POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - The '08 debut of rFr Stephen Garcia (PS#10) was highly anticipated but he was susp in the spring and not reinstated until the fall, putting him #3. SC used 3 diff QB's and they threw for 222 ypg but had the lowest comp % of the Steve Spurrier era (55%) with a 20-27 ratio. Garcia tied the school's single season rec for att's (432) in '09 but had just the 8th most yds (2862, 55%, 17-10). He was the first SC QB to start every game in a season for Spurrier. In '10 Garcia's finest moment came in the upset of #1 Alabama (17-20, 85%). At one point he was #5 in the FBS in pass eff but finished #22 (3059, 64%, 20-14) and had another rough bowl (0-3 ratio). Connor Shaw threw for 223 (70%, 1-2). Garcia was susp 2 more times in the spring and summer of '11 but was once again reinstated. He played in 5 (844, 52%, 4-9) and then was susp a final time and booted. He finished as the #3 career passer here. Shaw hit just 4-11 for 29 yds in 2 gms but s'td vs Kentucky and hit 26-39-311 yds. Shaw finished as the #2 rusher with 525 (3.9) while throwing for 1,448 (65%, 14-6). Battling Shaw will be rFr Tanner McEvoy (PS#23), Dylan Thompson (PS#72, 2 att LY) and Andrew Clifford (6'2" 212 Jr, 2 att LY). This year Shaw knows it is his team and I look for him to be vastly improved.

RUNNING BACKS - In '10 the top 3 RB's all ret'd but I proj'd true frosh Marcus Lattimore (PS#1) as the starter and listed him on my Preseason All-SEC Tm. Lattimore became the first 1,000 yd rusher here s'00 with 1,197 (4.8) despite missing most of 3 gms (incl bowl) with inj's. Kenny Miles had 626 (5.4) in '09 but 152 (3.8) in '10. LY Lattimore was on his way to a great season (818, 5.0) but made 7 st and was OFY vs Miss St. True frosh Brandon Wilds (PS#53) took over and rushed for 486 (4.5) while Miles added 204 (3.8). QB's were the #2 and #5 rushers and WR Bruce Ellington (Wildcat) had 106 (6.2). True frosh Shon Carson (PS#23) may have competed for starting time but he was lost to an ACL in Wk 2 and RS. Adding depth are Eric Baker (6'0" 208 Jr, PS#56) who has 53 car att but has battled in the L2Y and former LB turned FB Qua Gilchrist (6'1" 245 Sr, PS#38). Wilds had three 100 yd gms in his 4 sts and with the return of Lattimore, this unit is deeper, should stay healthier and is one of the nation's premiere RB units.

RECEIVERS - In '06 Sidney Rice had 1,090 (15.1) and left early for the NFL (#2DC). The late Kenny McKinley then led the team for 2 straight years and became the career leader and a #3DC. In '09 Spurrier landed 6'4" true frosh Alshon Jeffery (PS#10) who led with 763 (16.6). In '10 Jeffery had an AA ssn (schl rec 1517, 17.2). LY they spent the preseason searching for a #2 WR and while none emerged, Ace Sand-

ers was #2 with 383 (13.2). Due to the QB troubles, Jeffery's numbers dropped dramatically to 762 (15.6). This year they lose Jeffery (#2DC CHI) and Jason Barnes (4 st, 4 rec) but add in VHT Shaq Roland (PS#6). While the production could actually increase, this unit is less talented.

OFFENSIVE LINE - SC has had only 2 OL earn 1st Tm SEC (last in '98) prior to last year when OT Rokevious Watkins accomplished the feat. In each of Spurrier's first 5 yrs ('05-'09), this was an injury plagued group and only once did they top 3.6 ypc rush and just once all'd less than 30 sks ('06). In '10 they had to replace 2 st's (72 car sts ret). With Lattimore behind them they improved to 154 ypg (4.1) with 30 sks (7.7%). LY they had to replace 3 st's (70 car sts ret). With LT Kyle Nunn as a st'r they had just 4 sks in the first 4 and all'd 22 in the 8 w/o him. Even with Lattimore going out, they improved to 192 (4.5) but still all'd 30 sks (9.5%). TY they lose Watkins (13 st, 2Y str, 1st Tm SEC, #5DC STL), LT Nunn (5 st, 21 car st) and RG Terrence Campbell (12 st). They return 3rd Tm SEC C TJ Johnson (3 yr st'r) and 3 others with 4+ sts and are close exp-wise (61 car sts) and should be stronger provided they don't lose their LT after 4 sts like they did LY.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In each of Steve Spurrier's first 5 yrs, the DL was banged up. In '10 SC allowed 112 ypg rush (3.4), their best ypc s'00 and the D had 41 sk (DL 31), the most in 20+ yrs. LY they had to replace 2 st's (#7DC) but had 6 of the top 8 back. At midyear Spurrier said that their OL couldn't blk the DL in practice as PS#1 DE Jadeveon Clowney was a bkp behind 2 super DE's. It was very surprising that SC regressed to allowing 136 ypg (3.6) but did have 2 gms vs option tms (Navy, The Citadel) where they were big favorites (not "A" gm). Taking those 2 efforts away, they allowed 114 ypg (3.2) and the D had 31 sks. TY they lose DT Travian Robertson (13 st, 49 tkl, 8 tfl, #7DC ATL) and DE Melvin Ingram (12 st, 2nd Tm AA, 48 tkl, 10 sk, 5 tfl, #1DC SD). They return 2 st's and Clowney and should be one of the best D-line in the SEC.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 SC had to replace 1st Tm SEC Eric Norwood (career sk and tfl leader, #4DC). Shaq Wilson (11 st, #1 tkl'r '09) played in just 1 (7 tkl vs Aub) so they basically had 1 st'r back (ret #10, #11 tkl'r '09). The unit slipped to allowing 21.1 ppg. LY they had to replace 2 st's (#5, #13 tkl'r) but got Wilson back so it was like having 2 ret sts. SC improved to allowing 18.4 ppg (best s'00). TY they lose 2nd Tm SEC SPUR Antonio Allen (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 9.5 tfl, 3 int, #7DC NYJ) and Rodney Paulk (6 st, #3 tkl'r, 3.5 tfl). They move in S DeVonte Holloman (10 st, #5) and return 3 (#4, #7, #10 tkl'r) who started 4+ LY. This unit is equal to '11 in terms of exp and talent.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - SC finished #35 in my PDR in '07 and #30 with a veteran unit in '08. They had to replace 2 st's in '09 but Spurrier called CB Stephon Gilmore one of the best ever to come to SC. Gilmore started all 13 as a true and SC improved to #27. In '10 they had 7 of their top 8 back (1 st'r lost). CB Chris Culliver was OFY after 7 sts. Gilmore said that soph DJ Swearingin (PS#85) was the most gifted tkl'r on the tm and he started 8. The secondary surprisingly allowed 242 ypg, their highest in the modern era (#92 PDR, 62.8%, 23-10). LY they had to replace Culliver (#3DC). Akeem Augustine (10 st '10) was OFY after 1 gm so they had 2 st's back. SC just as surprisingly improved to #4 in my PDR (50.3%, 14-19). TY they lose Gilmore (13 st, 46 tkl, 4 int, 7 pbu, #1DC BUF), CB Marty Markett (6 st, 26 tkl), CB CC Whitlock (7 st, 16 tkl, 3 int) and Holloman (moves to LB). They have 2 back who have been full time st's but won't match LY's #4 PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Steve Spurrier inherited a unit that finished #108 in my ST rankings. They improved to #83, #50, #66 and #35. They had some problems in '09 (all'd 3 td) and slid

to #103. In '10 with a poor return game (#90 FBS KR, #115 PR) SC only moved up to #72. LY they had to replace their K/P but got in NCar transfer Jay Wooten (PS#10). Wooten hit 7-11 FG (L49) but had just 6 TB on 71 KO. P Joey Scribner-Howard avg 38.9 (net 35.0). The return units were avg but Ace Sanders got a 68 yd PR TD vs EC which was the first PR TD in Spurrier's 7 yrs here. Even with the loss of their K and P there is probably only one way to go in my ST rankings after a #94 finish LY.

COACHES - Steve Spurrier took Florida to 7 SEC Title games (and won 5 of them). He took over here in '05 and in '10 led SC to their first ever SEC Title game and followed that with a school record 11 wins in '11. Spurrier continues to be his own OC. Four year DC Ellis Johnson took the Southern Miss HC job and will be replaced by Lorenzo Ward. Ward was the DB coach at VT ('99-'05), Ark ('07) and here since '08.

PHIL'S FORECAST

South Carolina's last conf title came in the ACC in 1969. SC got to NY Day bowls vs Ohio St in both '00 and '01 but in former HC Lou Holtz's final 3 yrs ('02-'04), did not catch a lot of breaks and went 16-19. Expectations were high when Steve Spurrier took over and I feel he's done a fine job with zero losing seasons in 7 yrs (6 bowls). SC had never been picked higher than #3 in the SEC East media poll and in '10 was picked #3. Spurrier's high water mark in his first 5 yrs was a #6 ranking in '07 when the team began 6-1 but they finished just 6-6 (NR). In '09 they rose as high as 6-2 (#21) but finished 7-6 (NR). In '10 they had 14 ret sts, only 11 left lost and signed an excellent frosh class. They had twice as many Sr's (16) as '09. SC beat Florida in "The Swamp" 36-14 and took home the SEC East Title at just 5-3. They were destroyed by eventual Nat'l Champ Auburn 56-17 in the Title game prior to Spurrier suffering his 3rd straight bowl loss. I mentioned that SC in '10 had 34 sts lost to injury and 2 net close losses, signs pointing up and they were the SEC media's pick to win the East (I picked UGA). They trailed EC 17-0 and 24-14 at half but rallied for a 56-37 win in a TO heavy game. SC was outFD'd 23-15 and had basically FOUR Def/ST td's vs Georgia yet only won by 3, and Spurrier said "they outplayed us." They struggled vs the Navy option but Lattimore rushed for 246 and they won 24-21. QB Garcia had 4 int's keeping Vandy in the game as SCar had a 17-5 FD edge in their 21-3 win with the 5 FD's and 77 yds allowed the fewest since '87. Garcia hit just 9-23 with 2 int in their loss vs Aub at home (outgained 358-289). They switched QB's and in Shaw's first start they had a 639-96 yd edge and beat UK 54-3. Lattimore was OFY vs Miss St but SC got a td with 3:50 left to pull out a 14-12 win. Tenn gave 3rd string QB Justin Worley his first start and SC prevailed 14-3 on the road. SC was 7-1 and ranked #10 but hadn't scored first in any of the 8 gms. They were whipped at Ark by 16 on their 3rd straight road trip. SC got past a Florida tm starting their 3rd string QB, 17-12, beat The Citadel 41-20 and then destroyed Clemson 34-13 (CU had ACC Title gm on deck). They got a Hail Mary td pass before the half and went on to beat Neb 30-13 in the Capital One Bowl. SC has now beaten UF, UGA and Tenn each 2 yrs in a row and their only other 10 win season in 118 yrs of football came in 1984. 2011 was a ssn of firsts for the Gamecocks. They recorded 11 wins, a Top 10 finish in both the AP and coaches polls, a top finish in the BCS poll and an undefeated record against the SEC East. TY SC does have 11 ret sts and was +82.3 ypg in the SEC (#4). They do have a -3.0 in my Stock Market Indicator (pg 27) and draw both LSU and Ark out of the West. This is a quality SC tm with QB Shaw and RB Lattimore and one of the best def front 7's in the country but they won't match LY's 11 win total.

SC is 17-4 vs Vanderbilt incl 3 str wins. LTH the gm was tied 7-7 at HT but the SC defense locked down in the 2H allowing just 70 yds as VU did not cross midfield until its last offensive play (SOD at SC48). SC is only 3-5 the L8 vs EC. LY SC had 4 TO's in the 1H & trailed 24-14. In the 2H SC scored a td on 6 of their 7 pass taking adv of 4 EC TO's. SC has won 10 str home openers vs non-SEC tms (last loss in '99 vs EC). The Gamecocks have won both prior gms ('03 & '08). L/gm SC never trailed and led 26-6 prior to a UAB garbage td w/24 left. Into 2012, Spurrier is 44-0 all-time vs non-BCS schools. SC has dropped both prior gms with the last in the '05 Independence Bowl. SC jumped out to a 21-0 lead but with the gm tied 31-31 allowed a 77/51 GW td drive w/2:13 left (SC was int'd at the M37 on next drive). SC is 11-1 vs UK but lost LTH. The Gamecocks blew leads of 14-0 and 28-10 as the Wildcats went on a 68/12pl GW td drive w/1:15 (SC was int'd in the EZ w/04 from the UK20). LY in a classic SEC thriller there was 9 lead changes (3 in the 4Q). SC scored w/3:28 to go up by 3 & 16 sec later got a 5 yd FR td. UGA trimmed the lead back to 3 w/2:15 but SC got 1 FD and ran out the clock. SC has been dominated in this series going 2-16-1 w/4 str losses by 17 ppg. LTH ('07) the Gamecocks trailed 28-7 into the 4Q as 52% (137) of their yds came in the last quarter for a misleading final. LTH marked the Gamecocks 1st win ever at the "Swamp" (1-12 overall).
