POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - The only red QB with exp here in '09 was still Tyler Wilson (PS#32) who hit 11-22-69 (2 gm) as a true but RS. They brought in VHT Michigan transfer Ryan Mallett (PS#1) who had NFL size and arm strength. Mallett won the job and broke a lot of Clint Stoerner's ('96-'99) records with 3,624 (56%, 30-7). Wilson played in 5 (218, 61%). Petrino said he wanted Mallett to break Kevin Scanlon's 1979 comp % rec (64%). At home Mallett completed 68% (327 ypg). On the road he hit just 43% (223 ypg) but faced 4 top 20 pass D's. Mallett set the % mark in '10 throwing for 3,869 (65%, 32-12). Wilson played 2.5Q's vs Aub (Mallett inj) and had a pass eff rating of 182.6 despite two 4Q int's. Wilson played in 6 (453, 67%, 4-3). LY Mallett left (#3DC) as Ark's career passing leader in just 2 yrs but I still tagged Wilson press 2nd Tm SEC in my magazine. Wilson took a lot of hits but got up each time and threw for 3,638 (63.2%, 24-6). Athletic Brandon Mitchell played in 9 (271, 68.8%, 2-1). Wilson had school rec's of 510 yds vs A&M (Mallett, 409 in '10), 32 comp vs Miss St (31 Joe Ferguson in '71), 277 comp's and 438 att's (Mallett, 266-411 in '10) and a record streak of 184 passes without an int. TY Wilson returns with experience and earned 1st Tm SEC (1st time in school hist for QB) as a first year starter.

RUNNING BACKS - In '10 Ark had a veteran unit incl Broderick Green (PS#9) who led in '09 with 442 (4.2). Knile Davis (4.29 spd), who benches 415 lbs, took over at midseason and had games of 110, 182, 187, 152 and 139 and finished with 1,322 (6.5) and 13 td's (1st Tm SEC). Green was a distant #2 with 365 (3.5). Ronnie Wingo (PS#12, size, strength, speed), had 253 (6.2). LY Green tore his ACL (spg) and Davis was OFY mid-Aug (brk ankle). Green ret'd earlier than expected and had 260 (3.8). Dennis Johnson (PS#112), who had 342 (6.0) in '09 and RS in '10, led with 670 (6.3) and Wingo added 458 (4.4). TY they lose Green and DeAnthony Curtis (119, 5.9) but add in Kody Walker (6'2" 240 rFr, PS#441) and get back Davis, who almost ret'd at the end of LY, making this a vastly upgraded RB corps.

RECEIVERS - In '09 Greg Childs led with 894 (18.6) while Jarius Wright (PS#36) added 681 (16.6). Joe Adams (PS#25, miss 3) was #3 (568, 19.6) and DJ Williams (#1 '08, 723, 11.3) had 411 (12.8). Speedy true frosh Cobi Hamilton had 347 (18.3). In '10 Childs was #1 (659, 14.3) when he was lost after 8 games (inj). Adams led with 813 (16.3) and Wright was #2 (788, 18.8). Williams won the John Mackey Award (627, 11.6) and Hamilton had 630 (19.7). LY they had to replace Williams (#5DC). Wright set a school rec with 281 (Mike Reppond '71) vs A&M and led with 1,117 (16.9, 4th Tm AA). Adams had 652 (12.1) and new TE Chris Gragg was #4 (518, 12.6) while Hamilton had 542 (15.9). TY they lose Childs (2 st, 240, 11.4, #4DC MIN), Wright (12 st, #4DC MIN), Adams (11 st, #4DC

CAR) and suffered the tragic loss of TE Garrett Uekman (died in Nov). This will still be a solid, productive unit but clearly is weaker with the loss of 3 DC's.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 Ark had to replace a 1st Tm SEC RG (#5DC) but had 4 st's back although their C lost his job. The Hogs improved to 149 ypg (4.6, 28 sk). Last year they had to replace three 3 year starters (1st Tm SEC LT). The line improved as the season went on but as expected, their numbers dropped (137, 4.3, 28 sk). TY they lose OG Grant Cook (13 st) and OT Grant Freeman (13 st). Ark returns the same 2 st's they did LY in 2nd Tm SEC Alvin Bailey and C Travis Swanson and also see their ret car sts jump up to 65 TY (35 LY).

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 Ark lost 2 st's but had 8 back who earned sts in '09. UA improved to 37 sks, but the rush D slipped to 163 ypg (4.0). LY they had to replace 1 st'r but had 5 back who st'd 5+. DL cch Bobby Allen said he'd never been around a better group (depth and talent) of DT's and NG's and felt they could play a 6 man rotation with no drop off. DE Robert Thomas suffered a leg injury vs A&M (F/5 st, none after). Their top DL, Jake Bequette, missed 3 and DE Tenarius Wright missed 5. The Hogs struggled with those players out and allowed 168 ypg rush (4.3, 29 sk) despite playing significantly better in the 2H of year. This year they lose their top guy in 1st Tm SEC DE Bequette (10 st, 28 tkl, 10 sk, #3DC NE) and DT Zach Stadler (3 st, 24 tkl) but have 6 of the top 8 back and should allow under 4.0 ypc for the first time s/06.

LINEBACKERS - Last year the Hogs had to replace 1 st'r (#4 tkl'r, 12.5 tfl) and 2 bkps (29 tkl). They ret'd 2nd Tm SBC MLB Jerry Franklin and 3rd Tm SEC Jerico Nelson (#2 tkl'r). They also added in VHT Alonzo Highsmith (PS#11JC, IFS). Ark only improved to yielding 22.2 ppg (23.4 '10). TY they lose 2x 2nd Tm SEC MLB Franklin (13 st, #1 tkl'r, 10 tfl), Nelson (6 st, #5 tkl'r, 5.5 tfl, 2 int) and Ross Rasner (#7 tkl'r) moves to S. They return their #3 tkl'r and add in DE Wright but with the loss of the first player in school history to lead the team in tkl's for 4 straight years, I'll call them down a few notches.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Hogs finished #11 in my PDR in '06 and with a veteran unit in '07 were #1 (46%, 20 int!). In '08 they had to replace all 4 st's and as you would expect, dropped to #59. The Hogs had to replace 4 DB (comb 17 st) in '09 then both CB's were OFY (comb 3 st). The Hogs slid to #80 (59%, 22-13). In '10 UA had to replace 2 DB (comb 12 st, 85 tkl) but Isaac Madison ret'd (ACL '09). The Hogs rose to #31 (55%, 13-11). LY they had to replace 2 st's and I speculated they could be just as good and UA finished #33 (57%, 12-12) despite the fact that just 2 DB's st'd 11+ games (banged up). TY they lose CB Greg Gatson (9 st, 29 tkl), 3rd Tm SEC FS Tramain Thomas (11 st, #2 tkl'r, 5 int, 6 pbu), SS Elton Ford (2 st, 39 tkl) and CB Madison (4 st, 29 tkl, 4 pbu). They return 3 with 6+ sts and add in OLB Rasner (3 st LY) making them equally exp'd to LY. Expect the Hog secondary to stay healthier and potentially improve.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Arkansas had finished #94 in my ST rankings in '07 and in Petrino's first year ('08) was #94 again. Petrino hired John L. Smith (now HC) to oversee the unit. The '09 unit finished #79 and moved up to #55 in '10. LY PR Joe Adams (15.6, 1 td, '10) avg 16.9 with an SEC record tying 4 td's! He became just the 7th SEC player to have 2 PR td's in the same gm. Adams was named SEC STPOY and the FWAA RM of Yr. Dennis Johnson was the top KR (25.6, 1 td). Zach Hocker (PS#20) hit 16-19 FG (L/51) as a true and LY hit 21-27 FG (L/50) with an outstanding 40 TB's on 93 KO. P Dylan Breeding (42.5 '10) improved to 45.3 (37.6 net). The specialists are back and even with the loss of the inaugural winner of the Johnny Rodgers Award (pg 336) in Adams, they could come close to LY's #4 finish.

COACHES - Arkansas becomes the 3rd BCS program in just 2 ssn to lose a HC after spring practices. In Bobby Petrino's 3rd season he led the Hogs to their first ever BCS bowl and school record tying 11 wins. Hog fans' excitement was at an all-time high but Petrino was let go because of off-field issues. John L. Smith was the Weber St (alma mater) HC for 4.5 months before returning as he was the OLB cch and ST coor here the L3Y. Smith signed a 10 month contract. He previously was a HC at Mich St ('03-'06), Louisville ('98-'02), Utah St ('95-'97) and Idaho ('89-'94). OC Garrick McGee left to become the UAB HC and Bobby's brother Paul Petrino returns (Bobby's OC '03-'09 before L2Y at Illinois). New DC Paul Haynes was Ohio St's DB coach for 6Y and their co-DC LY. LB and asst HC Tarver Johnson handled the interim role during Spring practices.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Prior to '04, Ark went to 6 consec bowls matching a school rec set by Lou Holtz ('77-'82) and Ken Hatfield ('84-'89). Unfortunately for just the 3rd time in 61 yrs ('52-'53 and '96-'97), they suffered B2B losing seasons in '04 and '05. Despite their 2-6 record in SEC play in '05, they were +31 ypg! They outgained #4 UGA 332-217 (lost by 3) and lost to #3 LSU by 2 (2 miss FG) both on the road. In '06 they had the most ret sts in the SEC (18). Even coming off a 4-7 season I picked the Hogs #13 with the majority of the other magazines not having them ranked. Ark made it to the SEC Title gm and rose as high as #5! Their losses in '06 were to the #6, #9, #4 and #6 tms. In '07 the Hogs had just 12 ret sts (pressn #21). They were a disappointing 7-4 when they stunned #1 LSU in Death Valley in 3OT. Surprisingly Nutt stepped aside under strong fan pressure and with an interim HC they lost 38-7 in the Cotton Bowl. In Petrino's 1st ssn ('08) with just 9 ret sts, I picked a team that had been to 2 straight NY Day bowls and had 3 non-BCS foes on the sked to have a losing season. The Hogs finished just 5-7 but despite a 2-6 SEC record, were +0.1 ypg and -9 in TO's. In '09 they drew both Fla and UGA from the East but still made my Most Improved List for the 2nd time in 4 yrs. The Hogs did not disappoint me (8-5). In '10 they had 17 ret sts incl QB Mallett and Vandy replaced Florida on the sked. Two of my 9 sets of power ratings called for the Hogs to go 12-0 and they nearly accomplished that as they led Bama 20-14 in the 4Q. Vs eventual Nat'l Champ Auburn, Ark lost QB Mallett in the 2Q but still led 43-37 in the 4Q with bkp Wilson in. The Hogs were 10-2 and their +101 ypg led the SEC (Nat'l Champ Aub +92). In the Sugar Bowl vs Ohio St, they were int'd at the OSU 17 with :58 left. The Hogs' #12 finish was their best s/88 (also #12). LY they had to face both LSU and Bama on the road which had me picking them 3rd in the SEC West. Ark opened strong going 3-0 (avg win 47-13) and then as expected, lost to Bama 38-14 on the road. They trailed Ark-Miss 35-17 at half (outgained 204-284) but won 42-38. After dispatching Auburn they had a couple of 11:00 am starts at Miss and at Vandy. They trailed Ole Miss 17-0 in the 2Q but won 29-24. Vandy led 28-20 and was at the Ark1 but fumbled and Ark ret'd it 94 yds for a td, a 14 pt swing and instead of trailing by 15, Ark was tied at 28 and won by 3. They dominated SC, Tenn and Miss St at home by 28 ppg. It was #3 Ark vs #1 LSU and Ark led 14-0 but lost by 24 being outgained 494-254. In the Cotton Bowl they beat K-St 29-16 and finished #5. TY the Hogs get both LSU and Ala at home and are more exp'd with 13 ret sts including their QB but now face the ssn without Petrino. They benefitted from 3 net close wins LY and draw SC out of the East. I had Ark down as a Nat'l Title contender prior to the spring and this is a very dangerous team.

After all'g an onside kick while holding a 5 pt lead UA secured the win with a int at their own 40. Razorbacks have dominated this series winning 17 st. In the L/gm ('08) TU tied the gm at 23-23 late 3Q but UA returned the ensuing KO 96 yds for a GW td. TU's final drive was SOD in UA territory w/41 left.

Series started & played every yr S'92, UA has won 3 str. LTH it was tied 7-7 before UA exploded to a 41-10 lead.

LTHMSU forced OT w/a 25 yd fg. In 2OT (afterturn/miss fg in 1st OT) UA got a td & held on 4D from the UA12.

The home team has won the L/4. LY after a score-less 1Q that saw just 99 tll yds the tms combined for 352Q pts. UA only trailed 24-17 into the 4Q but was held to just 24 yds with 2 TO's in the final quarter.
