POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - In '08 JB Clark took over for a 3Y starter and threw for 2,350 (57%) with a 23-10 ratio. In '09 Clark (1546, 50%, 13-9) started 8 gms and Chris Lum (564, 49%, 5-5) started gms 4-6. LY there was a battle in the spring and when Lum won the job in the fall Clark departed. Lum threw for 2,881 (58%, 19-13) earning 1st tm PL. Mike Colvin had 245 yds both passing (45%, 3-4) and rushing (3.0) and started vs NH when Lum was inj'd. Both return and unlike the 2 previous

ssns they have a clear-cut starter. **RUNNING BACKS** - Jay Campbell was #3 with 66 (3.3) in '08 and was the only one of the top 4 to return in '09. Campbell led 659 (4.7) and was 2nd tm PL. Cambell led again in '10 with 652 (4.1) while adding 194 (11.4) rec and was 1st tm PL but now departs. QB Colvin was #2 in each of the L2Y. Zach Barket (167, 4.1) and Keith Sherman (123, 3.1) got valuable reps and it wouldn't surprise me to see them split time. The FB's are used mainly for blocking and will also split time in Sean Farrell (4st) and Bryce Arruda (3st). While they lose their #1, LY's numbers

were not overwhelming.

RECEIVERS - In '09 this unit had to start from scratch as their top 5 rec did not return. Last year they ret'd their top 4 rec and Jake Drwal, who led in '09 (641, 13.6), finished #2 (622, 11.5) grabbing 2nd tm PL honors. De'Vaughn Gordon was #2 in '09 (504, 14.8), played in 12 gms, but only had 6 rec. His playing time was vacuumed up by Ryan Spadola who had 1 rec in '09 but finished #1 with 1,130 (14.5) earning 1st tm PL and AA honors. Craig Zurn was #3 both seasons and he finished with 569 (14.2) while TE Alex Wojdowski was #4 both years finishing with 249 (12.4) last year. They return the top 2 and with an All-PL WR on

each side it'll be tough going for opposing CB's.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In 2008 the OL ret'd 3 starters but the rush numbers fell to 98 ypg (3.1). In '09 they ret'd just 2 st'rs but that incl 1st tm PL LT Will Rackley and they improved to 125 ypg (3.6). LY 4 of the 5 strs ret'd incl AA Rackley plus a 2nd tm PL RG and while they avg just 104 ypg (3.2), they cut their sks all'd in half (14, 3.0%). TY they lose 2.5 st'rs incl an AA and 1st tm PL. They ret 2nd tm PL C Jim Liebler (2Y st'r), RT Troy McKenna (17st L2Y) and Keith Schauder (16st 2Y) who will try to replace the PL's highest DC ever in AA LT Rackley (#3 JAX). While this unit is not

quite up to LY's group their numbers could get better. **DEFENSIVE LINE** - The DL returned 2 of 3 starters in '08 **DEFENSIVE LINE** - The DL returned 2 of 3 starters in '08 replace Jarard Cribbs (25-5.8) who has been the PR for 3Y and (110, 3.0) but only 1 in '09 (136, 3.5). LY they ret'd 2 starters All-PL KR John Kennedy (19-28.8, #5 FCS).

but DE Cody Connare (7st, 35 tkl, 4.5 tfl in '09) was banged up (11 tkl) and they allowed an almost identical 135 ypg (3.4). This year they only lose a NT (4st) and have 6 back w/ starting exp. Andrew Knapp (13st, 8 tfl) and Ben Flizack (10st, 5.5 tfl) both earned 2nd tm PL while NG Billy Dokouslis (9st) is expected to get a 5th year. The backups incl Connare, Phil Winnett (2st, 20 tkl. 6 tfl) and Tom Bianchi (1st. 32 tkl. 4.5 tfl). I expect the Hawks to have their best numbers in several years.



LINEBACKERS - The unit ret'd 3 of 4 starters in '09 and allowed 21.3 ppg. LY they lost the PL Def POY but again ret'd 3 starters and the team's #1, #6, #7 and #8 tacklers. In this writeup I called for them to break the 20 pt barrier and they did allowing just 19.1 ppg. TY for a 3rd straight season they ret 3 starters incl their 1st tm PL Mike Groome (#1 tkl'r), Colin Newton (#3) and 2nd tm PL Tanner RIvas (#4). The open spot will be filled by either Devin Greene (25 tkl LY, 4st, 45 tkl as DB in '09) or Billy Boyko (29 tkl).

l expect a second straight season of under 20 ppg.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - After losing all 4 starters in 2008 the secondary ret'd a pair of starters in '09 and improved to 188 ypg and 59% comp. LY they ret'd 3 starters incl a 1st and 2nd tm PL but fell back to 210 ypg (58%). This year the cupboard is bare as they lose all 4 starters (comb 84st L2Y) who had all won All-PL honors. CB Bryan Andrews (21 tkl) owns 2 st which is the

TOTAL ret career st for this very young secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Punter Alex Smith avg'd only 34.8 (31.4 net) in his 1st ssn but improved that to 38.3 (35.1 team net) LY earning 2nd tm PL and returns. K Jake Peery also returns and will certainly best his 3-7 performance from LY. They must

**COACHES** - Andy Coen is in his 6th season as HC and was previously an OC at Penn for 6 years. DC David Kotulski returns for his 6th season here. Second year OC Dave Cecchini rejoined Lehigh after being the OC at The Citadel for 4 yrs. He was here as the OC and asst HC from 2001-2003.

FORECAST - The Hawks avg'd 10 wins per season from '98-05 but avg'd just 5 in the next 4 years. LY they ret'd 17 starters and after an expected season opening win at Drake were shutout vs '09 FCS Champ #4 Villanova the next week. The team bounced back to beat Princeton after having lost B2B games and 3 of the L/4 to the Tigers. QB Lum was not available vs #18 NH and they were mauled getting outgained 519-129. Despite getting outgained 415-270, they rebounded again vs Fordham stopping the Rams on downs 5 times. They were outgained again at Harvard but came back from a 17-0 HT deficit to save the season. The next 4 games they rattled off 22, 30, 17 and 17 pt wins incl Holy Cross worst conf home loss since '05. In the nation's longest rivalry the Hawks knocked off Lafayette in their 146th meeting and finished undefeated in the PL for the 1st time since 2001. Lehigh got their 1st playoff win since '01 beating N lowa. Their memorable season came to a close vs Delaware as they only trailed 14-13 late 3Q before the Hens scored 28 pts in the final 18 min. This year their schedule doesn't include Villanova and if the secondary can come together the Bethlehem fans could have football in December for a second straight season.
