## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '08 Dustin Sherer started the last 7 and threw for 1,389 (55%, 6-5) and was #1 out of spring '09. Athletic VHT rFr Curt Phillips (PS#18) moved in front in Aug and #3 Scott Tolzien (107 yds '08) moved to the bkp spot. Sherer dropped to #3 (only 1 gm). Phillips had 8 int's the first wk of Aug practice so Tolzien took over the top spot. Phillips became the first UW frosh QB to play in an opener since Brooks Bollinger in '99. He appeared in just 3 more however as Tolzien was named B10 POW vs Mich St (4 td). Tolzien had an 0-5 ratio vs Iowa and Ohio St (2 IR td's) but still led the league in pass eff with a strong finish (2,705, 64.3%, 16-11) posting a schl rec 211 comp. LY they added rFr Jon Budmayr (PS#39). Tolzien led the FBS in comp % during the reg ssn while setting a school record hitting 72.9% (Darrell Bevell 67.8% in '93) and also won the Johnny Unitas Award for best Sr QB. He threw for 2,459 (16-6). Phillips was inj'd and Budmayr played in 3 (8-10-134). Battling Budmayr are rFr Joe Brennan (PS#47), true frosh preferred walk-on Joel Stave (PS#122) who was IFS and Nate Tice (PS#145, Mike's son). Not in the PSL are Drew McAdams (6'0" 190 rFr) and frosh Lance Baretz (PS#178). Phillips is OFY after the 3rd ACL tear in his right knee. This unit goes from an exp'd veteran who led the Big Ten in pass eff to a unit which contains 2 scholarship QB's who have combined to throw 10 career passes.

**RUNNING BACKS** - UW had a streak of 10 straight yrs with a 1,000 yard rusher until inj's slowed the top back in '03 and '04. UW started a new streak in '05 (6 str). RFr John Clay (PS#3) was #2 in '08 with 884 (5.7). Clay rushed for 1,517 (5.3) in '09 with 18 td's. True frosh Montee Ball (PS#64) took off his RS in Wk 5 and rushed for 391 (4.0). Zach Brown (PS#151) added 279 (4.2). LY this unit nearly set an NCAA record, coming up just 4 yds short of having THREE 1,000 yd rushers. Despite being banged up and missing nearly 3 gms Clay earned 3rd Tm AA AP. The top 3 all had 14+ td's (Big Ten rec). Clay rushed for 1,012 but his 5.4 ypc was the lowest of the 3. Bielema said the diff between the RB's was that Clay is 1st gear, Ball is 2nd gear and White 3rd. True frosh James White (PS#59) led with 1,052 and he teamed with Ball to become the 2nd duo in schl hist to top 150 in the same game (Mich). Ball had 132 in the bowl (996, 6.1, 18 td). Ryan Groy (PS#53OL, 315 lb) took snaps at FB. TY Clay left early for the NFL draft but White and Ball return as does Brown. Not listed below are Jeffrey Lewis (6'2" 210 rFr, PS#83), Kyle Zuleger (5'11" 183 So, 17 yd) and FB Jason Hengel (6'2" 234 rFr). It will be tough to top 2010's production but this unit looks just as strong.

**RECEIVERS** - The TE is a big part of the Badger offense and Garrett Graham led with 540 (13.5) in 2008. In 2009 Graham was #2 with 624 (12.2) and 6'3" WR Nick Toon (Al's son, PS#14) led with 805 (14.9). Isaac Anderson was #3 with 480 (16.0) and TE Lance Kendricks (9 st) had 356 (12.3). Kendricks, who is also an outstanding blocker, led UW with 663 (15.4) last year becoming the 5th UW TE to be drafted (#2DC STL) since 2006. Injury-riddled Toon was #2 with 459 (12.8) missing 4 and David Gilreath was #3 (370, 16.1). Walk-on former-QB Jared Abbrederis (6'2" 180 So) had 289 (14.4). This year they lose Kendricks (11 st), Anderson (6 st), Kyle Jefferson (4 rec) and Gilreath (7 st). Promising WR Marquis Mason (6'4" 231 rFr, PS#81) will miss '11 (ACL). It will be interesting to see who steps in at TE, but with 3 of the top 5 gone and Toon missed spring, this unit looks to be down a few notches.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - When I think of Wisconsin, I think of big O-lines and power rush attacks so it was surprising to me in '08 (4 starters back) that they had their best rushing production of the decade at just 211 ypg (4.8). In '09 they had to replace a #3DC and 2 other 3 yr str's (121 car st lost) but nearly matched those numbers with 204 ypg rush (4.6, 23 sk). LY the unit had 9 of their top 10 back (107 career starts) and avg 320 lbs. I called them the Big Ten's best OL and my #2 OL in the country. As you would expect, the Badgers' huge O-line opened holes for 246 ypg rush (5.5) with just 14 sacks (5.1%), their lowest total in recent history. This year they lose 1st Tm AA LT Gabe Carimi (13 st, 4Y str, B10 OLPOY, #1DC CHI), 1st Tm AA LG John Moffitt (13 st, 4Y str, #3DC SEA) and Bill Nagy (8 st, #7DC DAL). LY's unit did lose RT Josh Oglesby (10 st '09) after 2 sts so they basically have 4 full-time starters back. With the loss of a couple of 1st Tm AA's and last year's rushing production their best since 1999, I'll call them down a notch or two but still among the Big Ten's best.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - UW had to replace 3 str's (120 car st) incl a #3DC in '09. The less exp'd group surprisingly improved allowing a Big Ten best 88 ypg (2.9) and did not allow 100 yds rushing in any conf game. LY they lost 1st Tm B10 DE O'Brien Schofield (12 sk, 12.5, #4DC) and 2 other str's. They were equal to '09 in terms of exp and JJ Watt had a great year but the numbers slipped a little to 128 ypg rush allowed (3.9, 23 sk). This year they lose 1st Tm B10 DE Watt (13 st, #2 tk/r, 7 sk, 14 tfl, #1DC HOU). Even with the loss of their top guy, they have 7 of the top 8 back making it their most exp'd unit in 3 yrs.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '09 rFr Mike Taylor (PS#66) was the #1 tk/r before he was OFY vs Iowa. True frosh Chris Borland took his place and was the Big Ten's FPOY (#5 tk/r). The Badgers allowed an impressive 306 ypg (#17 FBS). LY the Badgers had 2 ret str's at LB for the 3rd straight year. Five of the top 6 were back but Borland was OFY after 2 sts. Taylor missed most of Aug and was slowed by a knee brace most of the season. They had their top 4 LB's for just 6 plays vs Ariz St when Borland got inj'd in the 1Q but still all'd just 322 ypg (#20 FBS). This year they lose OL Blake Sorensen (11 st, #1 tk/r), MLB Culmer St Jean (12 st, #2 tk/r, 3 tfl) and Kevin Rouse (15 tkl, 2 sk). Not in the PSL are Josh Harrison (6'0" 221 rFr, PS#216), Greg Russo (6'3" 246 Sr) and Coddie Ring-Noonan (5'10" 220 Jr, 3 tkl). The Taylor/Borland combo return making them close to last year in terms of experience and they should remain healthier.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - UW usually fields a strong secondary. They finished #7 in my PDR in '04, #19 in '05 and #2 in '06. UW slipped to #57 in '07 but with 3 starters back, were #35 in '08. With 2 starters back they were #45 in '09. Last year the unit returned intact (Smith lost job to Brinkley) so it surprised me that they only finished #43. Adding depth are Jerry Ponio (6'1" 200 So) and Frank Tamakloe (6'3" 182 rFr, PS#112). This year

they lose CB Niles Brinkley (13 st, #7 tk/r, 9 pbu) and SS Jay Valai (12 st, #9 tk/r, 1 int, 3 pbu). This unit is less experienced but could actually move up in the PDR.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - In Bielema's first year UW finished #44 in my ST rankings and moved up to #13 in '07. In '08 Philip Welch hit 20-24 FG's (long 52) while Brad Nortman had a net of 35.3. Poor coverage units had them slip back to #93. In '09 Welch hit just 17-24 FG's (2 miss 50+) although he did nail a 57 yarder (2nd longest school hist. John Hall, 60 in '95, Metro-dome). Nortman avg 42.0 (35.7 net). LY Nortman improved to 42.7 (37.6 net) and Welch had 10 TB's on 92 KO's while hitting 17-22 FG (L49) with 1 miss from 67! Coverage units again were a problem and they only moved up to #84. This year they lose solid RM David Gilreath (24.4 KR including 97 yd td vs OSU) but with Welch and Nortman back, should improve.

**COACHES** - After 17 years Barry Alvarez stepped aside in '06 as UW's all-time leader in wins (118), although he remains the AD. He handpicked his successor, Bret Bielema, who was brought in from K-St as the DC in '04. When he first took over, Bielema was the NCAA's 2nd youngest HC. After a 12-1 debut in '06, Bielema was named the Big Ten COY and has had his contract extended through 2015. LY he led UW to a share of the Big Ten Title (1st S/'99). Paul Chryst, who was the OC at Oregon St in '03-'04, came in as the "co-OC" in '05 and took over as the primary OC in '06. Although Chryst has received overtures from the NFL and colleges for HC jobs he has stayed and also had his contract extended through 2015. Dave Doeren was a DC here for 5 yrs but departs for NIU. The new co-DC's are Chris Ash who spent 8 of the L10Y as the Iowa St DB cch (SDST DB cch '07-'08) prior to arriving in Madison LY and Charlie Partridge who has been the DL cch here since 2008 after spending 5 seasons as a Pitt asst (DL 4 years).

## PHIL'S FORECAST

The Badgers' 2005 offense set a school record with 34.3 ppg and in Barry Alvarez's last year they went 10-3 to finish #15. Bret Bielema has done a fine job taking over for the legend and is now 49-16 finishing #7, #24, NR, #16 and #7. Ironically, his weakest season came in '08 when they had 16 ret str's and entered the season #13 (finished 7-6). That put them well under the radar in '09 and they were not ranked after 5 wks despite opening 5-0. UW's '08 squad was -8 in TO's and had 48 sts lost to injury with a def ypg of 12.4, all signs which pointed towards '09 success. The Badgers went 10-3 including a win over Miami, FL in the chilly Champs Sports Bowl. That '09 squad had just 10 ret str's and LY they had 16 str's back from a team that was +81.3 ypg in Big Ten play. They opened 4-0 but then on the road at Mich St, lost 34-24 being outgained 444-292. After a win over Minny, ESPN Gameday was on hand for a night game in Madison and they upset the #1 ranked Buckeyes. In a letdown spot the next week, they used a fake punt in the 4Q from deep in their own territory to set up a td and Iowa mismanaged the clock and UW escaped with a 1 pt win. The Badgers then dominated their final 4 defenseless foes with 83 vs Ind and 70 vs NW (both tms used bkp QB's the majority of the game), rising to #4 in the AP Poll. The Badgers won a share of the Big Ten Title for the first time since 1999. Even with their big blowout wins, UW was +80.5 ypg in Big Ten play (83.6 weaker than #1 Ohio St). In the Rose Bowl they lost to #3 TCU 21-19 getting stopped on a 2 pt conversion with 2:00 left. UW did have 5 players earn AP AA honors, their most ever. This year UW has just 12 ret str's losing the B10's pass eff leader, #5 rusher and DE Watt who was #2 in tfl. The Badgers benefitted from +14 in TO's and an offensive ypg of 10.7 which was actually the best mark in the FBS (pg 299). All of those signs point to UW not matching LY's 11 win total even though they are likely to be favored in 10 of their 12 games this year. How they fare in B2B road games vs Mich St and Ohio St will be the key to their season.
