POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - Boise has had some fine QB's excel in their system in recent years. Bart Hendricks was the Big West OPOY twice ('99 & '00), Ryan Dinwiddie became the career leading passer (9,819) from '00-'03 breaking Danny Wuerffel's NCAA record for career pass eff (168.9) and Jared Zabransky (3 yr str) threw for 2,587 (66%, 23-8) in '06. Four QB's battled for the job in '07 and Taylor Tharp had a fine season throwing for 3,340 (68%, 30-11). In '08 I projected VHT rFr Kellen Moore (PS#24) to win the job even though he was not the starter out of spring. Moore became the first frosh to start the season opener here at QB and showed how much success a VHT could have in this system. He threw for 3,486 (69%, 25-10). He followed that up with a sensational '09 finishing #2 in the FBS in pass eff (161.5) throwing for 3,536 (64%) with an amazing 39-3 ratio. LY he was the FWAA's 1st Tm AA QB and finished 4th in the Heisman voting after throwing for 3,845 (71.3%, 35-6) and leading the NCAA in pass eff (182.6). He also passed Dinwiddie as the career pass leader. Although Mike Coughlin (4-9-36) was listed 2nd string all year, Joe Southwick had more att's (24, 70.8%). This year they lose Coughlin (8 gm) and added to the mix is rFr Grant Hedrick (PS#91). I look for Southwick to gain more PT to prep for next year and while Moore will not improve much upon LY's stats, he could be the best QB in the country. Moore (38-2) needs just 8 wins to pass Colt McCoy (45-8) as the all-time winningest QB in NCAA history.

RUNNING BACKS - Ian Johnson wrapped up his 4 yr career as the school's #2 career rusher. He became the first Boise RB to have 2B's 1,000 yd seasons ('06-'07) since '01-'02 but in his senior year, had just 766 (5.1) and was only 2nd Tm WAC. Spelling Johnson were Jeremy Avery (614, 5.5) and DJ Harper (265, 4.8). Harper (4.43 spd) stepped to the forefront in '09 and led with 284 (6.5) after 3 but tore his ACL. Doug Martin the "Muscle Hamster" who had 107 (4.5) in '08 and moved to DB, ret'd to RB to split duties with Avery. Avery led with 1,151 (5.5) and Martin added 765 (5.9). LY 100% of their rushing yds ret'd. Harper appeared fully recovered but after 3 gms was OFY with another ACL injury (160, 8.9). Martin, now firmly back at RB led with 1,260 (6.3). He also showed his speed on his gm changing 84 yd td run vs Utah. Avery was #2 with 495 (5.2). This year they lose Avery (0 st), Jarvis Hodge (305, 6.6) and Matt Kaiserman (140, 3.6). Not listed in the PSL are Carlo Audagnotti (57" 184 Jr) and Drew Wright (5'9" 198 Jr). Despite losing 3 of the top 5 RB's, this unit could put up even stronger numbers.

RECEIVERS - VHT Jeremy Childs (PS#39) set a school record with 82 grabs (12.7) in '07. True frosh Titus Young (PS#152) and Austin Pettis (PS#127) finished #2 and #3 with 639 (14.5) and 465 (10.1). All 3 ret'd in '08 but Young played in just 3 (susp). Childs and Vinny Perretta combined for 1,380 (12.8) and 9 td's. In '09 they had to replace 3 of their top 4 rec's with the top returnee being Pettis (567, 11.6). Pettis had 855 (13.6) despite missing 1 (inj). Young led with 1,041 (13.2) and TE Kyle Efaw was #3 with 444 (14.3). Tyler Shoemaker (miss 2) had 345 (16.4). LY Young became Boise's all-time leader in rec yds and Pettis the all-time leader in rec's with Young having 1,215 (17.1) and Pettis 951 (13.4). Shoemaker finished a distant #3 at 582 (18.2) and Efaw had 299 (12.5). This year they lose Young (11 st, #2DC DET), Pettis (11 st, #3DC STL), Tommy Gallarda (5 st) and Sean King (5 gm). Naturally with the loss of a pair of career leaders, this unit will be down a few notches.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '08 Boise had their least exp'd O-line of the decade as only 1 of the top 6 ret'd (lost 101 car sts). They used 9 different OL combos and as expected, the numbers dropped to 152 ypg (4.4) but they did allow just 13 sks (3.0%). In '09 they had to replace 2 st'rs and had 40 career sts ret (#101 FBS). The more exp'd unit improved to 186 ypg (5.1) and allowed a paltry 5 sks (1.1%, #1 NCAA). LY they only had to replace 1 st'r (88 car sts ret). As you would expect, they improved again to 200 ypg rush (5.4) with just 8 sks (1.9%, #2 NCAA). This year they lose 2nd Tm WAC RG Will Lawrence (13 st, 2Y str), RT Matt Slater (11 st) and bkp Garrett Pendergast (retired, 6 st 3Y). They return 1st Tm WAC LT Nate Potter and 1st Tm WAC C Thomas Byrd. They have 8 of the top 10 back and the career sts are up to #13 (98). I look for continued improvement.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Boise had 7 of their top 8 DL's back for the 2nd straight year in '06 and allowed just 89 ypg rush (3.2), their best since joining IA. They slipped some the next 2 yrs but were still solid. In '09 they had to replace 4 DL (comb 34 sts) but ret'd star DE Ryan Winterswyk and allowed 120 ypg (3.8). LY the entire 2 deep ret'd and I said Boise could top 2006's dominant rush D totals. They allowed just 2.9 ypc (their best since joining FBS), while yielding 104 ypg rush and their 49 sks were best since 1997 (56). This year they lose 1st Tm WAC DE Winterswyk (13 st, 44 tkl, 9 fl) and JP Nisby (16 tkl, 4.5 fl) but have 6 of their top 8 back including 1st Tm WAC DT Billy Winn, DE Shea McClellin and also 2nd Tm WAC NT Chase Baker. Also returning is PS#39JC Tyrone Crawford, who they planned to RS LY, but he had 32 tkl and 7 sks as a bkp. Adding depth are Darren Koontz (6'3" 281 Jr, PS#279) and David Cushing (6'0" 267 rFr). Even with the loss of Winterswyk, this unit should be just as strong.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 Boise incorporated the NB into the D, which I include with the LB's. LY the entire 2 deep ret'd (8 with st exp) with 4 having been full-time st'rs incl 2nd Tm WAC Winston Venable. They even moved DE Byron Hout (PS#30) to LB and he started 9 until he broke his foot, but still earned 2nd Tm WAC. Boise allowed just 12.8 ypg (#2 NCAA). This year they lose 1st Tm WAC NB Venable (12 st, #4 tkl'r, 9.5 fl), Derrell Acree (4 st, 27 tkl) and Daron Mackey (25 tkl, 1.5 fl). They return 2 st'rs along with bkp JC Percy (3 st) who was the #2 tkl'r and NB Hunter White (1 st, 38 tkl). Not in the PSL are Travis Saxton (6'1" 214 rFr), Billy Derome (5'11" 191 So) and Matt Wilson (6'1" 228 Sr). This unit looks just as strong.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Over the last 9 yrs Boise has been #8, #6, #15, #52, #15, #20, #4, #11 and LY #2 in my PDR. LY they had to replace a #1 DC but had 3 st'rs back incl Brandyn Thompson who was the Def MVP of the Fiesta Bowl who took over for Kyle Wilson as the boundary CB. This year they lose 2nd Tm WAC CB Thompson (13 st, 31 tkl, 3 int,

7 pbu, #7DC WAS), 1st Tm WAC S Jeron Johnson (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 7 pd) and S Jason Robinson (22 tkl, 1 int). They do return 1st Tm WAC S George Iloka, but their returning CB's combined for just 1 int and 3 pbu in '10. As usual, Boise will finish high in my PDR but figures to be down a few notches.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Boise has always had a top-notch ST unit and from '99-'08 they finished #32, #23, #28, #2, #4, #19, #59, #10 and #2. All of their key players were back in '09 and I had them rated as the #1 ST unit in my magazine and they did not disappoint, finishing #1. Kyle Brotzman had a net of 39.6 in '08 and 38.3 in '09 and hit 18-25 FG's (L52) in 2009 but had just 7 TB on 97 KO. LY almost everyone ret'd and it was surprising to me that Boise slid down to #31. Chris Potter was the top PR (13.3) but Titus Young saw his KR avg drop from 26.9 (2 td) to 23.5 (0 td). Brotzman avg 44.1 with a team net of 36.4. Trevor Harman avg 44.7 punting and had 9 TB on 82 KO. Brotzman was a Lou Groza semifinalist but missed 2 crucial FG's vs Nevada gaining him national attention. He leaves as the NCAA's all-time point leader by a kicker and hit 16-23 (L50). With Petersen's track record, they could actually improve in my ST rankings.

COACHES - When Dirk Koetter left for Ariz St (after '00), asst Dan Hawkins took over as HC and went 53-11. When Hawkins left for Colorado in '06, Chris Petersen (OC prev 5Y) took over. Petersen was a Broyles finalist (top asst) twice and his offenses, in a 3 year stretch from 2002-'04, avg'd 45.8 ppg. In his first year as HC Petersen achieved a 13-0 record and a #5 finish. He has a remarkable record of 61-5 with 3 undefeated regular seasons in his 5 yrs! Petersen became the first ever to win the Paul "Bear" Bryant COY Award twice. Bryan Harsin, who was the OC here for 10Y before leaving for Texas, will be replaced by Brent Pease (WR cch 5 yr). Pease initially accepted the OC job at Indiana but ret'd here after Harsin left (2 wks). DC Pete Kwiatkowski is in his second season as DC. He has also been the DL coach for 5 seasons.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Boise St joined the WAC in 2001 and despite coming from the lower level Big West conf, they thoroughly dominated the league for its entire 10 yr stay. While the Broncos didn't win EVERY championship, they went a remarkable 75-5 (94%) in WAC play (+161.2 ypg). In my 2006 magazine I projected Boise to earn a BCS bowl berth. I had to sweat out a couple of games (WY and SJSU) but Boise ran the table then beat Okla in the Fiesta Bowl. They finished #5 in the AP (5th straight WAC Title). In '07 I projected Boise's run of conf champs to end and that's exactly what happened as they finished 10-3 and unranked. In '08 they went 12-1 with their lone loss to TCU in the bowl (by 1) and finished #11. In '09 I listed Boise as the #1 non-BCS team despite having to replace their top RB and WR and they did not disappoint. This time they went a perfect 14-0 and topped TCU in the Fiesta Bowl finishing #4. LY they had an amazing 19 ret st'rs after having the fewest scholarship seniors in the country in '09 (4). After Boise knocked off VT in the opener, not a day went by that Boise and the BCS National Title game were not brought up in the same sentence. Boise went on to win their next 9 by 40.1 ppg and were #3 when they travelled to #19 Nevada. They blew a 24-7 HT lead and missed 2 key FG's and lost in OT. They finished strong beating Utah St 50-14 then waxed #20 Utah in the bowl 26-3 and finished #9. This year Boise moves to the MWC so the competition gets tougher but the conf gave them the huge game vs TCU at home on the blue turf. They've won 8 conf titles the L10Y and will be favored for their 9th. Their early season test vs Georgia will determine whether or not this team will be a National Title contender again as they have 14 ret st'rs including Heisman candidate QB Kellen Moore. If the Broncos get past Georgia, their goal should not just be getting to a BCS bowl but capitalizing on their shot at a National Title berth.
