POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Jason White became the first OU QB to win the Heisman in '03. In his final two years he threw for 7,051 (63%) with a 75-19 ratio. In '07 I projected rFr Sam Bradford (PS#20) to start (3-way battle) and he ended up #1 in the FBS in pass eff. At 6'4" he became the tallest QB to start at OU. In '08 he won the Heisman while setting an FBS pass eff record with a 50-8 ratio (180.8). In '09 Bradford opted to return but was inj'd early then OFY vs Texas. RFr Landry Jones (PS#3), who barely won the #2 job and was expected to see spot duty, stepped in to throw for 3,198 (58%, 26-14). Jones had his ups and downs (5 int vs Neb) but threw for 418 in the bowl and eclipsed Bradford's OU Fr passing mark. LY the Sooners had to replace Bradford (#1 car pass, NFL Off Rookie Yr) but he had only played 8Q's in '09. Jones had a few uneven performances but did well throwing for 4,718 (65.6%, 38-12). RFr Drew Allen (pocket passer) hit 9-14-89 playing in 5. Dangerous runner Blake Bell (6'6") bulked up to 241 redshirted. In bowl practices Barry Switzer said Jones would be a 1st Rnd DC. His 405 comp's broke the OU single season record and he tied Bradford's schl record for pass yds in a critical gm with 468 vs Okla St. Jones should be one of the top QB's in the NCAA this year.

RUNNING BACKS - In '07 rFr DeMarco Murray (PS#5) was the leading rusher (764, 6.0) when he was knocked OFY vs TT. Allen Patrick (#7 DC) finished with 1,009 (5.8). Murray was leading with 1,002 (5.6) and 14 td's in '08 until he missed the last 2. Chris Brown (6'11, 3.9 in '07) finished #1 with 1,220 (5.6) and 20 td's. Mossis Madu (232, 5.8 in '07) added 475 (4.1). All 3 ret'd in '09 but Murray (hamstring) finished with just 705 (4.1) in just 5 sts. Brown led but with just 749 (4.1) and rFr Jermie Calhoun (PS#2) added 220 (4.9). Madu played WR. LY they had to replace Brown but Murray set OU's career td record with 63 (Steve Owens' 57, '67-'69). He also topped Joe Washington ('72-'75) for career all-purp yards (5,881, '72-'75). He led with 1,214 (4.3) in '10 but also led all RB's in the FBS with 71 rec (594, 8.4). Electric true frosh Roy Finch (PS#16) missed the first 5 and the bowl due to injuries but still had 398 (4.7). Fellow true frosh Brennan Clay (PS#7) added 127 (3.5) and Stoops said that Trey Millard (209 tll yds '10) could be OU's best FB in his tenure. This year Murray (14 st, #3DC DAL) and Madu (254, 4.3) depart. Adding depth are TB's Dominique Whaley (5'10" 197 Jr) and Jonathan Miller (5'11" 197 So, PS#58) and FB's David Driskill (6'1" 235 rFr) and David Welchert (6'1" 229 rFr). Despite the loss of their top guy, true frosh Brandon Williams (PS#5) was dynamic in the spring and this unit could be more productive overall.

RECEIVERS - In '09 OU had an inexp'd and injury plagued rec corps. Despite a shoulder injury, Ryan Broyles (PS#41) led with 1,120 (12.6). Broyles tied an OU single season record with 15 td's (Mark Clayton '03). The #2 rec was RB Murray. Brandon Caleb (PS#27) missed 2 and had 408 (15.7) while DeJuan Miller (PS#21), who was the only full-time player to play in all 13, was #3 (434, 12.1). LY 2 TE's were drafted but the top 3 WR's were back. Biletniokoff finalist Broyles had an amazing season with 1,622 (12.4) while leading the FBS with 131 rec. True frosh Kenny Stills (PS#13) lived up to his spring hype with 786 (12.9). Cameron Kenney (PS#17JC) was #4 with 544 (16.5). True frosh Trey Franks had 263 (9.1) and TE James Hanna (PS#25) added 292 (16.2). Miller played in just 6 gm (inj, 15 rec). Broyles is already OU's career receiving leader and turned down a shot at the NFL so the only losses are Kenney (4 st) and Caleb (4 rec). Clearly, this is one of the top rec corps in the country and they add in PS#7 rFr Justin McCoy and true frosh PS#4 Trey Metoyer.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '08 OU had 130 career st ret (#1 FBS) and all 5 st's were NFL prospects. They opened holes for 199 ypg rush (4.7) with 13 sks (2.5%). In '09 this unit was largely to blame for their 8-5 season as they had to replace 4 multiyear st's (#2 & #5 DC) and their numbers plummeted to 135 ypg rush (3.6) but with just 15 sks (2.9%). OU started 10 diff OL lineups due to inj's and ineffectiveness. LY they had to replace 2.5 st's (#1DC) and had 8 back with starting exp. Surprisingly, the numbers dropped to 3.3 ypg with 21 sks (3.3%). This year OU lose 1st Tm B12 RT Eric Mensik (14 st), C Brian Lepak (2 st, 13 gm) and Cory Brandon (8 st '09, 3 gm '10). They ret 4 st's and 8 of the top 10 (9 VHT) although RT Jones (4 st) may miss Sept (patella). After being a weakness the last 2 yrs, the Sooners O-line should be a strength.

DEFENSIVE LINE - The Sooners always have an excellent D-line. In '09 DT Gerald McCoy turned down being a #1 DC and they had all 4 st's back. As you would expect, the rush D improved to 93 ypg (2.8). Jeremy Beal led with 11 sks. LY they had to replace 2 ret st's incl McCoy (#1DC TB). One ret st'r, DT Adrian Taylor (13 st '09), suffered a dislocated ankle in the '09 bowl and was never 100% then was OFY (Achilles) vs TT. Beal was named the B12 Def POY but overall it was an inexp'd group. The Sooners slipped to allowing 149 ypg rush (4.1), their weakest numbers S/'97. This year they lose DE Beal (14 st, #4 tkl'r, 8.5 sks, #7DC DEN), DT Taylor (6 st, 12 tkl) and Pryce Macon (2 st, 21 tkl, 6 sk). Six return with starting exp incl Ronnell Lewis (PS#6) who moved from LB to DE and started the final 4. This unit is a little more experienced and even with the loss of their top guy, should have improved numbers.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 the Sooners ret'd 5 of their top 6 LB's and got back Ryan Reynolds (PS#3, inj '08). Travis Lewis, who broke Brian Bosworth's OU frosh record for tkl (144, Big 12 Fr Yr), earned 1st Tm B12 in '09 and the Sooners allowed just 14.5 ppg (best S/'01). LY they had to replace 2 st's (#3, #4 tkl'r). Of OU's top 7 LB's, 5 were soph or frosh and the unit was hit hard by inj's. Austin Box missed the first 5 (back) and Ronnell Lewis (knee) was never 100% and moved to DE. TY they are a more veteran unit (5 ret w/5+ sts) and 2nd Tm B12 LB Travis Lewis (#1 tkl'r) turned down the NFL. Tony Jefferson was the B12's co-Def FPOY. I look for big improvement over LY's 21.8 ppg with spring star Corey Nelson (PS#6) playing a much larger role.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Sooners always fare well in my PDR and in '08 despite replacing 3 st's, still finished #11. In '09 they had to replace 2 st's (1st & 2nd Tm B12). It surprised me that 3 of the st's were not VHT's but the Sooners still finished #3. LY they had to replace 2 st's again (1st and 2nd Tm B12). One ret st'r, Sam Proctor, lost his job. Demontre Hurst had a fine year with 11 pbu but did drop 3 potential int vs A&M. CB Jamell Fleming led the Big 12 in pd (#2 FBS). The Sooners finished #7. This year they lose 2 st's again in 1st Tm AA FS Quinton Carter

(#3 tkl'r, 6 pbu, #4DC DEN) and SS Jonathan Nelson (14 st, #2 tkl'r, 7 pbu, #7DC STL). Fleming was OFS (acad) but is expected to return along with Hurst (comb 6 int, 25 pbu) as well as Proctor (10 st '09). I look for another top 10 PDR finish.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Stoops' first 9 yrs his ST units were a strength with 6 top 13 finishes. Surprisingly in '08 they plummeted to #101 (all'd 4 KR td's). In '09 I expected a move back to its usual spot and they did (#12) despite not settling on a FG K. Jimmy Stevens hit 11-13 FG's but then lost his job to P Tress Way (1-6). Walk-on Patrick O'Hara hit 6-9 (.47). Way was #5 in the FBS with a 40.3 net. They improved their KR all'd from 23.8 to 20.2 with just 1 td. Broyles and Dominique Franks helped combine for a Stoops era high of 16.3 per PR. LY OU surprisingly dropped to #37, once again allowing 4 KR td's. O'Hara (best leg) won the K job but was inj'd. Stevens' numbers were respectable at 19-23 (.42) but Stoops sometimes bypassed FG's and said FG's were his main concern all year. He has 4 scholarship K's on the roster which hurts team depth but that shows what a priority it is to get the problem fixed. Way avg 44.0 (40.5 net). LS James Winchester (4.4 spd) is one of the first downfield on punt coverage (WR in HS) and rec'd 3 fmb's LY. After a surprisingly low finish last year, OU should move back up in my ST rankings.

COACHES - Prior to Bob Stoops' arrival, Oklahoma had 5 consec non-winning seasons. Stoops won a National Title in his 2nd season then played in the National Title game in '03, '04 and '08. OU's 122 wins the last 11 yrs are more than any other BCS team. The OC position has gone from Mike Leach to Mark Mangino to Chuck Long to Kevin Wilson and Stoops has never looked beyond his existing staff to fill it. They have new co-OC's in Josh Leupel (QB chl L6Y) who teams with Jay Norvell (co-OC L2Y). Co-DC's Brent Venables and Bobby Jack Wright (7th year as co-DC) enter their 13th year here.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 2000 Okla did not have a single starter miss a single game due to injury. They stunned the nation winning the Nat'l Title despite not being ranked in the preseason Top 20. In '02 OU won the Big 12 Title and the Rose Bowl. In '03 the Sooners lost the conf title game and the National Title vs LSU. In '04 they were 12-0 but lost the title game vs USC, 55-19. In 2005 OU slumped to 8-4 but then won the Big 12 Title the next 3 years to get to #7, #3 and #2 at the end of the reg season but lost 3 straight BCS gms including 2 large upsets in the Fiesta Bowl and finished #11, #8 and #5. In '09 OU lost QB Bradford and TE Gresham to inj's early on and finished 8-5. Despite their 5-3 B12 record, they were +133 ypg (#1). LY I picked the Sooners as my #1 Surprise Team (they were #7 & #8 in the preseason polls). At the start of the season OU jumped out to big leads (led all by 15+) then let undermanned foes back into those games. They were very impressive vs Florida St leading 47-10 before allowing a 47 yd td pass on the last play. At 6-0 they became the third straight (AP) #1 team to go down with ESPN Gameday on hand as they lost to Missouri. In that game OU had 3 trips inside the MU15 result in zero pts (2 TO, miss FG). At the half, Okla had a 301-99 yd edge but trailed 17-14 as they allowed the opening KR td. After dispatching Colo the redzone difficulties cropped up again. Against A&M they were SOD on 18 lg 3 times, had a fake FG td pass dropped and missed a FG. The Sooners won their next 2 then knocked off #10 Okla St on the road, #13 Neb in the B12 Title game and destroyed #25 Conn in the Fiesta Bowl. They finished 12-2 and #6. The Sooners were +161.3 ypg (B12 by far #1, 65.5 more than #2). There are a couple of concerns as they were +14 in TO's, had 5 net close wins and only had 4 sts lost to injury. OU figures to enter the season #1 in the AP poll and since the standings were introduced in 1998, they have been ranked more weeks at #1 and in the Top 5 than any other program in college football. OU has 16 ret st's, have won seven B12 Titles since 2000 and is the most talented team in the country.

OU has won 5 str games over Tulsa outscoring them by a combined 233-36. In the last meeting ('09) OU got the shutout w/a 529-269 yd edge. The Sooners only series loss S/1979 was in '96 (10-1).

Bonus: OU is 23-2 since 1986 in Norman openers (both losses vs TCU in '96 & '05).

LY was a rematch of the '00 Orange Bowl and OU dominated scoring TD's on their 1st 4 poss (led 44-7 into 4Q). OU has won 5 str vs FSU and is 10-3 in road openers S/'08.

Misleading final LY as OU committed 3 costly TO's (just 6 tll in 1st 5 gms), 2 resulted in 10 pts & the other stopped a drive deep in MU territory. OU led 21-20 into the 4Q before 16 MU unanswered pts.

First meeting. Into 2011, the Sooners have won 11 str vs non-conf/non-BCS opp's at home with the avg score 46-10. Sooners are 10-1 S/'00 prior to the RRR (avg win by 23 ppg).

Only 3 of the L/13 RRR's haven't been decided by DD's. OU hasn't beat UT in B2B yrs S'03 & '04. LY OU raced out to a 14-0 lead & 2 min into the 4Q led 28-10 before holding off UT.

OU is 54-10-2 S/'38 vs KU with 6 str DD wins. There has been no letdown after the RRR as OU has won 12 str the following gm. Under Stoops OU is 29-12 in true B12 AG's.

HT has won 7 str by an avg of 21 ppg. LY's gm was tied 7-7 early 1Q but then the OU def locked down TT all g 0 pts & 259 yds (3.6 ypp). Into 2011, OU won 31 str B12 HG's (last loss in '01).

OU has dominated this series going 70-17-4. In OU's last trip to Manhattan ('08) they jumped out to a 28-7 lead but KSU tied it at 28 before 4 OU TD's to lead 55-28 in a wild 1H (just 10 2H pts).

LY OU trailed 19-0 early 3Q marking the 1st time S'07 the Sooners were shutout in the 1H. OU rallied to pull within 2 but in the 4Q missed a 36-yd FG and were SOD at the A&M 1 & 4 the L/3 drives.

Oklahoma St: LY was one of the wildest Bedlam matchups as QB Jones matched a OU rec w/468 pass yds. The Sooners have won 9 str home finales by 32 ppg.

Stoops' squads have outscored BU on avg 43-13 going 12-0 (OU is 20-0 all-time). OU is 8-3 the L/11 prior to Bedlam (3-3 L/6). Jones was 26-39-67%-325-3-1 in his 1st start vs BU LY.

Prior to the gm last year OU cch's challenged them for a shutout (672-183 ssn best for off & def).

The gm was tied 24-24 into the 4Q as 40 4Q pts were scored including 4 TD's in 92 seconds.
