

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2010

OUARTERBACKS - In '06 Sean Glennon (PS#21) started all 13 and threw for 2,191 (56%, 11-11). In '07 VT signed Tyrod Taylor (PS#3) who drew many comparisons to Michael Vick. Due to injuries and coaches decisions, Glennon and Taylor split time. Glennon took control by year's end and threw for 1,796 (61%, 12-5). Taylor threw for 927 (54%, 5-3) with 429 rush (4.2). In '08 HC Frank Beamer made a surprising announcement that Taylor would RS. After losing the opener to EC, Beamer reversed his decision. Taylor started 10 and threw for 1,036 (57%) but with a poor 2-7 ratio (738 rush, 5.0). Glennon (4 st) threw for 743 (60%, 3-5). They also used TE Greg Boone in the "Wild Turkey" formation (1 pass, 76 rush yds). Taylor was the clear-cut starter in '09 and showed obvious improvement (2311, 56%, 13-5, 370 rush) as 31.6% of his comp's were for 20+ yds (11.1% in '08). He had streaks of 105 and 84 att's without an int. Without an exp'd bkp Taylor ran less. RFr Ju-Ju Clayton's (PS#185) first collegiate pass was an 80 yd TD vs BC but that was his only completion on 5 att's (5 gm). Logan Thomas (PS#3TE) battled Clayton in Aug but RS. Not in the PSL is Will Cole (6'0" 195 rFr, PS#267). VT did not run the Wild Turkey until late in the yr (Boone 2 rush, 1 pass). Taylor should be one of the ACC's top QB's in 2010.

RUNNING BACKS - In 2008 rFr Darren Evans (PS#16) took the starting job and set the ACC single season frosh rushing record with 1,265 (4.4). Unfortunately Evans tore his ACL in Aug '09 so the top returnee was soph Josh Oglesby (PS#75, 88, 2.3 '08) and he battled rFr Ryan Williams (PS#11) and true frosh David Wilson (PS#8). All 3 RB's were banged up in Aug so they moved in WR Tony Gregory (6'0" 186 rFr, PS#113) and prepped walk-on rFr Zac Evans (5'10" 194 So) for PT. They opted to play true frosh David Wilson (5'10" 211 So) more in Wk 2 and he along with Williams, became the first VT duo ever to top 160 each in the same game. Williams did have a costly fumble vs NC (4Q) but after that played with a vengeance and broke Evans' frosh record with 1,655 (5.6) with an ACC record 22 total TD's (1st Fr in ACC to lead conf in rush and scoring). QB Taylor was #2, Oglesby was #3 (335, 4.3) and Wilson #4 (334, 5.7). Not listed below is Kenny Lewis (5'9" 206 Sr, PS#49, 657 career yd, inj LY). This yr the only loss is FB Kenny Jefferson

(2 st) and RB coach Billy Hite calls this his strongest backfield in 32 years and I rank it the #2 overall RB unit in '10 (pg 12).

RECEIVERS - In '08 VT had to replace THREE NFL DC's and their top returning WR had just 3 rec. The inexp showed as there were numerous games with key dropped passes. VT was one of just 2 teams left in the FBS that did not have a WR with a TD catch when they finally got one in Wk 11. True frosh Jarrett Boykin led with 441 (14.7) while rFr Danny Coale was #2 with 408 (11.3). TE Greg

Boone added 278 (12.6) while true frosh Dyrell Roberts (PS#94) had 227 (13.4). Last year all 4 ret'd and Boykin improved to 835 with an outstanding 20.9 ypc and Coale was #2 with 614 (20.5) Roberts had 390 (17.7) and rFr Xavier Boyce added 88 (11.0). This year they lose TE's Boone (12 st, 7 rec) and Sam Wheeler (2 st, 2 rec). Not in the PSL are Nubian Peak (5'11" 183 rFr, PS#125), DJ Coles (6'3" 222 So, PS#38), Ben Barber (5'11" 212 rFr, PS#92), Austin Fuller (6'2" 205 So, PS#126) and TE's George George (6'3" 265 So), Randall Dunn (6'2" 245 So) and Rob Stanton (6'5" 234 Sr). This is VT's most experienced rec corps in 3 yrs.

OFFENSIVE LINE-VT had mostly exp'd O-lines in the first

six years of the decade with the avg ypc during that span being 4.55. In '06 they had to replace 3 st'rs (all 1st or 2nd Tm ACC) The less exp'd unit had their worst ypg (113, 3.2) rush since '72 (107) while allowing 9% sks (29). In '07 VT had to replace 2 strs and RT Ed Wang only started the last 8. The rush total improved to 134 ypg (3.3), but VT allowed a mind-boggling 54 sks (14.2%). In '08 VT had to replace a #1DC but moved up to 174 ypg (3.8) but still allowed the highest sk% (14.5) in FBS Last year they had to replace 2 multi-yr starters but returned 4th yr starter OG Sergio Render. They were more athletic with 4 ex-TE's in the spg 2 deep. VT improved to 208 ypg rush (4.7) with 31 sks (12.4%). This year they lose 2nd Tm ACC LG Render 12 st, 4Y st'r), 2nd Tm ÁCC LT Éd Wang (13 st, 3Y st'r, #5DC BUF) and C Richard Graham (5 gm). Six return with starting exp and while their career starts dropped from 90 to 54, this unit should be just as solid as the '09 version. **DEFENSIVE LINE**-VT always has an exceptional run defense

but in '08 they had to replace 3 st'rs (1st Tm ACC DT, #5DC DT, #3DC DE). Their numbers slipped to their "worst" in 4 yrs at 104 ypg (3.2) with 35 sks. In '08 they rotated 3 DT's and 3 DE's and 5 of the 6 ret'd in '09 so it was very surprising to me that VT allowed 128 ypg rush and 3.6 ypc (highest S/'92!) This year the losses are heavy as gone are 2nd Tm ACC DE Jason Worllds (13 st, 49 tkl, 4.5 sk, #2DC PIT), DT Cordarrow Thompson (13 st, 25 tkl, 1.5 tfl), DE Nekos Brown (13 st, 56 tkl, 6.5 sk) and DT Demetrius Taylor (5 st, 31 tkl, 5 tfl). Not in the PSL is Andrew Hutchings (6'2" 275 Sr). This unit is not as exp'd or talented as '09 and will not match the last 2 years' sack totals but could actually improve vs the rush.

LINEBACKERS - In both 2008 & '09 VT had to replace their #1 and #2 tkl'rs. While they had just one starter ret last year, backup Cody Grimm was actually the #3 tkl'r (71, 7.5 sks) in '08. Cam Martin (13 st '08) was not 100% and lost his job (20 tkl). This year they lose their #1 tackler in 3rd Tm AA Grimm (13 st, 106 tkl, 12.5 tfl, #7DC TB), Martin, Mark Muncey (6 tkl, 1 sk) and Jake Johnson (8 sts, #6 tkl'r) who transferred. Not in the PSL is Jack Tyler (5'11" 223 rFr, PS#329). Grimm was ACC POW 3 times and was tied for 1st in the FBS with 7 FF. This time they return their #2 and #7 tkl'rs making them equal to '09.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - VT always has a solid pass D and in the last 6 years they have finished #11, #2, #13, #2, #25 and #9. Last year's unit had 3 st'rs back and yielded 47.4% (9-11 ratio). This year they lose 2nd Tm ACC FS Kam Chancellor (13 st, 68 tkl, 2 int, 5 pbu, #5DC SEA), CB Stephan Virgil (10 st, 36 tkl, 1 pd), ROV Dorian Porch (9 st, 42 tkl, 4 pd) and ROV Matt Reidy (21 tkl). CB Rashad Carmichael snagged 6 int LY (4.26 spd) and is one of the ACC's top CB's. Not in the PSL is Mark Carter (6'0" 177 rFr). Three return who started in the bowl. ROV Davon Morgan started the last 4 and had more tkls (47) than Porch. Despite all that, this unit figures to drop a few notches in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Beamer coaches this unit himself and VT almost always finishes near the top of my ST rankings (#1 finish in '07). In '08 they had to replace their K and top KR and it was shocking to me that VT finished a lowly #79. They gave up 3 PRTD's for the first time in over 50 yrs and also had 2 punts blk'd incl one that was ret'd for a TD vs EC. VT did lose their 2 gunners Zach Luckett (susp) and Brandon Dillard (inj) unexpectedly. Last

year I called for them to be one of the most improved ST units in the country and VT did not disappoint (#13). For the 3rd straight year they had a 1st time senior starter at K and Matt Waldron (PS#17) hit 20-23 (long 46). P Brent Bowden improved his net rom 33.2 to 37.6. True frosh PR Jayron Hosley (PS#60) did well (11.2) while David Wilson (19.1) and Dyrell Roberts (31.9) split the KR duties. This year they lose both their K and P (#6DĆ TB) but I am sure Beamer will field another solid unit.

COACHES-I think Frank Beamer is one of the most outstanding coaches in the NCAA. He was a DB at VT from '66-'68 and the Hokies were in just 6 bowl games prior to his arrival ('87). Beamer filled the large shoes of Bill Dooley who went 64-37-1 from 78-'86. Beamer had four losing seasons in his first six including 2-8-1 in '92, but amazingly VT stuck with him and has been greatly rewarded. Beamer has not only taken them to 17 bowls since '93 but has made them a National Title contender. He has been the ACC COY twice. OC Bryan Stinespring is entering his 18th year here (OC S/'02). Stinespring has been much maligned recently with VT's offense ranking #100 and #103 in '07 and '08 but they improved to #50 in '09. Bud Foster has been with VT S/'87 and the DC since 1995. He was a Broyles Award finalist in '99, '01 and '05 and won the Award in '06 (only 4x finalist in awards history). Foster's defense was #1 in the FBS in '05 and '06, #4 in '07, in '08 and #12 last year. He interviewed for the Clemson HC job in '08 and turned down a DC offer from Georgia in Dec

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 1999, the Hokies played in the National Title game going 22-2 in a two year stretch. They are one of just 3 teams in the NCAA that have been to 17 straight bowls (Fla, Fla St). In their first year in the ACC (2004) they had just 10 st'rs back and were actually picked to finish 6th, 7th or 8th. I had them rated higher than all the others at #4 and they even exceeded my expectations as they won the ACC Title. VT almost knocked off undefeated Auburn in the Sugar Bowl finishing #10 at 10-3. The Hokies were 8-0 and #3 in '05 but lost to #5 Miami at home and later dropped the ACC Title game. After the Gator Bowl win they finished #7. VT outgained ACC foes by a conf best +128.8 ypg. In '06 they had just 9 ret st'rs (fewest ACC) but went 6-2 in the conf and 10-3 overall. Their D allowed just 9 FD's in the bowl but VT came up short vs UGA and finished #19. In '07 the Hokies had 14 fifth year seniors and were the preseason pick to win the ACC (#9 AP). They were destroyed by eventual Nat'l Champ LSU 48-7 and they also had some unimpressive wins early but got back to the ACC Title game and beat BC for their 2nd title in four years. Surprisingly, they fell short in selling their allotment of bowl tickets and lost the Orange Bowl to Kansas finishing #9. Beamer came into '08 at 5-24 vs Top 10 teams (only 2 wins vs #8 or better). VT was +11 in TO's in '07 and lost its top rusher, top 4 rec and top 3 tacklers and had just 10 ret st'rs (2nd fewest ACC). Despite those factors, I still picked them first in the Coastal. Beamer may have done his best coaching job yet. With a very young team they had numerous close wins incl getting an int vs Virginia in the EZ. Despite a 3-3 start in the ACC they won their final 2 and had the right teams lose to amazingly get to the ACC Title game where they throttled BC 30-12. VT was 0-4 in BCS bowls since 1996 but in the least anticipated BCS bowl, beat Cincy 20-7. Despite the Hokies' 5-3 reg ssn record in the ACC they were only +34.0 ypg (5th best). Last year Tech had 15 ret st'rs as they lost 1,000 yard rusher Darren Evans (ACL) over the summer. They did have to play their 2 toughest games on the road (in Atlanta) facing eventual National Champ Alabama and ACC Champ GT. VT is almost unbeatable on Thurs night games but lost at home to NC and finished the regular season 9-3. They had climbed as high as #4 in the polls (prior to GT) but dropped as low as #22. They won their last 5 by 24 ppg and finished #10 in the AP poll. This year VT only has 12 ret st'rs but their +126.4 ypg was the best mark in the ACC (34.4 ypg better than GT). They now have 2
