QB Andrew Luck



POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Since 1970 the Cardinal have had 13 QB's drafted incl #1 overall DC's Jim Plunkett and John Elway. Trent Edwards (PS#5) was the last DC (#3DC BUF). After Edwards' departure in '07, Stanford got uneven QB play. In '08 they avg'd just 152 ypg pass (56%). Despite the st'r returning in '09, the job clearly belonged to rFr Andrew Luck (PS#8) who some NFL scouts were already calling him the best prospect QB in the NCAA. Luck's numbers were not overwhelming with Toby Gerhart in the backfield as he threw for 2,575 (56%, 13-4) although he led the P10 in pass eff. He did miss the Sun Bowl vs Oklahoma and Tavita Pritchard (20 car st) hit 8-19-117. Luck lived up to the hype in '10 throwing for 3,338 (Pac-10 record 70.7%, 32-8). He broke Elway's record for td passes in a season and his 453 net yds rush was the highest single ssn tfl by an SU QB (Gene Washington, 362 in '66). Luck (P10 OPY, 2nd Tm AA) then surprised everyone and turned down being the #1 overall pick of the draft to return. His bkp was Sr Alex Loukas (PS#39) who had just 5 passes but rushed for 150 (8.3). RFr Josh Nunes (PS#17) ply'd in 4. Adding depth are Brett Nottingham (PS#14), Robbie Picazo (6'3" 202 So) and David Olson (6'3" 212 rFr, PS#171). Luck was the Heisman runner-up LY and is 2011's favorite.

RUNNING BACKS - In '07 Toby Gerhart rushed for 140 (11.7) in just 1 gm but RS (inj) while the leading RB had just 509 (4.4). In my '08 magazine I called for Gerhart to jump to the forefront and have the highest rushing total for an SU RB since Tommy Vardell (1084, '91). Gerhart did not let me down, setting the SU rec with 1,136 (5.4). In '09 Gerhart finished #2 in the closest Heisman race in history, rushing for an FBS best 1,871 (5.5) and an amazing 28 td's. LY they had to replace Gerhart (#2DC) and the top ret RB was soph Stephan Taylor (PS#36) who had 303 (5.4) as a true. Harbaugh was going to go with a RB-by-committee but soph Tyler Gaffney (PS#13) and Jeremy Stewart (6'1" 218 Sr, 1 st) were both banged up early. Taylor had 5 straight 100+ efforts, the only P10 RB to do so and he became just the 6th SU RB to rush for 1,000 yds in a ssn (Darrin Nelson, 777-78, '81, Brad Muster '86, Jon Volpe '88, Tommy Vardell '91 and Gerhart '08-'09) with 1137 (5.1). SU's 2nd best total ever. Taylor was also the #5 rec (266, 9.5). Good sized true frosh Anthony Wilkerson (PS#22) rushed for 408 (4.6), Gaffney (87 as true) had 255 (4.2) and rFr Usua Amanam (PS#32) had 126 (4.5). Owen Marecic was one of the best blk'g FB's in the

country rushing for 46 (2.0) getting double duty at LB. TY they lose Marecic (13 st, #4DC CLE) while Amanam was working at CB in spg. Not listed below are Ricky Seale (5'9" 200 rFr, PS#38), Andrew Stutz (6'1" 197 So), Michael Spanos (5'10" 178 So), Jackson Cummings (5'9" 192 rFr, Scout Tm POY) and Stewart (137, 7.6). This group is a lot more exp'd but it will be tough to improve much upon Taylor's fine '10 numbers.

RECEIVERS - In '09 this unit ret'd intact and got the added spd of soph Chris Owusu (10.4 100m) and 3 true frosh. Ryan Whalen led for a 2nd straight yr with 926 (16.2) while Owusu was #2 (682, 18.4). Coby Fleener was #3 (266, 12.7) and TE Konrad Reuland added 142 (23.7). LY the unit ret'd intact but Reuland lost his starting TE job to rFr Levine Toilolo (PS#5). Unfortunately, Toilolo was OFY in the opener (ACL). Whalen had just 10 st (inj) and dropped to #2 (439, 10.7). Doug Baldwin (10 st '08, inj '09) reestablished himself and led with 857 (14.8). Owusu missed 6 and was limited in a few others (inj) finishing #4 (396, 15.8). TE Fleener was #3 thanks to a monster bowl gm (173, 28.8, 3 td). TY they lose Whalen (10 st, #6DC CIN), TE Reuland (7 st, 209, 10.0) and Baldwin (12 st). Not in the PSL are Corey Gatewood (5'11" 181 Sr, PS#93), John Flacco (6'2" 187 rFr), Sam Knapp (6'3" 208 So), Brandon Gottfried (6'5" 227 rFr) and Jeff Trojan (6'3" 199 rFr). Despite the loss of their top 2, Luck's return will keep this unit productive.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '06, injuries decimated this unit as 9 diff players st'd (only 2 w/10+ st). SU avg'd just 65 ypg rushing (2.1), its worst S/'93 and yielded an FBS worst 50 sks (15.8%). They showed improvement in '07 to 111 ypg (3.0), SU's best total in 5 yrs but still allowed 48 sks (11.3%). In '08 they had to replace 2 st'rs but showed big time improvement in Harbaugh's 2nd yr with 200 ypg (4.9, 21 sk). In '09 they had to replace a 2nd Tm P10 C and 1st Tm P10 LT and their OL coach. Still the unit improved to 218 ypg (5.3) all'g the 2nd fewest sks in the FBS (7). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm P10 RT but had 4 st'rs back. Even losing star RB Gerhart, the unit paved the way for 214 ypg rush (5.2) and allowed just 6 sks (FBS best 1.6%). This year they lose 1st Tm AA C Chase Beeler (13 st, 3Y st'r), 2nd Tm P10 LG Andrew Phillips (13 st, 3Y st'r) and RT Derek Hall (13 st, HM P10). They do return two 1st Tm P10 (LT Jonathan Martin and RG David DeCastro). This will still be a quality unit but it is clearly less exp'd.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '06 SU had to replace 2 starters (#5 & #6 DC's) from its 3 man front and the 4.9 ypc all'd was their best in over 2 decades. SU switched to a 4 man front in '07 and showed improvement in each of the next 3 yrs going from 169 ypg rush allowed to 153 and 138 in '09. Last year they had to replace 1 st'r and 2 bkps (#7DC) and moved starting DE Thomas Keiser to OLB in their new 3-4 D (basically 1 st'r back). DE Brian Bulcke was the 6th overall pick in the CFL draft despite only 9 st in 4 years. SU improved again to all'g 121 ypg with their 3.9 ypc the best S/'04 and the D tallied 36 sks. This year they lose NG Sione Fua (13 st, 23 tkl, 4.5 sk, #3DC CAR) and DE Bulcke (10 st, 24 tkl). Much like LY, one starter returns so this unit should be on par with the '10 unit.

LINEBACKERS - Last year the Cardinal had to replace 3 LB's who comb'd for 25 starts (#5, #8, #12 tkl'rs). They returned PS#11 Shayne Skov who was the #3 tkl'r as a true frosh as well as their #6, #7 and #10 tkl'rs from '09. They also had FB Owen Marecic play full-time and he started all 13. SU all'd just 17.4 ppg, their best S/'92. TY they lose OLB Keiser (13 st, #9 tkl'r, 9.5 tfl, led early for NFL, UFA), Marecic (13 st, #5 tkl'r, 5.5 tfl) and Chike Amajoyi (21 tkl). LY they ret 4 who had 6+ st plus Marecic. This year their #1 and #2 tkl'rs are back but the rest of the LB's have a comb 2 career starts.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Despite failing to have a winning record from 2002-'06, Stanford performed well in my PDR finishing #37, #36, #20, #68 and #45. In Harbaugh's first 3 seasons, they dropped to #74, #88 and #97 (63%, 23-8) in '09. LY they

only had to replace 1 st'r and I called for their best finish in my PDR in at least 4 yrs. As expected, the Cardinal rose up to #16 (56.8% 16-18, best finish S/'96). This year they lose CB Richard Sherman (12 st, #6 tkl'r, 4 int, 9 pbu, #5DC SEA), S Taylor Skaufel (4 st, #7 tkl'r, 1 int) and S Austin Yancy (2 st, 19 tkl, 1 int). They do return 2nd Tm P10 SS Delano Howell (PS#27) and are equal to '10 in terms of exp but with the loss of their top cover CB, they probably will not match LY's unusually high PDR finish.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In '06 SU finished just #111 in my ST rankings but in Harbaugh's first 2 yrs they improved to #27 and #19. In '09 I called for them to improve and they moved up to #2. Chris Owusu tied a P10 rec with 3 KR td's (1167, 31.5). LY everyone ret'd but Owusu (24.3) missed 6. Nate Whitaker hit 17-19 FG's (L46) and also led the P10 in TB's with 28. SU did allow 21.9 on KR (#73 FBS) and 13.0 on PR D (#109). Stanford finished #40. Daniel Zychlinski replaced David Green (37.7 net '08) as the P in the first 10 gms and it appears that they will battle for the #1 spot again in fall (36.8 tm net). This year they lose their top-notch K Whitaker but should get a full season out of Owusu and figure to have a much improved unit.

COACHES - Jim Harbaugh took over in '07 after a 1-11 season and improved SU's record in all 4 yrs. LY they finished 12-1 and won a BCS bowl (first major bowl win S/'72) but he departs for the NFL. David Shaw takes over after being the OC here S/'07. Shaw spent 9 yrs as an NFL off asst (PHI, OAK, BAL) and prior to SU he was at Univ of San Diego. The '94 grad (4Y lett at rec) is this 5th alum to be HC here. OC Pep Hamilton was the WR cch here LY. He also comes from an NFL background as he was QB cch at CHI ('07-'09), SF ('06) and with the NYJ ('03-'05). The co-DC's are Derek Mason (DB cch LY) who was with the NFL prior (MIN '07-'09) as well as Jason Tarver who was with the 49ers from 2001-'10.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In the 7 yrs from '01-'07 the Cardinal had 4 different HC's. In '06 they were 1-11 and were dead last in the Pac-10 in conf ypg (-169, 90 yds worse than #9). Their 11 straight losses tied a SU rec (1959-'60). In Harbaugh's first ssn ('07) SU had 15 st'rs ret ('07). SU improved to 3-6 in the P10 and 4-8 overall but finished last in the P10 in conf ypg (-176, 109 worse than #9) for the 5th straight yr. Stanford was picked #9 in the P10 media poll in '08 but had 15 ret st'rs and improved to 5-7. In '09 they had 16 ret st'rs and 7 HC's. RB Toby Gerhart rushed for 1,871 (5.5) with 28 td's and guided SU to an 8-4 reg ssn which got them as high as #14 before a loss to Cal. LY they had 15 ret st'rs incl QB Luck. Three of my 9 sets of power ratings called for an 11-1 ssn but Stanford exceeded my expectations. They went 6-0 at Stanford Stadium, their first undefeated home ssn S/'77. They won 8 of their first 9 for the first time since the 1970 tm (led by eventual Heisman winner Jim Plunkett). The Cardinal opened up 4-0 after demolishing ND in South Bend 37-14. They led Oregon 21-3 in the 1Q but lost by 21 as the Ducks ran for 388 yds. SU got a 30 yd FG on the last play to get past USC 37-35 and then won their next 3 easily. They trailed Ariz ST 13-10 late but Luck manufactured an 85yd/10pl td drive scoring the gm winning td with 5:14 left. SU routed rival Cal on the road and shutout Oreg ST, the 1st time they had 3 shutouts in a ssn S/'69. #5 Stanford then wallowed #12 Virg Tech 40-12 in the bowl with a 534-288 yd edge. Stanford finished #4 their 6th ever Top Ten finish (1940, '51, '70, '71 & '92) and 2nd highest in tm history (#2 in '40). SU was +13 in TO's LY, had 2 net close wins and an offensive ypp of 11.7. They also have just 11 ret st'rs this yr and go from the battle tested coaching legacy of Harbaugh to a 1st yr HC. Stanford will be in the AP preseason Top 7 as QB Luck would have been the #1 pick in TY's draft yet opted to return. Their road sked has just one bowl tm from '10 on it (7-6 Ariz). Two of my 9 sets of power ratings call for an unbeaten yr but with the loss of their HC, and just 11 st'rs back they will not match LY's 12 win total.
