POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Unbelievably, since OSU joined the Big 8 in 1960, they had never had an all-conf QB heading into LY. After getting uneven QB play in '05 (49%, 11-17 ratio) and '06 (55%), Zac Robinson set an OSU season record for total offense (3,671) in '07. Robinson would top HC Mike Gundy's career passing mark throwing for 8,317 in his 4 yrs but did have a disappointing '09 season (2084, 15-12). He was in'd in '09 and OSU turned to Alex Cate as the starter vs Colo but he was 0-9 in the 1H. Former Yankees farmhand Brandon Weeden came off the bench and guided the comeback win and threw for 248 (62.5%, 4-1) on the yr. Weeden, who has the strongest arm that ex-OC Holgorsen had ever worked with, became a student of the game immersing himself in tape to prepare for the new off. The 27 yr old Weeden did not join his HS football team until his Jr yr and only started as a Sr in '01. Despite playing with a sprained thumb (opted against surgery) throughout most of '10 Weeden threw for a school record 4,277 (67%, 34-13) and became OSU's first 1st Tm all-conf QB since 1932 (Clarence Highfill). He set a school rec with 435 yds vs Baylor. Weeden returns and battling for the #2 spot are Clint Kiper (PS#97) who hit 14-19-23 and Johnny Deaton (PS#20). Adding depth is Ryan Howard (6'4" 212 Jr, PS#433JC). It will be tough for Weeden to top LY's stats especially with a new OC but he is much more exp'd and should remain a healthier.

RUNNING BACKS - In '07 Dantrell Savage (PS#11JC) had 10 straight 100 yd gms finishing with 1,272 (5.7). True frosh Kendall Hunter had 696 (6.5). In '08 they lost Savage but got back Keith Toston (6'31, 6.0 in '06, ACL '07). Hunter was 1st Tm AA rushing for 1,555 (6.5) incl 161 at #1 Texas. Hunter suffered an ankle inj and played in just 8 in '09 (382, 4.3). Toston had 206 vs Iowa St and became the 3rd straight Cowboy to top 1,000 yds with 1,218 (5.4). True frosh Jeremy Smith (PS#22) played in just 1 (MedRS) but had 160 (15 att) vs Grambling. LY they had to replace Toston and I speculated the unit could be even stronger as Hunter was backed by 3 VHT's. Hunter adapted to new OC Holgorsen's off easily, rushing for 1,548 (5.7) with 16 td's. In the opener Hunter was the first OSU RB to top 200 yds in a half since Barry Sanders ('88). Joseph Randle led Big 12 Fr in all-ppr yds with 1,160 as he was the best receiver of the RB's (427, 11.5) and the #2 rusher (452, 5.5). Smith was the best downhill runner and had 262 (4.7) with most of his carries in the RZ (7 td). They add PS#9 Herschel Sims. Not in the PSL are Grant Goodwin (5'8" 204 So), Michael Roberts (5'9" 194 Sr), Joe Aska (5'10" 199 Jr) along with FB's Zach Fullingim (6'0" 218 So) and Montra Nelson (6'2" 221 Jr). VHT Kye Staley (5'10" 213 Jr, PS#14) ret'd in the spg after leaving in Aug '10. TY they lose Hunter (12 st, #4DC SF) and solid blocking 1st Tm B12 FB Bryant Ward (1 st). I like the talent and there is a good chance they could keep their 1,000 yd streak alive but they are replacing a 2-time AA TB.

RECEIVERS - In '09 OSU had to replace 4 of their top 5 rec's so the unit was very young. Dez Bryant (1480, 17.0 in '08) was then susp'd after just 3 gms but he still finished #2 with 323 (19.0). Hubert Anyiam (PS#105) led with 515 (12.3) and rFr Justin Blackmon, in 4 sts, was #4 with 260 (13.0) while #5. Josh Cooper had 234 (11.7). At the end of Aug '10 Holgorsen wondered if a go-to WR would emerge. Blackmon became that guy and was the Big 12 OPOY, the Biletnikoff winner and led the nation with 1,782 (16.1) and 20 td's despite missing 1 gm (susp). For the first time since '02 OSU had two 100-rec's in the same gm when Blackmon and Cooper/Bowling did it 3 times. Blackmon had an NCAA rec 12 straight 100 yd rec gms (Aaron Turner of Pacific, 11). Anyiam was banged up and had just 135 (12.3). Cooper moved up to #2 with 736 (10.8). Mel Kiper had Blackmon #13 on his Big Board following the '10 ssn yet he turned down the NFL. Not in the PSL are Ryan Williams (5'11" 176 Jr), Justin Southwell (5'7" 162 Jr), Jerimie Gunnells (6'2" 232 Sr) and Patrick MacDonald (6'2" 206 So). The only loss is Bo Bowling (6 st, 437, 10.4). While it will be tough for Blackmon to improve upon '10's stats, this is a much more exp'd unit and hopefully a #3 WR will emerge.

OFFENSIVE LINE - LY OSU had to replace 1st Tm AA Russell Okung (#1DC), a pair of 3 yr str's and another str. The unit ret just 12 car sts (#117 FBS). With OSU moving to a TTech style off, it was very surprising to see the ypc actually increase to 5.0 while all'g just 10 sks (1.9%). RT Levy Adcock was the tm's top OL and did not allow a sk in 754 reg ssn snaps. This unit's performance was a key to OSU's surprising ssn. TY they lose bkps Jordan Taormina (8 gm) and Anthony Morgan (13 gm). While this unit is vastly more exp'd (5 str ret, all 65 '10 sts) than the '10 version and JC Michael Bowie (PS#21JC) may bump a ret str out of the lineup, it will be tough to improve much upon LY's fine stats.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '09 the Cowboys had to replace 2 DL (comb 14 sts) so they had their most exp'd unit in 3 yrs. As expected, they were much stronger, yielding a school record low 96 ypg rush (3.0) with 29 sks. LY they had to replace 2 str's but used a 10 man rotation and 7 of the top 10 ret'd. As expected, the numbers dropped but were still superior to the 9 yrs prior to '09. They allowed just 134 ypg rush (3.5) with 30 sks. DE Ugo Chinasa earned 2nd Tm B12 with DC Young saying his versatility allowed them to go from a 4-3 to a 3-4 without changing personnel. This year they lose their top guy, DE Chinasa (13 st, 38 tkl, 4 sk), DT Shane Jarka (10 st, 13 tkl, 2 tfl), DT Chris Donaldson (13 st, 25 tkl, 3 sk) and DE Darius Hart (24 tkl, 1 sk). No returning player had more than 7 sts LY making them a little less exp'd although they do add PS#36JC Ryan Robinson (IFS).

LINEBACKERS - In '09 OSU had an exp'd LB corps and trimmed their ppg all'd to 21.7 (best S/'97). LY they had to replace their #1, #2 and #3 tkl'rs. They did welcome back Orie Lemon (#2 tkl'r in '08) who missed '09. Lemon led with 133 tkl (9 tfl) although OSU slipped to all'g 26.4 ppg. TY they lose 1st Tm B12 Lemon (13 st), WLB Justin Gent (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 3 tfl) and Tolu Moala (15 tkl). James Thomas (#4 tkl'r) started the first 7 at SLB but impressive true frosh Shaun Lewis (PS#14, #5 tkl'r) started the last 6 (FWAA Frosh AA). While they lose their top guy and another full time str, this unit has a little more exp overall.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - From '05-'08 OSU finished just #98, #80, #92 and #64 in my PDR. Led by star CB Perrish Cox, an inexp'd unit having to replace 3 str's surprisingly finished #8 in '09. LY they had to replace 3 str's again incl their star and I said they would definitely drop in my PDR. Despite inexp and in'j OSU still finished a solid #23. Markelle Martin and Johnny Thomas made a solid S combo and OSU added depth by playing 6 true frosh DB's. TY they lose CB Andrew McGee (12 st, #7 tkl'r, 5 int, 7 pbu) but 7 of the top 8 ret making it their most experienced unit in years.

SPECIAL TEAMS - The Cowboys finished #3, #18, #3 and #11 in ST coor Joe DeForest's first 4 yrs. They added a #19 finish

in '06 and a #14 in '08. In '09 Quinn Sharp (PS#11) avg 45.1 (36.0 net). His strong leg boomed an FBS best 35 TB's on 70 KO's. Dan Bailey hit 28-37 FG's (L51) in '08-'09 and Perrish Cox became the career KR leader. OSU finished a surprising #50 as ace PR Dez Bryant was susp'd. DeForest always develops solid RM and true frosh Justin Gilbert (4.35 spd) was the top KR (26.8) with Joseph Randle #2 (25.6) in '10. Sharp improved his average to 46.2 (#3 FBS net 41.0) and made my 1st Tm AA P because he also had an amazing 53 TB's on 98 KO's making him a true ST weapon. Bailey had a great year hitting 27-31 (L52) and was my 2nd Tm AA. Bailey made his first 182 PAT's before his first car miss vs Texas and became the first Cowboy to win the Groza Award. OSU used 10 frosh on KR coverage early (allow 41.7 after 3) but made some improvements (27.4, #119 FBS). OSU finished #1 in my ST rankings and though they lose their star Bailey, as long as DeForest is around, they will contend for top 20 honors.

COACHES - Mike Gundy was a star QB here and later was the QB coach and OC in the early '90's. He ret'd here in '01 as the asst HC and OC and took over as HC in '05. Gundy, at 38, was the youngest HC in the NCAA in '05 and LY was named B12 COY. Dana Holgorsen led OSU's #3 offense LY but departs to WV and the new OC will be Todd Monken. Monken coached WR's here from '02-'04 and was an NFL WR cch (JAX '07-'10) and WR cch/pass gm coor at LSU ('05-'06). DC Bill Young is in his 3rd stint at OSU (last here in '78). He was the DC at Miami, Fl in '08, Kansas from '02-'07 and also the DC at Ohio St, Okla and USC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In '06 and '07 they barely qualified for bowls at 6-6 but recorded B2B bowl wins for the first time S/'87 when the original "triplets" in QB Mike Gundy, RB Thurman Thomas and WR Hart Lee Dykes played together. In '08 with just 13 ret str's and despite having to face the #1, #2, #3 and #3 tms they finished 9-4 and #16, (best S/'03). In '09 they had another version of the "triplets" in QB Zac Robinson, RB Kendall Hunter (1st Tm AA) and WR Dez Bryant (1st Tm AA) and were #9 in the preseason. When they knocked off Georgia, the tm entered the Top 5 for the first time S/'85 and also made the cover of SI. In a letdown spot they were upset by Houston. Bryant was lost after 3 sts and the banged up Hunter had just 3 sts all yr. They still moved to 6-1 before losing to #3 Texas. With a Fiesta Bowl bid on the line vs rival OU the Cowboys were outgained 367-109 and finished 9-4 (NR). LY they were one of the most inexp'd tms in the country (8 ret str's), losing 24 of 57 lettermen (42%). Since I had Baylor, TT and A&M all as solid teams, I actually selected the Cowboys last in the Big 12 South. OSU was picked 5th or 6th by nearly every magazine (only Blue Ribbon had 4th) and was 5th in the B12 media poll. I started to worry about my forecast while when doing my summer radio circuit, as OSU sideline reporter Robert Allen said the off would be much better than I expected. They barely got past Troy 41-38 but opened 3-0. They trailed A&M 14-0 after 1Q but A&M QB Jerrod Johnson had 4 int's and a fumble. OSU trailed 21-7 at half and at the end was tied when Johnson turned it over (28 yd IR at OSU 32) and OSU got the winning last play FG, 38-35. OSU actually trailed Louisiana 21-17 at half but dominated the 2H in a 26 pt win. The Cowboys then dominated TT on the road for their first win in Lubbock S/'44 as OC Holgorsen ran the TT offense better than Tuberville's crew did. After a loss to Neb at home, they were without WR Blackmon at K-St but still won by 10. They dominated Baylor, Texas and Kansas. OSU rose to #10 when they hosted Okla but were outgained 588-379 and lost by 6. In the bowl they beat Ariz 36-10 (+4 TO, 370-312 yd edge for UA). TY 2 of their 3 "triplets" in Weeden and Blackmon ret (turned down NFL) but OSU loses OC Holgorsen and RB Hunter from an off avg 44.2 ppg which was their best S/'88 (48.7). OSU was also +12 in TO's, has five B12 AG's and only had 2 sts lost due to in'j last year. OSU had their first 11 win ssn in program history and their first Top 15 finish (#11 S/'88 and OSU will be ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll to start '11 in a top heavy Big 12 conference.

OSU has won 15 str home openers. OSU is 7-0 vs UL and LY led 10-0 early but trailed 21-17 at HT being outgained 254-161. In the 2H OSU scored on 7 of their 8 poss (last was a QB kneel).

In LY's Alamo Bowl OSU held UA to 10 pts (ssn best OSU/ssn worst UA). Since joining the B12 ('96) OSU is 3-1 hosting non-conf/BCS schools, only loss to #23 UCLA in '02.

OSU is 6-1 in road openers. LY OSU led 20-0 into the 2Q and scored on their 1st 10 poss never looking back. The Cowboys did win their last trip to Tulsa ('00) but are just 3-6 there since '82.

With LY's win over A&M, OSU has won a series high 3 str gms. In OSU's last trip to Kyle Field they led 29-25 early 4Q & put the gm away w/a 93/16pl TD drive that chewed up 7:41.

Kansas St: LY OSU was w/o WR Blackmon (Susp) & trailed 7-0 but scored 24 unanswered incl a 26 yd IR TD. **Texas Tech:** The Cowboys win last year was the 1st in Lubbock since '44 (1-10-2).

OSU is 6-1 vs KU S/'98. LY OSU trailed 14-10 into the 2Q but scored the gms final 38 pts holding KU to just 109 yds & 8 FD's. LTH ('07) OSU lost 43-28 vs a #5 ranked Jayhawks tm.

OSU dropped 4 str from '96-'01 but won 3 of the L/4 vs MU. Last gm ('09) was tied 17-17 until OSU went on a 54/9pl TD drive w/.02 left until HT. OSU held MU to 80 yds & 3 FD's on just 28 plays in the 2H.

LY vs the Bears, Weeden threw for a school-rec 435 yds as OSU mounted a rec 725 yds. OSU has beat BU 5 str meetings scoring no less than 34 pts & giving up no more than 28 (avg score 47-16).

OSU has beaten KSU 3 of L/4 gms & their last 3 game series win streak was from 1987-'89.

LY OSU outscored TT 21-0 w/a 215-38 yd edge after the 1Q. WR Blackmon had a career-high 207 yds (20.7).

The avg MOV the L/5 meetings has been by 28 ppg. Cowboys are 10-2 the L/12 yrs prior to Bedlam.

Gundy is now 0-10 vs OU as both a QB & HC (0-4 as OSU starting QB from 1986-'89). OSU has dropped 8 straight in series but 3 of 4 in Stillwater have been by 6 points or less.
