

# POSITION OUTLOOK FOR

QUARTERBACKS - Matt Grothe (PS#55) started as a rFr and finished as the #2 career passer here. He would have been #1 but after breaking the BE career record for ttl off (Pat White WV 10,875) he tore his ACL in gm 3 of '09. RFr BJ Daniels (PS#76) took over and had a roller coaster yr at QB. In Daniels' first start he threw for 215 (126 rush) and led the upset of Fla St. He alternated good and bad gms and in USF's losses hit 48% (126 ypg, 2-7 ratio) with 262 rush. Daniels finished with 1,983 (54%, 14-9) and accounted for 58% of USF's off despite not starting until Wk 4 and was the #1 rusher (772, 4.4), LY the bkp was walk-on Bobby Eveld (PS#200). Daniels once again had his moments with his worst being key int's just before the half vs Fla and WV which set up td's, that changed the momentum of each gm. Daniels threw for 1,685 (58.4%). He started the yr with a 4-10 ratio but rebounded with a 7-3 ratio after that and was bowl MVP. He rushed for 259 (2.3) despite a lingering quad inj. Daniels was inj'd in the 2H vs Miami and Eveld guided the victory. Holtz said Eveld did a great job running the scout tm vs the #1's in practice and was not surprised. Eveld made his first career st vs Conn and hit 22-41-195 (1-3). In 7 gms he completed 56% (2 rush yds). Not in the PSL are Ryan Eppes (6'1" 210 So) and Brandon Smith (6'0" 195 rFr). I look for much improved QB play in the 2nd yr of Holtz's system.

RUNNING BACKS - From '06-'09 this unit was hit by inj's and lacked production. The leading RB rusher in '06 had 436 (3.6), '07 645 (4.7), '08 407 (4.0) and '09 581 (4.5). Moise Plancher was the top rusher in '09 and was awarded a 6th vr and he managed to play in all 13. In '09 Plancher snapped a 16 gm USF streak without a 100 yd rusher (vs WKU). LY 2 bkps quit and Demetris Murray (PS#90) who had 77 (5.5) in '09 emerged and had 115 vs WKU and 106 (8.2) vs L'ville and finished #2 with 542 (4.5). True frosh Marcus Shaw (PS#69) had 105 (8.8) and rFr Bradley Battles (5'8" 203 So, PS#66) had 52 (4.3). TY they add Dontae Aycock (PS#51) who signed at Auburn in '09 and VHT Darrell Scott (PS#1) who had 438 yds (4.0) in 2 yrs at Colo. Not in the PSL are JJ Peterson (5'10" 191 Sr) and Willie Davis (5'9" 195 Fr, PS#70). TY they lose their top guy, Plancher (793, 4.5) and FB Richard Kelly (7 st, 38 yds rush) but have only had 3 RB's surpass 700 yds (Plancher, Andre Hall 2Y '04-'05 and Rafael Williams '00). I predict USF will have their most productive leading rusher since Andre Hall's 1,374 in '05.

**RECEIVERS** - Jim Leavitt's receiving corps were usually filled with size and spd. Carlton Mitchell who is 6'4" and set a school record in the 400M (47.28) led in rec in '07 and '09 (706, 17.7). LY they had to replace Mitchell (#6DC) as well as their #5, #6 and #7 rec's but appeared to be in good shape. Unfortunately their #2 rec, AJ Love (489, 18.8) tore his ACL in April. Sterling Griffin (#4, 265, 18.9 '09) dislocated his ankle and also RS. That meant just 1 of the top 6 was back and that was Dontavia Bogan. He suffered an ankle injury missing some time but still led with 685 (14.6). Holtz called the unit "the land of the misfit toys" as 3 of the top guys were moved from other positions. Fórmer QB Evan Landi who Daniels calls "Sure Hands Landi" was #2 with 390 (13.9). Lindsey Lamar who was one of the Top 5 HS sprinters in the country was #3 (161, 6.4) and 5'6" Faron Hornes was #5 with (135, 12.3). This year they lose Bogan and TE Kevin Gidrey (11 st, 8 rec). Not listed in the PSL are Victor Marc (5'10" 208 Jr, PS#59, 1 rec last year), Jordan Duval (6'3" 213 rFr), TE Jake Carlton (6'3" 220 rFr) and Derrick Hopkins (5'5" 155 So). Despite the loss of the top guy, this is a much more exp'd unit with the ret of Love and Griffin.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '09 this unit was a major question mark as they went from having 87 car sts in '08 to just 32 (#106 FBS in '09). Three JC OT's DNQ which set the unit back. Thanks to mobile QB BJ Daniels (772 rush) they still avg 171 ypg rush (4.4) but all'd 38 sks (12.8%). LY 4 st'rs were back. The unit maintained good health with 4 OL starting all 13 but with Daniels' rush yds down to 259 (2.3), USF avg just 145 ypg (3.9) but did trim the sks to 26. TY they lose 1st Tm BE C Sampson Genus (13 st, 2Y st'r), 2nd Tm BE RT Jake Sims (13 st, 3Y st'r) and LT Jamar Bass (9 st, 2Y st'r). New LT Mark Popek has 9 career sts and while less exp'd with just 2 st'rs back, they are in the 2nd yr of Holtz's offense and could be more productive.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - USF is always tough vs the rush with their "worst" showings in FBS ball being 3.9 ypc which they all'd in both '05 and '09. In '08 a George Selvie-led DL all'd just 95 ypg rush (2.8). In '09 they had 3 st'rs back incl Selvie and added PS#3JC Jason Pierre-Paul. Surprisingly the rush D slipped to 135 ypg (3.9) and the D had just 25 sks. LY they had to replace 1st Tm BE DE Selvie (#7DC), Pierre-Paul (#1DC) and a DT (6 st). Despite being less exp'd, the unit improved to 126 ypg (3.5) with 30 sks. TY they lose DE Craig Marshall (8 st, #10 tkl'r, 9 tfl, int), 1st Tm BE DT Terrell McClain (13 st, 24 tkl, 3 sk, #3DC CAR) and DE David Bedford (13 st, 38 tkl, 1 sk,1 int). I look for a bigger impact from DE Ryne Giddins (PS#7) who had 2 sts as a rFr after rec from ankle surg in '09. This group is just as exp'd as '10 and is now in the 2nd yr of Holtz's system.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '09 USF had to replace their #1 tkl'r (#3DC) and had just 1 st'r back PS#22JC Kion Wilson. Wilson was outstanding (1st Tm BE, #1 tkl'r) and USF all'd just 19.8 ppg. LY they had to replace 2 st'rs in Wilson and their #4 tkl'r. Former HC Leavitt said that Sam Barrington was the best true frosh LB in USF history (1 st, 41 tkl) and that incl players like Ben Moffitt, Kawika Mitchell and Stephen Nicholas. Sabbath Joseph (#5 tkl'r '09) was the lone ret st'r. Perhaps their most physically gifted LB was PS#14JC Jacquian Williams (28 tkl '09). Barrington had a couple of shoulder inj's and then a couple of off field incidents. He became the st'r in Wk 2 and finished as the #3 tkl'r. TY they lose 2nd Tm BE SLB Williams (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 11 tfl, #6DC NYG), Joseph (1 st, #6 tkl'r, 6 tfl) and Donte Spires (9 tkl). DeDe Lattimore beat out Joseph for one LB spot and finished as the #2 tkl'r. They basically had zero st'rs back LY and this year return 2 plus add JUCO Mike Jeune and should be stronger.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - In '06 and '07 USF had the best CB combo in the NCAA and their 2 shutdown corners all'd USF to blitz often. USF was #21 and #7 in my PDR with an amazing 23 int in '07. In '08 those 2 departed (#1, #5DC) and USF dropped to #49. In '09 they had to replace two st'rs and were #41. LY they had to replace 2 st'rs (#2, #3 DC's). Mistral Raymond (2nd Tm BE) emerged as their top DB but did miss 2 sts. Early in the yr, Holtz was reluctant to pull starting FS Jerrell Young and SS Jon Lejiste off the field as he was worried that bkp frosh Mark Joyce and JaQuez Jenkins were not ready. True Fr Joyce st'd vs L'ville when Young was inj'd and finished with 33 tkl and 1 int on the yr. The less exp'd unit dropped to #56, their lowest finish S/'04. TY they lose CB Raymond (11 st, 56 tkl, 8 pd #6DC MIN) but this time have 7 of their top 8 back incl 3rd Tm BE SS Lejiste, and the Bulls should make significant strides.

SPECIAL TEAMS - USF has had some top-notch ST

finishes like #17 in my ST rankings in '01, #14 in '02 and #9 in 03. Surprisingly they dropped to #58, #55, #97, #78, #56 and in '09 plummeted to #102. They lost starting K Bonani (inj) prior to '09 and the tm had just 4 TB on 67 KO and Delbert Alvarado's net punting dropped to 34.6. KR Dontavia Bogan also saw his avg drop (26.6 to 21.4). LY almost everyone ret'd. K Schwartz hit 11-16 FG (L50) in '09 but missed from 26 and 46 yds vs WKU and hit 1-5. Bonani ret'd and hit an outstanding 17-21 FG's (2 misses 52 vd). He had 6 TB's on 48 KO's. P Justin Brockhaus-Kann started off the ssn so well that Holtz jokingly referred to him as "Gus the kicking mule". He cooled off incl 26 and 18 yd punts in windy conditions vs L'ville but was Big East STPW vs Mia (10, 41.0). He only avg 37.6 (34.2 net). KR Lindsey Lamar (26.6, 2td) was BE STPOY and tms kicked away from him. USF avg'd 11.5 on PR's. USF was only #67 but this yr with everyone back this should be one of the BE's top ST units.

COACHES - Skip Holtz was very successful at EC (38-27) incl B2B CUSA Titles finishing 9-5 in '08 and '09. He faces his former tm Connecticut (HC '94-'98) yearly now. Todd Fitch followed Holtz from EC and has now been his OC for 7 seasons (EC '07-'09, Conn '96-'98). The DC is Mark Snyder who was the HC of Marshall for 5 yrs (23-37 record). He was also Ohio St's LB cch from '01-'03 and their DC in '04.

# FOREGAS

USF didn't play their first football gm until '97 and was guided by Jim Leavitt throughout their history. They joined the Big East in '05 and did not have a losing ssn in that span although in Leavitt's final 2Y they were just 5-9 in Big East play. In '07 they rose as high as #2 at 6-0 but finished 9-4. The next yr they rose to #10 at 5-0 but finished 8-5 (-8 in TO's). In '09 they lost star QB Grothe to inj and BJ Daniels' first start was a 17-7 upset of Fla St but they ran hot and cold and USF finished just 8-5. I was high on USF LY as Holtz gets the most out of his talent having bagged B2B CUSA Titles despite not having the most gifted players and he inherited a USF squad that had underachieved. Holtz guided the tm to their 6th str bowl and ended 4 gm losing streaks to Cincy and Rutgers. They led Florida 7-0 late in the 1H when BJ Daniels threw a crucial int that turned the gm around. At 3-1 they were upset at home by Syr. The next wk Daniels threw another int just before the half putting WV up 17-3, a key play in the loss which dropped them to 3-3. After beating UC, Rut and L'ville to move to 6-3 they lost to Pitt at home by a td. The next wk they upset Miami on the road but with Daniels inj'd and out, they had a 333-232 yd edge vs Conn but lost on a 52 yd FG with :17 left. They had their 3rd str conf losing ssn at 3-4 and their -43.3 ypg was the 3rd worst mark. They beat Clem 31-26 in the bowl to finish at 8 wins for the 3rd str yr. Holtz is now in his 2nd ssn but has just 11 ret st'rs and only 3 BE HG's. This is still a very talented tm and they only lose 15 lettermen (fewest BE). Two of my 9 sets of power ratings call for 11 wins, and I will call for them to top last year's 8 win total.
