

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - Drew Stanton left after '06 as MSU's #2 career passer (#2DC). Brian Hoyer (PS#23) took over in '07 and left as the #3 career passer. Hover was the first QB to take the Spartans to B2B bowls s/90 and is now Tom Brady's bkp at NE. Kirk Cousins was Hoyer's bkp and surprisingly beat out Okla transfer Keith Nichol (PS#7) in '09. The 2 alt'd snaps early but Cousins took command and threw for 2,680 (60%, 19-9) while Nichol threw for 764 (54%, 7-3). Andrew Maxwell (PS#32) was impressive on the scout team. In '10 they moved Nichol to WR and Cousins tied Stanton's MSU rec of 16 str gms with a td pass. He threw for 2,825 (67%, 20-10) despite missing a lot of practice time in the final month (inj). Maxwell played in just 5 gms (11-25-123). LY Cousins became the 2nd MSU player ever to be a captain for 3 seasons (Robert McCurry 1946-'48). After becoming the 1st Spartan QB to beat Michigan 3 str ssns, Cousins hit Nichol with a 44 yd Hail Mary td on the final play to beat Wisc. He finished with numerous school records (comp, pass yd, td pass, pass eff, ttl off) and on the year threw for 3,316 (63.7%, 25-10, #4DC WAS). Maxwell played in just 4 gms (18-26-171) while Connor Cook (PS#45) RS. Despite a spring knee inj, Maxwell has been groomed to be the starter for the last 2 years. Naturally, this unit looks weaker losing a 3 year record-setting starter.

RUNNING BACKS - In HC Dantonio's first year ('07) he nearly had a pair of 1,000 yd rushers as Javon Ringer had 1,447 (5.9) while Jehuu Caulcrick had 872 (3.9) with 21 rush td's. In '08 they lost Caulcrick and Ringer got 92% of the RB carries. While he avg a pedestrian 4.2 ypc, he was the key to their offense with 1,637 and 22 td's (#5DC). In '09 the big news was the signing of 2 VHT true frosh in Edwin Baker (PS#10) and Larry Caper (PS#21). Caper led with just 468 (3.9) while Baker burned his RS in Wk 7 and was #2 (427, 5.0). In '10 Caper missed the first 2 gms and Le'Veon Bell (PS#106) became the first Spartan true frosh RB to top 100 in his first game (141). Caper became more of a 3rd down back (144, 3.8) and Bell had 549 in the first 6 but hit the wall after an inj with just 56 in the final 7. Baker became iust the 6th MSU soph to rush for 1,000 (1201, 5.8, 13 td), LY all 3 were back and I thought the Spartans would rank among the rush leaders in the Big Ten but they shockingly finished #11. Bell led with 948 (5.2) and Baker was benched after struggling with fumbles finishing #2 with 665 (only 3.9). Caper was #3 with 116 (3.9) and rFr Nick Hill (PS#49) added 113 (3.9). This year

they lose Baker (#7DC SD) but with a more veteran O-line, I look for significantly improved rushing numbers.

RECEIVERS - In '10 Mark Dell (PS#22) led with 788 (15.5) while BJ Cunningham was #2 (611, 12.2). Keshawn Martin was the #3 rush (157) and rec (394, 12.3) while conv QB Keith Nichol (262, 11.9) struggled with nagging in s. LY the Spartans had to replace Dell. Cunningham teamed with Cousins to form a strong combo and became MSU's career leader in rec's and rec yds as he led with 1,306 (16.5, #6DC MIA). Martin was #2 with 777 (11.8, #4DC HOU) and TE Brian Linthicum was #3 (364, 11.7). Nichol added 352 (13.5) incl the 44 yd Hail Mary winner against the Badgers. This year those 4 all depart with the leading returnee being TE Dion Sims (PS#8) who had 99 (8.2). They do add in Tenn transfer DeAnthony Arnett (PS#9) who could possibly be eligible this year. This is an inexperienced unit with an inexperienced QB so I expect reduced numbers.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 the Spartans had to replace a 1st Tm B10 LT and 2 other st'rs (43 car sts ret). While the sacks rose from 14 to 24 (6.4%), they improved to 152 ypg rush (4.5). LY they had to replace 3 st'rs (2nd Tm B10 LT) and again ret'd 2 st'rs (57 car st) while also adding in PS#50JC Fou Fonoti and DL Dan France who both won starting jobs. MSU lost C Blake Treadwell to inj after 3 sts (5 st DL '10). The numbers dropped to 138 ypg (3.9) but with just 16 sks (3.5%). TY they lose their top OL in LG Joel Foreman (13 st, 4Y st'r, 1st Tm B10) who was the first Spartan OL to start 4 consec seasons s/88 (Tony Mandarich) and bkp Jared McGaha (1 st). The Spartans have 4 st'rs ret (74 car st) and should have a good increase in their rush production.

DEFENSIVE LINE - LY MSU had to replace 1 st'r and moved DL Treadwell to the O-line. I looked for a much bigger impact out of William Gholston (PS#3) and teamed with DT Jerel Worthy, called it the Spartans' deepest and most complete D-line since at least '07. Despite Tyler Hoover (PS#44, 9 st, 36 tkl, 3 sk 10) RS, they had a legitimate 3 deep on the D-line. I sold the unit short as they allowed just 101 ypg rush (2.8) with 45 sks, their best rush D s/99 and most sks s/03. Gholston grew into one of the league's most feared DE's capped by his dominating bowl gm (7 tkl, 2 sk, 3 tfl) vs UGA. TY MSU loses 1st Tm AA DT Worthy (14 st, 30 tkl, 3.5 sk, 7 tfl, #2DC GB), NT Kevin Pickelman (10 st, 37 tkl, 4 sk) and DT Johnathan Strayhorn (6 tkl). LY they basically had 2 ret sts up front, the same as this yr. They add in Vanderbilt transfer James Kittredge and get Hoover back who has moved to DT. With the loss of Worthy, this unit is down a few notches but it is still among the elite of the Big Ten

LINEBACKERS - Seventeen MSU LB's have been drafted s/80 but none were chosen from '01-'10 until Greg Jones (#6DC) was picked in '11. LY veteran duo Jones and Eric Gordon both departed (#1, #2 tkl'rs, 1st Tm AA and 2nd Tm B10). They ret'd VHT Chris Norman (PS#16, #6 tkl'r) and I said to not be surprised if another VHT, Max Bullough (PS#17), came close to matching Jones' performance. While Bullough was #1 with 89 (7 tfl), it was Denicos Allen who grabbed the spotlight finishing #2 with 83 while recording 11 sks (#2 B10). You would have expected a drop with the loss of their top 2 LB's (95 car sts) but the D improved from 22.3 ppg to 18.4 ppg. The unit also had more overall speed and just 1 upperclassman. Naturally, the unit returns intact (#1, #2 and #4 tkl'rs) plus they add in rFr Lawrence Thomas (PS#6) and should be one of the nation's top LB corps

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Last year MSU had to replace a pair of 2nd Tm B10 DB's (#6DC). CB's Johnny Adams and Darqueze Dennard's coverage abilities gave MSU greater freedom to run pressure packages. Adams earned 1st Tm B10 and is considered a potential #1DC for '13. Dennard missed 3 of the L/4 reg ssn gms but ret'd with 2 int in the bowl. FS Trenton Robinson earned 1st Tm B10 honors while SS Isaiah Lewis was 2nd Tm B10. The Spartans moved up to #24 in my PDR (53.9%, 20-18). This year they lose FS Robinson (#3 tkl'r, 4 int, 2 pbu, #6DC SF) but return 7 of the top 8 and should have their first top 20 finish in my PDR s/98 (#8).

SPECIAL TEAMS-In Dantonio's first 2 years here, MSU finished #77 and #58 in my ST rankings before improving to #17 in '09 and #14 in '10. LY MSU had to replace their star P (38.1 net) and a 4 year LS and I predicted they would drop a few notches which they did (#20). Keshawn Martin moved to #2 on MSU's career PR yd list while Nick Hill was the top KR (26.3). Dan Conroy, who hit 14-15 FG (L50) in '10, hit 17-23 (2-5 50+) LY. Kevin Muma had 17 TB on 83 KO. P Mike Sadler avg 41.1 (tm net only 35.1) and the PRD was #118 (16.2) thanks in part to giving up a 92 yd PR td in the bowl. TY they only lose PR Martin (11.0) and I look for them to again finish in their accustomed top 20 spot.

COACHES - MSU wanted an old school disciplinarian so they brought in Mark Dantonio in '07. Dantonio served on Nick Saban's staff as the Spartans' DB coach ('95-'00). He was the DC at Ohio St ('01-'03) incl their Nat'l Title year before taking over at Cincy as HC in '04 (2 bowls, 3 yrs). He has guided the Spartans to 5 straight bowls (4 bowls prev 10Y) and their 22 wins the L2Y is a school record. The 2nd yr OC is Dan Roushar (OL cch under Dantonio s/05). He was the OC at III ('04) as well as N III ('98-'02). The DC is Pat Narduzzi who was Miami, OH's DC in '03 and Cincy's DC from '04-'06.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Mark Dantonio inherited the Big Ten's biggest underachiever in '07. In John L. Smith's debut season in '03 they opened up -1 but despite plenty of talent, went just 15-25 through '06. Dantonio immediately improved the team to 7-6 and then 9-4 (#24) in '08. In '09 they were picked 3rd in the Big Ten media poll (I had them tied for 4th) and the Spartans finished in a tie for 6th. MSU had numerou's players susp'd for the bowl, and lost to TT to drop to 6-7. The Spartans made my Most Improved List in '10 and I called it Dantonio's best edition here. MSU won a share of their first B10 Title s/'90 (3-way tie OSU & Wisc) but was passed over for a BCS bowl. They got to their 4th str bowl for the 1st time s/90 and while they were #7 and taking on a 3 loss Bama team, were blown out 49-7. Despite their 7-1 mark in Big Ten play, they were only +40 ypg in '10 (#4). LY Mich St had just 12 ret sts and played 5 road gms vs bowl teams. MSU opened '11 with a couple of blowout wins but then lost at ND 31-13 despite a 358-275 yd edge. After beating CM 45-7 they were shutting out OSU until giving up a garbage TD with :10 left to only win 10-7. MSU beat Mich at home (28-14) for their 4th straight win over their rival for the first time since 1959-'62. They were a HD to Wisc and got a Hail Mary pass on the final play to pull out a 37-31 win. The Spartans were in a flat spot at Neb (off 2 huge wins) and lost 24-3. They trailed Minn 24-21 into the 4Q but escaped 31-24 and led lowa 31-7 at half en route to a 16 pt win. MSU destroyed Ind (55-3) and beat NW, 31-17. In the B10 Title game loss, a running into the P penalty with 1:57 left nullified a MSU PR to the UW3. They had a 317-151 yd edge at half but UW took the lead after a FD on 4&6 set up Wisc's go ahead td and MSU lost, 42-39. The Spartans appeared out of it trailing Georgia, 16-0 at the half, but rallied to win it in 3OT to finish 11-3 and AP #11. MSU was #3 in the Big Ten at +53 ypg but benefitted from 3 net close wins, +7 in TO's and an off ypp of 12.6. Despite the Stock Market Indicator (pg 27) stat showing a -2.5 and just 13 ret sts, six of my 9 sets of power ratings call for MSU to repeat their 10 win reg ssn total.

First meeting. Spartans have won 13 str home openers by 23 ppg. Under Dantonio MSU is 14-1 hosting non-Big Ten opp's (only loss in '09 vs CM). MSU is 1-4 vs Top 10 & 6-13 vs Top 25 foes under Dantonio. MSU is 5-3 vs instate CM and this will mark the first gm in Mt Pleasant. Spartans have gone 8-5 in true road openers. This will be just the 3rd AG vs a non-BCS school (Louisville '95 & Hawaii '04) S/'89. Nine of the L/12 meetings have been decided by single digits (4 of L/7 by a fg). LY MSU was held to a ssn low 29 (1.3) rush yds. HT has won the L4Y by 10 ppg after previously losing 7 str. Spartans are a perfect 8-0 vs the Eagles and in the last 5 have outscored EM on avg 50-9 with no gm closer than 32 pts. L/gm ('08) was tied 7-7 early 2Q before 35 unanswered by MSU. MSU last beat OSU 2 yrs in-a-row in '98 & '99. LY prior to the final drive (OSU scored td w/:10), OSU's deepest penetration was to the M34. MSU allowed 178 yds (lowest S/'99 in B10 gm; 151 vs NU) MSU is 12-2 vs IU. LTH ('08) saw 2 safeties, a blk'd punt and QB Hoyer & IU QB Lewis each tossing careerlong td passes. IU cut the deficit to 34-29 mid-3Q but MSU limited them to just 95 yds the rest of the way. LY MSU jumped on Iowa early as they led 31-7 w/2 td's in a 36 second stretch late 2Q. Into 2012, the Spartans are a perfect 8-0 hosting B10 foes with the avg win by 17 ppg. Spartans have now won B2B gms in Ann Arbor by DD after having lost 8 str.LTHMSU earned their most lopsided victory (34-17) in this rivalry since beating UM 34-0 in 1967!

MSU last won in Madison in '01. LTH ('09) MSU did outgain & outFD UW despite a 8 pt loss but trailed 38-17 before 2 late td's in the final 2:07 (never had lead at any point). MSU is now 0-6 vs Neb. LY MSU was off their final play "Hail Mary" pass win hosting UW and came out flat in Lincoln. MSU ran just 6 plays in the Neb RZ and mustered a ssn low in pts and yds.
