSU (+58 yds) but lost by 20 pts all g 2 KR TD's & an IR TD (UT's worst home defeat in Brown era). UT has dominated this series winning 12 in a row. The last & only time UT lost to OSU in Austin was in 1944! UT was outgained LY (3rd opp to do so in '09) by OSU but won the TO battle 5-1.
