POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - In just 2 yrs as a starter, Darryl Clark finished with 6 PSU records including passing yds (3,003) and td's (24). Kevin Newsome (PS#10) played in 10 (8-11-66) and had 95 rush (4.8) as a true as Clark's backup in '09. LY Newsome battled true frosh Paul Jones (PS#7, IFS), Rob Bolden (PS#5) and former walk-on Matt McGloin (PS#171). Bolden won the job and became the first true frosh QB to start here since '92 (Wally Richardson) and the first ever to start the opener. He was inconsistent at times but keep in mind he made his first 2 road starts at Alabama and Iowa, 2 tough venues vs top 25 D's. Bolden hit 11-13 vs Minn before being inj'd in the 2Q. Newsome had hit 6-13-78 (66 rush, best athlete of QB's) but they surprisingly went to McGloin who JoePa said "is a little bit more stable." McGloin's first pass was a 42 yd td vs Minn and he guided the road win. McGloin got his first start vs Mich engineering the home upset and becoming the first walk-on to start at QB in the Paterno era. Bolden ret'd from inj and st'd vs NW but was pulled after a fumble on the 2nd series. McGloin led 5 straight td drives matching the biggest comeback (trailing 21-0) in the Paterno era. The brash McGloin predicted a big game traveling into Ohio St. A PSU QB had not thrown a td pass in Columbus in the Big Ten era (8 gms S'93) but he had 2 in the 1H (but 4-17-43 2 IR td's 2H). He became the first PSU QB to have B2B 300 yd gms (Indy, Mich St). In the bowl McGloin hit 17-41 with 5 int's (13-4 ratio prior) but was not pulled. Bolden and Newsome considered transfers but both ret'd (either could still leave). McGloin and Bolden split the #1 snaps in the spring. PSU QB's combined for 55% with a 19-16 ratio LY. I look for much improved numbers no matter who wins the job as the group is vastly more experienced.

RUNNING BACKS - In '07 Rodney Kinlaw became the 11th Lion to top 1,000 yds rushing with 1,329 (5.5). RfR Evan Royster (PS#18) was the power back (513, 6.3). In '08 they had to replace Kinlaw and Royster improved his speed. RfR Stephon Green (4.29 spd) rushed for 578 (5.5) while Royster rushed for 1,236 (6.5). In '09 Royster struggled with the flu early but got back into form (1169, 5.7). Green was inj'd early and #2 RB Brandon Beachum (PS#14) had just 113 (4.7) before an ACL inj. Green finished #2 with 319 (4.5). Last year Royster had his ypc drop to 4.9 but was #1 again with 1,014. Green rushed for 188 (3.9) and they added in true frosh Silas Redd (PS#10) who was #2 (437, 5.7). Royster (#6DC WAS) was not the fastest, the

most powerful nor the most elusive RB to play for PSU but left as the school's career leading rusher (Royster says Redd will break his record). Even with the loss of their 3 time 1,000 yard rusher, this unit could be more productive.

RECEIVERS - In '05 Paterno brought in an excellent class of true frosh as those 3 WR's were the top 3 rec's in all 4 of their seasons. In '09 the unit was a major ? as they had to replace their #2 and #3 career rec's and the team's MVP in '08 (2 #3DC's). While the 3 that departed combined for 1,932 (14.6) in 2008, 2009's top 3 incl TE Andrew Quarless combined for 1,921 (14.2). Derek Moye is 6'5" (4.38 spd) and led with 785 (16.4) while Graham Zug had 600 (13.0). LY PSU was hit hard at TE as they had to replace #5 and #7DC's. Andrew Szczerba (PS#26), the only exp'd TE (2 rec), was lost in August and RfR Gary Gilliam (6'6" 275 So, PS#145) started 3 of the first 4 (1 rec) before an ACL. True frosh Kevin Haplea (PS#11) led the TE's with 3 rec's. WR Moye led with 885 (16.7) while HB/WR Brett Brackett (PS#37) had 525 (13.5). The 6'3" soph Justin Brown (PS#20) was #3 (452, 13.7) and diminutive 5'7" Devon Smith (4.19 spd) added 363 (13.4). Surprisingly, Zug had just 194 (11.4). This year they lose Zug (2 st) and Brackett (11 st) while Gilliam (knee) and versatile WR/Wildcat QB Curtis Drake (5'11" 173 Jr) may also miss the season. They have 3 of the top 4 WR's back, to form what should be an improved group.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '08 the Lions OL had 93.8% sts ret and they opened holes for 206 ypg rush (5.2) while allowing just 13 sks (3.4%). In '09 they had to replace 3 st's including the Rimington Award winner, a 3rd Tm AA OG and a 1st Tm B10 LT. They did shuffle the OL at times but the numbers only dropped to 170 ypg (4.7) with 17 sks (4.3%). LY they had to replace a 3rd Tm AA LT but had 3 st's back including Stefan Wisniewski who moved from C to RG. Surprisingly, the more veteran unit only opened holes for 143 ypg (4.1) but did allow a paltry 12 sks (2.8%). RT Lou Eliades (13 st '09) was lost after 4 sts (ACL) and DeOnTae Pannell (7 st '09) only started 2 so they essentially had three 1st time st's for 4 playing different positions than what they played the year before. This year they lose 1st Tm B10 RG Wisniewski (13 st, 3Y st'r, #2DC OAK), C Doug Klopacz (13 st) and RT Eliades but with 3 starters back, should have improved production.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Penn St had not allowed over 94 ypg rush in the 5 yrs prior to '10 thanks in part to this unit. LY they had to replace Jared Odrick (#1DC) who became PSU's 4th Big Ten DPOY and the league's first interior DL to win the award S'93 (Dan Wilkinson, Ohio St). They had 31 sts and 18.5 sks back, and it surprised me that they "only" had 5 VHT's in the entire group. The unit was hit hard by inj's as through the first 6 the DL had just 5 sks. DE Jack Crawford (13 st '09) only st'd 7 (foot inj). Projected st'r DE Eric Latimore (5 st '09) only st'd 3 (6 tkl). PSU shockingly all'd 166 ypg (4.5, 17 sk), their worst numbers S'03. This year they lose DT Ollie Ogbu (12 st, #8 tkl'r, 8.5 tfl) and DE Pete Massaro (11 st, #11 tkl'r, ACL in spg) and after being unusually weak up front LY, should return to their previous standards.

LINEBACKERS - "Linebacker U" had a surprising streak of 6 straight yrs without a LB drafted ('01-'06). They now have had 6 in the last 4 years including 3 in 2010 (#2, #3, #7 DC's). LY the LB unit's inexperienced (7 st, 68 tkl ret) and inj's likely had something to do with the Lions' uncharacteristically porous rush D. True frosh Khairi Fortt (PS#5) was impressive despite stingers. The top 2, Mauti (ankle/shoulder) and Hodges (leg), battled injuries. Against Illinois, the unit was very banged up missing 2 starters and a couple of bkps. This year the Lions lose ILB Chris Colasanti (11 st, #1 tkl'r) and OLB Bani Gbadyu (10 st, #7 tkl'r). While 2 st's depart, they return their #3 and #5 tkl's. This unit is more experienced and has 8 VHT's in the 3 deep.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - PSU has had five Top 10 finishes in my PDR in the last 14 yrs. In '06 they had to replace all 4 st's

and still finished #16. In '09 they again had to replace 4 st's and were #23. LY they only had to replace 2 (comb 12 st, 57 tkl). I was stunned to see that Penn St finished #69 (61%, 19-10). This year the only loss is Andrew Dailey (2 st, 16 tkl). WR Chaz Powell moved to CB and st'd the last 6 so they have 6 back who st'd 6+. One of the reasons for LY's drop was that the D went from 37 sacks to 17. With a stronger front 7, I expect PSU to have one of the most improved PDR's in the country.

SPECIAL TEAMS - PSU finished #17 in my ST rankings in '06, #36 in '07 and #4 in '08. In '09 I was shocked as it was probably Paterno's worst ST unit ever (#115) with major gaffes in their losses to Iowa and OSU. LY improvement had to be expected and the Lions rose to #34. In '09 Collin Wagner hit 15-22 FG's (L47) but was 1-5 from 40+. He improved greatly in '10 to 20-25 (L49) and 8-11 from 40+. VHT RfR P Anthony Fera (PS#3) avg 41.4 (tm net 36.8) and had 19 TB's on 49 KO's. Fera missed the L2 reg sn gms after an appendectomy and true frosh Alex Butterworth (PS#27) avg 38.1 on 12 punts. KR Chaz Powell avg 23.2 in '09 and LY including a 100 yd'r vs YSU (Lions 1st S'75), he avg 24.0. Despite the loss of a quality K, this unit could improve once again.

COACHES - Joe Paterno is the NCAA's IA all-time career win leader and has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. Paterno has won 2 National Titles ('82 & '86) and four other times has finished undefeated. He has won more bowls than any other coach (24) and has moved past Amos Alonzo Stagg for the longest HC tenure at one school. To put Paterno's legendary numbers in perspective his 401 wins are 161 more than the #2 active coach (Beamer, VT). The OC since '04 is Galen Hall, who was the HC at Florida (1984-'89). The DC is Tom Bradley who is in his 33rd year at Penn St and 12th as DC. Since 1966 when Paterno took over, there have been 883 FBS coaching changes.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Joe Paterno has done remarkable things but PSU actually had 4 losing seasons out of 5 from 2000-'04. Paterno's squad rebounded with a vengeance in '05 going 11-1 and finishing #3. The next 2 yrs they finished #24 (9-4 '06) and unranked (9-4 '07). In '08, out of the 14 sources documented by stassen.com, five did not even have the Lions RANKED (#22 AP) and I had the only publication to put them in the Top 10. PSU rose as high as #3 at 9-0 when they suffered a tough loss at Iowa (led 23-14 4Q). After a rare bowl loss for Paterno (to USC) they finished #8 but were by far #1 in the Big Ten in ypg (+124.2) and had 38 sts lost due to injury. In '09 they were #5 when they lost to unranked Iowa at home, 21-10. Later they lost to #15 Ohio St at home 24-7 but after beating LSU in the Capital One Bowl, finished #9 in the AP Poll. LY it looked like a rebuilding year and they were the first team in NCAA history to face 3 teams that won BCS bowl gms the previous year. They had to face all 3 (Ala, Iowa, Ohio St) on the road with just 12 ret st's, 21 lett lost including 20 pts lost in the NFL draft (pg 308). The Lions lost 4 gms by 20+ pts for the first time since 1897. Penn St had 3 drives inside #1 Ala's 26 result in zero pts. After the expected loss to Iowa they were 3-2 and had a banged up defense and were dominated at home by Illinois. They beat Minn and then as a home dog, with QB McGloin getting his first start, they beat Mich (led 28-10). They trailed NW 21-0 but tied the largest home comeback in the Paterno era. The Lions actually led Ohio St 14-3 at half but lost with a pair of IR td's in the 2H. After whipping Indiana, they lost to Mich St at home (MSU's first win in Happy Valley S'65). In Urban Meyer's final game, Penn St was down 30-24 but driving for the winning score before giving up an 80 yd IR td. PSU was just 4-4 in the Big Ten (-14.1 ypg) but are a much more veteran unit (14 ret sts). This year they have a rematch with Ala and travel in their final 2 to Columbus (2nd st yr) and Madison. If they get their QB situation figured out and win one of those 2 tough conf road games, they could find themselves in the Big Ten Title game.

First meeting. The Sycamores finished 6-5 LY incl a 40-7 loss vs Cincinnati. ISU had gone just 2-54 from '05-'09. Penn St has won 9 straight home openers by an avg 28 ppg.

PSU is 2-2 vs the SEC the L5Y. QB Bolden made his 1st road start LY in Tuscaloosa going 13-29-141-0-2. PSU trailed 24-0 LY early 4Q as 30% of their tll yds came after.

PSU last lost to TU in 1941 & have won 28 str. LY's gm was the closest S'85 as PSU trailed 13-6 after 1Q & 13-9 at HT. Nittany Lions allowed just 71 yds & no drive over 5 plays in the 2H.

Just one prior meeting between these schools in '92, Penn St walloped EMU 52-7. Into 2011, the Nittany Lions have won 22 str vs non-BCS tms with the avg score 41-9.

PSU is 14-0 vs IU with the avg MOV by 17 ppg. In the last visit to Bloomington ('07) the yds & FD's were even but 4 IU TO's helped PSU including a FR on the 129 w/40 left.

PSU dropped 3 str and 8 of 9 IU & LY trailed 17-0 & was outgained 148-1 in the 1Q. The 21 pt loss was the worst ever in the series (23 gms). PSU is 18-6 hosting B10 opp's the L5Y.

PSU is 10-3-1 vs PU incl 4 str wins by 13 ppg. Last time here ('07) the Nittany Lions won 26-19 but trailed 16-13 into the 4Q. PSU has not allowed an offensive TD in the L11 Q's to Purdue.

LY marked career win 400 for Paterno and the 21 pt come-from-behind victory matched the largest under Joe Pa ('94 beat Illinois down 21). PSU is 11-3 vs NU with the 1st meeting in 1993.

PSU is 14-4 vs UI and has never dropped B2B gms in the series, in fact they have won each by DD's after a defeat. Both starting QB's where Fr LY and figure to square off the next 3 sns.

The HT is 9-3 in this series (1 neutral gm). PSU is 10-1 L11Y in home finales (lost LY). Last time hosting the Huskers ('02) the Nittany Lions dominated #8 NU 40-7 (worst NU loss in 12 yrs).

PSU is just 2-7 S'02 vs OSU and hasn't scored more than 20 pts in any gm (avg 12 ppg). PSU is 1-8 in B10 gms in Columbus w/the only win coming in '08. LY they led 14-3 at HT but all'd 2 IR TD's.

PSU is 6-8 vs UW but has won the L2 meetings by a combined 86-14. In the last trip to Camp Randall ('08) PSU only outgained UW 377-313 in the 41 pt win taking advantage of 4 Badger TO's.
