POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - The '08 debut of rFr Stephen Garcia (PS#10) was highly anticipated but he was susp in the spring and not reinstated until the fall, putting him #3. Tommy Beecher st'd the opener but then Chris Smelley took over. At the end of the yr Smelley and Garcia rotated snaps and Garcia st'd the bowl. For the season, SC's 3 QB's threw for 222 ypg but had the lowest comp % of the Spurrier era (55%) with a 20-27 ratio. In '09 Smelley and Beecher transferred. Garcia tied the school's single season record for att's with 432 but had just the 8th most yds. Garcia is a mobile QB (453 gross rush) who threw for 2,862 (55%, 17-10) and was the first SC QB to start every game in a season for Spurrier. CB Stephon Gilmore (PS#6) was the "WildCock" QB in the final 2. LY true freshman Connor Shaw (PS#47) was #2. Garcia had a fine start to the year but in the reg ssn matchup vs Auburn, fumbled twice in the 4Q and was pulled for PS#47 Connor Shaw who threw two 4Q int's. Garcia was the Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week when he guided the upset of #1 Alabama (17 of 20 pass). Garcia inj'd his shoulder vs Clemson but started the SEC Title gm and bowl. At one point he was #5 in the FBS in pass eff but finished #22 (3059, 64%, 20-14) and had another rough bowl (0-3 ratio). Shaw threw for 223 (69.7%). Not listed below are Dylan Thompson (6'2" 208 rFr, PS#72), Andrew Clifford (6'2" 221 So, PS#201) and Seth Strickland (6'2" 193 Jr). Garcia was susp twice this spring and will have a tough road ahead of him to get out of Spurrier's doghouse and hold off Shaw in the fall.

RUNNING BACKS - In '09 speed back Kenny Miles (PS#98) led with 626 (5.4) while power back Brian Maddox (PS#23) added 307 (3.0). LY the top 3 RB's ret'd but I projected true frosh Marcus Lattimore (PS#1) as the starter and listed him on my Preseason All-SEC Tm. Lattimore did not disappoint as he became the first 1,000 yd rusher here since '00 with 1,197 (4.8) despite missing 1 full game and most of 2 others (incl bowl) with inj's. Lattimore broke 29 tkls and had 127 yds after contact vs Georgia. Maddox filled in for Lattimore vs Vandy and rushed for 146 on 24 carries and finished with 391 (5.3) while Miles had 152 (3.8). This year they lose Maddox (1 st) but as long as Lattimore stays healthy, this is one of the premiere RB corps in the country and they add in a couple of solid true frosh.

RECEIVERS - In '06 Sidney Rice had 1,090 (15.1) and left early for the NFL (#2DC). The late Kenny McKinley was #2 with 880 (17.3). McKinley set a school record for rec with 77 in '07.

TE Jared Cook was #2 with 421 (14.0) and was one of the tm's fastest. In '08 McKinley became the school's career receiving leader. He missed 3 but was still #1 (642, 11.9). Cook was #2 (573, 15.5). In '09 they both departed (#5 and #3 DC's) and the top returnees were Moe Brown (391, 13.0) and 6'4" Jason Barnes (346, 12.8). Spurrier landed 6'4" true frosh Alshon Jeffery (PS#10) and 6'5" rFr Tori Gurley (4.5 spd) emerged. Jeffery with 763 (16.6), Brown was #2 (491, 14.9), Gurley #3 (440, 14.2) and TE Weslye Saunders added 353 (11.0). LY they had to replace Brown but Jeffery had an AA ssn with an amazing 1,517 (17.2) resetting the school's single ssn rec records. Gurley was a distant #2 (465, 10.6). Saunders DNP (dismissed) and they moved in FB Patrick DiMarco (147, 9.8). TY they lose DiMarco (13 st) and Gurley (14 st). Not listed below are WR Bruce Ellington (5'9" 200 So) who is a standout on SC's basketball tm and TE's Mike Triglia (6'4" 240 Jr, PS#76) and converted QB Payton Barker (6'3" 225 Jr). DD Smith was the star WR of the spring. As long as Jeffery stays healthy, this is one of the taller rec corps in the FBS and it is also one of the best.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In each of Steve Spurrier's first five years, the injury prone OL was shuffled constantly. They had 4 st's back in '08 but 3 of them comb for just 12 sts and they opened holes for just 94 ypg rush (2.1) with 39 sks. SC has had only 2 OL ever earn 1st Tm SEC (last in '98). In '09 they had to replace 2 st's but lost another after 2 sts. They still improved to 121 ypg rush (3.6) with 37 sks. LY they had to replace 2 st's (72 car sts back). Two OL managed to start all 14 although just CTJ Johnson started all 14 at the same position. SC improved to 154 ypg (4.1) with 30 sk (7.7%) thanks in part to the addition of true frosh RB Lattimore. This year they lose 2nd Tm SEC LG Garrett Chisolm (12 st), RT Hutch Eckerson (12 st, 2Y st'r) and LT Jarriel King (7 st, 3Y st'r). They are as exp'd as '10 (70 car sts) and could improve again especially if they stay healthy.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In each of Steve Spurrier's first 5 yrs, the DL was banged up and in '09 no DL started more than 11. The injuries may have been the reason they put up similar stats (138 ypg, 3.7, 28 sks) to '08 despite having 3 st's back. LY they had to replace 2 players who comb for 18 st (5.5 sk) but Spurrier convinced DE Cliff Matthews to turn down the NFL. Matthews did wear a cumbersome shoulder brace which limited his mobility but still earned 2nd Tm SEC. Three DL's played with broken hands but the unit had just 1 start missed. SC trimmed the rush D numbers to 112 ypg (3.4), their best ypc since '00 and the D had 41 sk (DL 31) the most in 20+ yrs. This year they lose DT Ladi Ajiboye (13 st, #11 tkl'r, 2 sk) and Cliff Matthews (14 st, #9 tkl'r, 5.5 sk, #7DC ATL). Six of the top 8 are back incl 1st Tm SEC 6'7" Devin Taylor who had 7.5 sks. Despite the loss of 2 quality DL, the Gamecocks front could be just as strong and they add PS#1 Jadeveon Clowney!

LINEBACKERS - LY SC had to replace 1st Tm SEC Eric Norwood who departed as their career sack and tfl leader (#4DC). Returning st'r Shaq Wilson (11 st, #1 tkl'r '09) was inj'd and played in just 1 game (7 tkl vs Aub) so they basically had 1 starter back (ret'd #10, #11 tkl'r's '09). This year they lose WLB Tony Straughter (13 st, #13 tkl'r, 2 tfl) and MLB Josh Dickerson (14 st, #5 tkl'r, 6.5 tfl). With Wilson returning and SS Holloman moving to Spur in spring, it is like having 3 st's back, so the unit is clearly more exp'd despite the loss of 2 st's.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - SC finished #35 in my PDR in '07 and #30 with a veteran unit in '08. They had to replace 2 st's in '09 but Spurrier called CB Stephon Gilmore one of the best players ever to come to SC. Gilmore started all 13 as a true frosh and SC improved to #27. LY they had 7 of their top 8 back (1 st'r lost). They lost starting CB Chris Culliver to injury after 7 and were lit up by Ark the next week. Gilmore said that

soph DJ Swearingin (PS#85) was the most gifted tkl'r on the team and he started 8 (4 SS, 4 FS) moving ahead of Akeem Auguste at FS. The secondary was certainly the defense's Achilles' heel as they ended up allowing 242 ypg, their highest in the modern era (#92 PDR, 62.8%, 23-10). This year they do lose CB Culliver (7 st, #13 tkl'r, 2 pbu, #3DC SF) and SS Holloman moved to Spur, but the Gamecocks should have one of the most improved secondaries in the country.

SPECIAL TEAMS - When Steve Spurrier took over he inherited a unit that finished #108 in my ST rankings. In his first 4 seasons they improved to #83, #50, #66 and #35. They had some problems in '09 (all'd 24.4 per KR, 3 td) and surprisingly slid to #103. Last year RM Chris Culliver (holds school rec KR's) was injured. The return game was below average (#90 FBS KR, #115 PR). Spencer Lanning hit 17-20 FG (L47) in '09 and was 17-24 (L51) LY. Lanning also punted (44.1, 37.1 net). Joey Scribner-Howard had the best leg of the K's and had 4 TB on 17 KO with Jay Wooten (PS#10) having 5 on 65. This year they lose Lanning and while not an overwhelming group, could improve upon last year's #72 finish.

COACHES - Steve Spurrier took Florida to 7 SEC Title games (and won 5 of them). Last year he led the Gamecocks to their first ever SEC Title game and to 9 wins for only the third time in school history and earned SEC COY. He is his own OC and his son Steve Jr is the passing game coordinator. DC Ellis Johnson enters his 4th year here after being the DC at Miss St ('04-'07). Johnson has spurned several offers the last few years earning an contract extension through 2013 and was the 3rd highest paid asst in the SEC last year.

PHIL'S FORECAST

South Carolina's last conf title came in the ACC in 1969. SC got to NY Day bowls vs Ohio St in both '00 and '01 but in Lou Holtz's final 3 yrs, did not catch a lot of breaks and went 16-19. Expectations were high when Steve Spurrier took over and I feel he's done a fine job with zero losing seasons in 6 yrs (5 bowls). SC had never been picked higher than #3 in the SEC East in the preseason media poll and in '10 was picked #3, just one vote behind UGA. Spurrier's high water mark in his first 5 yrs was a #6 ranking in '07 when the team began 6-1 but they finished that year just 6-6. In '09 they rose as high as #21 but lost 3 of their final 4 and finished unranked again. LY they had 14 ret st's, only 12 left lost and signed an excellent frosh class. They had 16 seniors which was twice as many as in '09. They opened 3-0 incl a win over UGA and led Auburn 27-21 after 3Q but had 4 TO's in the 4Q and lost by 8. SC, off a bye, caught Bama on their 3rd straight tough game and knocked off the #1 Tide 35-21 in a game they controlled. The next week in a letdown spot, they lost RB Lattimore at the half to injury and blew a 28-10 3Q lead losing by 3 with an int in the EZ at Kentucky (int came on FD at UK20 w/:04 left). After a couple of wins, they had a meaningless gm vs Ark. A win the next week over Florida would give them the SEC East Title. SC mailed it in vs the Hogs (lost by 21) but got their first win in The Swamp in school history and dominated UF 36-14 taking home their first ever SEC East Title. They dispatched Troy and Clemson in meaningless games while awaiting their SEC Title game. They trailed Aub 21-14 but gave up a deflating td with no time left in the 1H and suffered the biggest loss in SEC Title game history, 56-17. Spurrier has had trouble getting this team prepared for bowls as his record dropped to 1-4 with his 3rd straight bowl loss, this one to Flor St, 26-17. They did have a 414-308 yd edge and lost RB Lattimore on the first series. SC also had 34 sts lost to injury in '10 and 2 net close losses. SC has their most talented team yet under Spurrier and will be in the AP preseason Top 10. A trip Between the Hedges on Sept 10th may determine the SEC East Title and SC has a great shot at their first 10 win season since 1984 (10-2).

SC is 10-5 vs EC but is just 2-5 S'91 including a loss in the L/meeting ('99). First meeting at neutral site. Gamecocks have won 11 consecutive ssn openers by 18 ppg (3 shutouts).

SC is 5-11 in road openers. SC is 1-3 in Athens '03 & in '09 lost 41-37. SC got a IR TD early 4Q to get within 1 but the XP was blk'd. After a UGA FG SC's 4&4 EZ pass from the UGA7 fell inc w/22.

Gamecocks are 4-3 vs the Midshipmen but have won 4 of the L/5 including the L/meeting in '88 (19-8). HT is 6-1 in the series. Into 2011, Spurrier is 41-0 vs non-BCS schools.

SC is 16-4 vs Vandy. LY the gm was tied 7-7 at HT but SC defense locked down in the 2H allowing just 70 yds as Vandy did not cross midfield until its last off play (SOD at SC48).

LY in the SEC Title gm, SC cut the deficit to 21-14 w/16 but gave up a 51 yd "Hail Mary" pass on the 1H final play (35-3 Aub run to end gm). In the reg ssn gm SC led 27-21 into the 4Q prior to Aub's 14 pt 4Q.

SC has gone 5-0 hosting UK S'01 but lost LY snapping a 10 gm series winning streak. SC blew leads of 14-0 & 28-10 as UK went on a 68/12pl GW TD drive w/1:15 (SC was int in EZ w/04).

SC has won their L/2 trips to Starkville incl the L/visit in '06, 15-0. It was win #150 for Spurrier as SC held MSU to just 161 yds & just 10 of 56 (18%) of the Bulldog plays were in SC territory.

Arkansas: SC dropped its L/2 at Arkinc 33-16 in '09. **Florida:** LY's win secured SC's 1st trip to the SEC Title gm. SC was down 7-3 but scored 26 unanswered & finished w/a 24-11 FD edge.

SC is 1-14 in Knoxville (1 pt in '05). In '09 SC lost 31-13 but had the FD (19-15) & yd edge (365-341). SC committed 4 TO's that resulted in 24 UT pts incl 3 fum on their 1st 5 poss (down 21-0).

LTH SC led 16-10 after opening the 3Q w/a 80 yd TD pass (Garcia-Jeffery) but all'd the gms final 23 pts.

Spurrier was the Gator HC from 1990-'01 (122-27-1). He is 2-4 at SC vs his alma mater.

SC is 39-7-3 vs The Citadel but lost the L/meeting ('90) at home 38-35. Bulldogs are 10-73-4 vs SEC opp's.

109th meeting & played every yr since 1909. The Gamecocks have won 2 str & their last 3 gm

series win streak was from 1968-'70. LY's 22 pt MOV was SC's largest in the series since 1994.
