
# SBURGH PA



**POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011** 

QUARTERBACKS - In mid-Aug '09, Wannstedt said the QB job was a 3-way battle between returnees PS#25 Bill Stull (2356, 57%, 9-10 in '08), Pat Bostick (PS#9) who started 8 in '07 (1,500, 62%, 8-13) with 1 st in '08, and Tino Sunseri (PS#29). Stull won the job and had a much better year than expected (2,633,65%, 21-8). Bostick RS and Sunseri played in 5 (114, 59%, 2-0). Sunseri was the clear-cut st'r in '10 and while he struggled early, he improved midseason incl 272 vs ND, 281 with 4 td's vs Syr and 307 vs Rutgers. He threw for 2,572 (64.5%, 16-9). Bostick played in 4 (44 yds). This year Sunseri must learn a new offense and added to the mix are frosh Anthony Gonzalez (PS#28) and Mark Myers (PS#125). This unit is much more exp'd and even with the coaching change, they will put up

much bigger numbers in the new QB friendly system. **RUNNING BACKS**-LeSean McCoy (PS#8, 210 lbs) had B2B 1,000 yd seasons in '07 & '08. In '09 the top 3 departed and the ret RB's had a comb'd 49 yds on 17 att's. Wannstedt again turned it over to a freshman. True frosh Dion Lewis had a phenomenal ssn and was 2nd Tm AA. He rushed for 1,799 (5.5) eclipsing McCoy's BE frosh record. True frosh Ray Graham (PS#31) rushed for just 349 but 5.7 ypc in '09, and Wannstedt called him the star of the spg in '10. FB Henry Hynoski (PS#31) was a solid blk'r who rushed for 107 (4.5) with 109 (7.3) rec yds in '09. All 3 ret'd in '10 and while Lewis was a hard-nosed inside runner, Graham was fast and shifty. Graham led in rushing the majority of the yr and finished with 922 (6.2) including 277 vs FIU which was the 2nd highest total in Pitt history (Tony Dorsett 303 vs ND '75). Lewis seemed to get better the more carries he received and had a career high 261 yds on 42 carries vs Cincy and finished #1 with 1,061 (4.8). Léwis (#5DC PHI) and Hynoski left early leaving Graham as the only scholarship RB this spg. While Graham will have a fine year, I don't think the top 2 RB's will combine for 1,983 (5.4) like they did LY.

RECEIVERS - Under former HC Walt Harris, Pitt was gaining the reputation of "WR U" as they had a WR lead the BE in receiving 7 times in 8 yrs (1997-'04). In '08 Derek Kinder led Pitt with just 422 (11.7) and had to be replaced in '09 (#7DC) as did their #3 rec. The leading returnee was 6'5" Jon Baldwin (PS#15, 4.37 spd). Baldwin only finished #2 with 404 but had an impressive 22.4 ypc as a true in '08. As expected, Baldwin

had a much bigger year in '09 (#3 BE) with 1,111 (19.5). Dorin Dickerson (PS#8) had played RB, WR and LB before moving to TE. Dickerson earned 1st Tm AA with 529 (10.8) and 10 td's. Solid blocking TE Nate Byham (PS#2) had 108 (10.8). Oderick Turner (6'3", PS#97) was #3 (227, 10.8) and 6'5" rFr Mike Sha-nahan was #4 (211, 14.1). LY they lost Byham (12 st, #6DC), Dickerson (8 st, #7DC) and Turner (10 st). The unit struggled early with a young QB and improved some when 6'4" Devin Street was used more in the Dickerson-type role (although still WR). Baldwin led with 822 (15.5). Shanahan emerged with some great catches and was #2 with 589 (13.7). Street finished #3 with 318 (12.7). This year Baldwin left early for the NFL (#1DC KC) while TE Mike Cruz (213, 11.2) left the team in spring. WR Brendon Felder (PS#96) is transferring from UNC and is applying for immediate eligibility. Even with the loss of their top guy, this unit could come close to last year's production.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '09 Pitt had a veteran O-line with 4 st'rs back and as you would expect, improved to 180 ypg rush (4.9) while trimming the sk total to 15 (4.4%). LY they had to replace 3 multi-yr st<sup>r</sup>rs, but returned two 1st Tm BE caliber OT's. The numbers dipped a little to 166 ypg rush (4.6) with 23 sks (6.4%). This year they lose C Alex Karabin (13 st) and 1st Tm BE LT Jason Pinkston (13 st, 3Y st'r, #5DC CLE). Lúcas Nix started 13 at RT in '09 and moved to RG after 3 sts LY so they have 3 full-time st'rs back. Even though they are learning a new system and losing their top guy, this is a more exp'd group.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '09 Pitt had 4 back who had been full-time st'rs (lost 1 st'r) and I called it the best DL in Wannstedt's 5Y. They did not disappoint allowing 106 ypg rush (3.3) with an FBS high 47 sks (36 by DL!). LY they had to replace 2 st'rs then star DE Greg Romeus played in just 2 (inj, 8 sks '09, 0 '10). Surprisingly Pitt dropped to 120 ypg rush (3.5) with 34 sks. Wannstedt was high on his 4 frosh signees in TJ Clemmings, Bryan Murphy, Aaron Donald and Khavnin Mosley-Smith calling them the DL of the future. Jabaal Sheard earned BE DPOY and DE Lindsey led the BE in tff (17.5). DE Justin Hargrove was the surprise of Aug but only had 1 sk. TY they lose DE Sheard (12 st, #6 tkl'r, 9 sk, #2DC CLE), DE Romeus (2 st, 7 tkl, #7DC NO), DE Nate Nix (12 tkl) and NT Tyler Tkach (1 st, 5 tkl). Three st'rs return to the new 3 man front and despite the loss of 2 stars, the unit could be stronger as it is more experienced

**LINEBACKERS** - Pitt actually has had two FWAA AA LB's in the last 5 yrs in HB Blades ('06) and Scott McKillop ('08). In '09 they had to replace 2 st'rs (#1 and #2 tkl'r). They ret'd 1 st'r and an '07 st'r who missed '08. True frosh Dan Mason earned BE DPOW in his first start and Pitt allowed just 19.8 ppg. LY they had to replace 1st Tm BE MLB Adam Gunn (#3 tkl'r) but ret'd their #1 and #12 tkl'rs as well as Mason. The unit had produced a 1st Tm BE MLB 5 straight vrs heading into '10 but MLB Mason dislocated his kneecap in Sept. Max Gruder shifted to MLB (#2 tkl'r) and Pitt allowed just 19.0 ppg. This year the top 7 LB's return incl their #2, #3 and #9 tkl'rs as well as Mason.

This should be one of the BE's best LB corps.

PITTERS A PITTER OF THE P NCAA in ypg pass D twice in Wannstedt's 6 yrs. In '09 Pitt had 7 of the top 8 back (4 VHT). Surprisingly, they only finished #43 in my PDR (light slate opp) but did snag 15 int's. LY they had to replace a 1st Tm BE CB Aaron Berry, their other starting CB and a S (6 st). I thought that despite the losses they would move up in my PDR and that they did to #28 despite SS Dom DeCicco having to start 4 at LB due to attrition. This year the Panthers lose ČB Ricky Gary (13 st, 34 tkl, 6 pd) and 1st Tm BE DeCicco (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 5 int) but return 6 of the top 8 incl 2nd Tm BE FS Jarred Holley (PS#31). They have 41 starts returning (44 in '10), so they are nearly as experienced as last year.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Pitt was #13 in my ST rankings in '06 then #55, #29 and #66 the next 3Y. The unit ret'd intact LY and Dan Hutchins was 1 of 10 semi's for the Ray Guy Awd. After punts of 50 and 56, he shanked punts of 15 and 29 vs Conn. Hutchins hit 18-25 FG's but was 2-6 from 40+ (6-13 career) although he made 60 yd FG's in practice. He improved from a 41.1 punt avg to 44.8 and his net from 34.5 to an outstanding 39.8 (#6 FBS). Kevin Harper (PS#17) had 11 TB on 70 KO. Cameron Saddler (20.9 KR & 10.5 PR) shared duties with Ray Graham (21.8 KR). They moved up to #52 in '10 but with the loss of Hutchins' punting ability they figure to drop some this year.

DACHES - Dave Wannstedt was the HC here for 6 seasons and despite 3 straight bowls and 26 wins in his final 3Y (most here S/81-'83) he was forced out. Mike Haywood was hired but fired 16 days later after legal troubles. Pitt turned to Todd Graham who was 36-17 as Tulsa's HC the L4Y. Graham spent 1 yr as Rice's HC ('06, 7-6) and was the Tulsa DC ('03-'05). The co-OC's are Calvin Magee who was the OC at Mich ('07-'10) and WV ('05-'07) and Mike Norvell (Tulsa '07-'10) who served as the pass gm coor for Graham the L2Y. DC Keith Patterson has been at Tulsa the last 8 ssns and was the co-DC the last 5 years. He will share duties with co-DC Paul Randolph (L4Y Tulsa).

### PHIL'S FORECAST

The Pittsburgh coaching changes have been unusual. Walt Harris went to bowls in each of his final 5 yrs and in his final ssn, they won the Big East Title (Fiesta Bowl) despite having just 9 ret st'rs. He was forced out and Dave Wannstedt took over. In Wannstedt's 2nd season they avg'd 31.8 ppg, their best since 1981 but still finished just 6-6. Wannstedt was on his way out in his 3rd yr but upset #2 WV knocking them out of the National Title game and they finished 5-7 securing him another yr. In '08 the Panthers made my Most Improved List and had their first winning season under Wannstedt going 9-4. In '09 six of my sets of power ratings called for them to have a DD win ssn and that they did at 10-3 (1st 10 win yr S/81) and it could have been even better. The WV game was meaningless as a BCS bowl berth relied on what they did vs Cincy. In that UC gm they led 31-10 but lost by 1. LY they were the preseason Big East favorites (22 of 24 votes) and were ranked #15. I did not have them in my Top 25 as they had benefitted from +10 in TO's in 09, had just 11 ret st'rs (last in BE) and only had 7 sts lost to inj in '09, plus just 3 BE HG's. Wannstedt called it the youngest tm in his 6 yrs. Pitt opened vs a very good Utah team on the road and lost by a FG in OT, making it their 6th straight time they lost by a td or less. After beating NH they were manhandled by Miami on a Thurs night. They only led FIU 23-17 in the 4Q before getting 3 late td's to win 44-17. They did have 3 drives inside the ND20 result in 3 pts (miss FG, bad snap on FG) and lost despite a 382-329 yd edge. They throttled Syr on the road. After pummeling Rutgers (513-203 vd edge), they appeared on their way to an outright BE Title with a 20-3 win over L'ville. They were 3-0 and the two BE tms with 1 loss were tms that Pitt had beaten. They led Conn 21-13 in the 3Q but UC scored 10 pts in :48 and ended up losing by 2. After beating USF on the road, they were done in by -4 in TO's vs WV and even with a 20-13 FD edge, lost by 25. They beat Cincy in the snow 28-10 gaining a share of the BE Title then surprisingly Wannstedt was let go. In the bowl the players dedicated the gm to Wannstedt and they dominated Kentucky 27-10 to finish 8-5 and their +94.9 ypg in Big East play was 2nd best. They have the best mark in ypg over the last 2 yrs. Pitt did have 2 net close losses and has 4 Big East home games (8 HG's overall) and Todd Graham steps into a great situation with 13 ret st'rs. Graham piloted my Most Improved Team in the country last year (Tulsa) and they went from 5-7 to 10-3. Pitt has my #1 rated D in the Big East and their offense will be much more potent in Graham's system. I pick Pitt for the Big East Title and a BCS bowl berth.
