

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

**OUARTERBACKS** - In HC Mike Sherman's first vr in '08 Jerrod Johnson took over for incumbent senior starter Stephen McGee (shoulder) and in his first 7 sts threw for 263 ypg (64%, 15-4). In his last 3 he threw for 156 (47%, 3-6). McGee threw for just 586 (66%) and was a surprising #4DC. Ryan Tannehill was the team's #1 rec in '08 but also the Aggies' only exp'd bkp QB in '09 as he lobbied Sherman to battle for the QB job. Johnson, despite being under heavy pressure due to a leaky O-line, set several school records throwing for 3,579 (60%, 30-8) to go along with 506 rush (3.5). Tannehill hit just 4-8 (#2 rec). Last season Johnson was the preseason Big 12 OPOY but after shoulder surgery struggled at times to even throw spirals. Due to TO's (9 int, 2 fmbl), he was pulled after 7 sts after he had become A&M's career leader in passing (8,011) and total offense (8,888). Tannehill took over in the 2Q vs Kansas and guided the tm to 6 straight wins while Johnson would not throw another pass and departs. Tannehill threw for 1,638 (65%, 13-6). Battling for the bkp spot are rFr Jameill Showers (PS#41 strongest arm), Matt Joeckel (PS#53), Luke Woodley (6'2" 192 rFr, PS#97), Patrick O'Quinn (6'2" 208 So) and athletic true frosh Johnny Manziel (PS#26 IFS), Tannehill should improve now that he has more reps but keep in mind the last 3 Aggie senior QB's (dating back to Reggie McNeal) have all struggled.

RUNNING BACKS - A&M had just one 1,000 yard rusher from 1999-'09 (Courtney Lewis 1,024 in '03). The top rusher in '08 had just 406 (4.3). The leading returning rusher in '09 was Cyrus Gray (PS#13) who had 363 (4.8) in '08. Gray started 9 and rushed for 757 (4.8) while explosive true frosh Christine Michael (PS#6) led with 844 (5.1) thanks in part to a school rec 97 yd TD run vs Baylor. Last year I said the Aggies should finally produce a 1,000 yd rusher, but didn't know if it would be Michael or Gray. Michael appeared to be on his way as after 8 he rushed for 631 (5.0) but he broke his tibia vs TT (OFY). Gray, who had 195 yds in the first 6, took the feature back role and ran with it. He became A&M's first RB since 1988 to top 100 in 7 consecutive games and the first since 1995 to have a 200 yard game when he had the most ever (223) by an Aggie vs Texas. He finished with 1,133 (5.7). Providing depth are Mister Jones (6'2" 210 rFr, PS#74), Jay Tolliver (5'10" 205 Jr), Byron Jones-Campbell (5'8" 191 Jr) and FB's Andrew Wolridge (6'1" 275 Jr. PS#85) and Garrett Graham (5'10" 208 rFr), Gray and Michael combined for 1,764 (5.4) last year so it will be tough to top those numbers but this is one of the nation's best RB corps.

RECEIVERS - In '08 A&M had to replace its top 3 receivers and the top two WR's turned out to be frosh. Jeff Fuller was #2 with 630 (12.6) setting the school record for rec td's (9) and bkp QB Tannehill (6'4") set the school frosh record for rec yd with 844 (15.3). In '09 Tannehill wasn't on the field full-time due to his bkp QB duties and finished #2 (609, 13.2). Fuller was dominant in the spring but cracked his fibula (miss 4). He still finished #3 (568, 13.9). True frosh Uzoma Nwachukwu led with 708 (17.7) and while only 6'0", catches passes at their highest point with his leaping ability. LY Tannehill played in 5 gms at WR (11 rec) before moving to QB. Fuller shattered Bob Long's (19 from '66-'68) school career td record with 28. Surprisingly, A&M had never produced a 1,000 yd receiver (Robert Ferguson's 885 in '00 was school rec) until Fuller led with 1,066 (14.8) and 12 td. Ryan Swope was #2 with 825 (11.6) with a banged up Nwachukwu having just 407 (11.3) This year they only lose Terrence McCoy (6 st, 9 rec) and not listed below are Taylor Randle (6'0" 190 Sr), Seth Gardner (6'4" 209 Jr) and TE's Connor Fields (6'3" 228 rFr), Tommy Dorman (6'2" 237 Jr, PS#19QB) and Matt Sherman (6'1" 209 Jr), Fuller turned down the NFL and they won't lose their #2 rec to QB this yr.

OFFENSIVE LINE-In '07 A&M's OL had 4 Sr st'rs and opened holes for 212 ypg rush (4.8) with just 16 sks (4.3%). Naturally, the losses were heavy in '08 (21 car sts, 4th fewest FBS) and they had to learn a new system. The numbers plummeted to 89 rush ypg (2.9) with 39 sks (9.5%). In '09 they had 4 st'rs ret and improved to 184 ypg (4.4) with 29 sks (5.7%) despite inj's as Sherman said he was constantly patching holes. LY they had to replace 3 st'rs. I mentioned that despite being less exp'd, they should remain healthier and 4 OL started all 13. Evan Eike had 26 car sts before missing the last 7 and he was replaced by PS#4 true frosh Jake Matthews (last 7 sts at RT, Brian Thomas moved to LG). A&M only slipped a little to 165 ypg (4.1) with 37 sks (7.2%). This year they lose 2nd Tm B12 C Matt Allen (13 st, 1.5Y st'r) but have 9 of the top 10 back with all 5 st'rs being VHT's. This is one of the B12's best O-line.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In '08 A&M had to replace 3 DL st'rs and the unit was overrun yielding 219 ypg rush and 5.2 ypc (worst ypc in 20+ yrs). In '09 they had to replace 2 strs and 2 bkps. After a brief stint on the OL, Lucas Patterson (11 st DT '08) moved back to the DL in Aug (4 ret st exp). The D's sks jumped from 16 to 36, and they also improved their run D yielding "only" 172 ypg (4.6). LY they only had to replace one st'r and 3 DL ret'd who had 5+ sts as they officially switched to the 3-4 under new DC Tim DeRuyter. The more exp'd line helped A&M improve to allowing 130 ypg rush (3.5), their best since '01, with 30 sks. This year they lose DE Patterson (13 st, 50 tkl, 3 sk) but have 5 of the top 6 back. Adding depth is Michael Ebbitt (6<sup>í</sup>4" 275 Sr PS#61). This DL was the most dominant unit in the spring and it should continue to improve in the 2nd yr of the system.

**LINEBACKERS** - With its "Wrecking Crew" defense, A&M used to be known as "Linebacker U" but they have had a dry spell at the position with no former Aggie playing the position in the NFL (in 2010). The '09 group had 10 career sts with 3 of the 4 st'rs being a true frosh, a rFr and a soph. Von Miller starred leading the FBS with 17 sks. LY A&M ret'd their #3, #4, #5, #7, #8 and #13 tkl'rs. Miller (1st Tm AA) led the B12 in sks again (10.5) and became A&M's first Butkus Award winner. This year they lose Miller (13 st, #4 tkl'r, #1DC DEN) and 2nd Tm B12 ILB Michael Hodges (#1 tkl'r, 7.5 tfl). They return their #2 and #3

whichaer houges (#1 kH, 7.5 kH). They feturn their #2 and #3 kH'rs but are less exp'd, lose their star and LY trimmed their ppg allowed from 33.5 to 21.9. This is my only ? on the tm. **DEFENSIVE BACKS** - The Aggies have had some poor finishes in my PDR like #104 in '05, #84 in '07 and #103 in '08. In '09 their 4 st'rs incl'd a true frosh and 2 soph (comb 14 st '08). In the magazine I said that while they were less exp'd but with a stronger front 7, I expected them to move up in my PDR and they did to #61. LY they only had to replace 1 st'r (#6DC) and A&M also got back

CB Coryell Judie (PS#10) who was a projected '09 starter but RS. I called for continued improvement and A&M moved up to #14. This year the entire 2 deep returns including 5 who had 7+ starts LY.

SPECIAL TEAMS - A&M is famous for their "12th Man" ST unit (4 top 10 finishes). In former HC Dennis Franchione's final 2 yrs ('06-'07) they were #27 and #31 in my ST rankings. In Sherman's first 2 vrs ('08-'09) they were #61 and just #98 after ST basically all'd 21 pts in the bowl gm vs Georgia and the ST cch was fired. LY they had everyone back so improvement was expected. Dustin Harris got the tm's first PR TD S/98 (Jason Webster). A&M has an excellent LS in Ben Bredthauer. Randy Bullock had mono in Aug and did not regain his leg strength until later in the yr. He hit 12-19 (L50) in '09 and improved to 16-21 (L50) in '10 with 13 TB on 77 KO. Coryell Judie (30.2) became the first Ággie to have a KR td in B2B wks. Ken Wood and Ryan Epperson split the P duties in '09. Epperson took command in '10 but missed 2 (Wood 14 punts). The team avg 35.7 ypg with a 34.0 net (both last in the B12). A&M improved some to #57. TY all of the key players ret and they will easily have the best finish in Sherman's 4 years.

**COACHES** - Mike Sherman took over in '08 and was previously the OL cch here from '89-'93 and '95-'96. He was an NFL HC at GB (57-39 with 4 playoff trips) from '00-'05 and the OC of the HOU Texans in '06 & '07. Sherman will serve as his own OC for a 2nd season and the QB coach is Tom Rossley who has been here S/'08 (GB OC from '00-'06). The 2nd year DC is Tim DeRuyter who was the DC at AF ('07-'09) and Ohio ('95-'98, '02-'04) as well as co-DC at Nevada ('05-'06). After a successful debut season, he interviewed for the Tulsa HC job.

# PHIL'S FORECAS

A&M took a streak of 20 consec non-losing yrs into Dennis Franchione's first season in '03. In his first 4 yrs he had Holiday and Cotton Bowl berths but also TWO losing seasons. In '07 they had a killer schedule and after opening up 6-2 they lost to the #9, #5 and #7 tms but then did knock off #11 Texas for a 2nd st year. Franchione stepped down and Gary Darnell was the interim HC for the bowl (7-6). In '08 A&M had just 10 ret st'rs and a new HC in Mike Sherman. They were upset by Ark St in the opener and then suffered their worst non-conf defeat at Kyle Field S/88 in a 41-23 loss to Miami, Fl. Their 4 wins in '08 tied the '03 squad for fewest in a season since '72 (3-8). It was the first time A&M finished either tied or below Baylor in the Big 12 South. A&M was -147 ypg (2nd worst) in conf play and -10 in TO's. The '09 squad had 16 ret st'rs and had a better than expected season as they got to a bowl despite playing a schl record 18 true frosh (6-7). Interestingly, back in '90 they played 16 true frosh and in '91 followed that up with an SWC Title (10-1, only loss by 1 pt). LY coming off B2B losing seasons for the first time since 1972-1973, A&M made my Most Improved List and was picked 3rd in the South by the Big 12 media. The Aggies opened 3-0 but then QB Johnson's 5 TO's cost them vs Okla St and they lost by 3 despite a 535-351 yd edge. They lost to Ryan Mallett and Ark by 7 and then were stunned by MO 30-9. A&M rolled over KU on the road then TT fumbled into the EZ twice for TB's and A&M won by 18. They switched their QB to Tannehill who cut down on the TO's and threw for 449 vd and 4 td in his 1st start vs TT. The D stepped up in the RZ vs OU stopping the Sooners 3 times. All of OU's SOD's were inside the 2 (4 trips I20 for 0 pts). They trailed Baylor 30-14 but rallied for a 42-30 win. Nebraska was hit with 16 pen's for 145 yds while A&M had just 2 pen's for 10 yds. NU QB Martinez was also hobbled in the 2H and A&M escaped with a 3 pt win. Versus a desperate Texas team needing to win to qualify for a bowl, A&M won 24-17 on Thanksgiving night with UT getting int'd at the A&M 8 at the end. LSU throttled them 41-24 in the bowl. Of their top 50 players on the 2 deep, just 6 were seniors. A&M was +57.8 ypg in B12 (4th best) and TY gets 5 HG's in B12 play. They did have just 4 sts lost to inj all year. The Aggies get both Texas and Okla St at home and all NINE sets of my power ratings call for their first double digit win season since 1998.
