POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - The moment Terrelle Pryor signed with OSU he was anointed an instant savior by Buckeye fans (PS#1). As a true frosh in '08 he threw for 1,311 (61%, 12-4, 631 rush) while starting 10. In '09 he threw for 2,094 (57%, 18-11) and was the #1 rusher (779, 4.8) becoming the first QB to lead Ohio St in rushing since Les Horvath (Heisman winner) in 1944. Pryor had a great Rose Bowl hitting 23-37-266 (72 rush) winning MVP honors. Backup Joe Bauserman (PS#59) hit just 6-19 for 124 in '09. In '10 Pryor studied much more film and nearly topped (157.9) Bobby Hoving's school record in pass eff (163.4 in '95). He became the first primary starting QB since the end of WWII to lead his team to Big Ten Titles in his frosh, soph and junior years. Pryor threw for 2,772 (65%, 27-11) and was the #2 rusher (754, 5.6). Against Ohio U, Pryor completed a school record 16 straight passes (Jim Karsatos 12 in '85). He injured his leg vs Illinois and was not 100% the next few wks and vs Indiana did not have a designed run attempt (3 sk). Pryor will be susp'd for the first 5 of '11 but was allowed to play in the bowl where he hit 14-25-221-2-0 (rush 116) to earn his 2nd straight bowl MVP award. He returns along with 26 yr old Bauserman (16-22-174) and soph Kenny Guiton (6'2" 190, PS#116). Added in are PS#2 true frosh Braxton Miller (IFS) and rFr Taylor Graham (6'4" 225, PS#35). Pryor may be rusty when he returns midseason and this position will not match last year's numbers.

RUNNING BACKS - Chris "Beanie" Wells (PS#1) set an OSU soph record with 1,609 (5.9) in '07. Despite missing 3 in '08, he rushed for 1,197 (5.8) and was the team's MVP. Dan "Boom" Herron (PS#44) was the #2 RB in '08 with 439 (4.9) and began '09 as the starter but only rushed for 600 (3.9). QB Pryor led in rushing in '09. Brandon Saine (PS#2) led the RB's with 739 (5.1) while true frosh Jordan Hall (PS#45) added 248 (5.2). LY they added rFr Jaamal Berry (PS#7). Saine struggled and was used mostly as a rec (#3) after Wk 3 and finished #2 RB (337, 4.8). Herron led with 1,155 (5.3) and 16 td's and now has 500 career touches without losing a fumble. FB Zach Boren is a solid blocker (OL of wk vs Ill) and had OSU's first FB carry

since '07. Berry rushed for 266 with a team high 8.3 ypc while Hall added 161 (4.4). True frosh Carlos Hyde (6'0" 238 So, PS#29) had 141 (5.9). This year they lose Saine and Herron will be susp'd for the first 5. Rod Smith (PS#9) arrived late LY and RS but the 6'3" 220 lb power back was impressive in bowl practice. He has size, speed and has been compared to Wells. Not listed below are FB's James Georgiades (5'11" 240 Jr) & David Durham (6'1" 231 rFr, PS#69). I look for improved numbers from the Buckeye RB's despite Herron's susp.

RECEIVERS - Ohio St is quickly becoming another "WR U." They had three 1st round WR picks in '06 and '07 comb'd. In '09 they had to replace #2 and #4 DC's. Dane Sanzenbacher (PS#106) was the top returnee (272, 13.0 in '08). I expected big things out of DeVier Posey (PS#4). Posey (11 rec true) led with 828 (13.8) in '09 but finished #2 in '10 (848, 16.0) behind Sanzenbacher's 948 (17.2). TE Jake Stoneburner (PS#4) was on pace for the most rec's by a TE under Tressel until an injury and finished #3 (222, 10.6). This year they lose the clutch playmaker Sanzenbacher (13 sts) and Taurian Washington (1 st, 5 rec) while Posey is susp'd for the first 5. Stoneburner and RB Hall were used frequently in the slot in the spg as none of the young WR's had really stepped up. This unit is less exp'd and will be down a few notches.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '09 OSU had to replace 3 st's and had a poor 1H of the year but got a lot stronger in the 2H as they ran for 200+ yds in 5 of the last 6. With mobile QB Pryor (779 rush) the OL opened holes for 195 ypg rush (4.5) with 24 sks (7.6%). LY they had to replace 1 st'r (93 car sts back) and improved to 220 ypg rush with their 5.2 ypc being OSU's best in over 2 decades (22 sks, 6.3%). TY they lose 1st Tm B10 LG Justin Boren (13 st, 3Y str), RG Bryant Browning (13 st, 3Y str), Connor Smith (13 gm) and Andrew Miller (13 gm). With 77 career sts incl 1st Tm AA C Mike Brewster, they should come close to '10's production despite missing 1st Tm B10 LT Mike Adams for the first 5.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '09 the Buckeyes had a veteran D-line and their usually tough defense allowed just 91 ypg (2.9, 30 sk). LY they had to replace 2 st's (#4, #7 DC's) and 2 bkps (comb 8 st, 37 tkl). Cameron Heyward turned down the NFL so 1.5 st's ret. After playing an 8 DL rotation in the first 6, OSU played just 5 DL vs Wisc as the staff didn't trust the younger players and the Bucks allowed a season rush yd high 184 (4.3). The less exp'd line still fared well allowing just 97 ypg (3.1) but the 23 sks were their fewest in more than a decade. This year they lose DE Heyward (13 st, #6 tkl, 13 tfl) and DT Dexter Larimore (13 st, #11 tkl, 4 sk) but do have 6 of the top 8 back. Interestingly Heyward became the 3rd OSU DL in the L2Y to be drafted by the Steelers (#1DC) prompting PIT HC Tomlin to remark that OSU's D is the closest in the college gym to what the Steelers run. Despite the loss of their star, this is a deeper unit which should put more pressure on QB's.

LINEBACKERS - In 2008 James Laurinaitis won Big Ten DPOY while Marcus Freeman was 2nd Tm Big Ten. In 2009 those 2 departed (#2, #5DC's) and the top 2 returnees were only the #4 and #15 tkl'rs. They did add PS#4, PS#7 and PS#9 true frosh. Brian Rolle (#2 tkl'r '09) was given #36 which had been the # of AA LB's Spielman, Cousineau and Marek. He teamed with #1 tackler Ross Homan to put up comparable numbers to the Laurinaitis/Freeman duo (214 tkl '08 vs 203 '09). Last year they had to replace 1 starter but the top 2 returned. Rolle and Homan were the top 2 again but this time combined for just 148 tkls as Homan missed 2 (inj) and SLB Sweat (PS#13) missed one. This year they lose MLB Rolle (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 11.5 tfl, #6DC PHI) and WLB Homan (11 st, #2 tkl'r, 2 tfl, #6DC MIN). Sweat was the #3 tkl'r and they RS projected starter Etienne Sabino (PS#7). VHT's Storm Klein and Jordan Whiting combined for just 20 tkls. I like this unit's potential but with the loss of their top 2, I'll call it down a few notches.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Since '97 OSU has had 7 #1DC DB's with 24 drafted overall. Even in a year like '06 when they had to replace all 4 st'rs (#1, #3, #4DC's), OSU still finished #12 in my PDR (10-21 ratio). They lost #1 and #4 DC's in '09 but finished #12 (10-24 ratio). LY they had to replace 2 st'rs only losing a #7DC and improved to #5 (53.8%, 9-19) despite season ending inj's to 4 S's by Halloween. This year they lose 1st Tm AA CB Chimdi Chekwa (13 st, #8 tkl'r, 3 int, 9 pbu, #4DC OAK), CB Devon Torrence (13 st, #4 tkl'r, 2 int, 8 pbu) and 1st Tm B10 FS Jermale Hines (12 st, #3 tkl'r, 5 pd, #5DC STL). This unit is less exp'd and weaker overall but history says they should still finish in the top 20.

SPECIAL TEAMS - OSU has recorded two #1 finishes in my ST rankings ('94 and '04). Jim Tressel has been quoted as saying the punt is the most important play in football and holds scrimmages in spring and Aug devoted exclusively to ST's. In '07 they only finished #41 but in '08, moved back to #5. OSU's ST play has been surprisingly inconsistent the last 2 yrs. They finished #41 in '09 and LY had to replace their K, P and top RM. OSU gave up a KR and a PR td (vs Mia) in the same gm and 2 KR td on the year both for the first time ever. RFr Jaamal Berry was a top-notch KR (25.4) while Jordan Hall was solid on PR's (9.9). Devin Barclay hit an outstanding 20-24 FG's (L48). Drew Basil (PS#8) had 9 TB's on 87 KO but had his 2 FG attempts (both 50+) blk'd. Ben Buchanan avg 41.0 (34.3 net) with 2 P's blk'd. The Buckeyes had their worst finish S/'99 (#73) at #49. OSU spent a 2011 scholarship on LS Bryce Haynes and should move back up.

COACHES - In Jim Tressel's 2nd yr, he became the 1st cch to win an NCAA Title at both the IAA and IA levels. He was the COY in '02 and enters his 12th ssn with a record 6 straight Big Ten Titles and 6 straight BCS appearances. OC Jim Bollman also coaches the OL (12 yr). The last 6 yrs they have used co-DC's in Jim Heacock and Luke Fickell who will serve as the interim HC for the susp'd Tressel in the first 5 of '11. Heacock calls the def plays and won the Broyles Award (NCAA's top asst) in '07. Prior to Heacock's 15 yrs here he was the HC at Illinois St ('88-'95).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Ohio St actually finished outside of the AP Top 25 for 3 straight years prior to 2002. I rated Ohio St #7 in '02 which was far higher than almost every other source. I called them my #1 Surprise Team (darkhorse contender for the Nat'l Title) while only 2 other preseason magazines even picked OSU to win the Big Ten. OSU took home their first Nat'l Title since 1968 (Woody Hayes' 3rd) when they defeated Miami. Since that National Title, OSU has finished in the Top 5 in the AP poll 6 of 8 years with their other 2 seasons finishing #9 and #20. They played for the Nat'l championship in '06 and '07 but lost to a pair of SEC schools. They had lost 3 straight BCS games but defeated Oregon (Rose Bowl) in '09 finishing #5. LY the Buckeyes got to #1 but went into Wisc with ESPN Gameday on hand for a night game and lost to the Badgers 31-18. The Buckeyes ripped through the rest of their schedule including a key road win at Iowa and then beat Ark in the Sugar Bowl to finish 12-1 but just #5. OSU finished in a 3 way tie for tops in the Big Ten which was the 6th straight time they won at least a share of the Title. This year the Buckeyes move into the Leaders division of the Big Ten and will be without QB Pryor, RB Herron, WR Posey, DE Thomas, LT Adams AND coach Tressel for the first 5 (maybe more for Tressel). Those susp plus the fact that OSU was +15 in TO's in '10, benefitted from 2 net close wins, only had 7 sts lost to injury and had an off ypg of 11.6, have them pointed down. On the positive side their +164 ypg was by far the league's best with their fellow co-champs Mich St at +39.9 ypg and Wisc +80.5 ypg. Also for the first time since 2003 no underclassmen declared for the draft. With everyone available, OSU is the best in the Big Ten and a National Title contender. It is early May when I am writing this and I am not sure what additional actions the NCAA will take (hearing in Aug). If the penalties are minimal for this season I feel they have a great shot at a 7th straight Big Ten Title.

OSU has won 32 str home openers by 21 ppg and the last loss was vs Penn St ('78). The Buckeyes are 27-1 all-time vs the MAC and 6-1 vs Akron (lost in 1894).

Coming into 2011, OSU is 42-0-1 vs instate schools since 1922. OSU has shutout UT in both meetings including the L/gm in '09, 38-0 at Browns Stadium (23-9 FD & 522-210 yd edge).

LY vs UM for the 1st time since 1936, Ohio St all'd both a PR and KRTD in the same gm. This will mark the 4th different venue. OSU is 3-1 vs UM incl the 2002 Nat'l Championship.

OSU is 3-1 vs CU with the L/meeting a 13-10 win in Columbus in '86. The Buckeyes and Buffaloes agreed to this gm just about 1 yr ago. Under Tressel, OSU is 7-2 hosting non-conf/BCS tms.

In the L/meeting in '08 OSU won 45-7 as they led 28-0 at HT w/a 254-60 yd edge forcing 5 TO's. In '98 at home #1 OSU lost to a unranked MSU squad 28-24 costing them a National Title shot.

OSU is 2-0 vs NU but they last played in '56. This will be the first trip to Lincoln. Under Tressel the Buckeyes are 31-9 in Big 10 road gms including 21-3 the L&Y, avg win by 20 ppg.

The visitor is 14-5 S'90 & OSU has won its L/8 trips to Champaign including LY. The Buckeyes only led 14-10 into the 4Q & after QB Pryor was injured ran 24 of 28 plays.

Penn St: OSU was down 14-3 at HT LY but rallied in the 2H holding PSU to just 55 yds on 26 plays marking the biggest comeback under Tressel (OSU had TD's on 5 of 1st 6 H drives).

OSU allowed 31 pts LY to UW which is the most S'08 (35 vs #1 USC). The L2Y OSU has been outgained and UW is the only tm to beat OSU 4x's the last decade (next closest was 2x).

OSU has beaten IU 16 str & outrushed them on avg the L/7 gms 228-33 (5.7-1.1). The Buckeyes are 30-1-1 hosting the Hoosiers S'52 (only loss in '87, Earl Bruce's last ssn at the helm).

OSU got revenge LY from the '09 loss as they dominated PU holding them to under 100 yds till the final poss & the deepest penetration was the OSU39. Visitor is just 2-8 the L/10 yrs.

Buckeyes have had 6 IRTD's in the L/7 gms. Last OSU Big 10 home loss was vs PSU in '08.

LY OSU started off slow (outgained 118-13 after 2 poss each) but UM was SOD on the OSU28 & fgm.

on the OSU9. LTH OSU only led 14-10 3Q but held UM to a punt, 3 int's & a SOD on the L/5 drives.
