POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2011

QUARTERBACKS - In '08 Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 (61%, 25-10) and was the #1 overall pick in the NFL draft. Joe Cox (PS#8) took over in '09 as a 5th yr Sr. He had 58 career passes (432 yds). He put up decent numbers throwing for 2,584 (24-15) but only comp 56%. Mobile Logan Gray (PS#19) hit 5-12 (2 int). UGA's 17 int's were their most S/Y84. Two rFr in Aaron Murray (PS#6) and Zach Mettenberger (PS#24) battled for the QB job last spring. Mettenberger was dismissed leaving the job to Murray and Gray moved to WR. As a Fr, Murray actually had a higher pass eff rating (154.5) than Stafford did as a Jr and also higher than Stanford's Andrew Luck in his rFr ssn. Murray threw for 3,049 (61.1%, 24-8) which was the 2nd highest ever for a Fr in the SEC (UK's Jared Lorenzen 3,687 in '00) and showed mobility (358 gross rush). True frosh Hutson Mason (PS#43) played in 4 hitting 9-17-102 becoming the 2nd QB in NCAA history to throw a td on his 1st career pass. Added to the mix TY are Christian LeMay (PS#4) and Greg Bingham (6'4" 223 rFr). This unit goes from having zero career att's to one that returns a QB who finished #14 in the FBS in pass eff.

RUNNING BACKS - Surprisingly heading into '07 UGA had just one 1,000 yd back S/Y92! In '07 rFr Knowshon Moreno (PS#14, 1334, 5.4) was the first 1st Tm SEC RB here since Garrison Hearst in '92. In '08 Moreno became the 2nd back in UGA history (Herschel Walker) to have B2B 1,000 yd efforts (#1 SEC, 1400, 5.6). RFr Caleb King (PS#7) rushed for 247 (4.0) but after missing a key blk had just 1 att over the L4 gm. Moreno left early (#1DC) and King was the frontrunner to start in '09 but missed the 1st 2 (inj). Richard Samuel led in each of the first 3 and finished with 395 (4.5). King was #2 with 594 (5.2) in 5 sts. They took the RS off Washaun Ealey (PS#3) in the 3Q of gm 5. Ealey led with 717 (5.7). LY the top 2 ret'd and they moved Samuel to LB. King was the best pass protecting RB. Ealey was susp'd the first gm and King missed 2 (inj) then 2 more (susp) midyear. Ealey had 2 crucial fmbles early and King got the unit's first 100 yd gm vs Colo but did fmb! at the end. Ealey rushed for 123 vs VU and had a school rec 5 rush tds vs UK. Ealey spr'd his MCL and had just 37 yds vs UF but 118 vs GT. Soph Carlton Thomas (PS#35) was #3 with 272 (4.2). King had 430 (5.4) and Ealey led with 811 (5.2). Not listed below are Wes Van Dyk (6'0" 204 Jr) and FB's Dustin Royston (5'11" 232 So) and Chris Young (6'1" 230 So). TY they lose both FB's in Shaun Chapas (9 yr, 73 tkl yds, #7DC DAL) and Fred Munzmaier (3 st, 92 tkl yds) and Ealey decided to transfer after spring. With Ealey's departure, true frosh Isaiah Crowell (PS#4) will be counted on heavily and could win the starting job!

RECEIVERS - In '08 the Bulldogs ret'd their #2 rec Mohamed Massaquoi (PS#5, 491, 15.3 in '07) and added exciting true frosh AJ Green (PS#3). They formed the best duo in the SEC with Green leading with 963 (17.2) and Massaquoi adding 920 (15.9). In '09 they had to replace Massaquoi (#2DC) and Green (miss 3) was inj'd (808, 15.2). RFr Tavares King (PS#6) was a distant #2 with 377 (20.9). Richt has sent four TE's to the NFL since his arrival, but the '09 TE's comb for just 38 rec's. LY the receiving unit took a big hit with Green missing the first 4 (susp). Green still easily led with 848 (14.9). Kris Durham (PS#34) was #2 with 659 (#3 FBS 20.6 ypc). King only started 5 but had 504 (18.7). TE Orson Charles (PS#2) looks like he has an NFL future (422, 16.2). This year they lose Green (8 st, #1DC CIN), Durham (8 st, #4DC SEA) and Logan Gray (9 rec). This unit will be weaker in '11 with the loss of the #1 WR taken in the draft, but will not drop off as much as you might think.

OFFENSIVE LINE - UGA had a veteran OL in '09 but only improved to 161 ypg rush (4.7) although their 12 sks all'd were best in the SEC. They did avg 243 ypg (5.9) rush over the L5. LY they had an amazing 155 career sts ret so I expected big time improvement. Stuningly the rush ypg fell to 143 (4.1) and they all'd 25 sks (7.0%). They even burned the RS of true frosh Kenarious Gates (3 st, 7 gm). TY they lose RT Josh Davis (11 st, 2Y str), 1st Tm SEC Clint Boling (13 st, 4Y str, #4DC CIN), Chris Davis (3 st, 3Y str), Tanner Strickland (3 st) and Ben Harden (3 gm). Trinton Sturdivant (PS#4, 6'5" 312, 7 st) tore his ACL in spg (3rd tear) and his career may be over. While this unit is far less exp'd than LY, they still have 86 career sts and can only improve upon their unexpectedly poor '10 ssn.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '09 UGA had to replace 2 DL str's and all'd 126 rush ypg (3.4). LY they had to replace 3 plyrs (comb 26 sts) who were #4, #7 and #7 DC's. DC Grantham's system is similar to Bama's and requires a massive NT (called Nose). They basically had 1 str back and slipped allowing 147 ypg (3.7, 24 sk). This year the Bulldogs must replace DeDemarcus Dobbs (11 st, #13 tkl'r, 1 sk), DE Brandon Wood (1 st, 16 tkl, 1 sk) and DE Kiantie Tripp (13 tkl, 1.5 sk). They landed a big Nose in 340 lb PS#5JC Jonathan Jenkins and move PS#3 DeAngelo Tyson to DE and will be much stronger up front.

LINEBACKERS - LY UGA had to replace 1st Tm SEC Rennie Curran (#1 tkl'r, #3DC) and 2 bkp LB (6 st, 32 tkl combined). They shifted to a 3-4 and 2nd Tm SEC DE Justin Houston moved to LB and was the top returning sk man in the SEC. Houston impressed me as he was the #3 tkl'r but also had 10 sks, 8.5 tfl and a mind-boggling 44 qbh (1st Tm AA). UGA's LB corps was banged up in both '08 and '09 and was healthier LY improving to 22.1 ppg. TY they lose Houston (13 st, #3DC KC), OLB Darryl Gamble (7 st, #7 tkl'r, 3.5 tfl), 2nd Tm SEC ILB Akeem Dent (13 st, #1 tkl'r, #3DC ATL) and Marcus Dowlin (2 st, #4 tkl'r). They add in USC transfer Jarvis Jones (PS#23) and TJ Stripling (PS#9) who played in 5 as a true (inj). They also moved PS#10 RB Richard Samuel in (395, 4.8 '09, RS '10) and they add PS#5DB Alec Ogletree and true frosh PS#3 Ray Drew. UGA's D has underperformed recently and while this unit is less exp'd and loses two 3rd RD DC's, they could surprise.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UGA had a veteran secondary in '08 but after finishing #8 and #17 in my PDR, they surprisingly dropped to #57. In '09 they had to replace 2 str's (#3DC) and had a lower than expected finish at #74. LY they had to replace 3 str's (#5DC). The unit was my biggest concern but played better than I expected (#29, 54.9%, 15-16). After giving up 380 pass yds to Ark, they shook up the secondary with S Jaker Hamilton and CB Vance Cuff (4.24 spd) being replaced by Shawn Williams and Sanders Commings. TY they lose CB Cuff (5 st, 22 tkl) and Chad Gloer (9 tkl) but have 6 of the top 8 back with all 6 having 3+ sts LY.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In the last 10Y UGA has had 8 Top 24 finishes (5 top 7) in my ST rankings. In '09 P Drew Butler (PS#21), whose father Kevin is the only K in the CFB HOF, won the Ray Guy (net 41.9). Blair Walsh had 17 TB's on 75 KO's in '09 and almost set a UGA single ssn FG accuracy rec (missed 55 yd FG into the wind). He hit 20-22 FG's (L53, four 50+). Brandon Boykin became the 2nd SEC ply'r to have 3 KR td's in the same yr (Willie Gault, UT, '80). LY '09 Groza finalist Walsh broke the UGA rec for consec PAT's (Brandon Coutu '07, 114) with 119 (ended vs UK). LS TY Fris's father was a LS here in the magical '80 ssn. Butler was a Ray Guy finalist again LY (44.5, 40.6 net) and with Walsh forms the best K/P combo in the country. UGA has had 3 AA K's in Allan Leavitt ('76), Rex Robinson ('79-'80) and Kevin Butler ('83-'84). Brandon Boykin became the sch'l's career KR leader with 1,813 (Gene Washington 1637, '73-'76). Brandon Smith did well at PR (14.3). I had UGA #5 in my pressn ST rankings LY and they finished #7. With everyone back I feel the Dawgs have the best ST unit in the country.

COACHES - Richt is now in his 11th ssn here and earned SEC COY honors in '02 and '05. He was the OC at Flor St from '94-'00. Richt turned the playcalling over to Mike Bobo prior to the GT game in '06. Bobo was a QB here and the QB chg S/'01 and became the youngest coor in the SEC (32) in '07. DC Todd Grantham has 11 yrs of NFL coaching exp (DAL DL '08-'09, CLE '05-'07). LY he was the 3rd highest paid FBS asst.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In Richt's 2nd ssn ('02) he led UGA to their first SEC Title in 20 yrs and set a school record with 13 wins (#3 AP). In '03 they finished 11-3 and #7. In '04 they beat FL for 1st time S/'97 and finished 10-2, #7. In '05 they had to replace 6 NFL DC's and my publication was the only one to call for UGA to win the SEC East as everyone else had them finishing 3rd. They nearly went undefeated but QB DJ Shockley was inj'd and they lost to UF without him. Richt still won his 2nd SEC Title thrashing LSU 34-14 in the SEC Title game but after an upset loss to WV in the Sugar Bowl, they finished #10. Only UGA and USC finished in the Top 10 each year from '02-'05. UGA's D finished in the top 20 for 7 straight yrs ('01-'07). Richt became just the 5th SEC HC to win 10+ in 4 str yrs (Bryant, Dooley, Fulmer, Spurrier). In '06 they had just 9 ret str's and finished 9-4 (#23). In '07 they were picked #3 in the East by the media. I had the only magazine to pick them to win the SEC East and I had them tying for the Title. They tied for the SEC East Title and after beating Hawaii in the Sugar Bowl 41-10, finished #2 (AP). In '08 they were tagged #1 in the pressn AP poll. Of the 14 sources from football.stassen.com, 10 had UGA either #1 or #2 overall, but I had UGA 2nd in the East mostly due to a killer schedule. UGA finished 10-3 and ranked #13. In '09 they were #13 in the pressn AP but surprisingly slipped to 8-5 (-21.0 ypg SEC). Last year I did not put Richt on my "Coaches On The Hotseat" list as I figured he could survive a losing season and that proved accurate. Their best off player, WR Green, was susp'd the first 4 and the off struggled losing close ones to Ark, Miss St and Colo and they actually opened up 1-4. After topping 40 pts vs Tenn, VU and UK with Green back, UF had the advantage of a bye and UGA came up 3 pts short in OT. UGA led eventual Nat'l Champ Auburn 21-7 into the 2Q but lost 49-31 and needed a win over GT just to get to a bowl. It was a disappointing bowl as on their opening drive they opted to kick a FG on 4th & inches (from the UCF3) letting UCF know they'd be in it the entire way and UGA lost 10-6 for their first losing ssn S/'96! UGA finished 6-7 despite benefitting from +10 TO's but they did have 4 net close losses. UGA has 12 ret str's and signed some key newcomers who should have a huge impact. UGA is one of my Most Improved Teams and is my upset pick to win the SEC East.

The first & only meeting was in the '05 opener. UGA won 48-13 in Athens w/a 574-292 yd edge. Georgia Dome is home to the NFL Falcons. UGA was 1-5 LY in reg ssn neutral/AG's (worst mark S'90).
The winner of this series has scored just 20 pts or less in 8 of the L10 meetings. UGA has won 7 of the L9 vs SC but LY were held to ssn lows in pts (6), FD's (11) & yds (253).
First meeting. Chanticleers went 6-6 LY (FCS playoffs) including a 31-0 loss vs WV. CCU first started playing football in '03, 4th str yr facing a BCS team losing the first 3, 146-13.
Bulldogs have won the L/8 by 13 ppg. In the L/trip to Oxford ('06) UGA struggled as they were down 3-0 at HT but pulled out a 14-9 win. Under Richt, UGA is 8-2 in true road openers (0-2 L2Y).
UGA had a series high 9-gm win streak snapped LY. UGA trailed 24-6 late 4Q before a garbage TD but did fun into EZ (1H) & had a PR fum. UGA hasn't dropped 2 str vs MSU since 1951 & '56.
Bulldogs have been hammered their L/2 trips to Knoxville ('07 & '09). They have been outscored on avg 40-17 (outgained 442-242), in '09 UGA was held w/o an off TD & in '07 trailed 28-0.
Georgia has won 9 str trips to Nashville, eight by DD's (L/loss in '91, 16-1-1 since 1975). Coming into 2011 under Richt the Bulldogs are 27-8 in true SEC road gms (1-3 LY).
Auburn: LY UGA jumped out to a 21-7 lead after 1Q (162-93 yd edge).
Kentucky: Since '91 UGA is 17-3 vs the Wildcats with the avg W by 16 ppg & avg L by 6 ppg.
LY Georgia trailed 21-7 at HT & 21-10 into the 4Q. The Bulldogs forced OT (first time in series 88 meetings) with a 21 pt 4Q. In OT UGA was int at the UF7 & lost on a 37 yd FG.
UGA is 3-0 vs NMST (L/gm in '02). The Bulldogs won 41-10 but had just 17-16 FD & 299-275 yd edges. Into 2011, UGA has won 32 str non-conf/non-GT HG's (last lost vs SMiss in '96).
LY UGA only trailed 35-31 but ran 11 plays (2.2 ypp) to the Tigers 20 (5.3 ypp, 14 pts) in the final Q.
The home team has dropped 3 str. LY Ealey set a UGA rec w/5 rush TD's (157 yds, 5.6 ypc).
This rivalry has been ply'd in the reg ssn finale 57 of the L/58 yrs. UGA has beaten GT in 9 of the L10 yrs incl 5 str in Atlanta. LTH Georgia rushed for a Richt era high 339 yds (7.7).
