POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - Matt Grothe (PS#55) started as a rFr and finished as the #2 career passer here. He would have been #1 but after breaking the BE career record for tti off (Pat White WV 10,875) he tore his ACL in gm 3 of '09. Rfr BJ Daniels (PS#76) took over and had a roller coaster season. In Daniels' first start he threw for 215 (126 rush) and led the upset of Fla St. He alternated good and bad gms and in USF's losses hit 48% (126 ypg, 2-7). Daniels finished with 1,983 (54%, 14-9) and accounted for 58% of USF's off (#1 rush, 772, 4.4) despite not starting until Wk 4. In '10 Daniels once again had his moments with his worst being momentum changing int's just before the half vs Florida and WV. Daniels threw for 1,685 (58%). He opened with a 4-10 ratio (7-3 after) but was the bowl MVP. He rushed for 259 (2.3) despite a lingering quad inj. Bobby Eveld did a great job running the scout tm in practice so it was no surprise to HC Skip Holtz when he took over for the inj'd Daniels in the 2H vs Miami and led them to the win. Eveld made his first career st vs Conn (22-41-195, 1-3). LY both ret'd and Daniels had his best season throwing for 2,585 (58.9%, 13-7, 60.1 rush). Daniels had a stretch of 129 passes without an int and also set a USF record with 409 yds vs Cincy. Daniels had 371 total yds vs Syr but was inj'd a little over 5 min into the 3Q vs Miami. Eveld hit 5-9-36 yds in the 2H and started vs L'ville (20-35-210). Daniels ret'd vs WV but hit just 21-44-226 with a crucial pick six and also fumbled on a late drive. Adding depth to the unit is Matt Floyd (6'1" 201 rFr, PS#91). This year both QB's return and Daniels should have his best year yet.

RUNNING BACKS - From '06-'09 this unit was hit by inj's and lacked production. The leading RB rusher in '06 had 436 (3.6), '07 645 (4.7), '08 407 (4.0) and '09 581 (4.5). Moise Plancher was the top rusher in '09 and was awarded a 6th yr. In '10 two bkps quit and Demetris Murray (PS#90), who had 77 (5.5) in '09, emerged with 115 vs WKU and 106 (8.2) vs L'ville and finished #2 (542, 4.5). True frosh Marcus Shaw (PS#69) had 105 (8.8). LY they added in VHT Darrell Scott (PS#1) who had 438 (4.0) in 2 yrs at Colo. They had to replace their top guy Plancher (793, 4.5) but Scott, despite inj's, rushed for 814 (5.3) which was the most for a RB here since Andre Hall (1374, 5.1) in '05. Murray added 503 (4.2) while QB Daniels was #2 and WR's were #4 and #5. Not listed below is Willie Davis (5'9" 203 rFr, PS#70). This year Scott left early for the NFL (UFA DAL) and Murray will team with PS#84JC Michael Pierre while Tye Turner (6'3" 255 So, PS#215) and WR Lindsey Lamar (174, 1st RB '09) may also get a look. USF's RB unit should be just as strong.

RECEIVERS - Former HC Jim Leavitt's rec corps were usually filled with size and speed. In '10 they had to replace their career rec leader and then AJ Love (#2, 489, 18.8) tore his ACL and Sterling Griffin (#4, 265, 18.9 '09) also RS due to inj. Just 1 of their top 6 was back. Holtz called the unit "the land of the misfit toys" as 3 of the top guys were moved from other positions like former QB Evan "Sure Hands" Landi who was #2 (390, 13.9). Lindsey Lamar was one of the nation's Top 5 HS sprinters and finished #3 (161, 6.4). LY they did have to replace their top guy (685, 14.6) but had 4 of their top 6 back and also returned Griffin and Love. Griffin was on pace for a record setting year (40 rec F/7 gms) when he missed 4 (inj) but still led with 530 (12.3). Deonte Welch was #2 with 433 (14.0) and Victor Marc (PS#59QB) was #3 (357, 10.8) while Landi was #4 (297, 10.2). Ten players topped 100 yds. This year they lose Love (6 st, 122, 13.6) and Joel Miller (6 rec) but return 9 w/st exp and add in 2 VHT's as well as VHT Florida transfer WR Chris Dunkley (PS#11) and are also deep at TE incl former QB Isaac Virgin (6'4" 256 Jr, PS#165) and Jeff Hawkins (6'4" 261 Sr, PS#68) who missed LY (ACL). The Bulls should have one of the BE's stronger receiving corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 USF had 4 st's back and maintained good health with 4 OL starting all 13. USF still avg'd just 145 ypg (3.9, 26 sk). LY they lost a 1st Tm BE C (2Y st'r), a 2nd Tm BE RT (3Y st'r) and a 2Y starting LT. They had just 2 st's back but new LT Mark Popek had 9 car sts and I said they could improve in Holtz's 2nd season. They moved up to 182 ypg rush (4.6) with just 16 sks (3.7%). All 5 OL started all 12. TY they lose 1st Tm BE LG Jeremiah Warren (3Y st'r), 3rd Tm BE C Chaz Hine (3Y st'r) and bkp C Kevin McCaskill (3 gm). While their career sts drop from 62 to 46, they have 3 ret sts (2 LY), add in two JC's (IFS) and could continue their upward trend.

DEFENSIVE LINE - USF is always tough vs the rush with their "worst" showings in FBS ball being 3.9 ypc which they all'd in both '05 and '09. In '08 a George Selvie-led DL all'd just 95 ypg rush (2.8). In '09 they had 3 st's back incl Selvie and added PS#3JC Jason Pierre-Paul. Surprisingly their rush D slipped to 135 ypg (3.9, 25 sk). In '10 they had to replace 1st Tm BE Selvie (#7DC), Pierre-Paul (#1DC) and a DT (6 st). They actually improved to 126 ypg (3.5, 30 sk). LY they had to replace 3 st's (#3DC). I called for a bigger impact from DE Ryne Giddins (PS#7) who had 2 sts as a rFr (ankle surg '09). Giddins earned 2nd Tm BE and was #3 in sks (5.5). USF improved to 107 ypg (3.0, 39 sk) despite having just 1 st'r ret up front. TY they lose DT Keith McCaskill (11 st, 29 tkl, 4 sk), DE Patrick Hampton (12 st, 23 tkl, 4 tfl) and DE Claude Davis (16 tkl, 6 sk). They do have 5 of their top 8 back making them more experienced and stronger.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 USF had to replace 2 st's (#1, #4 tkl's). Former HC Leavitt said that Sam Barrington was the best true frosh LB in USF history (1 st, 41 tkl) and that incl players like Ben Moffitt, Kawika Mitchell and Stephen Nicholas. Perhaps their most physically gifted LB was PS#14JC Jacquian Williams (28 tkl '09). Barrington finished as the #3 tkl'r as USF allowed 20.0 ppg. LY they had to replace 2nd Tm BE Williams (13 st, #1 tkl'r, #6DC) and their #6 tkl'r (1 st). They had 2 ret sts (0 in '10) and added JUCO Mike Jeune but USF dropped to 22.7 ppg. TY they lose Curtis Weatherspoon (10 tkl) but return all 3 st's (#1, #2, #3 tkl's, 35 of 36 sts). I'll call this a solidly improved unit and one of the Big East's top LB corps.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In '06 and '07 USF had the best CB combo in the NCAA and their 2 shutdown corners all'd USF to blitz often. USF was #21 and #7 in the PDR with an amazing 23 int in '07. In '08 both departed (#1, #5DC's) and USF dropped to #49. They had to replace 2 st's in both '09 (#41) and '10 (#56, lowest s/04). LY they had to replace their top cover CB (#6DC) but had

7 of their top 8 back incl 3rd Tm BE SS Jon Lejiste. Unfortunately starting CB's Quenton Washington and Kayvon Webster collided vs Miami (both conc's) missing 1 st but USF improved slightly to #50 (61.2%, 16-12). TY they lose CB Quenton Washington (11 st, 45 tkl, 9 pd) and 2nd Tm BE FS Jerrell Young (12 st, 51 tkl, 2 int, 2 pbu) but should move up in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - USF has had some top-notch ST finishes like #17 in my ST rankings in '01, #14 in '02 and #9 in '03. Surprisingly they dropped to #58, #55, #97, #78, #56 and plummeted to #102 in '09. In Holtz's first year they improved to #67 and with everyone back I thought it could be one of the Big East's better ST units in '11. P Justin Brockhaus-Kann (34.2 net '10) almost lost his job (34.7 tm net). Maikon Bonani was 17-21 FG (2 miss 50+) in '10 but hit just 19-26 (L49) while Marvin Kloss had 9 TB on 71 KO. They lost their top PR Terrence Mitchell for the final 8 gms so Victor Marc (crucial fum PR vs Rut) and Evan Landi split the duties. TY the unit returns intact and after LY's disappointing #98 finish, should improve.

COACHES - Skip Holtz came here in '10 after back to back CUSA Titles at East Carolina ('08-'09). He now faces his former Connecticut team (HC '94-'98) annually. Todd Fitch has been his OC for 8 seasons (EC '07-'09, Conn '96-'98). The new DC is Chris Cosh who was previously the DC at both Kansas St ('09-'11) and Maryland ('06-'08).

PHIL'S FORECAST

USF didn't play their first football gm until '97 and were guided by Jim Leavitt from day 1. They joined the Big East in '05 and did not have a losing ssn in that span although in Leavitt's final 2Y they were just 5-9 in Big East play. In '07 they rose as high as #2 at 6-0 but finished 9-4. In '08 they rose to #10 (5-0) but finished 8-5 (-8 to T's). In '09 they lost star QB Grothe to inj and BJ Daniels' first start was a 17-7 upset of #18 Fla St but he ran hot and cold and USF finished just 8-5. I was high on USF in '10 as Holtz gets the most out of his talent having bagged B2B CUSA Titles despite not having the most talent and he inherited a USF squad that had underachieved. Holtz guided USF to their 6th straight bowl while ending 4 gm series losing streaks to both Cincy and Rutgers. They did have their 3rd straight BE losing ssn at 3-4 and their -43 ypg was 3rd worst but they then beat Clemson 31-26 in the bowl to finish at 8 wins for the 3rd straight yr. Holtz did have just 11 ret sts LY (lost 15 left fewest BE) while having just 3 BE HG's. USF had just 9 Sr's on the 2 deep. The Bulls became just the 9th tm to win in their first ever meeting at ND (23-20) but were outgained 508-254 in the game. USF dominated Ball St, Florida A&M and UTEP (comb 159-48) and was 4-0 (ranked #16). They were favored at Pitt but were dominated 44-17. Conn got a 10 yd FRtd with 7:06 left and pulled out a 16-10 win. Cincy got a td with :12 left for a 37-34 win in a game USF led 27-17 early 4Q. USF had a 381-228 yd edge and led Rutgers 17-3 in the 4Q missing a 27 yd FG with :02 left in reg and losing in OT. At this point, Holtz correctly pointed out that the team was 3 plays away from being 7-1. They blasted Syracuse on a Fri night, 37-17, but then Daniels was inj'd in the 3Q vs Miami (lost by 3). They led Louisville 17-10 at half but lost at home by 10. USF led WV 27-20 but gave up a 52 yd IR td and 90 yd KR td in a 30-27 loss (USF 397-364 yd edge). USF also had a key fumble on FD at the WV28 when they were driving to take the lead (3:02 left). It was the Bulls first losing season s/'04. TY they are a much more exp'd group with 15 ret sts and despite their 1-6 BE rec LY they were +26.4 ypg. They also had 4 net close losses giving them a 91.4% chance of improvement (pg 309). USF makes my Most Improved List and gets my call to earn their first ever Big East Title, to finish the ssn ranked for the first time and to land in a BCS bowl.

First meeting. Moccasins went 5-6 LY incl a 40-7 loss at Neb. USF is 15-0 in Raymond James Stadium openers, the avg win by 32 ppg. USF is 15-0 vs 1AA/FCS tms S/'01 (1st yr as a FBS member).

First meeting. The Bulls are 5-1 the L6Y in road openers (6-9 all-time). USF joined the BE in '05 and since are 9-4 in non-conf away gms (9-1 run, only loss at #8 Florida ('10) in that span).

HT has won 3 str. LY USF led 17-3 w/7:38 left. RU had a 98 yd KR for a td, forced 2 punts and got a 34 yd td pass to tie the gm w/1:01. USF missed a 27 yd fg as time exp'd and lost in OT after an int.

LY was the schools only prior gm. The Bulls led 37-0 with a 30-8 FD and 486-132 yd edge after 3Q. Cardinals gained 41% of their yds (93) in the 4Q. Into '12, USF is 5-0 in non-conf AG's vs non-BCS opp's S/'05.

The last and only gm was in '09, USF won 17-7. USF led 14-0 into the 4Q. They forced 3 TO's, stopped FSU at their 1 and FSU missed a 44 yd fg. FSU cut the deficit to a TD but a sk/fum led to a USF fg w/3:44 left.

First meeting. Temple had IND status in '05 & '06 and was in the MAC L5Y after being "kicked out" of the BE in '04 (rejoin TY). The Bulls are 9-16 on the Big East road (4-10 L4Y).

Bonus: The Bulls are 1-6 the last 2 yrs in BE HG's (5 str losses by an avg 5 ppg).

USF is 5-4 vs UL (avg MOV by winner is 17 ppg). LTH the Bulls trailed 14-3 late 2Q but were sparked by a 100 yd KR td, eventual winning in OT (USF is 8-1 all-time in OT).

USF is 6-1 but HT has dropped 3 str by 13 ppg. LY USF led 17-10 late 2Q then scored the gms next 13 pts as SU's only 2H score came on a 58 yd td pass w/3:41 left. USF's only loss was by 4 pts (avg win by 24 ppg).
