

# USC TROJANS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

**QUARTERBACKS** - In the past decade five Trojan QB's have been drafted and Carson Palmer and Matt Leinart both won Heisman Trophies. Soph Mark Sanchez (PS#2) had 3 sts and threw for 695 (61%, 7-5) in '07 when starter John David Booty (PS#1) was inj'd. The Trojans' 238 ypg passing in '07 was their lowest since Carroll's first season in 2001 (227). In '08 Sanchez battled the mobile Aaron Corp (PS#9) and Ark transfer Mitch Mustain (PS#1). Mustain was 8-0 as a starter for the Hogs in '06 throwing for 894 (52%, 10-9). I said even with the loss of 2 yr st'r Booty, they could improve. Sanchez threw for 3,207 (66%) with a 34-10 ratio (#1 P10 pass eff). Mustain played in 8 (157 yd) while Corp played in 5 (14 yd). Carroll was not happy when Sanchez opted to leave early for the NFL which left the Trojans with the least exp'd QB's of his tenure. Corp was the starter out of spring but suffered a cracked fibula and true frosh Matt Barkley (PS#5) took most of the snaps in Aug. Barkley was impressive early but inj'd his shoulder leading the comeback vs Ohio St. Corp started vs UW but hit just 13 of 22 (110 yd) in the upset loss. Barkley played well upon his return (278 ypg, 60%, 6-4) during the Trojans' 4 game win streak. As the season began to turn south he struggled hitting 7 of 22 for 112 yds vs Ariz St, tossing 3 int vs Stanford and passing for just 144 in the home loss to Arizona. In the bowl he hit 27-37 for 350. Overall Barkley threw for 2,735 (59.9%) with a poor 15-14 ratio. The Trojans avg'd just 222 ypg passing (lowest under Carroll). At times Mustain passed Corp for the #2 spot. Not in the PSL is Princeton transfer Brett Kan (6'2" 190 PS#120). Corp transferred but this is a much more exp'd unit and Barkley should step it up as a sophomore.

**RUNNING BACKS** - This is a school known for its RB's with five Heisman Trophy winners in Mike Garrett, OJ Simpson, Charles White, Marcus Allen and Reggie Bush. In '06 they had to replace a tremendous set of RB's in Bush and powerful LenDale White (comb 3042, 7.7, 40 rush TD's) who were the only 2 RB's in the Carroll era at that time to run for 1,000. Stafon Johnson (PS#3), who was #2 in '07 (673, 6.9) led in '08 with 705 (5.1). Joe McKnight, who had 540 (5.7) in '07 was #2 in '08 with 659 (7.4). CJ Gable (PS#9) was #3 with 617 (5.8). Last year Johnson suffered a horrific weight room injury and played in just 4 but was still the #3 rusher. Allen Bradford (PS#3) was #2 with 668 (5.8). Carroll finally had a feature RB in McKnight, who became the Trojans' 26th 1,000 yard rusher with 1,014 (6.2). This year they lose McKnight (#4DC NYJ, 11 st), Johnson (1 st) and FB Adam Goodman (9 gm). Adding depth are Curtis McNeal (5'8" 190 So, PS#34) and FB Hunter Simmons (6'2" 235 rFr). Despite the loss of 2 of their top 3 rushers, this unit is still loaded with talent with true frosh Dillon Baxter (PS#4) compared to Bush by Kiffin in the spring.

**RECEIVERS** - In '08 Ark (5 st) '06 transfer Damian Williams (PS#11) led with 869 (15.0). Last year they had 4 of their top 5 back. Ronald Johnson (PS#14) was #3 in '08 but he broke his

collarbone and missed the first 5. Anthony McCoy was one of the most impressive TE's in the country but did miss 3 and was #2 with 457 (20.8). Williams had more than twice as many yds as McCoy with 1,010 (14.4) and was Off Bowl MVP (12-189) while Johnson was #3 (378, 11.1). RFr Brice Butler (PS#17) added 292 (14.6) and David Ausberry (PS#2) had 123 (10.2). This year they lose Williams (#3DC TEN) and McCoy (9 st, #6DC SEA). They add in a host of VHT's and not listed below are Travon Patterson (5'10" 175 Sr, PS#58), Spencer Vigoren (6'4" 220 Sr), Robbie Boyer (6'0" 185 So, PS#132), and TE's Ian Wandler (6'4" 270 Sr) and Jordan Cameron (6'5" 220 Sr), who was #1 out of spring. Despite being less exp'd, with a seasoned QB they could put up better numbers.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '07 USC had to replace 2 st's and the unit was hit hard by inj's. They still paved the way for 197 ypg rush (5.0) with just 17 sks (3.7%). In '08 they lost their 20th 1st round OL DC since 1968 in LT Sam Baker and had just one starter ret but did have 5 with starting exp. Surprisingly the inexp'd O-line matched '07's numbers with 195 ypg (5.0, 18 sk). Last year the entire 2 deep ret'd and SJStHC Dick Tomey said that USC's O-line was the best he'd seen in his long career. They did lose star C Kristofer O'Dowd for 5 gm (inj) but the numbers actually slipped a little to 167 ypg rush (4.9) with 18 sks (4.7%). This year they lose 1st Tm P10 C/G Jeff Byers (13 st, 3Y st'r), 1st Tm P10 LT Charles Brown (13 st, 2Y st'r, #2DC NO), RG Alex Parsons (11 st, 2Y st'r) and bkp Nick Howell (9 gm). O'Dowd returns and the PSL includes 9 players who are PS#20 or better. This unit is less exp'd but '09's numbers were lower than expected.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - The Trojans always field a premiere D-line. In 2003 they allowed just 1.8 ypg rush with 55 sks. Their "worst" year of the decade was '05 when they yielded 3.8 ypc. Last year they had to replace 3 st's (#1, #2 and #4 DC's). After gm 6, they led the nation in sacks per game and were 2nd in tfl. Shockingly in 2 of the next 3, they would yield 391 rush (8.0) vs Oregon and 325 (6.5) vs Stanford (0 sks in those 2). For the season USC allowed 128 ypg (3.7) with 35 sks. This year they lose 1st Tm Pac-10 DE Everson Griffen (12 st, 45 tkl, 8 sk, #4DC MIN) and DT Averell Spicer (2 tkl, inj). NT Christian Tupou (11 st, 25 tkl) tore his ACL in the spring game and is expected to miss the season. Six of the top 8 return with all 12 in the 3 deep being VHT's (5 w/st exp). This remains one of the premiere D-lines in the country.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '08 the Trojans led the NCAA in ppg allowed (9.0) with the best set of LB's in the country. While that '08 unit had to replace #1 and #5 DC's, they produced the Bednarik Award winner, a 1st Tm AA and #1, #2 and #4 NFL DC's. DC Rocky Seto said the '09 version was faster and while they played well early, they had 4 poor games and allowed 19.8 ppg (worst S/'05). Chris Galippo battled neck and back injuries while Malcolm Smith (PS#12) missed 3. This year they only lose Luther Brown (9 tkl) and Uona Kaveinga (2 tkl) as the top 5 return (4 w/7+ car sts). Not listed in the PSL are Will Andrew (6'2" 225 rFr) and Ross Cumming (6'1" 220 Jr). The 3 starters are a PS#2, #12 and #12 and this is a vastly more exp'd unit.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Under Pete Carroll, the Trojans finished #16, #12, #7, #1, #9, #10, #6, #1 and #14 in my pass D rankings. Last year they had to replace a pair of #6DC's and then proj'd starting CB Shareece Wright missed the entire reg season. Taylor Mays turned down the NFL, but wasn't 100% due to a knee injury suffered vs Ohio St. This year they lose 1st Tm AA FS Mays (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 4 pd, #2DC SF), SS Will Harris (13 st, #4 tkl'r, 4 int, 4 pbu), 2nd Tm P10 CB Kevin Thomas (13 st, 57 tkl, 11 pbu, #3DC IND) and 2nd Tm P10 CB Josh Pinkard (12 st, 59 tkl, 2 int, 9 pbu). This unit is my biggest question mark on the 2010 team as they have just 5 career starts ret (lose 116 car st). Not listed below are CB's Allen Noble (6'0" 190 Jr) and Spencer Spiegel (5'11" 175 Jr). Naturally 8 players in the 3

deep are VHT's. This is the first time since I began publishing my magazine (1995) that USC returns zero starters at DB.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - USC finished #29, #15, #87 and #36 in my ST rankings from '03-'06. In '07 they surprisingly dropped to a Carroll era low of #101. In '08 I called for a large improvement and they were #50. Last year they had to replace their K and P and then top PR Stafon Johnson was inj'd after 4. Carroll did hire the first full-time ST coor (Brian Schneider) at USC since '01. Nebraska transfer Jordan Congdon (24-30 FG's w/NU) hit 12-16 (long 42). P Jacob Harfman (PS#36JC) missed a 50 yd FG vs UCLA. Billy O'Malley opened as P (37.3) but Harfman took over and avg 39.8 (37.0 tm net, 12 in 20). PR Damian Williams avg 14.2 with 2 TD's. The Trojans only finished #59. This year they lose Congdon and Williams but should have their best finish since at least '06 especially with the addition of ST cch John Baxter (Fresno '97-'09).

**COACHES** - Pete Carroll had been an NFL HC (NYJ and Patriots) and was lured back to the pros by SEA this year. Carroll led USC to a 97-19 record with two National Titles and an unprecedented 7 consecutive P10 Titles ('02-'08) in 10 years. The Trojans nabbed Carroll's former OC Lane Kiffin to take over. Kiffin was an asst at USC under Carroll for 6 years (OC L/2) before becoming the youngest HC in modern NFL history at 31 in '07. He was fired by the Raiders 4 gms into the '08 ssn (5-15 2Y). Tennessee hired him to revitalize a stale program LY and he led them to a 7-6 record, but disappointingly left them in the lurch after 1 ssn. Kiffin is his own OC and he brings his father, legendary DC Monte Kiffin, with him. Monte was the DC of the Tampa Bay Bucs for 13 yrs prior to joining his son at UT LY. DL cch/recruiting coor Ed Orgeron also returns to USC (DL coach here '98-'04) to help run the D.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Pete Carroll had inherited a team that had only topped 6 wins in a season once ('98) in the 5 yrs before he arrived. Not too many fans were excited about Pete Carroll's hiring but his was the only team in the country to finish in the AP Top 4 in each of the 7 yrs from 2002-'08. They won a National Title in '04 and nearly again in '05. In '07 they were the consensus preseason #1. The Trojans dropped as low as #13 after losing 2 P10 games but finished #3 after winning their last 5. In '08 the Trojans had just 11 ret starters but had most of their tough Pac-10 games at home so were favored for the conf title again. USC had the most impressive ypg in Pac-10 play (+232.7) since 2005 (Bush, Leinart, White +274.5). After beating Ohio St at home they were upset by Oregon St on the road but were 12-1 (#3) including a 38-24 thrashing of Penn St in the Rose Bowl. Their D allowed just 9.0 ppg (#1 NCAA) and is the top mark here S/'67 (7.9). The D was a question mark heading into '09 (3 st's back). They performed well early and after USC beat Ohio St on the road, they appeared on the fast track for a potential National Title game. Unfortunately they once again lost the game after Ohio St to a P10 team on the road (Wash) playing without QB Barkley (inj). The Trojans destroyed Wash St and Cal the next 2 weeks (combined 57-9) and got past both ND and Oregon St. They were #4 and favored in Autzen Stadium one week after allowing 36 pts to OSU. They yielded 47 to UO (worst loss S/'97), the most pts allowed by USC in Carroll's tenure. They escaped Ariz St (14-9) but then Jim Harbaugh and Stanford handed it to them 55-21. It was their worst home defeat since 1966 and the most points EVER allowed by a USC team. The score was 28-21 going into the 4Q. While Carroll was upset at Harbaugh for piling it on late, he used a similar tactic when they threw a TD pass after UCLA called a TO in the final minute in a 28-7 win. In the battle for the Holiday Bowl berth, Ariz got a 36 yd TD pass with 3:14 left sending the 8-4 Trojans to the Emerald Bowl. I wondered if Carroll could get his team up for their first non-Rose Bowl since '04 especially after falling out of the AP Top 25 (102 wk streak). They rebounded to beat BC 24-13. Their 2 losses at home LY were the most since Carroll's first season ('01). They made a controversial hire bringing in Lane Kiffin when Carroll ret'd to the NFL. The Trojans were 5-4 in the Pac-10 but were actually -19.4 ypg (4th worst). USC does have just 10 ret st's but they have a more seasoned D (best in P10) and now have a veteran QB. The Trojans should open up 5-0 which would have them buying into Kiffin and gaining confidence. They have five P10 HG's and a great shot at their 8th Pac-10 crown in 9 years.

USC has won 12 str ssn openers. These two last met in the 2005 opener (at Hawaii), a 63-17 Trojan victory. The Trojans are 28-1 vs current WAC opponents (6-0 vs Hawaii).

The Trojans are 12-6 vs the ACC. USC's won 12 straight home openers the last 6 by an avg of 46-7. They're 6-0 in that span vs non-conf/BCS teams with a 29-10 avg score.

USC leads this series 4-1-1 all-time (last matchup in Minn was in 1980 a 24-7 win). After LY's road win at Ohio St, the Trojans are 68-27-2 all-time vs current Big Ten tms.

In USC's last visit to Pullman, the Trojans did not allow the Cougars to get past their own 45 yard line in the 69-0 shutout. USC has won 7 straight in this series by 33 ppg.

For the 2nd straight year after a big win over Ohio St, USC was upset as they allowed a FG with :03 remaining to the Huskies in the 16-13 upset. USC is now 6-1 vs UW.

With their 55-21 loss to Stanford LY, the USC defense had allowed 111 points over its last 3 games, making the most allowed during a 3-game stretch in school history.

The Trojans have outscored the Golden Bears by a combined 47-6 the past 2 season's while outgaining Cal by an average of 434-220. Last home loss to Cal was in 2000.

In last year's mauling in Eugene, Pete Carroll lost just his second game by more than a TD in his 9 years of coaching the Trojans (27-16 loss to ND in '01, Carroll's 1st year).

In a game that featured 18 penalties for 173 yds, USC escaped with a 14-9 victory LY in Tempe despite ASU having large edges in both yards (347-258) & FD's (23-12).

Prior to LY's loss in the Coliseum, the Trojans had won 7 straight against Arizona. With the loss to UA, USC lost 2 gms in one season at the Coliseum for the 1st time S/'01.

Trailing 21-0 at HT, #1 USC lost in Corvallis for a 2nd consec time 2 yrs ago. USC has lost just 3 times to OSU S/'68. Trojans have dropped 4 str in the state of Oregon.

USC has outscored the Irish by a 40-15 avg dating back to 2002. In Notre Dame's last visit to the Coliseum, the Trojans held the Irish to just 91 yds and 4 first downs.

USC has won 10 of 11 after LY's 28-7 victory. USC has allowed just 11 ppg to UCLA the past 5 ssns. LY USC took a knee (:54) but after a UCLA time-out threw a 48 yd TD pass.
