


FLORIDA ST SEMINOLES

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - RFr Christian Ponder (PS#22) only played in one gm (8-18-105, 2 int) in '07 but was the clear-cut s't'r in '08. He was the Off MVP after throwing for 2,006 (56%, 14-13). In '09 he was having the best season here since 2000 (Chris Weinke) but was lost vs Clemson. For the season he threw for 2,717 (14-7) and his 68.8% was 2nd best in FSU history. RFr EJ Manuel (PS#4) got his first start vs WF (15-20-220) but struggled in his next 2 sts (1-5 ratio). He said he was not 100% healthy, but still earned the Bowl MVP. The '09 season was the first time FSU completed over 60% since Weinke's Heisman ssn in '00 (only 5th time S/93). Ponder battled through an elbow inj missing 2 gms in '10 and saw his stats drop dramatically (2044, 61.5%, 20-8). Manuel had 2 sts and threw for 861 (69.9%, 4-4) and went 7-7 in the bowl with the gm clinching 4Q drive after replacing the inj'd Ponder early 2Q. Even with the loss of Ponder (#1DC MIN) this unit will only be down a few notches.

RUNNING BACKS - With all of the VHT's and NFL caliber talent former HC Bobby Bowden compiled at the RB position, it's amazing that FSU has not had a 1,000 yard rusher since Warrick Dunn ('96). In '05, FSU had its worst ypg (94, 3.3) rushing S/47 and "improved" to just 97 ypg (3.5) in '06. In '07 Antone Smith (PS#4) rushed for 819 (4.3) and FSU jumped to 128 (3.7). In '08 Smith had just 792 (4.5). Jermaine Thomas (PS#81) was not cleared until late Aug but he had 91 in the opener, 130 vs GT, and 94 vs Clem where he suffered turf toe (49 over final four 482, 7.0). Thomas was the expected s't'r in '09 but was banged up (77, 3.0 first 5). When healthy he became the first RB here S/02 to record 3 straight 100 yd gm incl 186 vs NCSt and led with 832 (5.1) the most since 2004. Ty Jones finished #2 with 251 (4.9). The unit got a boost late from true frosh Lonnie Pryor (156, 5.8) while another true frosh Chris Thompson (PS#29) added 120 (5.2). Despite the additions they still regressed to 150 (4.6). Those 4 RB's ret'd last year and each had their moments. Thompson had 3 long td runs (90, 83, 70 yds) and led with 845 (6.3). Jones was the #1 rusher after 4 games with 283 (7.9) and was the only FSU RB that had not been tk'd for a loss. Unfortunately, he was injured vs WF (miss 3) and finished #2 (527, 6.1). Thomas missed 3 (knee inj vs Clem) and had 490 (5.7) while Pryor added 112

(4.9). They bounced back to avg 171 (4.8) as a unit. This year the group returns intact (top 3 combined for 1862, 6.1), with 3 additional VHT's and it is one of the ACC's best.

RECEIVERS - In '09 FSU had to replace the top 2 as the top 3 returnees were Taiwan Easterling (PS#310, 322, 10.7), Bert Reed (PS#107, 295, 12.8) and Rod Owens (PS#68, 183, 12.2). In '09 Owens was #1 (729, 12.0) and Reed, who became more physical, was #2 (710, 11.8) despite just 3 sts. Soph Jarmon Fortson (PS#75) had 610 (13.6) and Easterling had 442 (12.6). LY Fortson was dismissed in Aug. Reed struggled with drops but led with 614 (10.6). Easterling struggled to get open but was #3 with 551 (12.8). A pair of soph's emerged in Willie Haulstead (PS#36) who was #2 (587, 15.4) while PS#47 Rodney Smith (6'6") was #4 with 448 (14.5). With everyone ret, this is a much more exp'd unit which should have better production in '11.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Florida St avg'd just 94 ypg (3.3) and allowed 32 sks in '05 then 97 ypg (3.5) with 26 sks allowed in '06. They brought in Rick Trickett as the OL coach and showed improvement in both '07 and '08. In '09, despite 89 career sts returning and only 3 starts lost to injury, they slipped to 150 ypg rush (4.6) with 20 sks. All 5 starters returned in '10 (146 car sts) and the unit improved to 171 (4.8) with 27 sks (6.8%). Rodney Hudson won his 2nd Jacobs Blocking Award. TY they lose 2nd Tm ACC C Ryan McMahon (14 st, 4Y st'r), 1st Tm AA LG Hudson (14 st, 4Y st'r, #2DCKC) and bkp Antwane Greenlee (3 gm). While they lose 2 quality starters, they have 112 career starts returning, add in a PS#2JC and could improve.

DEFENSIVE LINE - FSU almost always has a tough rush D and in '08 they had to replace 3 DL (19 st) and allowed 133 ypg (worst S/95, 3.8) but the D did have 39 sks. In '09 they had to replace 2 s't'rs (#2 DC). FSU almost always had 1 or 2 super pass rushing DE's but has not had one recently as their DE's comb for 4 sks in '09 in a yr unit was hit hard by inj's (only 1 DL had 12 st). The numbers were amazing as they allowed an ACC high 205 ypg rush and 5.4 ypc (26 sks), their worst total S/76. LY they had to replace 2 DL (comb 15 sts) then lost Moses McCray (9 st '09) to an ACL prior to the season. I expected a much bigger impact from PS#1 Jacobbi McDaniel (2 st true) last year but an elbow injury limited him to 31 tkl (5.5 tfl). Seven of the 8 DL were frosh and soph but FSU tied for #1 in the nation in sks with 48 (35 by DL). DE Brandon Jenkins finished tied for #3 in FBS with 13.5 sks. They trimmed the rush defense to 129 ypg (3.4). This year they lose 4th Tm ACC DE Markus White (14 st, #5 tkl'r, 8 sk, #7DC WAS). They add in PS#1JC Tank Carradine and should have their best rush D since '06 (93, 2.9) along with a great pass rush.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 the Seminoles had to replace their top 2 tkl'rs and a backup (4 sts). It was the first time in a few years they did not have to replace an NFL DC and they returned their #4, #7 and #13 tkl'rs. It was still surprising that FSU allowed 30.0 ppg, their worst since 1973. They had 7 VHT's incl #1 & #2 tkl'rs and the D improved to 19.6 ppg, the best since S/06. TY they lose SLB Mister Alexander (14 st, #8 tkl'r, 5.5 tfl) and MLB Kendall Smith (14 st, #2 tkl'r, 3.5 tfl). LY they signed PS#2 Christian Jones and PS#4 Jeff Luc at LB but they combined for just 26 tkl's and should have a much bigger impact this year. I like the talent level but they have just 1 upperclassmen in my 2 deep below and may be a notch weaker.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - From 1994-2000 FSU finished in the top 6 of 7 times of my PDR. In '05 they had their worst finish ever at #74 and the next 3 yrs were a mediocre #43, #50 and #60. They had 1.5 st's back in '09 and set a new low (#102). LY they had to replace 3 s't'rs again including a #1DC. The lone returning starter, Ochuko Jenije moved to S but lost his spot to Nick Moody. Despite the inexp, FSU managed to

improve to #32 (58.3%, 17-15). This year they lose FS Jenije (2 st, 16 tkl), FS Jajuan Harley (5 tkl) but have all 4 s't'rs back and 7 VHT's in the 2-deep (only non-VHT is PS#75). The Seminoles will have their best finish in my PDR since '04 (#22).

SPECIAL TEAMS - FSU normally ranks in the top 25 of my ST rankings. In '08 Graham Gano won the Lou Groza Award after hitting 24-26 FG (L53) and FSU finished #3. In '09 they had to replace Gano as well as their top PR and KR and dropped to #26. Exciting true frosh Greg Reid did lead the NCAA in PR (18.4) and was a solid KR (25.5). LY Reid's PR numbers dropped (10.1) but he set the KR record for a game (193 vs NCSt) and a season (724, 23.4). K Dustin Hopkins (PS#1) who had a 65 yd FG in practice in HS, improved from 19-27 (L52) on FG's with 24 TB's on KO's in '09 to 22-28 (L55 GW FG vs CU) with 41 TB's (#2 FBS) in '10. P Shawn Powell also improved from 41.6 to 44.3 with the net rising from 36.1 to 39.0. Of his 50 punts, only 21 were ret'd (for 143 yds!) TY the unit returns intact and should be one of the nation's best (#10 in '10).

COACHES - Hall of Famer Bobby Bowden reluctantly retired #2 in the FBS for career wins (389 in 44 yr HC career - NCAA recognizes 377) after 34 seasons at FSU. In '07 Jimbo Fisher came over as OC from LSU (OC L7Y). In '09 he was named as Bowden's successor and took on many duties, even some on game day. In Fisher's first season as HC ('10) FSU not only won the Atlantic, but totaled 10 wins here for the first time since 2003. In January Fisher signed a contract ext through 2015 at \$2.75 mil annually. The OC is James Coley who is also the TE coach and was an assistant under Fisher at LSU. Before arriving here Coley was the OC/QB cch at FIU in '07 and was an off asst for 2 yrs with the Miami Dolphins prior. DC Mark Stoops (2nd yr) spent 6 yrs as the DC at Arizona under his brother Mike. Greg Hudson is also in his second season here as the asst dc HC/LB cch (EC, Minny, Cincy, Conn prior).

PHIL'S FORECAST

FSU had an amazing run of 14 straight years finishing in the Top 5 in the final polls but has not been back since 2000! FSU did finish #15, #21, #11, #15 and #23 in the AP poll from 2001-'05 but in Bowden's last 4 yrs finished ranked just once (9-4 in '08, #21). They went 7-6 in the other 3 yrs and needed a bowl win in each to achieve a winning season. In '09 they were the media's preseason favorite to win the Atlantic (I had Clemson) and they actually finished 3rd at 4-4 and -5.5 ypg (6th best ACC). Last year I mentioned that Jimbo Fisher stepped into a great situation as the team had not had double digit wins since '03 and 7 of my 9 sets of power ratings called for a double digit win season. They had 8 ret s't'rs on offense and got to their 29th consecutive bowl. After they beat Samford 59-6 many were calling for them to upset Okla but they were actually throttled, getting a 47 yd td pass on the last play to "only" lose 47-17. They took care of business the next 5 weeks, including a key road win at #13 Miami and were 6-1 (#16) when they travelled to NCSt on a Thurs night. They led 21-7 at half but fumbled at the 4 on 2nd & gl with :49 left and lost. FSU missed a 40 yd FG "wide right" with :02 left and lost to NC by 2. Without Ponder, they were outFD'd 15-3 in the 1H by Clemson but nailed a walk off 55 yd FG for a 16-13 win. In a key game in the ACC Atlantic, they beat MD on the road 30-16 then beat Florida 31-7 and NCSt lost to MD giving them the Atlantic Title. They did lose to VT by 11 in the ACC Title game but then beat S Car in the bowl. They finished 10-4 and ranked #17. Florida St had a def ypg of 18.0 (pg 299) but this year have 16 ret s't'rs (3rd most ACC). They get Oklahoma (likely ranked #1) at home, where they are beatable (all 9 of OU's losses the L3Y's have been away from home) but do have to play Florida in "The Swamp". Eight of my 9 sets of power ratings calls for an 8-0 ACC season so how they fare vs OU and UF will determine if they can get back into the Top 5 and be considered a National Title contender.

First meeting. Fisher went 10-4 LY as HC, best 1st yr record for a HC in FSU history (Bowden went 5-6 in '76). FSU is 20-1 S'90 in home openers (only loss was to Miami in '09, 38-34).
First meeting. The Buccaneers went 3-8 LY but 2 losses came vs Hawai'i (66-7) & Kentucky (49-21). CSU started FB in 1991 & is 0-15 overall vs FBS schools with an avg score of 51-12.
Seminoles are just 1-5 in this series (only win was in 1965). This will mark the 1st meeting in Tallahassee. FSU is 5-12 its L/17 gms vs Top 10 opp's incl B2B losses by 27 & 30 pts.
Visitor is 1-8 L9Y. FSU is 7-4 overall at Clemson but has dropped 4 str by 15 ppg. In '09 FSU led 24-21 into the 4Q but all'd 19 4Q pts (2 td's off int's). FSU has been outgained in 7 of the L9 gms.
Miami: LY FSU led 24-7 at HT but was outgained 207-202 as UM missed a 32 yd FG & fmb'd at its 1 setting up a short FSU TD. Virginia: LY FSU led 27-0 at HT w/a dominating 316-32 yd edge.
FSU is 16-3 in ACC meetings vs WF ('92). L/gm in Winston-Salem QB Manuel (PS#4) made his 1st career start (265 tll yds) as FSU went up 31-7 late 2Q never relinquishing the lead.
FSU is 6-0 in Durham putting up 50+ in their L5 trips winning by 24+ each. In '06 (L/visit) FSU jumped out to a 21-0 1Q lead despite only 1 drive over 8 yds. Into 2011, FSU is 8-4 the L3Y on the ACC road.
FSU is 19-2 vs MD incl 4 str. LY FSU had to come-from-behind for the win & the ACC Atlantic crown. MD, down 7, was driving but threw an int at the FSU4 which was ret'd 96 yds for a TD w/36 left!
Seven of the L10 have been decided by a TD or less. LY FSU led 21-7 at HT & clinging to a 3 pt lead late 4Q gave up a 4&g TD after a 70/13pt drive. FSU had a 1&g at the NCS8 but fmb'd w/49 left.
LTH FSU trailed 21-3 but tied it at 21 in the 4Q.
They got to the BC19 & BC27 their final 2 drives.
There have been 6 straight upsets in this series with the home team losing 5 straight.
FSU is 14-2 vs the Cavaliers (1st gm in '92). FSU has outgained UVA in every meeting (+192 ypg).
FSU is 2-6 its L8 trips to Gainesville including 3 straight series losses by 29 ppg. In their last visit FSU was hammered vs #1 Florida & trailed 30-0 late 3Q being outgained 392-109.

NEWCOMERS 20 VHT 8 HT
