

QUARTERBACKS - LY VT had to replace ACC POY Tyrod Taylor who threw for 2,743 (60%, 24-5) and was the #2 rusher (659). He tied the schrl record for 100 yd rush gms for a QB (Bob Schweickert 6, '62-'64). Logan Thomas (PS#3TE) played in (12-26-107). Taylor departed (#6DC) as the career passing and total off leader. Thomas is 6'6" 262 lbs with a powerful arm and great mobility and after a slow start got better on a weekly basis. He threw for 3,013 (59.8%, 19-10, 469 rush). Thomas' 11 rush td's tied for the most by a QB in VT history (Bruce Arians '74). Against Miami, Thomas became the first VT QB s/99 (Michael Vick) to have more td passes than inc passes (23-25, 3 tds, VT comp rec'd under Beamer) and rushed 19 yds on 4&1 for the game winning td. He wore down GT, outweighing the LB's by 20+ lbs for a career-high 70 yds on 18 carries. Backing him up is Mark Leal (PS#83) who played in 3 (9-13). Future 1st rounder Thomas should be one of the top QB's in the country.

RUNNING BACKS—In '08/rf Darren Evans (PS#16) set the ACC single season frosh rushing record with 1,265 (4.4). Evans tore his ACL in Aug '09 so the top returnee was sopho Josh Oglesby (PS#75, 88, 2.3 in '08) and he battled r/r Ryan Williams (PS#11) and true frosh David Wilson (PS#8). In Wk 2 Wilson and Williams became the first VT duo ever to top 160 each in a game. Williams did have a costly fumble vs NC (4Q) but played with a vengeance after that and broke Evans' frosh record with 1,655 (5.6) and an ACC record 22 total td's. In '10 RB coach Billy Hite called it the strongest backfield he's had in 32 yrs at VT. Wilson finished #3 (619, 5.5), Williams played in just 10 (5 st, inj, 477, 4.3) and Evans led with 854 (5.7). LY both Evans and Williams departed and many wondered if Wilson could handle a feature back's load of carries. He did have 7 fmb/s (lost 4) in 231 carries after going the first 201 of his career w/o losing one but set the single season record with 1,709 (5.9) on 290 att's. Wilson left early and became the 9th Tech player to be drafted in the 1st round (32 overall NYG). Oglesby rushed for 371 (3.8) and Tony Gregory had 16 carries (1.7). This year they lose Oglesby and Wilson and even with the addition of 3 VHT's, I don't see another RB of Wilson's caliber waiting in the wings so I'll call them down a few notches.

RECEIVERS - In '08 VT's top returning WR had just 3 recs (lost 3 NFL DC's). VT did not have a WR with a td catch until Wk 11. True frosh Jarrett Boykin led with 441 (14.7) and also led in '09 (835, 20.9) and '10 (847, 16.0) while rFr Danny Coale was #2 in '08 (408, 11.3), '09 (614, 20.5) and '10 (732, 18.8). Dyrrell Roberts was #3 in '09 (390, 17.7) and '10 (303, 14.4). LY they

had to replace a starting TE but moved DL Chris Drager (PS#21) back to TE. Both Boykin and Coale topped Ricky Scales' 2,272 career yds and Ernest Wilford's ssn rec record (55', '03). Coale led with 904 (15.1) while Boykin was #2 with 761 (12.5). The 6'4" Marcus Davis was #3 with 510 (17.0). Ty they lose Coale (14 st, #5DC DAL), Boykin (13 st) and Drager (12 st, 201, 13.4) but Roberts RS LY. While they may have a little extra added speed (rFr Demitri Knowles 4.28 40!), with the loss of their top 2 career rec's this unit is down a few notches.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Frank Beamer usually produces a top-notch O-line but surprisingly has had some recent struggles. In '06 they had their lowest rushing numbers s/32 (107) with 113 ypg (3.2, 29 sk). In '07 VT improved to 134 ypg (3.3) but all'd a mind-boggling 54 sks (14.2%). In '08 they moved up to 174 ypg (3.8) but with the highest sk % in the FBS (14.5%). In '09 they had to replace 2 multi-yr str's and improved to 208 ypg (4.7, 31 sk, 12.4%). In '10 they had to replace two 2nd Tm ACC OL's and had similar numbers (199 ypg, 4.9, 34 sk, 9.9%). LY they had 9 of their top 10 back (98 car st). I called for them to have their lowest sk % s/'03 and that they did (17, 4.2%) although the rush numbers dropped to 187 (4.4) despite all 5 starting all 14 gms. Ty the losses are heavier. Gone are 3rd Tm AA RT Blake DeChristopher (14 st, 4Y str), LT Andrew Lanier (14 st, 2Y str), HM ACC LG Greg Nosal (14 st, 2Y str) and 2nd Tm ACC RG Jaymes Brooks (14 st, 3Y str). The unit returns just 17 car str's (lose 151) and is my biggest ? on this 2012 squad.

DEFENSIVE LINE - VT always has an exceptional run defense but in '09 with a veteran D-line (5 of top 6 back), they allowed 128 ypg rush and 3.6 ypc (worst s/'03). In '10 they had to replace 3 str's (#2DC) and a bkp (5 st). With just 1 str back, they allowed 156 ypg (worst s/'92) and a remarkable 4.7 ypc (worst Beamer era, 4.6 '87). LY they again had just 1 str back in DT Antoine Hopkins (lost two 2nd Tm ACC DL). Over the summer, they lost 300 lb DT Kwamaine Battle and then Antoine (318 lbs) only started the 1st 5 (inj). That made them smaller & inexp'd in the middle. VT still managed to improve to 104 ypg (3.2, 41 sk). Corey Marshall (250 lbs) became the first true frosh to start here s/'02 but was then replaced by another true in Luther Maddy (288 lbs). James Gayle (2nd Tm ACC) may become the next great DE (4.4 spd, DE record 39.5"VL). This year the line returns mostly intact (lose 3 bkps) and should be one of the best D-lines in the country.

LINEBACKERS - In '10 VT had to replace their #1 & #6 tkl'rs. Barquell Rivers (#2 tkl'r) missed the year (inj) and Lyndell Gibson was the only ret LB who had over 17 tkl's (53) in '09. VT allowed 20.6 ppg (worst s'03). LY they had to replace their #4 tkl'r but had their #1 and #8 tkl'rs back and got the return of Rivers. It was an injury-plagued year as Jeron Gouveia-Winslow only st'd 5 and Bruce Taylor 8, as both went down with Lisfranc inj's (which often has a long recovery time) but they still only allowed 17.6 ppg. CB Kyle Fuller moved in and made 6 sts at the WHIP LB. TY they lose Rivers (2 st, 16 tkl) and Telvion Clark (6 tkl) but return 5 of the top 6 and as long as this unit stays healthier, they should be one of the ACC's best.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - VT always fields a solid unit with Top 15 finishes in my PDR in 7 of the L/8Y incl #6 LY. In '10 CB Jayron Hosley tied a schl rec w/9 int's (Ron Davidson '67). VT had an AA DB every yr from 1999-'08 and after not having one in '09, Hosley was named 1st Tm AA (Walter Camp). LY they had to replace a #4DC and a 2nd Tm ACC ROV (#2 tk'l). After having 26 car sts in '10, they had 40 in '11 and all'd 49.9% (16-16 ratio). TY they lose 2nd Tm ACC CB Hosley (13 st, #5 tk'l, 3 int, 12 pbu, #3DC NYG), 1st Tm ACC ROV Eddie Whiteley (14 st, #2 tk'l) and CB Cris Hill (5 st, 34 tk'l). They have 32 sts ret from LY so this should be your typical top-notch VT secondary.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Beamer coaches this unit himself and VT almost always finishes near the top of my ST rankings (#1 in '07). In '08 they had to replace their K and top KR and it was shocking that VT finished #79 giving up 3 PR td's for the first time in 50+ yrs. In '09 I called for them to be one of the most improved ST units in the country and VT did not disappoint (#13). In '10 they had to replace both their K and P (#6DC, 37.6 net) but Beamer got them to #6. LY they had to replace their P and K (5th consec yr new K) but it surprised me that VT slid to #44. VT struggled to find a P.Scott Demler (best hang time) avg only 33.1 while Michael Branthover had a 75 yd'r vs Duke (VT's 2nd longest) but avg just 36.6 and WR Danny Coale had the best avg (43.5). Cody Journell hit 14-17 FG (L42). In the bowl the top 2 K were susp and Justin Myer hit 4-5 (but had a costly miss in OT). TY they lose Myer and KR Wilson (18.9) while Journell (susp) is ?. Naturally, after LY's unusually low finish, they should get back to a normal spot in my ST rankings.

COACHES Frank Beamer now stands as the active leader in wins in the FBS. He was a DB at VT from '66-'68 and VT was in just 6 bowls prior to his arrival ('87). Beamer had 4 losing seasons in his F/6 but he's taken them in 19 consec bowls and has won the ACC Title 3 of the L5Y. OC Bryan Stinespring is in his 20th yr here (OC s/'02). Bud Foster has been DC s/'95. He won the Broyles Award in '06 (only 4x finalist in award's history). Foster's scoring def's have finished in the top nine 7 of the L8Y.

In 1999, the Hokies played in the National Title gm and went 22-2 in a two yr stretch. They are one of just 3 tms in the NCAA that have been to 19 str bowls (Fla, Fla St). VT made the move to the ACC in '04 and have been the dominant tm going 53-11 (reg ssn) and playing in 5 of the 7 ACC Title gms, with 4 ACC Titles ('04, '07, '08, '10). They are the only team in the country that has won 10+ gms in each of the last 8 yrs. VT opened '10 at 0-2 incl a loss to an FCS tm (JMU) but would win their next 11 including the ACC Title game before getting drilled by Stanford in the bowl, 40-12. LY I listed VT as my #1 Surprise Team in the country or a non-Top 10 team that could win the National Title. Had it not been for Clemson, VT may have had that opportunity. VT did have just 12 ret sts and coach Beamer said that he couldn't remember a year with as many season ending injuries. VT opened 4-0 vs overmatched foes then had the situational edge vs Clemson at home with the Tigers off B2B home upset wins over ranked tms. The Hokies trailed 10-3 at half and lost 23-3. VT led Miami 31-21 in the 4Q but needed a td with :56 left to win 38-35. They then got expected wins vs WF, BC and Duke and played GT on a Thurs coming off a bye. They had extra time to prepare for the option and won on the road 37-26. They led NC 24-7 and held on for a 24-21 win and then in the showdown to determine the ACC Coastal Title, they shutout rival UVA on the road, 38-0. Despite their earlier loss to Clemson, VT was a td fav in the ACC Champ gm but was waxed again by the Tigers, 38-10. They still landed a surprising BCS bowl (Sugar Bowl) where they dominated Mich with a 377-184 yd edge (22-12 FD) but somehow lost by 3 in OT matching their '10 record at 11-3. TYVT gets those inj'd def sts back plus their replacements so they are even more veteran than their 9 ret sts on the def shows. They only ret 3 sts on off but now have exp at QB in 6'6" Logan Thomas. VT was +81.9 ypg (best ACC). They benefitted from 3 net close wins and do have to play Clemson, NC and Miami all on the road. Despite the schedule and inexp on off, VT gets my call to return to the ACC Title gm.

VT is 4-1 vs GT incl 2 str wins. LY VT trailed 26-21 late 3Q but ended the gm scoring 16 unanswered as they limited GT to just 1 yd their final 3 drives. The Hokies are 15-1 in Blacksburg openers (lost to James Madison '10).

First meeting. The last time VT was coming off a Mon Night gm they ironically lost 21-16 vs FCS James Madison ('10). Governors went 3-8 LY incl losses at Cincinnati (72-10) and Memphis (27-6).

Old Big East rivals will be again conf foes next year. VT has dropped 3 str after opening 7-1. LTH ('03, also L/gm) VT lost 31-28. VT allowed the GW to w/47 left. Hokies are 18-1 in true road openers.

Virginia Tech is 2-0 vs BG with the L/meeting in '93 (won 33-16, other gm in '90; 21-7). Into '12, the Hokies are 36-1 hosting non-conf foes. VT is 19-2 vs the MAC (losses to Miami '97 & Kent St '75).

VT is 5-1 S/87. L/meeting was in the '08 Orange Bowl. VT trailed 7-0 after 1Q but limited UC to 178 yds the L3Q & won 20-7. UC tossed 4 int's (in EZ & at VT32, 1 & 45) and were SOD at the VT1.
