## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

**QUARTERBACKS** - Christian Ponder was a 3 yr st'r (#1DC) but was injured allowing EJ Manuel (PS#4) to have 6 sts in '09 and '10 comb (incl both bowls) and throw for 1,678 (67%, 6-10, 366 rush). Manuel was the clear-cut starter in '11 but after a fumble and 2 int in the 1H vs WF, Manuel came in and almost led the comeback (286 yd, 2-2). In 9 games Trickett threw for 675 (61.1%, 7-4) while Manuel threw for 2,666 (65.3%, 18-8). Manuel enters the year with 121 consec passes without an int (none in L/5 gms) while Trickett now has experience and I look for good sized improvement from the FSU QB's.

**RUNNING BACKS** - With all of the VHT's and NFL caliber talent former HC Bobby Bowden compiled at RB, it's amazing that FSU has not had a 1,000 yd rusher since Warrick Dunn in 1996! In fact, since '96 FSU has had just 3 RB's top 900. In '05, FSU had its worst ypg (94, 3.3) rushing s/47 and "improved" to just 97 ypg (3.5) in '06. In '10, Chris Thompson (PS#29) led with 845 (6.3) while Ty Jones had 527 (6.1) and Jermaine Thomas (PS#81) had 490 (5.7) and all 3 ret'd LY. After 4 gms, Thompson was the leading rusher with just 81 (2.9) but broke 2 vertebrae in his back in gm 5 and was OFY. Thomas didn't get his 1st carry until the 3Q of the 2nd gm (inj). True frosh Devonta Freeman (PS#28) broke out with B2B 100 yd gms vs Duke and MD which were FSU's only 2 in '11. Freeman led with 579 (4.8) while true frosh James Wilder (PS#43) had 160 (4.6). Not listed below are Eric Beverly (5'9" 243 rFr, PS#42) and FB Chad Abram (6'0" 235 Jr, PS#93). This year they lose Thomas (279, 4.6) and Jones (71 yd) but I expect more production out of Freeman, Thompson and Wilder plus they add in PS#6 Mario Pender (IFS) making this a much improved group.

**RECEIVERS** - In '09 Bert Reed was #2 with 710 (11.8) and after they lost their top guy in '10, Reed led but with only 614 (10.6) while Willie Haulstead (PS#36) had 587 (15.4), Taiwan Easterling was #3 with 551 (12.8), Rodney Smith (PS#47) was #4 with 448 (14.5) and TE Beau Reliford (PS#48) was #5 with 198 (11.6). LY they had to replace Easterling (MLB DC Cubs) and Haulstead RS (conc). True frosh Rashad Greene only played in 9 gms but led with 596 (15.7) while Smith improved to 561 (15.6). Reed was banged up and dropped to #5 (403, 13.9) getting bested by PS#9 Christian Green (450, 17.3) and soph Kenny Shaw (PS#29, 418, 12.3). This year they lose Reed (7

st), Reliford (9 st, 7 rec) and TE Ja'Baris Little (3 st, 1 rec). Even with the loss of Reed, the top 4 from LY are back, Haulstead returns and they add in 6'6" 242 rFr Kelvin Benjamin (PS#17) making this a deep, talented (10 VHT's) and exp'd group.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - Rick Trickett came in as the OL coach in '07 (128 ypg, 3.7, 22 sk) and FSU improved to 179 ypg (4.8, 26 sk) in '08. In '09, despite only 3 st lost to injury, they slipped to 150 ypg rush (4.6, 20 sk). All 5 st's ret'd in '10 and the unit improved to 171 (4.8, 27 sk). LY they had to replace Rodney Hudson (2 Jacobs Blocking Awards, #2DC), 2nd Tm ACC C Ryan McMahon (4Y st'r) and a bkp. While they had 112 car sts ret, the unit was hit hard by inj's in spring and had little continuity during the season. Bobby Hart (PS#11), a 17 yr old true and 2 soph st'd most of the 2H of the year (4 true frosh started bowl). FSU's numbers dropped dramatically to 112 ypg (3.3) and they all'd 41 sks (t-#110 FBS, 10.7%). TY they lose C David Spurlock (6 st, inj, 34 car st), 1st Tm ACC RT Zebrie Sanders (13 st, 4Y st'r, #5DC BUF) and LT Andrew Datko (4 st, inj, 40 car st, #7DC GB). While the unit drops to 50 car sts ret, I would expect better health and improved numbers and they add in PS#11 & 30 JUCO's. They also get to face the best D-line in the country every day in practice.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - FSU almost always has a tough rush D and in '08 they had to replace 3 DL (19 st) and allowed 133 ypg (worst s/95, 3.8) but did have 39 sks. In '09 they had to replace 2 st's (#2DC). FSU usually fields 1 or 2 super pass rushing DE's but the DE's comb for just 4 sks in '09 as the unit was hit hard by inj's. They amazingly allowed an ACC high 205 ypg rush and 5.4 ypc (26 sk), their worst s/76. In '10 they had to replace 3 DL (24 st). Seven of the 8 DL were frosh and soph but FSU tied for #1 FBS in sks with 48 (35 by DL). DE Brandon Jenkins led with 13.5 sks while trimming the rush D to 129 ypg (3.4). LY they lost a #7DC but added in PS#1 JC Tank Carradine and I said they should have their best rush D s/06 (93, 2.9). FSU did even better yielding just 83 ypg (#2 FBS, 2.3, 40 sk). Not listed below are Moses McCray (6'2" 317 Sr, PS#49, 4 tkl LY) and Derrick Mitchell (6'5" 314 rFr, PS#50). TY the unit returns intact including their top 3 DE's (20.5 sk in '11) and they add in a PS#1, PS#3 and PS#12 DL's. This is the best D-line in the country.

**LINEBACKERS** - In '09 FSU had to replace their top 2 tkl'r's and a bkp (4 sts) but it was still surprising that they allowed 30.0 ppg, their worst s/73. In '10 they had to replace a 2nd Tm ACC LB (#7DC) and 2 bkps. They had 7 VHT's incl their #1 & #2 tkl'r's and the D improved to 19.6 ypg (best s/04). LY they had to replace 2 st's (#2 and #8 tkl'r's). While they had just 1 st'r back, the st's were PS#2, PS#4 and PS#24 and the D improved to 15.1 ppg. TY they lose Nigel Bradham who is the first Nole since Marvin Jones ('90-'92) to lead FSU in tkl's for 3 straight yrs (86 tkl, 2 sk, 7.5 tfl, #4DC BUF) and Jeff Luc (15 tkl) but have 4 of their top 6 back making it their most exp'd LB corps in years.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - The Noles had 1.5 st's back in '09 and set a new FSU low at #102 in my PDR. In '10 they had to replace 3 st's again (#1DC) and the lone ret st'r lost his spot. FSU still improved to #32 (58%, 17-15). LY all 4 st's were back w/7 VHT's in the 2 deep. I said they would have their best PDR s/04 and they did not disappoint finishing #18 (59.1%, 16-16). TY they lose CB Mike Harris (6 st, #2 tkl'r, 1 int, 9 pbu, #6DC JAX) and SS Terrance Parks (11 st, #6 tkl'r, 1 int, 3 pbu). They return 3 who had 9+ sts LY while Karlos Williams (PS#2) and Nick Waisome (PS#12) both got their feet wet as trues and should have a bigger impact. Despite being slightly less experienced, I'll call for continued improvement this year.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - FSU normally ranks in the top 25 of my ST rankings. In '08 Graham Gano won the Lou Groza

Award (24-26 FG, L53) and FSU finished #3. In '09 they had to replace Gano as well as their top PR and KR and dropped to #26. Exciting true frosh Greg Reid led the NCAA in PR (18.4) and was a solid KR (25.5). In '10 Reid set school KR records for a gm (193 vs NCST) and a season (742, 23.9). K Dustin Hopkins (PS#11) improved from 19-27 (L52) with 24 TB on 75 KO in '09 to 22-28 (L55, GW FG vs CU) with 41 TB's (#2 FBS) in '10. P Shawn Powell also improved from 41.6 to 44.3 (39.0 net). Last year the unit returned intact and after their #10 finish in '10, I pegged them to finish #2 and they actually finished #1. Hopkins was a Groza finalist and 1st Tm AA Powell would have been a finalist for the Ray Guy had he attempted more punts (41.3 net #2 FBS). This year they lose their outstanding P but will once again be among the elite.

**COACHES** - Hall of Famer Bobby Bowden reluctantly retired #2 in the FBS for career wins. In '07 Jimbo Fisher came over as OC from LSU (OC L7Y). In Fisher's first season as HC ('10) FSU not only won the Atlantic, but totaled 10 wins (1st time s/03). The OC is James Coley who was an asst under Fisher at LSU. DC Mark Stoops (3rd yr) spent 6 yrs as the DC at Arizona under his brother Mike. Greg Hudson is also in his 3rd season here as the asst def HC/LB cch (DC for 8Y at EC & Minn prior).

## PHIL'S FORECAST

FSU had an amazing run of 14 straight yrs finishing in the Top 5 in the final polls but has not been back s/00! FSU did finish #15, #21, #11, #15 and #23 AP from 2001-'05 but in Bowden's last 4 yrs finished ranked just once (9-4 in '08, #21). They went 7-6 in the other 3 yrs and needed a bowl win in each to achieve a winning season. In '09 they were the media's preseason favorite to win the Atlantic (I had Clemson) and they finished 3rd at 4-4 and -5.5 ypg. In '10 I mentioned that Jimbo Fisher stepped into a great situation as the team had not had double digit wins s/03 and 7 of my 9 sets of power ratings called for them to reach that plateau. FSU got as high as 6-1 (#16) but finished 10-4 (#17) after a loss to VT in the ACC Title gm but they did beat Scar in the bowl. LY they had 14 st's back and expectations were extremely high as they avoided VT and had #1 ranked Okla at home. FSU started #6 and dispatched ULM and CS by a comb 96-10. Many were calling for the upset of #1 OU but they lost QB EJ Manuel in the 3Q and lost by 10. In a letdown spot after spending their entire summer talking about Oklahoma and with a bkp QB making his first road start, they lost at Clem 35-30. After a bye, Manuel did not start, but did play vs Wake and they lost again, 35-30. FSU then beat Duke and MD by an identical 41-16 score and waxed NCST and BC by a comb 72-7. They were outgained 383-259 by Miami but were +3 in TO's (led 23-7) in a 23-19 win. The next wk vs UVA was a "C" game situation. They were in a Miami/Florida sandwich and a large favorite. UVA got a td with 1:16 left to take a stunning 14-13 lead and then FSU's tremendous K Hopkins actually missed a 42 yd FG which would have given them the win. They were outgained by Florida 184-95 but led 14-0 at half and won 21-7. In the bowl FSU beat ND 18-14 to finish 9-4 (#23) and I understand the circumstances behind all 4 losses. TY FSU has 17 st's back and were #3 in the ACC LY at +77.8 ypg despite their 5-3 finish. LY I went against the grain picking the tm with the best D in the country (Alabama) to win the Nat'l Title and the Tide delivered. TY FSU has the best D in the country and all 9 sets of my power ratings are calling for a perfect 12-0 season.

First meeting. Seminoles are 21-1 in home openers (only loss was to Miami, FL in '09, 38-34). The Racers went 7-4 LY incl a 21-9 loss at Louisville. MSU has had B2B winning ssns for the 1st time S/'99 & '00.

First meeting. Originally FSU was to host WV but the gm was cancelled due to WV's move to the B12. Tigers open TY w/OK St (FSU just 2nd program faced w/FBS status). SSU has had just 2 wins or less in 10 of L12Y.

FSU is 23-6 vs WF but 4 losses have come in the L6Y. LY FSU led 7-3 into the 2Q but trailed 9-7 and never had the lead again scoring w/:54 left. FSU had 5 TO's that resulted in 17 WF pts.

The home team is 9-1. LY FSU's only lead was 3-0. Trailing just 28-23 early 4Q FSU allowed a 62 yd td pass. FSU did get the ball back down 5 but on 4&9 was sk'd at their 38 w/1:37 left.

Just the 2nd all-time meeting. #18 Florida St led 17-7 in Tallahassee in '09. Florida St is 17-5 in road openers but have dropped 2 straight (at #10 OU and #21 Clemson).
