## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

**QUARTERBACKS** - The only ret QB with exp here in '09 was rFr Tyler Wilson (PS#32) who hit 11-22-69 (2 gm) as a true but RS. Ryan Mallett (PS#1) has an arm that has been compared to John Elway's. As a true frosh at Michigan in '07, he was 3-0 as the starter (892, 43%, 7-5). He RS here in '08 and was the clear-cut st'r in '09. Mallett broke a lot of Clint Stoerner's (96-'99) records with 3,624 (55.8%, 30-7). Wilson played in 5 (218, 61.1%). Petrino said he wanted Mallett to break Kevin Scanlon's 1979 compl % record (64%). At home, Mallett threw 68.3% (327 ypg). On the road he hit just 42.9% (223 ypg) but faced four Top 20 pass D's. Mallett turned down the NFL in '10 and set the % mark throwing for 3,869 (64.7%, 32-12). Wilson did get to play 2.5Q's vs Auburn (Mallett inj) and at the end of the 3Q had a pass eff of 299.29 but two 4Q int's dropped him to 182.6 for the game. Wilson played in 6 (453, 66.7%, 4-3). 6'4" Brandon Mitchell is an athletic runner and hit 1-3-16 (2 rush att). Jacoby Walker (PS#36) was inj'd. Mallett had a school record 409 vs Vandy and leaves as the sch'l's career passing leader in just 2 yrs. Naturally going from an exp'd #3DC (NE) to a unit with just 112 career att, the numbers will drop but any QB in Petrino's system should produce quality numbers.

**RUNNING BACKS** - From 2005-'07 UA had an amazing trio of RB's in Darren McFadden, Felix Jones and Peyton Hillis (3,339 rush and 877 rec yds comb '07). In '08 they were all drafted by the NFL. HC Petrino favors a bigger back, so it was surprising that 5'7" Michael Smith won the starting job in '08. Smith (370 bench) rushed for 1,072 (5.2). True frosh Dennis Johnson (4.4 spd) was the #2 RB with 184 (5.1). In '09 they got the large additions of 244 lb Broderick Green (PS#9) who had 168 (5.2) at USC in '08, true frosh Ronnie Wingo (PS#12) and Knile Davis (PS#26). Smith only played in 8 (inj) and finished #2 (396, 5.6). Green set a school rec with a 99 yd td run vs EM and led with 442 (4.2). Johnson had 107 vs UF and was #3 (342, 6.0). Wingo added 319 (6.5) while Davis had 163 (4.9). LY they only had to replace Smith but then Dennis Johnson was lost after 2 gm. Davis has been timed as low as 4.29 in the 40 and benches 415 lbs. He piled up six 100+ yd gms with 176 vs Ole Miss, 110 vs SC, 182 vs UTEP, 187 vs MSU, 152 vs LSU and 139 vs OSU (26 of 27 RB carries). He finished with 1,322 (6.5) and 13 td's. Green was a distant #2 (365, 3.5) and Wingo had 253 (6.2). Not listed below are Ronald Watkins (5'9" 190

Jr) and FB's Morgan Linton (5'11" 240 rFr), Brandon Pyle (6'2" 240 Jr), and Allen Whitlow (6'1" 249 So). Green tore his ACL in spg, but this unit will improve upon LY's 149 ypg rush.

**RECEIVERS** - In '08 TE DJ Williams (PS#18) led with 723 (11.9), true frosh Joe Adams (PS#25) had 377 (12.2) and Jarius Wright (PS#36) had 348 (18.3). In '09 Greg Childs led with 894 (18.6) while Wright added 681 (16.6). Adams suffered a mild stroke (out 3) but was #3 (568, 19.6). Mallett preferred throwing the ball deep to WR's so TE Williams only had 411 (12.8). Speedy true frosh Cobi Hamilton had 347 (18.3). LY Childs was leading the tm with 659 (14.3) but was lost after 8 (inj). Joe Adams (4 sts) led with 813 (16.3) while Wright was #2 (788, 18.8). DJ Williams won the John Mackey Award and had 627 (11.6). Hamilton had 630 (19.7). TY they lose Williams (#5DC GB) and TE Ben Cleveland (4 rec, 3 st). The proj'd st'r at TE is Chris Gragg and he has 7 sts and just 9 rec in his career which is a large drop off from Williams. As long as a new TE emerges, this will once again be one of the NCAA's top receiving corps.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - The Hogs led the SEC in rushing in 5 of Houston Nutt's last 6 yrs. The one year they did not ('04) they had 0 ret OL st'r's and were still #2! In Bobby Petrino's first yr ('08) they had to replace 4 st'r's. As you would expect in a new system (run blk to pass blk), their rush numbers plummeted to just 114 ypg (3.6) while they allowed 46 sks (2nd most FBS). In '09 Ark had to replace 3 st'r's but improved to 132 ypg rush (4.3) with 24 sk (5.5%). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm SEC RG (#5DC) but had 4 st'r's back although C Seth Oxner lost his starting spot. The Hogs improved again to 149 ypg (4.6) with 28 sks (6.0%). This year they lose 1st Tm SEC LT DeMarcus Love (13 st, 3Y st'r, #6DC MIN), LG Wade Grayson (13 st, 3Y st'r), RT Ray Dominguez (13 st, 3Y st'r) and Zhamal Thomas (12 gm). UA has 2 st'r's back plus 4 others with starting exp incl Oxner. While less exp'd, this still looks like a quality O-line.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In Petrino's 1st yr Ark had a veteran DL but the rest of the D was inexp'd and they slipped allowing 171 ypg rush (4.4). In '09 UA had to replace 3 DL (comb 6 sts). Four of the tm's top 9 tk'l'r's in '08 were DL and all ret'd. They improved to 153 ypg (4.0) with 29 sks. LY Ark lost 2 st'r's but had 8 back who earned sts in '09. UA improved to 37 sks, but the rush D slipped to 163 ypg (4.0). Zach Stadther (8 st, 42 tk'l '09) DNP in the first 5 (1 st). DL cch Bobby Allen said he'd never been around a better group of DT's and NG's than Ark had LY. TY they lose DE Damaro Ambrose (13 st, 33 tk'l, 3.5 sk) and DT Patrick Jones (8 tk'l). Ark has 5 back who started 5+ and Stadther could climb out of Petrino's doghouse (17 car st). This is a much more exp'd group and should make solid strides.

**LINEBACKERS** - After having an inexp'd unit in '08, UA ret'd their top 3 LB's in '09. TE Williams said the LB's were bigger, faster and better students of the gm. In '09 the Hogs' D all'd 6.1 ppg less (25.1). LY they had to replace their #2 tk'l'r but had their #1, #3 and #7 back with all 3 having 7+ sts. I called for continued improvement and UA dropped the ppg to 23.4. TY they lose OLB Anthony Leon (12 st, #4 tk'l'r, 12.5 tk'l), OLB Freddy Burton (8 st 70 tk'l 2Y) and Jermaine Love (13 tk'l, 1 sk). 2nd Tm SEC MLB Jerry Franklin (#1 tk'l'r, 13 tk'l) and 3rd Tm SEC Jerico Nelson (PS#54, #2 tk'l'r) are back. They also bring in PS#11JC Alonzo Highsmith and true frosh Tyler Gilbert was IFS. Franklin is the 2nd Hog since '60 to lead the tm in tkls for 3 straight ssns and UA's LB corps looks stronger for the 3rd str yr.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - The Hogs finished #11 in my PDR in '06 and with a veteran unit in '07 were #1 (45.5%, 20 int). In '08 they had to replace all 4 st'r's and as you would expect, dropped to #59. The Hogs had to replace 4 DB (comb 17 st) in '09 then lost CB Isaac Madison (11 st '08) to a torn ACL and CB David Gordon after 3 sts. The Hogs slid to #80 (59.2%, 22-13). Last

year they had to replace 2 DB (comb 12 st, 85 tk'l) but Madison ret'd. The Hogs rose to #31 (55%, 13-11). This year they lose CB Ramon Broadway (9 st, 38 tk'l), SS Rudell Crim (12 st, #5 tk'l'r, 3 int) and CB Andru Stewart (14 tk'l, 1 int). While a little less experienced, this unit should be just as good.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Bobby Petrino's ST's at L'ville finished #70, #41, #63 and #39 in my ST rankings ('03-'06). He inherited a ST unit that finished #94 in '07 and was #94 again in '08. Petrino hired John L. Smith (former HC at Mich St and L'ville) to oversee the unit. The '09 unit finished #79 and ret'd intact LY. K Alex Tejada improved to 15 TB on 86 KO but lost his K job to true frosh Zach Hocker (PS#20) who hit 16-19 (L51, longest for Ark '92) and has hit 60 yd FG's in practice. P Dylan Breeding (32.6 net '09) improved to 42.5 (37.5 net) LY. In '09 Dennis Johnson had 1,031 KR yds (25.8) but was inj'd after 3 ret (26.0) in '10. The Hogs struggled on KR's (19.4) and '10's top KR Lance Ray (22.5) transferred after spring. Joe Adams avg 15.6 on PR's including a school record 97 yd PR vs Ole Miss (Ken Hatfield 95 yd'r in '63) and also had a 62 yd PR td vs UGA called back. They finished #55 and with Johnson back at KR, figure to have another solid finish this year.

**COACHES** - HC Petrino had a great run guiding L'ville to 4 bowls and a pair of #6 AP finishes. He left for the ATL Falcons in '07 and was blasted by the media after quitting with 3 gms to go. In his 3rd yr here he led the Hogs to their first ever BCS bowl. OC Garrick McGee (2nd yr) spent 2Y as QB cch here ('08-'09) and 2Y as the NW OC ('06-'07). DC Willy Robinson (4th yr) was the STL Rams' DB cch ('06-'07) prior to coming to UA.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Prior to '04, Ark went to 6 consec bowls matching a school rec set by Lou Holtz ('77-'82) and Ken Hatfield ('84-'89). Unfortunately for just the 3rd time in 61 yrs ('52-'53 and '96-'97), they suffered B2B losing seasons in '04 and '05. Despite their 2-6 record in SEC play in '05, they were +31.3 ypg! They outgained #4 UGA 332-217 (lost by 3 road) and thanks to a pair of missed FG's, lost to #3 LSU by 2 in Baton Rouge. Ark used the most true frosh (18) in the nation in '05. In '06 they had the most ret st'r's in the SEC (18) and that had me very high on the Hogs. I picked the Hogs #13 coming off a 4-7 season with the majority of the other magazines not having them ranked. Ark did not disappoint me, in fact they made it to the SEC Title gm and rose as high as #5. Their losses in '06 were to the #6, #9, #4 and #6 tms. In '07 the Hogs had just 12 ret st'r's and were preseason #21. They were a disappointing 7-4 when they stunned #1 LSU in Death Valley in 3OT. Surprisingly Nutt, who was 53-17 at home, stepped aside under strong fan pressure and with an interim HC they were whipped by Missouri 38-7 in the Cotton Bowl. In '08 with just 9 ret st'r's, I picked the tm that had been to 2 straight NY Day bowls and had 3 non-BCS foes on the sked to have a losing season. The Hogs finished just 5-7 and despite a 2-6 SEC record, were +0.1 ypg and -9 in TO's. In '09 they drew both Flor and GA from the East but still made my Most Improved List for the 2nd time in 4 yrs. The Hogs did not disappoint me (8-5). LY they had 17 ret st'r's incl QB Mallett and Vandy replaced Florida on the sked. Two of my 9 sets of power ratings actually called for the Hogs to go 12-0 and they nearly accomplished that. Against Bama, Ark led 20-14 in the 4Q before Mallett had two int's and Bama escaped. Versus eventual Nat'l Champ Auburn, Ark lost QB Mallett to inj in the 2Q. With bkp QB Wilson in, they still led 43-37 in the 4Q before TO's did them in. The Hogs were 10-2 and their +101.4 ypg led the SEC (National Champ Auburn #2 +91.7). In the Sugar Bowl vs Ohio St, they were int'd at the OSU 17 with :58 left and came up 5 pts short. The Hogs' #12 finish was their best S/88 (also #12). TY they do face both LSU and Bama on the road (both Top 5). They have an inexp'd QB but 8 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for DD wins. This team is 2 upsets away from playing for the National Title this year.

The Bears went 5-6 LY incl a 48-24 loss to K-St but MSU had a 25-23 FD edge & were outgained by just 46 yds. UA is 6-0 vs MSU incl a 48-10 win in the '09 ssn opener (+13 FD's & +386 yds).

Arkansas is 2-0 vs New Mexico but the L/gm was in 1987, a 43-25 win in Little Rock. Into 2011, Ark has won 16 str non-conf HG's & under Petrino (9-0) has outscored opp's an avg 43-18.

The Razorbacks are 3-0 vs the Trojans outgaining them 408-324 with an avg score of 42-15. In the L/meeting ('09) UA won 56-20 jumping out to a 28-7 lead. Ark is 27-0 vs current SBC tms.

Ark is 1-5 S'99 in Tuscaloosa & in their L/trip lost 35-7 being outgained 425-254. Ark has dropped 4 str overall by 18 ppg vs Bama. Under Petrino Ark is 4-8 on the SEC road (3-1 LY).

Series started in 1903 & these former SWC rivals ply'd every yr from '34-'91 (Ark leads 40-24-3). In '09 Ark alum Dallas Cowboy owner Jerry Jones brought the gm to TX.

Petrino was the OC at Aub in '02 prior to taking the Louisville HC job. HT is 3-6 S'02. LY Ark led 43-37 w/14:09 left but imploded allowing 28 unanswered (L/3 TD's on a 47 yd FR & 2 int's).

South Carolina: Ark is 9-4 S'98 vs SC incl 4 wins the L5Y. Tennessee: In the last meeting ('07) Arkansas lost 34-13 (trailed 27-13 late 3Q) as 3 int's were costly (1 tossed in EZ & another ret for a TD).

Ark has won 7 of the L/10 but snapped a 2 gm losing streak LY. In the Razorbacks L/trip to Oxford they lost 30-17 (trailed 17-0 late 2Q). Ark cut it to 7 late 3Q but could only muster 19 yds in the 4Q.

This will be just the 9th overall meeting as Arkansas is 6-2 including 3-0 in Nashville. In the L/trip ('06) Ark escaped with a 21-19 win as Vanderbilt missed a 48-yd FG w/55 left.

LY the gm was tied 7-7 into the 2Q but Ark exploded & led 41-10 before 2 late garbage scoring drives by SC.

The Razorbacks are just 3-13 vs the Vols but have won 2 of the last 3 at home incl 2006.

Arkansas has dominated this series (14-2 S'95) & has never dropped a gm hosting the Bulldogs (8-0-1).

This rivalry has been decided by a TD or less (five by 5 pts or less) L6Y. Ark has won 3 of L/4 but lost their L/visit to Baton Rouge as LSU kicked a 41-yd FG w/04 to force OT (Ark missed 35 yd FG in OT).
