POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Over the last decade 5 Trojan QB's had been drafted with Carson Palmer and Matt Leinart taking home Heisman Trophies. In '08 Mark Sanchez (PS#2) threw for 3,207 (66%, 34-10, #1 P10 pass eff) and Carroll was not happy when he opted to leave early for the NFL (#1DC NYJ). Mitch Mustain who was 8-0 as a starter for Arkansas in '06 battled true frosh Matt Barkley (PS#5) and Jr Aaron Corp (PS#9). Corp was the starter out of the spg but suffered a cracked fibula and Barkley took most of the snaps in Aug. Barkley had a good season throwing for 2,735 (60%, 15-14) missing 1 start with inj but the Trojans avg'd just 222 ypg passing (lowest under Carroll). Corp threw for 155 (65%) and trans after the ssn. LY Barkley was noticeably quicker after dropping 10 lbs and had some outstanding gms, twice tying a school record with 5 td passes vs Hawaii and Cal. Barkley threw for 2,791 (62.6%, 26-12). He suffered an ankle inj which forced him to leave the gm in the 2Q vs Oregon St and missed ND. Mustain threw for 348 (56.2%, 1-1). Battling for the #2 spot will be rFr Jesse Scroggins (PS#8), true frosh Cody Kessler (PS#9), Max Wittek (PS#8) and Princeton transfer Brett Kan. John Manogian (6'0" 215 Jr), Emon Saeed (6'2" 200 Jr) and Anthony Neyer (6'2" 200 rFr) add depth. Barkley (2 time O'Brien semifinalist) is one of the top QB's in college football.

RUNNING BACKS - USC is known for it's fine TB tradition and LY had to replace a 1,000 yard rusher in Joe McKnight (#4DC). The top returnee was Allen Bradford (PS#3) who had 668 (5.8). Bradford was #1 after spring but Marc Tyler (PS#1) won the job in August. Tyler rushed for 913 (5.3) while Bradford was #2 with 794 and an impressive 7.2 ypc. Exciting true frosh Dillon Baxter (PS#4) was susp'd for 2 and had just 253 (4.8) often working out of the Wildcat. This year they lose Bradford (#6DC TB, 4 st), CJ Gable (253, 4.8, PS#9) and FB Stanley Havili (PS#39, #7DC PHI, 32 rec, 13 st). Despite the losses, with the top guy back and some solid additions, this is once again one of the elite RB corps in the country which is likely to use the FB less.

RECEIVERS - Last year the Trojans had to replace their top two rec's (#3DC WR, #6DC TE). The top returnee was Ronald Johnson who had 378 (11.1) despite missing the 1st 5 with inj in '09. Johnson was very impressive in spring and August but surprisingly was only #2 with 692 (10.8) and a team high 8 td's. True frosh Robert Woods lived up to his PS#2 billing and led with 792 (12.2). TE Rhett Ellison (PS#42) was #5 (239, 11.4)

and David Ausberry (PS#2) was #4 (252, 12.6). This year they lose Johnson (12 st, #6DC SF), Ausberry (1 st, #7DC OAK) and TE Jordan Cameron (16 rec, #4DC CLE). They have added 3 PS#1's from each of the last two classes in rFr WR Prater, rFr TE Xavier Grimble and true WR George Farmer. Not in the PSL below are WR's Cody Skene (5'9" 165 So), Walter Calistro (5'9" 170 So), Reed Semcken (6'2" 180 rFr) and TE's Kevin Downey (6'3" 210 So) and Michael Cox (6'4" 230 rFr). This unit is actually a little more exp'd than the '10 version and of course, is loaded with talent.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '08 USC had to replace their 20th 1st Rnd OL DC since 1968 and had just 1 st'r returning. Surprisingly the inexp'd O-line matched '07's #'s with 195 ypg rush (5.0, 18 sk). In '09 the entire 2 deep ret'd and former SJSt HC Dick Tomey said that USC's O-line was the best he'd seen in his long career. The numbers slipped a little to 167 ypg (4.9, 18 sk). LY they had to replace 3 st'r's incl a pair of 1st Tm P10 OL's (#2DC). I noted that while the unit was less exp'd, the numbers could actually improve and they did (189 ypg, 5.2) allowing 18 sk (4.0%) for the 3rd st year. TY they lose C Kristofer O'Dowd (13 st, 3Y st'r), RT Tyrone Smith (12 st, 1st Tm P10, #1DC DAL), LG Butch Lewis (9 st, 3Y st'r), LG Michael Reardon (5 st) and bkp Zack Heberer (13 gm on ST's). TY they add in PS#10, PS#17 and 2 JC VHT's who were IFS and equal 2010's exp.

DEFENSIVE LINE - For most of this past decade, the Trojans fielded a premiere D-line. In '03 they allowed just 1.8 ypc rush with 55 sks. Their "worst" year came in '05 when they yielded 3.8 ypc. In '09 they had to replace 3 st'r's (#1, #2 and #4 DC's). After gm 6, they led the nation in sks per gm and were 2nd in ftl. Shockingly they had some poor gms and for the season all'd 128 ypg (3.7). LY they had to replace 1 st'r (#4DC) then lost DT Christian Tupou (11 st) to an ACL (spg). DE Nick Perry, who led with 8 sks in '09 only started 9 (ankle). Returning starting DT Jurrell Casey was dominant in the spg and earned 1st Tm P10. Even with 2 st'r's back, the Trojans slipped to allowing 140 ypg (4.4) with just 28 sks, their worst ypc allowed since 1991. TY Casey (13 st, #5 tkl'r, 11 ftl) left early for the NFL draft (#3DC TEN) and also gone is DT Hebron Fangupo (4 tkl, trans to BYU) and DT Derek Simmons (9 tkl). Even with the loss of their top guy, this unit will resemble more of what you would expect from a Trojan D-line.

LINEBACKERS - In '08 the Trojans led the FBS in ppg allowed (9.0) with the best set of LB's in the country. While that '08 unit had to replace #1 and #5 DC's, they produced the Bednarik Award winner, a 1st Tm AA and #1, #2 and #4 NFL DC's. Then DC Rocky Seto said the '09 version was faster and while they played well early, they had 4 poor games and allowed 19.8 ppg (worst S/O's). LY the unit ret'd intact but USC shockingly allowed 26.7 ppg and their 400 ypg allowed was the worst since the school began keeping track in 1955. This year they lose WLB Malcolm Smith (11 st, #2 tkl'r, 8 ftl, #7DC SEA) and SLB Michael Morgan (13 st, #6 tkl'r, 3 ftl). They do return 2 who split the MLB spot LY in Chris Galippo (PS#2, 29 tkl, 70 tkl '09) and Devon Kennard (#4 tkl'r) but Kiffin was disappointed with the play at that position putting the job up for grabs after the Oregon gm. The Trojans introduced a new S/LB hybrid position in the spg to help combat the spread. The LB corps is less exp'd but with two back who have been full time st'r's and a unit loaded with VHT's, the ppg allowed will improve.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Under Carroll, the Trojans finished #16, #12, #7, #1, #9, #10, #6, #1 and #14 in my PDR from '01-'09. LY the unit was wiped out, losing all 4 st'r's (#2, #3 DC) and they had just 4 car st's ret. As you would expect, USC had its lowest finish ever in my PDR since I began keeping track in '94 at #61 (59.9%, 30-15). Not in the PSL are CB's Boomer

Roepke (5'8" 185 Sr), Taylor Ashton (5'8" 175 Sr) and S's John Auran (5'11" 190 So), Chidozie Uche (5'10" 180 Jr) and Samuel Sulam (5'10" 185 rFr). TY they lose 2nd Tm P10 CB Sharee Wright (13 st, #3 tkl'r, 10 pbu, #3DC SD) but have 7 of the top 8 back making the unit vastly more exp'd than '10 and allowing them to make a big jump in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Carroll's final 3 yrs ('07-'09) USC was surprisingly #101, #50 and #59 in my ST rankings. Kiffin hired ST cch John Baxter whose '09 Fresno St unit finished #20. The Trojans had to replace their K and top PR. The K became the major problem as Joe Houston struggled early hitting 2 of his first 6 FG's incl a crucial 40 yd 4Q miss vs Wash which left the Huskies within 3. He finished strong however hitting his final 5 FG's (10-16, L45). P Jacob Harfman (37.0 tm net '09) improved to 41.1 (37.2 tm net) with 14 TB on 76 KO. Robert Woods had a KR td (25.6) and Ronald Johnson a PR td (14.2). USC moved all the way up to #23 but lose Houston, Harfman and Johnson. While you would expect a drop, if a solid K emerges (add PS#2) they could have a shot at improvement.

COACHES - Pete Carroll led USC to a 97-19 record with two National Titles and an unprecedented 7 consec P10 Titles ('02-'08) in 10 yrs. Lane Kiffin was an asst at USC under Carroll for 6 yrs (OC LY) before becoming the youngest HC in modern NFL history at 31 in '07. He was fired by the Raiders 4 gms into '08 (5-15 2Y) and then was the HC at Tenn in '09 (7-6). The OC for a 2nd season is Kennedy Pola (asst here '00-'03). Pola previously was an NFL RB cch (JAX '05-'09). Ed Orgeron is the DC and was also at Tenn in '09 (asst HC) and his resume includes his HC stint at Ole Miss ('05-'07). Lane's father is the legendary Monte Kiffin who is the asst HC and was the DC at Tenn in '09 and has 26 yrs of NFL exp (TB DC 13 yrs).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Pete Carroll had inherited a tm that had only topped 6 wins in a season once ('98) in the 5 yrs before he arrived. Not too many fans were excited about Carroll's hiring but his Trojans became the only tm in the country to finish in the AP Top 4 in each of the 7 yrs from 2002-'08. They won a National Title in '04 and nearly again in '05. 2009 was an unusual yr for Carroll as they plummeted to 9-4. The defense had all'd 8.6 ppg in the first 5 but it jumped to 26.9 ppg over the last 8. The Trojans fell to 5-4 in the Pac-10 and were actually -19.4 ypg (4th worst). This came just one year after they were +232.7 ypg, 131.7 ypg better than the #2 team. LY as I was writing my magazine in April USC was my favorite to win the P10 before being hit hard by NCAA probation incl a postseason ban for both 2010 and '11 and a reduction in scholarships. USC was so thin prior to the season that they adjusted practices to cut back on contact. It seemed to have an effect in the opener as Hawaii gained 588 yds. USC was unimpressive the next 2 wks in wins vs Virg and Minn before beating Wash St 50-16. Against Washington USC missed a 40 yd FG with 2:34 left which would have put them up by 4 and UW got a 32 yd FG with no time left for the upset, 32-31. The next wk vs Stanford, USC got a td with 1:08 left for a 35-34 lead but SU would hit a 30 yd FG on the final play. USC destroyed Cal (48-14) then basically had their Super Bowl vs #1 Oregon. USC led 32-29 in the 3Q but lost 53-32. They narrowly got past Arizona as they blk'd an xp and ret'd it for 2 and got a 29 yd FG for a 1 pt lead. ASU missed a 42 yd FG with 1:34 left for the win. After Arizona pulled within 3 with 1:01 left USC rec'd an onside kick and held on for a win. Without QB Barkley they were beaten by both Oregon St (hurt in 1H) and ND. With Barkley back, the Trojans rebounded to beat UCLA 28-14. USC's 5 losses were the most since '01. The Trojans tied for 3rd in the P10 at 5-4 and were +46.4 ypg. USC does draw both Oregon and Stanford from the North (both top 7 AP) and has to face Arizona on the road (South fav). While this yr's tm is young (just 12 scholarship Sr's) they are capable of winning the Pac-12 South (but cannot play in the Title gm).

USC has won 4 straight over Minn. LY USC trailed 19-13 late 3Q but then had 3 straight TD drives. The Trojans have won 13 straight home openers (avg score of 35-11).		
USC is 6-3 vs Utah but dropped the L/meeting (2001 Las Vegas Bowl). USC trailed 10-0 at HT & could only muster 1 rush yd as 80 (53%) of their 151 yds came on one drive.		
The Trojans are 2-0 vs the Orange with a 16-0 shutout in 1924 (in LA) & a 34-16 KO Classic opener (in NJ) in 1990. Into 2011, USC is 15-1 hosting non-conf opp's S'02.		
USC has won 5 str trips to Tempe. LTH USC escaped w/a 14-9 win being outFD'd 23-12 & outgained 347-258 as the gm featured 18 pen (173 yds). USC int ASU on the gm's final play from their 45.		
LY RB Marc Tyler (PS#1) had career highs in rushing (160) & att (31) as USC jumped out to a 14-0 lead & never trailed. USC was 28-1 hosting conf opp's from 2002-'08 but just 5-4 L2Y.		
Washington: USC has dropped B2B gms vs UW (last series 3 gm losing streak was from 1990-'92).		
Oregon: The Trojans are 2-5 the last 7 trips to Eugene including B2B defeats.		
USC has won 8 of L/9 at Cal incl 3 str by 20 ppg. In their last trip USC led 23-0 into the 4Q. USC int'd Cal in the EZ on the opening drive and later Cal was SOD at the SC38 & SC18.		
LY's loss to ND snapped a series high 8 gm win streak. USC has won 4 str trips to South Bend. LTH USC never trailed & after ND had a 1&g1 at the SC4, stopped 3 str EZ passes (last inc was gm's final play).		
Trojans have dropped B2B gms vs the Cardinal. LY USC went 51/10pl w/1:08 left scoring on a 3 yd TD run to take a 1-pt lead but SU went 62/7pl nailing a 30-yd GW FG as time exp (overall 7 lead changes).		
First meeting S'02. HC Kiffin has faced CU once in his career, in '99 as the Colo St OL cch (won 41-14).		
LY's gm had 8 lead changes. After USC missed a 40 yd FG, UW went 61/10pl nailing a GW 32 yd FG as time exp.		
LTH the gm was tied 17-17 late 2Q but USC was outscored 30-3 & outgained 416-134 (59 yds on their final drive).		
USC has beat cross-city rival UCLA 4 str yrs (all by 14+ pts). LY the Trojans admitted this was their "bowl"		
as UCLA gained 53% of their FD's (9) & 39% of its yds (141) on the L/2 pass after the gm had been decided.
