

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Kevin Kolb started as a true frosh and had a storied 4 yr career topping David Klingler as the school's all-time leading passer. In '07 rFr Case Keenum took over and in '08 had a streak of 13 straight 300 yd gms end in the bowl (1 shy FBS rec). He set an FBS record with 25 straight comp over a 2 game span (Tee Martin 24 at Tenn, '98). Keenum threw for 5,020 (67%, 44-11) while avg 386 ypg!! Keenum had another record setting year in '09 (#8 Heisman vote) throwing for 5,671 (70%, 44-15) but had a career high SIX int in the bowl. He came into last year 4,167 yds behind Timmy Chang (Hawaii) to become the NCAA's all-time leading passer and it looked like a foregone conclusion. Keenum was ini'd vs UTEP then OFY against UCLA with an ACL. Cotton Turner (PS#104) was the bkp but he broke his clavicle also vs UCLA and true frosh Terrance Broadway (PS#31) led them to 10 of their 13 pts. Broadway started vs Tulane but passed for just 174 with 3 TO's and 5 sks. David Piland (PS#152) started the rest of the year. He threw for 2,641 (58.3%, 24-14) while Keenum threw for 636 (65.6%, 5-5) in just over 2 gms. One year after seeing both their passing ypg (434 to 327) and comp % (70.3 to 61.6%) drop, they should return to '09's numbers. Keenum was granted a 6th year and will become the NCAA's all-time passer if he stays healthy.

Not listed below are Drew Hollingshead (6'3" 210 So, PS#73) and Crawford Jones (6'1" 193 Jr, PS#325). **RUNNING BACKS** - The Cougars have had some topnotch RB's in recent years including Joffrey Reynolds who set a CUSA single season rush record (1,545 in '02). They also produced 1,000+ yd rushers in '03 and '05. In '06 Anthony 'Quick Six" Alridge rushed for 959 with an amazing 10.1 ypc! In '07 Alridge had 1,597 (6.2) while adding 42 rec (10.2). In '08 true frosh Bryce Beall, who is physical, strong and fast, took over. He had his first 100 yd game in Wk 5 and finished with 1,247 (6.3) along with 496 rec yds (14.6). In '09 Beall split carries with true frosh Charles Sims (PS#124). Sims finished with 698 (5.3) and 759 rec vds (10.8) while Beall had 670 (4.8) and 311 rec yds (9.7). I projected Sims as the starter LY but he was acad ineligible. Beall led with 870 (5.3) and Michael Hayes (PS#90JC late signee) started 3 (629, 4.2). Soph Chris Wilson (5'11" 210 Jr, PS#180) added 122 (5.1). Not in the PSL are Xavier Brown (6'0" 197 rFr, PS#144), Kurtis Shaw (5'8" 193 Jr), Terrell Douglas (5'11" 207 Jr), Randall Hollimon (6'1" 200 rFr), Braxton Welford (6'0" 200 Jr) and Wilson. Everyone is back including Sims making this a very deep and improved RB corps.

RECEIVERS - In '08 Patrick Edwards had 634 (13.8) before a gruesome broken leg vs Marshall. He was the #2 réturnee in '09 (lost top rec) and lowa transfer James Cleveland (464, 12.9 in '07) led with 1,214 (11.7) despite missing 2 (inj). Tyron Carrier (1026, 12.8 '08) was #2 in '09 with 1,029 (11.3) and Edwards, back from injury, had 1,021 (12.0). RB Sims was #4. LY everyone ret'd but with QB Keenum getting inj, they did not match 09's numbers. Edwards led with 1,100 (15.5), Cleveland was #2 with 800 (14.0) and Carrier had 480 (9.1) Kierrie Johnson was #3 with 572 (15.5). This year they lose Johnson (11 st) and Cleveland (9 st). Adding depth are Demetrius Woods (6'0" 195 Jr, PS#101), Gino Collins (5'11" 185 Jr), Marcus Williams (5'10" 175 Jr), Langston Williams (5'9" 160 rFr) and Desmond Bonds (6'0" 160 Fr). While this unit is less exp'd, they could put up better numbers.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '07's magazine I called this unit UH's most talented O-line in years and they opened holes for 224 ypg rush (4.9), their best since joining CUSA (34 sks, 7.8%). In '07 Briles' offense ran the ball 58% of the time vs 40% under HC Sumlin. In '08 despite having 8 of the top 10 back, UH saw their rush drop to 161 ypg but their ypc rose to 5.2 and the sks allowed dropped to 4.4% (27). In '09 they had to replace 2 multi-year st'rs (#2 DC) then lost starting LT Jacolby Ashworth after 4 sts. The numbers dropped to 130 ypg (4.5) but just 18 sks (2.4%). LY UH had to replace 2 st'rs but did move in Isaiah Thompson (24 st DL). The numbers improved to 153 ypg (4.5) with 12 sks. This year they lose C Jordan Shoemaker (12 st, 2.5Y str), RT Roy Watts (12 st, 2Y st'r), 2nd Tm CUSA LG Thompson (10 st, 3Y st'r) and Jaryd Anderson (3 st). Houston has just 2 ret st'rs but one is 1st Tm CUSA Chris Thompson. LY UH used the same starting lineup in 10 gms (good health) and with this year's group being less exp'd, I'll call it down a few notches.

DEFENSIVE LINE - The Cougars' rush D improved in each of Briles' 5 yrs from allowing 209 ypg (5.1) in '03 to 140 (3.8) in '07 (see right). In '08 the unit ret'd 2 veteran senior st'rs and Sumlin switched them to a 4-3. DE Phillip Hunt became the CUSA DPOY (14 sks). Surprisingly UH allowed 175 ypg rush (4.2). They had to replace 3 st'rs incl Hunt in '09 and I wrote that the DL was the biggest concern on the '09 squad. They were undersized and inexp'd. Not unexpectedly, the Cougars allowed 227 ypg rush (highest S/'94) and 5.1 ypc. LY they added BYU transfer Matangi Tonga (PS#44) and strength coach Larry Jackson called DE David Hunter "freakishly strong" (450+ bench). UH shifted back to a 3-4 and lost DT Zeke Riser (14 st 09) to an ACL in the spring so they had just 1 st'r back. Soph Kelvin King took DE Tyrone Campbell's (moved to NG) starting spot (last 7). This year they lose NT Tonga (9 st, 26 tkl, 5.5 tfl). Not in the PSL are Jeremiah Farley (6'1" 264 So, PS#294), Nathan Ramirez (6'1" 245 Jr) and Alex Ogbongbemiga (6'0" 250 Fr). While I list 2 st'rs they basically have 3 back with the return of Riser. Houston adds another JC and should improve upon the poor 209 ypg (4.8) of '10.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 UH had to replace their #3 tkl'r then

lost 2 LB's to injury. True frosh Phillip Steward started 9 (#4 tkl'r). LY they had to replace their #2 tkl'r. Marcus McGraw (#1 tkl'r in '08) was #3 in the FBS with 156 tkl's in '09 and finished #1 on the squad again (110). Matt Nicholson (#7 '08, miss '09) ret'd LY to start 9 until an injury (#7 tkl"). Steward finished #2 in tkls. This year the only loss is Nicholson. Not listed below are Adrian Harris (6'0" 200 Jr) and David Mason (6'3" 217 Jr). With the return of their #1, #2, #3 & #5 tkl'rs, this is the best Cougar LB corps in

quite some time and they add in PS#33JC Lloyd Allen. **DEFENSIVE BACKS** - They only had to replace 2 st'rs in '08 and UH surprisingly slipped from #55 in my PDR to #94. In '09 they only had 1 st'r back then lost 2 projected S's over the summer. UH actually improved a little to #84. LY they had one of my Surprise Teams (pg 20).

to replace 2 st'rs. SS Roisean Haynes started the first 6 but was inj'd and lost his spot to Jacky Candy. UH improved to #75. This year they lose CB Jamal Robinson (11 st, 47 tkl, 1 int, 7 pbu, 4th Tm CUSA), CB Devin Mays (11 st, 27 tkl, 3 pbu), S Candy (6 st, 60 tkl, 1 int), Haynes (6 st, 45 tkl) and CB Loyce Means (2 st, 38 tkl, 3 int, 6 pbu). Not in the PSL are Rodney Hopkins (5'8" 187 rFr) and Michael Owens (5'9" 172 Fr). I project two JC's as starting CB's and an A&M transfer at SS so they

could be close to '10 despite having 1 st'r back.

SPECIAL TEAMS - UH's best finish in my ST rankings under Briles was his first season at #50. In his final 4 yrs they were #115, #106, #92 and #90. In Sumlin's first year they had to replace their top KR (28.3) and PR but still moved up to #59. In '09 I said they should be one of the top ST units in the CUSA. The ST units were a major part of the team's success as they blk'd 6 kicks, had 5 KR td's and finished #29. They used 3 diff K's but rFr Matt Hogan hit 12-12 FG's (51 yd gm winner vs Tulsa), although he missed 2 xp's and a 3rd was blk'd vs EC. Tyron Carrier avg 29.0 on KR's with 4 td's and was also the top PR (10.4). LY they had to replace their P (34.4 tm net). Hogan hit 14-17 FG (L49) and true frosh P Richie Leone avg 41.4 (35.5 tm net). Leone had 7 TB on 59 KO and the return game was solid. UH dropped to #60 but with all of the key players back they are one of the upper tier units in the country (pg 15).

COACHES - Art Briles did a great job heré in his 5 years guiding the team to 4 bowls but left for Baylor after '07. Kevin Sumlin picked up right where Briles left off with bowls his first 2 seasons. Sumlin was Okla's ST's coach from '03-'05 before being elevated to co-OC ('06-'07). Jason Phillips is in his ninth season here and 4th as co-OC. Former TTech QB Kliff Kingsbury is in his 4th season here and 2nd as co-OC/ QB cch. DC Brian Stewart begins his 2nd year here after a 9 yr NFL coaching career with stints at HOÚ (DB '02-03), SD (DB '04-'06), DAL (DC '07-'08) and PHI (D spec asst '09).

PHIL'S FORECAS

Art Briles took a team that had won just 3, 0 and 5 the previous 3 seasons to one that had just 1 losing record in his 5 yrs with the high water mark being '06. They were my pick to win the CUSA West in '06 (media picked them #3) and they delivered, winning the CUSA Title going 10-4 with one of their losses coming on a last play Hail Mary. In Briles' last season, even after losing QB Kevin Kolb, UH still avg 34.5 ppg and finished 8-5. In Kevin Sumlin's first year the Cougars finished 8-5 again improving to 40.6 ppg. All they had to do was beat Rice in the "Bayou Bucket" game and they would have won the CUSA West but they lost by 14. They did win their first bowl game since 1980 when they knocked off AF 34-28. In '09 Case Keenum was in his 3rd year as a starter and piloted the team to 42.2 ppg including upsets of #5 Okla St, TTech and Miss St with 2 of those coming on the road. They won the CUSA West Title going 10-2 but in the CUSA Title game and the bowl (rematch vs AF), were -8 in turnovers and dropped both. After reaching #13 in Wk10 they finished unranked. LY UH was the preseason favorite to win CUSA led by Keenum. UH put up 122 pts in the first 2 but then Keenum was inj'd and OFY in their loss to UCLA. The Cougars dropped 2 of the next 3 including a tough loss to Rice where they had a 436-344 yd edge but lost by 3. After beating SMU and Memphis, Houston was 5-3 and in the CUSA chase but suffered a tough loss at home to UCF and QB Piland had 5 int's vs Tulsa in the 3 pt loss. They lost to SM by 18 and TT by 15 to finish 5-7 for their first losing season since '04. Keenum was granted a 6th year and college football will benefit from that. UH also had 3 net close losses but does have just 12 ret st'rs. Keenum's return has me very excited for this year's squad and 8 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for a double digit win season which will at least double LY's 5 win total! Three of the 9 call for them to be 11-0 when they travel to Tulsa! UH is also
