POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS-When I think of BYU I think of great QB's like Ty Detmer, Steve Young and Jim McMahon. John Beck left here (#2DC) as the school's #2 all-time passer. Ariz St transfer Max Hall (PS#52) had not played in 4 yrs (RS, mission) but set the MWC single season soph record for total offense in '07. He threw for 3,848 (60%, 26-12) and then 3,957 (69%, 35-14) in '08. Hall got stronger and faster in the offseason and threw for 3,560 (67%, 33-14) in '09 and was the MWC OPW 5x. Hall left (NFL ARZ) as the MWC career passing leader and his 32 wins topped Detmer's mark. Riley Nelson (PS#65) is not your prototypical BYU QB as he is an undersized running QB who lacks a powerful arm. He started 7 at Utah St in '06 throwing for 925 (55%, 6-7) sparking what was then a moribund offense. After a mission Nelson hit 7-10 in '09 (122 rush) as Hall's bkp. Mendenhall opted to alternate Nelson and true frosh Jake Heaps (PS#2) in '10 and in Wk 1 each threw for 131 yds. Both struggled vs AF then Nelson, who started the other 3, was OFY vs Fla St. Heaps was not helped by dropped passes and after TCU had just a 1-6 ratio but showed great improvement with a 14-3 ratio over the final 6. His 2,316 yds passing (57.2%, 15-9) was the lowest for a BYU passing leader since Matt Berry in '03 but his 15 td passes broke Ty Detmer's 22 yr old record for a BYU frosh. In fact, Heaps set every BYU frosh passing record. Not listed in the PSL are James Lark (6'2" 202 Jr, PS#58), Christian Stewart (6'2" 190 rFr) and Brad Heap (6'3" 215 rFr). This should be one of the most improved QB positions in the country and should get back to producing BYU-type numbers.

RUNNING BACKS-Harvey Unga (1227, 5.0) not only broke Ronney Jenkins' BYU 1996 frosh rushing record (733) but also the MWC frosh record in '07. In '08 Unga's stats dipped a bit to 1,132 (4.7). True frosh JJ Di Luigi (PS#94) was compared to LaDainian Tomlinson but had just 48 (3.7). In '09 Unga had the swine flu over the summer and was rarely 100% during the yr (inj's) but still topped 1,000 for the 3rd straight season (1087, 5.2). Di Luigi had 248 (5.5) and Bryan Kariya, who started the opener (118 all-purp vs Okla), had 199 (3.6). LY Unga left BYU after spring and was taken in the supplemental draft (7th RD CHI). They still had 3 solid RB's especially in the 2H of the year. Di Luigi led with 917 (5.2) starting 10 and was also the team's reception leader with 45. Kariya had 537 (3.9) in 9 sts and Joshua "Juice" Quezada had 505 (5.1). This year the unit is in much better shape as all 3 return and not listed below is David Foote (5'11" 208 Jr).

RECEIVERS-In '09 BYU had to replace its career rec leader Austin Collie (#4DC). TE Dennis Pitta had 1,083 (13.0) in '08 and led BYU in '09 with 829 (13.4). McKay Jacobson (PS#38) had

547 (19.5) in '06 then went on a mission. Jacobson ret'd for the '09 season and was the team's deep threat avg 24.2 ypc but was just #2 (556) as he missed 4 (inj). LY they had to replace Pitta (#4DC, #3 BYU rec yds) and the unit was plagued by dropped passes, failure to separate and uneven blocking. A RB led the team in rec (but only had 1 rec td) and the top WR was rFr Cody Hoffman who had 527 (12.5) incl having 137 and 3 td's in the bowl. Surprisingly Jacobson was #3 (410, 11.1). Luke Ashworth emerged in the 2H of the year and had 368 (11.5). Nobody really replaced Pitta but Devin Mahina had 11 rec in 5 sts (TE's had 0 td's). Not listed in the PSL are Rhen Brown (5'10" 180 Jr), Skyler Ridley (5'11" 168 So), Brady Hunt (6'2" 200 Fr), Andrew Cusick (6'5" 205 rFr), Matt Marshall (5'10" 172 Sr), Kaneakua Friel (6'5" 235 So) and Matthew Edwards (6'3" 225 Sr). This year they only lose Ashworth (1 st) and BJ Peterson (2 rec). O'Neill Chambers (6'2" 211) was susp in Oct (14 car sts) and HC Mendenhall has said he will not play TY but may be back in '12. Hoffman is 6'4" with speed and they add in 6'3" Ross Apo (orig committed to Texas, PS#30). After an incredibly poor year, I look for BYU to have a vastly improved rec corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE-In '08 BYU had a veteran OL that avg 327 lbs but did not meet my expectations as they only opened holes for 134 ypg rush (4.1) with 19 sks. They only had 23 career sts back in '09 (#117 FBS) and the lone returning st'r, Matt Reynolds, fractured his hand in Aug. Surprisingly the young O-line opened holes for 146 ypg rush (4.0) and 23 sks (5.5%). LY they had 9 of the top 10 back (66 car sts). Surprisingly the unit struggled early allowing 8 sks to Fla St but yielded just 13 in the other 12. The numbers improved to 168 ypg rush (4.2) with 4.9% sks and they hit their stride in the last 6 (210 ypg, 4.5, 4 sks). This year they lose 2nd Tm MWC RG Jason Speredon (13 st) and RG Nick Alletto (11 gm bkp '10, 1 st '09). Reynolds turned down the NFL which means 4 of 5 st's return (107 car sts) and I look for continued improvement.

DEFENSIVE LINE-In '09 BYU ret'd the MWC career sk leader DE Jan Jorgensen along with almost the entire 2 deep and improved to 110 ypg rush (3.4). LY they had to replace 2 st's and then their lone returnee, Romney Fuga was lost vs Nevada (ACL). The less exp'd group didn't do bad allowing 139 ypg (3.9, 24 sks). This year they lose 1st Tm MWC DE Vic So'oto (13 st, 45 tkl, 5 sk, 6.5 tfl) but get back Fuga and Jordan Richardson (5 st, ACL). They also add in 310 lb PS#5JC Hebron Fangupo (USC transfer) and Ian Dulan (17 sts '06-'08) returns from a mission. Not in the PSL are Matt Peterson (6'5" 260 Jr, 2 tkl), Mike Muehlmann (6'4" 240 So, 3 st TE), Simote Ve'a (5'11" 243 Sr), Matthew Jensen (6'6" 231 rFr), Kalama Kaluhihi Kalani (5'10" 266 Jr), Garrett Eskelsen (6'2" 233 Jr), Uani Unga (6'1" 219 Jr) and Josh Marquardt (6'1" 248 So). Despite the loss of the top guy, this unit is much more exp'd.

LINEBACKERS-BYU had a veteran, senior laden LB corps in '09 and LY they had to replace their #2, #5, #6 and #10 tkl'rs along with 2 others (3 st, 25 tkl). They had just 10 car sts (Jordan Pendleton). Mendenhall thought BYU was better vs mobile QB's due to the number of OLB's they had. Pendleton was OFY after 5 sts but surprisingly BYU went from allowing 21.5 ppg to just 21.6. This year they lose 3rd Tm MWC MLB Shane Hunter (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 3.5 tfl), Zeke Mendenhall (2 st, 15 tkl), AJ Van Valkenburg (2 tkl) and Jadon Wagner (9 st, 38 tkl) who made himself elig for the CFL draft. They return a healthy Pendleton and 6 who started LY plus add in VHT USC transfer Uona Kaveinga (PS#36). Not in the PSL are Connell Hess (6'0" 224 Jr), Tyler Beck (6'1" 210 So), Peter Welsh (5'11" 205 rFr) and Ezekel Ansah (6'6" 254 Jr). This should be a vastly improved unit.

DEFENSIVE BACKS-After finishing #19 and #15 in my PDR in '06 and '07 they ret'd 7 car sts in '08 and plummeted

to #93. They had to replace 2 st's in '09 but still moved back up to #33. LY they only lost 1 st'r FS Scott Johnson (#3 tkl'r) but did lose FS Steven Thomas after 3 sts. BYU still moved up to #25 (53.4%, 20-16). This year they lose CB Brandon Bradley (13 st, 40 tkl, 1 int), 3rd Tm MWC CB Brian Logan (12 st, 51 tkl, 2 int, 7 pbu), 1st Tm MWC KAT Andrew Rich (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 7.5 tfl, 5 int) and Thomas (retired from football). This unit is my ONLY concern on the 2011 squad.

SPECIAL TEAMS-Mendenhall's first unit finished #100 in my ST rankings and I called for them to be one of the most improved ST units in '06 and they moved up to #20. They had to replace most of their key players in '07 and dropped to #60. In '08 everyone was back (#26). In '09 even with O'Neill Chambers they finished just #69. LY the unit ret'd intact and Chambers became BYU's all-time leader in KR yardage (1612) passing Mike Rigell ('98-'01) but was susp after 7 gms. K Mitch Payne set BYU's record for most career and most consec PAT's with 162 (Kurt Gunther 1980-'82). He also passed his brother Matt for first all-time on the MWC career K pts list. Payne hit 17-21 FG's (L48). Riley Stephenson (PS#14) avg 42.0 on punts (37.1 net) and had an outstanding 23 TB's on 64 KO's. The team struggled on KR D (23.1). This year they lose Payne but add in Justin Sorensen (PS#1) who returns from a mission and they could be just as good as LY's #43 finish.

COACHES-Bronco Mendenhall was the DC under Rocky Long at New Mexico for 5 yrs prior to coming here in '03 as the DC. The Cougars went 6-6 in his first year as HC ('05) but have gone 50-15 since incl three 11 win seasons. Robert Anae resigned as the OC and QB cch Brandon Doman (7th yr here) will fill that role. Mendenhall started as his own DC, but in '08 promoted Jaime Hill. Last season Hill was relieved after 5 (all'd 28.8 ppg) and Mendenhall again was his own DC. He brought a new energy to the D and they did not allow a 1H point in the final 4 reg season gms. BYU is one of only a handful of FBS programs that do not have a separate DC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

When Gary Crowton took over in '01, it was a dream season as they piled up 44.1 ppg, 524 ypg and at one point were 12-0 lobbying for a BCS bowl berth. After losing their bowl, BYU finished 12-2 and #25. BYU then had 3 consec losing seasons. Bronco Mendenhall took over in '05 and they went 6-6. The next 4 yrs BYU finished 11-2 (#16), 11-2 (#14), 10-3 (#25) and 11-2 (#12) and were 29-3 in the MWC including 8-0 in both '06 and '07. In '09 they knocked off #3 Okla (first win vs Top 10 S'90) and moved as high as #7 but lost to Fla St and landed in their 5th consec Las Vegas Bowl. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU history to lead his team to bowl eligibility in each of his first 6 yrs. LY BYU lost RB Unga over the summer then announced that both QB's would rotate every other series. BYU did beat Washington but lost to AF by 21, FSU by 24 and then to Nevada at home by 14. Utah St ended a 10 game losing streak to the Cougars and BYU fell to 1-4 with the offense avg a dismal 15 ppg. The next week was "replay gate" where 3 replay booth officials were susp'd after they missed a fumble and BYU prevailed over SDSU 24-21. They trailed TCU just 3-0 with just over 2:00 left in the 1Q but lost 31-3. The Cougars rebounded to win their next 4 (+221 ypg, +31 ppg). They led Utah 13-0 in the 3Q but had a 42 yd FG bkd'd at the end and lost. In the bowl they rolled over UTEP 52-24. This year BYU makes the big switch to being an Independent and are coming off a year where they had 40 sts lost to injury and their first non double digit win season since '05. They did surprisingly have 2 net close wins last year. BYU returns 15 starters and would be a preseason favorite in the MWC if they still played there. I give them a great shot at double digit wins despite playing Ole Miss, Texas, Oregon St, TCU and Hawai'i all away from home. BYU is much improved over last year's version.

First meeting and BYU is 1-3 vs the SEC (won L/gm vs Miss St, '01). The Cougars will begin 2011 as an Independent after being in the MWC the L12Y. BYU is 2-7 its L/9 road openers (won 2 of L3).
BYU's only trip to Austin was in 1987, a 22-17 win, the schools inaugural meeting. Cougars are 10-3 S'03 in their 2nd consecutive AG. LY BYU started 1-4 for 1st time S'73.
87th "Holy War", 1st time schools not in same conf. This gm has been decided by a TD or less 12x's in L14Y. LY BYU led 13-0 into the 4Q but down 1, had a 42 yd FG blk'd as time exp'd.
First meeting. Since 2000 BYU is 4-1 vs CUSA incl a 28 pt win vs UTEP in LY's bowl. The Cougars are 13-1 on Friday nights since 1987 with the only loss vs Utah St last year.
LY was 1st time in this series S'82 BYU was held below 30 pts. BYU's last 2 gm losing streak vs USU was in '73 /74. LY BYU trailed 24-3 at HT (outgained 243-144) & 31-10 into the 4Q before a garbage TD.
BYU has won 5 of the L/6 vs SJSt incl the most recent meeting in '98, 46-43. BYU trailed at HT 14-13 but had a 577-370 yd edge as 2 fmbld KO's set up TD's (SJSt missed a 47 yd FG as time exp).
HC Mendenhall is an OSU alumni (2 yr str at S/LB & Capt) & was on the staff in '95-'96 & '89-'90. BYU won the '09 Las Vegas Bowl and the L/trip to Corvallis was the '78 opener, a 10-6 win (2-4 at OSU).
