POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QB's - In 2008 they brought in LSU trans Ryan Perrilloux (PS#1) and true freshman PS#144 Marques Ivory (Priest Holmes cousin). Perrilloux earned 2nd Tm OVC honors and Ivory added 127 (58%, 2-0). In '09 Perrilloux threw for 2,350 (59%) with an outstanding 23-2 ratio while rushing for 443 (4.5, 8 td) earning OVC OPOY but departed. Ivory started the '09 opener (Perrilloux susp) and in 9 games threw for 315 (65%, 4-1) with 50 yds (2.1) rushing. Ivory was a press 1st tm OVC fav and proved deserving after their upset of Ole Miss. He finished throwing for 2,248 (58.6%, 18-9) with 193 (3.2) rush but fell short of conf honors. He has dropped 25 lbs this off-ssn. His backups are Soph QB/P Cody Blanchard (PS#114, 296, 65.9%, 8-2, 360, 6.6 rush), who earned OVC FPOY as well as Alabama tran Thomas Darrah (PS#138).

RB's - In '09 Calvin Middleton led with 629 (5.0) and Jamal Young was #2 (523.5.2). Both ret'd LY and again Middleton was #1 (514, 4.4) and Young was #2 (468, 4.5). Darius Barksdale was #3 (389, 3.9), QB Blanchard was #4 and FB Alfonso Freeney was #5 (207, 5.8). TY JSU returns their top guy but lose Young. Waiting in the wings is their next great VHT FBS tran Washaun Ealey (PS#3). Ealey had 9 st in 2Y at Georgia rushing for 1,528 (5.4). This unit is clearly ahead of where they were LY.

Rec's - In '09 the Gamecocks ret'd just their #2 rec from their top 4. James Wilkerson led with 716 (19.9). LY JSU lost their #1 and #2 but ret'd #3-#7. The leading returnee LY was Alan Bonner (300, 21.4 in '09) who finished #4 (245, 14.4). Jeffrey Cameron had 297 (12.9) in '08 then RS in '09 and led LY with 728 (18.7) earning 2nd tm OVC. James Shaw (#4 in '09) was #2 with 316 (12.6) while FIU trans John Houston Whiddon (PS#124), who was inj'd in the '09 opener, was #3 with 281 (10.4). TY they lose their #1 and #3 plus 1st tm OVC TE Cory Freeman (100, 8.3). While about equal to LY they may be stronger as W Mich tran Trey Smith (PS#196) was called "an emerging star" this spring.

O-Line - The OL ret'd 3 st's in '08 and looked to return 3 ret st's again in '09 but they lost one to inj, yet still avg'd 189 ypg and 4.8 ypc. LY they lost only 1 st'r (2nd tm OVC) and while the

rush numbers dipped to 167 ypg (4.2) the sacks went from 24 (8.0%) to just 9 (2.5%). This year they lose 3 All-OVC players (one 1 st, two 2nd). The 2 returnees are LT Odie Rush and RG Tori Mobley. The new LG is De'Von Hayes (2 st) while Fr are on top of the depth chart at C (rFr Max Holcombe) and RT (true Thomas Williams, PS#172). Keep an eye on Colt Kennedy, Ricky Clemons, Ga Southern trans Taylor Johnstone and Matt Jones (20 car st), who was inj'd LY. The losses are deep but will be easier to overcome with talented skill players.

D-Line - The DL ret'd 2 of 3 st's in both '08 and '09 and cut the rush D to 150 ypg and 3.8 ypc. They lost 2 st's LY (a 1st tm OVC) and slipped to all'g 162 ypg and 4.2 ypc. While I call it 1 st'r lost it really is a 1/2 as NG Tim McGee (6st, 18 tkl) departs and Michael Ellis (4 st, 11 tkl) will be the full time replacement. At DT Jamison Wadley (46 tkl, 3 sk, 3.5 tfl) returns after earning 2nd tm OVC. The DE spot will be a battle between DiMetrio Tyson (4 st, 31 tkl, 4 tfl) and Marquis George (2 st, 33 tkl, 5 tfl). Experienced depth will

surely allow this unit to approach '09's numbers. **LB's** - The LB unit ret'd 3 st's in '09 incl a 1st tm OVC and posted their best numbers in recent yrs at 17.1 ppg. LY they again lost 1 st'r but it was their #1 tkl'r and their numbers plummeted to 25.0 ppg. TY they lose the #1 and #2 tkl's (2nd tm OVC). Returning are ROV Monte Lewis (#8 tkl'r, 4 sk) and BAN Rodney Garrett (#4 tkl'r, 13 tfl). Easing the losses are DB Robert Gray (3 st, 31 tkl) and Ole Miss trans Clarence Jackson (PS#107). James Powell (1 st, 25 tkl, 3 tfl) and Brenton Tolson (1 st, 20 tkl) are providing depth. They lose their top 2 but should still put up better numbers.

DB's - The secondary ret'd 3 st's in '09 incl a 1st tm OVC and they were a lock down unit (#10 FCS pass eff D) surrendering just 155 ypg and 50.7% comp. LY they had to replace 2 st's incl their SS (#2 tkl'r) and FS (2nd tm OVC). The unit all'd 198 ypg and a recent high of 58.4%. TY they lose just 1 st'r in CB TJ Heath (9 st, t-#9 tkl'r), who earned 2nd tm AA honors in '09. The Safeties will again be 1st tm OVC Kegnald Harris (10 st, #6 tkl'r, 5 int, 5 pbu) and Jason Horton (12 st, #3 tkl'r, 3 pbu). The veteran CB AJ Davis (34 tkl, 4 pbu), who has made 28 st the L3Y, will be teamed with JC Aries Lockhart (PS#241JC). If the newcomer fails Jawaan Booker (6st, t-#9 tkl'r, 4 pbu) will pick up the slack.

SPECIAL TEAMS - The ST unit returns basically intact incl Fla St tran K James Esco, who hit 13-20 (long 45). Also back is QB/P Cody Blanchard, who will try to improve on a 39.5 avg and 35.5 net. The team was #2 in the FCS in KR's led by Alan Bonner (25.9, 1 td) and James Shaw (26.6). The unit was also #13 in the FCS in PR's again led by Bonner (10.8).

COACHES - HC Jack Crowe enters his 11th ssn here and was also Ark's HC for 3Y's. OC Ronnie Letson is in his 8th ssn. Greg Stewart stepped down last Dec after spending 20Y here (11 as DC) and the new DC will be Chris Boone, who is very familiar with the OVC spending the L3Y in the same role at UTM.

FORECAST - The Gamecocks have an impressive 3 year record of 25-9 with 3 of the losses vs BCS teams and one in LY's playoffs. In LY's season opener they trailed Ole Miss 31-10 at HT but pulled the ssn's biggest FCS upset in 2OT. They had an incredible streak winning their first 5 games all by a td or less including getting a 72 yd td pass w/1:16 left vs Chattanooga and winning in OT vs Georgia St. They pushed their win streak to 8 games before their first lost, at EKU. It was #6 vs #7 and they got their 6th close win on a 17-yd TD pass with :11 left vs SEMO. They led TT 24-7 in the 4Q but looked ahead and gave up 4 TD's in under 10 min. In the 2H of the playoff game vs Wofford they got to the W23 (int'd), W18 (SOD), W18 (FG), and W36 (int'd). The team is clearly better than their 13 returning starters and will again be in the OVC Title hunt.
