POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Vince Young became the first player in NCAA history to have 2,500 pass and 1,000 rush yds in a season ('05) and left Austin 30-2 as a starting QB. In '06 rFr Colt McCoy (PS#11) had a much better season than most expected setting the school record for td passes (29). In '07 nobody expected a soph slump. While he narrowly missed out on the schl rec for pass yds in a ssn (Major Applewhite 3,357 in '99), he also nearly set the rec for most int. McCoy dropped from 68% (29-7) to 65% (22-18). In '08 I expected McCoy to return to his '06 form and he did even better hitting a NCAA record 76.7% throwing for 3,859 (34-8). He was also the #1 rusher (561, 4.1) and the Heisman runner-up. McCoy threw for 3,521 (71%, 27-12) in '09 but was inj'd early in the BCS Title game. True frosh bkp Garrett Gilbert (PS#2) struggled in the 1H (1-10, 2 int) vs Bama before leading a 2H comeback. Based on that performance '10 expectations were enormous for Gilbert who is blessed with NFL measurables but had only hit 30-66-310-2-4 coming into the season. LY he was the #2 rusher (380, 3.8) but struggled throwing for 2,744 (59%) with a poor 10-17 ratio leading the B12 in int. Battling for the starting job will be PS#51 Case McCoy (Colt's bro), Connor Wood (PS#6, IFS '10) and VHT David Ash (PS#16, IFS). Gilbert operated out of the shotgun in HS and took a good portion of the snaps from C LY which would account for some of his difficulties. I look for much improved numbers.

RUNNING BACKS - Texas has had a terrific RB tradition including Heisman Trophy winners Earl Campbell and Ricky Williams. Cedric Benson became just the 5th ply'r in NCAA hist to top 1,000 yds rushing for 4 straight yrs including 1,834 (5.6) in '04. Jamaal Charles led the RB's for 3 consec yrs including 1,619 (6.3) in '07. In '08 Vondrell McGee was the top RB with a paltry 376 (4.3). Cody Johnson had 338 (4.4) and Fozzy Whittaker (PS#18) had 284 (4.4). In '09 McGee dropped to 300 (5.4). Tre' Newton (PS#29) led with just 552 (4.8) and Johnson was the #2 RB (335, 3.9) while Whittaker added 212 (4.0). LY one of the reasons I had UT rated lower than most was their move away from the spread to a power run game as I failed to see a feature RB on the roster. After 10 wks their leading rusher in gross yds was QB Gilbert. Johnson had a pair of 100 yd efforts in the last 2 and led with 592 (4.4). TY he will be used in a true FB role. Whittaker had 351 (4.4) and DJ Monroe were their most electrifying RB at times and rushed for 195 (8.5). This year they lose McGee and Newton (3 st, 229, 3.6). I expect PS#1 Malcolm Williams (probably UT's most talented RB recruit since Benson) to take over the featured spot and revive the Horns' tradition of 1,000 yard backs.

RECEIVERS - In '08 Jordan Shipley (PS#7) and Quan Cosby (PS#9) became UT's first duo to each top 1,000. In '09 they had to replace Cosby but Shipley was a Biletinikoff finalist (1485, 12.8).

Malcolm Williams (PS#11) was #2 with 550 (14.1), James Kirkendoll (PS#28) was #3 (461, 9.6) and conv QB John Chiles added 319 (9.4). Their TE's were wiped out prior to the yrs as PS#36 Greg Smith (worked with the OL) became the st'r and DL Ahmad Howard was the bkp (PS#29) combining for just 6 rec. LY they had to replace Shipley (#3DC). Chiles was hobbled early but had 117 (23.4) vs Iowa Stand finished #3 (418, 14.4). Mike Davis (PS#10) became the 2nd frosh in UT history to have over 100 yds rec in one of his first 2 gms with 104 vs WY. He had 183 in gm 2-4 but missed Okla and had 0 rec vs Neb (inj). Davis' 47 rec's set a schl Fr rec topping BJ Johnson (41 in '00). DeSean Hales (PS#16) was Gilbert's favorite target in the spg but had just 75 (7.5). The TE's comb for only 121 (5.8). Kirkendoll led with 707 (13.6) while Williams was just #4 (334, 13.9). TY they lose Kirkendoll (11 st) and Chiles (8 st). With a more exp'd QB, I can see them topping LY's numbers.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '09 UT only had to replace 1 st'r (91 car st ret) but surprisingly their numbers dropped to 148 ypg rush (4.0) with 31 sks (5.7%), their weakest numbers since '02. LY they had to replace a 2nd Tm B12 C, a 2nd Tm AA LT, and an HM B12 LG (2 st's ret). I mentioned that despite being less exp'd, their numbers could improve and thanks to 259 yd rush vs FAU they did slightly to 151 ypg (4.2) while allowing just 18 sks (4.0%). This year they lose LT Kyle Hix (11 st, 3Y st'r), LG Michael Huey (8 st, 2Y st'r), RT Britt Mitchell (12 st) and Steve Moore (9 gm). Just like LY they return 2 st's and with the entire 2 deep made up of VHT's, they could improve again.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '06 UT had 3 st's back and had their best rush D S/42 all'g 61 ypg (2.3). In '07 despite just 1 ret st'r, UT all'd just 93 ypg (2.9). In '08 they had to replace 2 DT's. DE Brian Orakpo earned Big 12 DPOY and won the Nagurski and Lombardi Awards. Texas all'd just 84 ypg (3.1) with an FBS leading 47 sks. In '09 they had to replace 3 st's (#1, #3, #4 DC's) but LB Sergio Kindle moved to DE and they all'd just 72 ypg rush (2.2) with 44 sks. LY they had to replace 2.5 st's incl a pair of #2 DC's. Surprisingly, the Horns rush D allowed their highest ypg S/03 (139, 3.5). This year they lose 1st Tm B12 DE Sam Acho (12 st, #4 tkl'r, 9 sk, #4DC ARZ), DE Eddie Jones (8 st, #7 tkl'r, 6 sk) and DT Tyrell Higgins (2 st, 12 tkl). Three ret who started 5+ with 10 of the DL ranking PS#25 or higher. DT Alex Okafor (PS#4) moves to DE (260 lbs) along with FB Chris Whaley (PS#14). Despite being just as exp'd as '10, UT's numbers should be stronger.

LINEBACKERS - Texas divides the playing time at their LB positions and at times the bkps have more tkls than the st's. LY they had to replace 2nd Tm B12 Rodrick Muckelroy (#1 tkl'r) who was only the 2nd Horns LB to be drafted in the last 15 yrs (#4DC). They did add PS#1 Jordan Hicks but he had little impact (23 tkl) and their 2 other VHT signees sat out. They played 5 DB's a lot in '09 so technically only 1 st'r ret'd in Keenan Robinson (#3 tkl'r) but they also ret'd #9 Emmanuel Acho. Acho moved back and forth from OLB to MLB. UT allowed 23.7 ypg (7 ppg more than '09). This year they lose MLB Dustin Earnest (4 st, #9 tkl'r) and Jared Norton (16 tkl). Not only do their top 2 tkl'rs return but those 3 VHT's should have a much bigger impact.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - After a #6 finish in my PDR in '05, the Horns yielded a school record 236 ypg passing in '06 (#63 PDR) and in '07 had to replace 3 st's incl a Thorpe Award winning CB and allowed a new record of 278 ypg (#109 FBS). They still finished #45 in my PDR due to facing a tough slate of opp QB's. In '08 UT had to replace 3 st's again but moved back up to #19. Texas climbed to #4 in '09 trimming the ypg to 180 (14-25 ratio). LY they had to replace 1 st'r in 1st Tm AA SS Earl Thomas (#1DC) but had a unit loaded with exp and NFL prospects. The Horns finished #15 trimming the ypg again to 162 despite an underachieving front seven. This year they lose 3 NFL DC's in CB Curtis Brown (10 st, 26 tkl, 7 pbu, #3DC PIT), DE Aaron Williams (9 st, 46 tkl, 13 pbu, #2DC BUF) and Chykie Brown (9 st, 19 tkl, 7 pbu, #5DC BAL). They return 3 who st'd 6+ but are a little less experienced.

SPECIAL TEAMS - With Brown's great recruiting classes, most of the bkps are VHT's and contribute here. Since '00 they have finished #18, #10, #16, #15, #36, #1 (in '05), #12, #26, #10 and #3 ('09) in my ST rankings. LY they had to replace their K (24-27) and top PR (13.0). P Justin Tucker had 43 punts (40.4) in '09 and John Gold had 15 (44.1). LY Tucker had 35 (41.2) and Gold 24 (43.6) as the tm had a net of 36.5 (34.1 '09). DJ Monroe was the top KR in '09 (33.6) but slipped to 20.5. Tucker hit 23-27 FG (L51) and had 15 TB's on 65 KO's. Curtis Brown was the main PR (14.9) but had some troubles handling punts and Aaron Williams had 11 PR's (7.8). With Tucker returning, I look for improvement on LY's #48 finish.

COACHES - Mack Brown took over a team that had 3 winning seasons the previous 7 yrs (4-7 prior yr) and has won or tied for six Big 12 South Titles. In '08 Mack Brown won the Bobby Dodd award as Nat'l COY. This year longtime OC Greg Davis is replaced by co-OC's Bryan Harsin and Major Applewhite (asst HC/B cch here L3Y). Harsin who piloted Boise St's offense the L5Y will be the play caller. Manny Diaz has the tough job of replacing 3 year DC Will Muschamp (Fla HC). Diaz was Miss St's DC LY after spending 4 yrs at Middle Tennessee in the same role.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Mack Brown came into '05 with just a 1-12 record vs Top 5 tms but things changed in a big way. UT defeated #4 Ohio St on the road and after having lost 5 straight to Okla, won 45-12. They beat defending National Champ #1 USC in the Rose Bowl winning their first National Title since 1970. In '06 they were #4 when QB McCoy was inj'd and they finished just 10-3. In '07 they fell as low as #23 but finished #10. In '08 they had just 11 st's ret and a tough schedule. The young team came together quickly and they knocked off #1 Okla 45-35 and moved to #1 appearing to have arrived a year early. They gave up a td with :01 left and lost to #6 TT on the road and with a 3-way tie were excluded from the B12 Title game. Denied a shot at the National Title a disappointed Longhorn team still beat #10 Ohio St in the Fiesta Bowl, 24-21. In '09 I projected the Horns to play in the National Title game and they got past Okla 16-13 and then in the B12 Title game needed a 46 yd FG with :01 left to get to the Championship game. Unfortunately they lost QB McCoy to injury while leading 6-0 and despite a 276-263 yd edge, were done in by 5 TO's and lost to Alabama 37-21. LY I mentioned that they had just 8 st's lost to injury in '09, were +9 in TO's, had an incredible off ypg of 10.7 (pg 299) and that their +94.3 ypg was only the 3rd best in the B12. UT made a crucial decision of going from the spread to more of a pro-style downhill run attack despite being unable to produce a feature back in the previous 4 yrs. With Garrett Gilbert's solid 2H in the Title game, many treated the Horns as if they had a ret st'r at QB however Gilbert's play reflected his inexp (10-17 ratio). I got beat up pretty good in the preseason by Texas fans as I did not have the Horns in my Preseason Top 10. They entered the season at #5 but dropped to #7 after an unimpressive 3-0 start. Against UCLA they had 4 TO's in the 1H and trailed 13-3 prior to UCLA establishing the run vs them in the 2H in a stunning 22 pt home loss. They trailed Okla 28-10 before losing by 8. Texas fell out of the AP Top 25 for the first time in 163 wks but coming off a bye, upset #5 Neb on the road and appeared to have turned their season around. Unfortunately, they trailed Iowa St 28-6 and lost by 7 at home. They led Baylor 19-10 in the 3Q but lost by 8. They had 412-270 yd and 23-13 FD edges but actually trailed Kan St 39-0 in the 4Q with 5 int's by Gilbert. They trailed Okla St 33-3 after the 3Q for their first 4 game home losing streak since 1956. After beating Fla Atl they needed a win over rival A&M at home to salvage a bowl. Trailing 24-17 they were int'd at the A&M 8 with 2:37 left for a stunning plummet to 5-7. Making it even more shocking was that they finished at the bottom of the div standings for the first time S/56. Brown had led UNC and UT to winning records for 20 st yrs, the longest active streak of any FBS coach. He has made some great hires at coor (see Coaches) and keep in mind that UT was -12 in TO's LY. Texas now makes my Most Improved List and will have a much better year than most expect.

UT has beaten Rice 39 of L/40 gms including 11 str topping 50+ pts in 4 of L/5. LY the Longhorns trailed 3-0 into the 20 before scoring 24 str to pull away. UT has won 11 str openers by 40 ppg.

Texas is 0-2 vs BYU with the last meeting in '88, a 47-6 defeat. The Longhorns were in the midst of a 4-7 ssn while the Cougars finished 10-3 under legendary HC Lavell Edwards.

UT has dropped 3 str in this series (L/win in '71) including LY when they allowed 264 (4.7) rush yds after holding UCLA to -6 yds into the 2Q. UT has won 10 str road openers by 20 ppg.

Kansas St: LY Gilbert tossed 5 int's that resulted in 17 KSU pts. With the loss UT fell below .500 for the 1st time S/99 opener. A&M: LY's loss eliminated UT from a bowl (1st time under Brown & 1st time S'97).

UT is 3-0 in Ames incl their last trip ('07) when they won 56-3 w/a 28-14 FD & 514-228 yd edge. The Longhorns have won 7 of their L/8 B12 "true" road gms and since 1999 are 36-6.

In the L6Y UT has held OU to 124 rush yds or less in 5 gms all'g just 88 ypg (2.5) and in '09 held OU to -16 on the ground, lowest ever in RRR history. Last time this gm wasn't in Dallas was in 1923.

LY marked the 1st time S'56 UT dropped 4 HG's in-a-row after the OSU loss. UT has won 13 str the gm following the RRR. UT is 22-3 vs OSU & has never dropped B2B gms in the series.

Baylor: UT won 47-14 in their last trip to Waco holding Baylor to just 246 yds. The Longhorns led 47-0 mid-4Q as the Bear's last 2 drives netted 44% (109) of their yds.

In the eight B12 meetings Texas has outscored KU on avg 47-16. In 2009 Colt McCoy played his FHB & broke the NCAA record for most wins by a major CFB QB w/43.

In the L12Y Texas has won 10 gms by an avg of 21 ppg and the 2 losses have been by 4 & 6 pts. The 144 yds that Texas allowed LY was the fewest they have yielded in this series S'82.

Under Brown the Longhorns have won all 3 trips to Columbia (by 19, 31 & 34 pts). In the L/3 meetings overall UT has outgained MU on avg 525-284 & outscored them 49-19.

Texas is 16-2 in home finales (both losses were to A&M in 2006 by 5 pts & last year by 7 pts).

Visitor is 4-2. L/gm at Kyle Field UT sealed the win w/a 95 yd KR TD up just 3 with 6:57 left.

Despite LY's loss, UT has won 16 of the last 18 meetings (last lost B2B to BU in '91-'92).
