POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - John Parker Wilson (PS#31) st'd from '06-'08 and became UA's all-time leader. JPW threw for 2,273 (58%, 10-8) in '08. Greg McElroy (PS#27) played in 6 (8-11 for 123). In '09 McElroy was the clear-cut starter and completed 66% with a 9-1 ratio in the first 5. He struggled midyear but vs Aub led the gm winning drive (7-8-63) and was a different QB vs UF earning SEC Title gm MVP. In the bowl vs Texas he hit just 6-11-58 but became the first Tide QB to comp over 60% (2508, 61%, 17-4) since Jay Barker ('94). Big things were expected for his senior ssn and he broke Tim Tebow's SEC record being int'd only 10x (3 by Ark) in 658 career att's (1 every 65.8 - Tebow 62.2). McElroy (#7DC NYJ) set the school rec for comp% in a gm (92.3% vs GSt). He completed 70.9% throwing for 2,987 and a school record 20 td's (JPW '07, 18) with just 5 int. RFr 6'4" AJ McCarron (PS#9) is best remembered for Saban chewing him out and spanking him after an ill-advised deep pass in the 4Q vs Miss St. He QB'd a good portion of the bowl and hit 30-48-389 (3-0) on the yr. McCarron will battle Phillip Sims (rFr, PS#1, IFS LY), rFr Blake Sims (PS#40) and Phillip Ely (PS#21, IFS). TY's group is very talented, but much less experienced.

RUNNING BACKS - In '08 Glen Coffee (545, 4.2 in '07) led with 1,383 (5.9) and 215 lb true frosh Mark Ingram (PS#66) added 728 (5.1). In '09 they lost Coffee (#3DC) but added PS#2 true Fr Trent Richardson. Ingram became UA's 1st ever Heisman winner setting the school's single ssn rush record with 1,658 (6.1, 17 td) and was the #3 rec (334, 10.4). There was little dropoff when Richardson was inserted (751, 5.2). Ingram missed the first 2 of '10 (knee inj) and after rushing for 151 vs Duke and 157 vs Ark, he failed to top 100 in the L9. He finished with just 875 (5.5). Richardson became the first UA RB to reach 100 yds rec in a gm in 12Y. He benches 460 and is a powerful runner. Richardson had 144 rush vs PSU and added 119 vs Tenn (#1 rusher midssn). He missed 2.5 gms (knee) and had just 66 rush yds in the L2 and finished with 700 (6.2). RFr Eddie Lacy (PS#27) had 2 fmbls inside the 5 early then was banged up and did not have an att in 4 str gms midssn. He was the top rusher in the bowl with 86 (406, 7.2). Demetrius Goode (5'9" 205 Sr, PS#79) added 140 (4.1) and true frosh Jalston Fowler (PS#39) had 111 (7.9). TY Ingram (#1DC NO) departs early for the NFL (#4 car rush, just 304 from #1) but Dee Hart (PS#10) was IFS. Not listed below are Corey Grant (5'9" 194 rFr, PS#30), Nick Tinker (5'10" 207 So) and Ben Howell (5'9" 202 Jr). Even with the loss of Ingram, this unit is one of the nation's best.

RECEIVERS - True frosh Julio Jones (PS#1) was by far the tm's go-to threat in '08 (924, 15.9) with over 4 times the yds as the #2 WR (191). In '09 Jones was inj'd early and in the first 7 had just 13 rec but over the L5 (reg ssn) had 27 to lead again (596, 13.9). Marquis Maze (PS#40) was #2 with 523 (16.9). LY those 2 ret'd but they did have to replace their TE (313, 12.0). Jones had a school record 221 vs Tenn (David Palmer 217 in '93) just 2 wks after breaking his hand. Jones set UA single season records for rec and rec yds with 78 and 1,133 (14.5) topping DJ Hall ('06-'07). Maze was #2 with 557 (14.7) and Darius Hanks (272, 16.0 '09) had 456 (14.2). TY Jones left early for the NFL (#1DC ATL) and also gone is TE/HB Preston Dial (8 st, 264). This unit is weaker with the loss of their #2 career rec but does add 6'5" Ohio St transfer Duron Carter (Cris' son).

OFFENSIVE LINE - This unit was a big ? in '09 as they had to replace 3 st'rs incl a 1st Tm AA C and 1st Tm AA LT. They surprisingly improved to 215 ypg rush (5.0, 20 sk). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm AA LG (#3DC) and 1 other str. Despite being more exp'd, they dropped to 183 ypg (5.1) with 32 sks (8.8%). TY they lose 1st Tm SEC LT James Carpenter (13 st, 2Y str, #1DC SEA), David Ross (6 gm) and Brian Motley (8 gm). UA has 4 st'rs back incl 3rd Tm AA RG Barrett Jones and 2nd Tm SEC C William Vlachos. JC trans Aaron Douglas was expected to fill the LT spot but he tragically died in May. This is the most exp'd OL in 3Y and should have much improved numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - The Tide switched from a 4-3 to a 3-4 in '07 (2 st'rs ret) and improved to 124 rush ypg all'd (3.4). In '08 they had to replace a 1st Tm SEC DE but also got the large (literally) addition of PS#2JC Terrence Cody (365 lb). UA all'd just 74 ypg (2.7), their best S/'99. In '09 Cody turned down the NFL (1 st'r lost) and they all'd just 78 ypg (2.8) with 32 sks. LY they had to replace all 3 st'rs and the unit ret'd just 6 career sts (7 sk, 14 tfl). Expectations were high for DE Marcell Dareus but he was susp the first 2. UA dropped to 110 ypg rush all'd (3.3), 27 sks. TY they lose 3rd Tm AA DE Dareus (11 st, 34 tkl, 4.5 sk, #1DC BUF) and DE Luther Davis (4 st, 21 tkl, 3 tfl). They add some solid JUCOs (remember Cody?) Jesse Williams (PS#6) and Quinton Dial (PS#9), both IFS. Not listed below are Glenn Harbin (6'5" 260 Jr, PS#68) and Undra Billingsley (6'2" 288 Jr, PS#61). Despite the loss of their top guy, this is a more veteran group and should resemble the DL's from '08 and '09.

LINEBACKERS - The Tide has had inexp'd LB units the L3Y. In '09 they lost 2 of their top LB's (one over summer, one after 4 sts). They still had Rolando McClain (SEC DPOY) who won the Butkus Award. LY they had to replace McClain (#1 tkl'r, #1 DC) and their #4 and #5 tkl'rs. They did get back Dont'a Hightower who was 1st Tm FWAA Fr AA in '08 (4 st '09) but the other 5 LB's in the 2 deep combined for 58 tkl's in '09 with 3 sts. TY they lose SLB Chavis Williams (8 st, 12 tkl) and Michael DeJohn (3 tkl). Hightower was UA's #2 tkl'r and turned down the NFL. They also return their #3 tkl'r CJ Mosley and sk leader Courtney Upshaw (7 sk, 7.5 tfl). I have high expectations for Nicco Johnson (PS#5) who had 7 sts as a soph and 3 true frosh VHT's (2 IFS). This is UA's most exp'd LB corps in 4Y.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Saban's first DB unit at Bama only finished #40 in my PDR. He spends a lot of time coaching DB's and is normally harder on the secondary than any other unit. They had to replace 2 st'rs in '08 yet moved up to #17. In '09 they had to replace a #3DC but had 7 of the top 8 back and the Tide moved up to #2 (47%, 11-24) as SS Mark Barron led the SEC with 7 int's. LY they had to replace 3 st'rs (#1, #2, #7 DC's) and 5 bkps (comb 17 st, 112 tkl). They still finished #3 in my PDR (52.3%, 12-22) with FS Lester #1 in the SEC with 8 int. TY the unit returns intact with Barron turning down at shot at the NFL. This is the nation's best secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Saban's 1st yr everyone ret'd and they moved up to #17 (#34 '06) in my ST rankings. In '08 they finished #37 and in '09 #36. LY UA had to replace their career PR and KR leader Javier Arenas (15.4 PR, 29.0 KR '09) and Leigh Richardson (PS#2) avg 26.4 with 1 td. Tiffin set school records for FG's in a season (30) and car (83) and had 14 TB's on 94 KO's in '09. Replacing him was true frosh Cade Foster (7-9, L49) and soph Jeremy Shelley (12-16, L42). Foster had 10 TB's on 84 KO's. PR Julio Jones broke his hand and Marquis Maze avg a solid 12.7 on PR's with an 81 yd PR td called back vs Miss St. True frosh P Cody Mandell (PS#16) avg 39.2 (net 36.2). The Tide moved up to #26 and with all of their key players back, should have their best finish yet under Saban.

COACHES - Nick Saban took LSU to a National Title in '03 and spent 2005 and 2006 as HC of the Miami Dolphins. He guided the Tide to their 13th National Title in his 3rd year and is the highest paid college coach. In 15 years as a college HC, he's never had a losing season and has been named National COY 3 times. OC Jim McElwain (4th yr) was the NFL Raiders' QB cch in 2006 and the Fresno St OC in 2007. Kirby Smart was promoted to DC in 2008 and won the Broyles Award in 2009.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Nick Saban inherited a Tide squad that had 1 winning season the previous 4Y. In his first year they opened 6-2 but needed a bowl win over Colo to pull out a winning ssn at 7-6. In my Best/Worst Case Scenario (see PhilSteele.com) I said they could have been 13-0 as all 6 losses were by 7 or less. Heading into '08 Bama had B2B winning ssns just twice since Gene Stallings departed in '96. They had just 12 ret st'rs plus a tough schedule with road gms vs GA, Tenn, LSU, Ark and Clemson (†ATL). It looked like UA was a yr away with just 9 scholarship Sr's (tied fewest FBS). Surprisingly the Tide won the SEC West moving to #1 AP (1st time reg ssn S/'80!). Saban was named the AP COY. At 12-0 they lost to UF in the SEC Title gm and then a disappointed Bama tm was a no-show in the Sugar Bowl vs Utah. In '09 UA had to replace their starting QB and top RB. Surprisingly the off went from 356 ypg to 403 ypg (best S/'02). UA went 12-0 again and got their first EVER Heisman Trophy winner in Mark Ingram. They whipped UF 32-13 in the SEC Title game. Texas led 6-0 but then lost QB McCoy and Bama dominated UT after that in their 37-21 win capturing their first Nat'l Title S/'92. LY Bama was the consensus pick for #1 but I pointed out that UA had just 2 ret st'rs on D and a killer sked in which their final 6 SEC foes all had a bye prior. My magazine was the only 1 that did not place them in the Nat'l Title game and Tide fans let me know that during my summer radio circuit. Bama also had 7 players drafted in '10 (most S/'87). After opening up 3-0 they allowed 302 yds in the 1H and trailed Ark 17-7 but got a couple of 4Q int and a 24-20 win. In a rematch of the previous 2 SEC Title games, UA handed Urban Meyer the worst loss of his career, 31-6. Playing their 3rd straight tough game, they trailed SCar (off a bye) 21-3 late 2Q and lost 35-21. After whipping Miss and Tenn, Les Miles moved to 4-2 vs the Tide with a 24-21 upset in Death Valley (LSU 433-330 yd edge). Bama won their next 2 and Auburn had the SEC Title gm clinched and on deck. Bama looked like they would blow out the Tigers leading 24-0 and could have been up 38-0 at the half but blew a couple of opportunities and Aub came back for a 28-27 win. In the bowl, #15 Bama was favored by 8 vs #7 Mich St and showed why as they rolled to a 49-7 win (546-171 yd edge, MSU -48 rush yds was 2nd best ever by UA). TY Bama loses QB McElroy, RB Ingram and WR Jones which is similar to '09 when they had a veteran defense and inexperienced off. They do have to play UF, Penn St and Auburn on the road but the sked is much more favorable than LY. UA was +62 ypg in SEC play last year (3rd best). Led by the best D in the NCAA, I will call for the Tide to win their 2nd National Title in 3 years!

First meeting. Saban was a 1973 graduate of Kent St. Alabama is 18-2 in ssn openers w/ the 2 losses in 2000 & '01 (both vs UCLA). UA did lose their last gm vs a MAC member, 19-16 vs NIU in '03. UA is 2-3 in true non-conf AG's S'00. UA is 9-5 vs PSU and has won 4 of the L/5 meetings incl LY. The Tides last trip to State College was in 1989, a 17-16 win (blk'd an 18-yd FG w/13 left). UA is 3-0 vs NT, avg score 41-11. In '09 (L/gm) UA won 53-7 w/a 523-187 yd & 28-7 FD edge. Tide enters '11 9-0 the L3Y in non-conf HG's w/ the avg W is by 36 ppg, last loss vs SBC was ULM ('07). UA has won 19 str SEC openers. HT is 5-2. LY Bama was down 20-7 mid-3Q before 17 un-answered as the Tide D had 3 int's (1 in the EZ & 2 came in the 4Q on Ark's L/2 drives). The Crimson Tides last visit to the Swamp was in 2006 (lost 28-13). UA had a 10-0 lead early 2Q but had 5 of their next 7 poss end on a miss FG, punt from the UF35, int, int TD ret & sk/fum. Tide has simply dominated this series going 43-2 S'70 w/20 str wins by 17 ppg. In the last gm ('07) UA won 24-10 (in Nashville) w/a 371-232 yd & 22-13 FD edge (Saban's 1st yr at the helm). UA has won 7 str in this series w/4 of the 7 W's by 4 pts or less. UA is 7-2 in Oxford and LTH outgained Ole Miss by 157 yds as 12 of their 22 pts came off of 5 TO's & a blk'd punt. LTH UA had to blk 2 FG's to preserve a 12-10 win and LY only led by 3 at HT before a 2H surge. UA outgained UT 300-175 as the Vols 5 2H poss ended on a missed FG, 2 ints, punt & SOD.

Georgia Southern: First meeting. Eagles finished 10-5 LY (FCS quarterfinals) including a 13-7 loss vs Navy. GS held Navy scoreless in the 2H and allowed just 109 (2.5) rush yds. Saban went 48-16 as the LSU HC from 2000-'04. LY there were 5 lead changes as UA led 14-10 into the 4Q. Into 2011, under Saban UA is 13-3 hosting SEC opp's (Ls to UGA, LSU & Aub). UA has won 3 str over MSU incl LTH Bama outgained Miss St 444-213 in a 31-3 win. Loser in this matchup hasn't topped 17 pts the L/13 gms. Into 2011, UA is 12-4 L4Y on the SEC road.
