POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - Boise has had some fine QB's excel in their system. Bart Hendricks was the Big West OPOY twice ('99 & '00) and Ryan Dinwiddie ('00-'03) left as the Broncos' career passing leader setting the NCAA record for career pass eff (168.9). In '08 I projected VHT rFr Kellen Moore (PS#24) to win the job even though he was not the starter out of spring. Moore became the first frosh QB to start the opener here and showed how much success a VHT could have in this system. He threw for 3,486 (69%, 25-10) and followed that up in '09 by throwing for 3,536 (64%) with an amazing 39-3 ratio. In '10 he was the FWAA's AA QB and finished 4th in the Heisman voting after throwing for 3,845 (71%, 35-6) and leading the NCAA in pass eff (182.6). The 2nd most att's in '10 belonged to Joe Southwick (17-24-202). LY Moore set the NCAA record for most wins by a starting QB with 50 (3 losses by 5 tfl pts) and became the 1st player in FBS history to top 3,000 tfl and 3,000 pass yds in 4 diff seasons. Moore threw for 3,800 (74.3%, 43-9). He leaves holding almost every Boise passing record and finished as the 2nd least int'd QB in FBS hist. Southwick played in 8 (198, 76.7%, 1-1) and rFr Grant Hedrick played in 8 (3 att) as the Wildcat QB (70 rush, 8.8). TY those 2 return and will battle rFr Jimmy Laughrea (PS#55) and true Nick Patti (PS#65) who was in for spring. I expect the new Boise QB to put up similar numbers to past QB's but clearly, there will be a drop off replacing a player like Moore.

RUNNING BACKS - In '09 Doug Martin (the "Muscle Hamster") was the #2 rusher with 765 (5.9) and Jeremy Avery led with 1,151 (5.5). In '10 Martin took over with 1,260 (6.3) while Avery dropped to 495 (5.2). DJ Harper, who was coming off an ACL inj, was lost after 3 (160, 8.9). LY they had to replace Avery but Martin with his aggressive, violent running style became the 5th Boise rusher with B2B 1,000 yd seasons (1299, 4.9). Harper finished #2 557 (4.8) and Drew Wright had 218 (5.1). TY they lose Martin (#1 DC TB) and Raphael Lambert who tore his ACL in spg. Not listed below are Phillip Hogan (5'6" 163 rFr) and FB Jamal Wilson (6'1" 240 rFr). Harper was granted a 6th year and will be another productive Boise RB but I'll call this unit down a few notches TY.

RECEIVERS - The WR's were the biggest concern on the team heading into '11 as they had to replace the school's #1 and #2 career leading rec's in Titus Young (#2DC, 1215, 17.1) and Austin Pettis (#3DC, 951, 13.4). The leading returnees were Tyler Shoemaker (582, 18.2), TE Kyle Eftaw (299, 12.5) and Gerald Boldewijn (changed name from Hiwat) who had 160 (14.5). Boldewijn, who is the biggest (6'4") and fastest of the WR's, sat out the first 4 and had just 266 (14.0). Shoemaker led with 994 (16.0) and a schl rec 16 td's (Pettis, 14 in '09). Frosh Matt Miller set the BSU record for rec's with 62 (679, 11.0) and rec td's (9) incl a 46 yd Hail Mary vs WY which he caught on his

back. Mitch Burroughs (PS#151) was #3 with 500 (10.2). TY they lose Shoemaker (7 st) and Eftaw (8 st, 264, 8.5). Not listed below are TE's Jake Hardee (6'3" 231 rFr) and Hayden Plinke (6'4" 240 Fr). Even with the loss of 2 st's, incl their top guy, this unit is more exp'd and less of a question mark TY.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 Boise had 4 st's back (88 car sts). As you would expect they improved to 200 ypg rush (5.4) with just 8 sks (1.9%, #2 FBS). LY they had to replace 2 st's (2nd Tm WAC G) but did return 98 car sts (#13 FBS) incl 1st Tm WAC LT Nate Potter and 2x 1st Tm'r C Thomas Byrd. Byrd started only 4 (inj) and new starting RG Jake Broyles was lost after 3. With the move up in competition, Boise's numbers dropped to 172 ypg rush (4.5) but Moore's quick release kept them at 8 sks (1.7%). TY they lose 1st Tm MW Potter (13 st, 4Y st'r, #7DC ARZ), C Byrd (4 st, 3Y st'r) and RG Chuck Hayes (10 st). The Broncos have had a 1st Tm All-Conf LT 8 yrs running. They do return 2nd Tm MW LG Joe Kellogg, RT Charles Leno (who protected Moore's blindsides) and 64 car sts but the sks will likely climb with an inexp'd QB.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 the entire 2 deep ret'd and I said Boise could top '06's dominant rush D totals (89 ypg, 3.2). They allowed just 2.9 ypc (104 ypg rush) and had 49 sks (best s'/97). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm WAC DE but ret'd 1st Tm WAC DT Billy Winn, 1st Tm WAC DE Shea McClellin and 2nd Tm WAC NT Chase Baker. They also ret'd PS#39JC Tyrone Crawford (bench 22528x) who had 7 sks in '10. Boise surprisingly slipped to 110 ypg (3.5, 24 sk) despite the fearsome front 4 as they had to take on an option team in AF (97.2 ypg w/o them) and tougher competition. TY they lose 1st Tm MW DE Crawford (11 st, 44 tkl, 6.5 sk, 7 tfl, #3DC DAL), 1st Tm MW DE McClellin (13 st, 50 tkl, 7 sk, #1DC CHI), 2nd Tm MW DT Winn (12 st, 33 tkl, 3 sk, #6DC CLE), NT Baker (10 st, 22 tkl, 2.5 tfl) and DE Jarrell Root (6 st, 24 tkl, 2 sk). They ret only 5 car sts and could have 2 or 3 frosh starting but do add a PS#23JC.

LINEBACKERS - In '09 Boise incorporated the NB into the D, which I include with the LB's. In '10 the entire 2 deep ret'd (8 w/st exp) with 4 full-time st's. They even moved DE Byron Hout (PS#30) to LB and he started 9 st (inj) earning 2nd Tm WAC. Boise allowed just 12.8 ppg (#2 FBS). LY they had to replace a 1st Tm WAC NB (#4 tkl'r) and 2 bkps (4 st, 52 tkl). They ret'd 2 st's and bkp JC Percy (3 st, #2 tkl'r) and I called them just as strong. A surprising stat to me was that a LB hadn't led the team in tkl's s'/07 or been a 1st Tm All-Conf selection s'/06. Hout broke the first break (#1 tkl'r) but they only landed 2 3rd Tm MW LB's. Boise slipped to allowing 18.7 ppg. TY they lose Hout (13 st, 4 tfl), WLB Aaron Tevis (13 st, #6 tkl'r, 2.5 tfl) and NB Hunter White (3 st, #9 tkl'r). HC Chris Petersen will mold a solid group but this unit is clearly less exp'd (return #5, #18, #21 tkl'r's).

DEFENSIVE BACKS - Over the last 10 years Boise has been #8, #6, #15, #52, #15, #20, #4, #11, #2 and LY #40 in my PDR. LY they had to replace a 1st Tm WAC S (#1 tkl'r), 2nd Tm WAC CB (#7DC) and a bkp. The main reason for their drop was likely due to inj's. Jerrell Gavins looked like the best CB with 3 int's in 3 gms but was OFY. Jamar Taylor started just 9 and Ebenezer Makinde only 4. The banged up secondary got lit up by TCU (473 yds), SDSU (350) and in the bowl (395). TY they lose SS Cedric Febis (11 st, 49 tkl, 1 int), FS George Iloka (13 st, #2 tkl'r, #5DC CIN), Quaylon Ewing-Burton (4 st, 26 tkl) and SS Travis Stanaway (3 st, 38 tkl). They do have 6 back who drew starts LY and I'll count it as 2 ret st's which is one more than LY. Boise should remain healthier and move back up to their normal level.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Boise has always had a top-notch ST unit and from '99-'08 they finished #32, #23, #28, #28, #2, #4, #19, #59, #10 and #2. All of their key players were back

in '09 and I had them rated as the #1 ST unit in my magazine and they finished #1. In '10 they slid to #31. LY P Brad Elkin avg 42.0 (tm net 37.8, 25 I20) while rFr Dan Goodale became the 3rd of the last 4 starting K's to have walked on from a local HS. A FG crushed Boise fans in '10 (Nev) and LY Goodale missed a 39 yd GW attempt vs TCU. He and Michael Frisina comb to hit 6-9 (L32) and missed 8 xps. I expect a schlp frosh to take over at K. In '11 despite losing their K, P and top KR's I said they could improve and they exceeded my expectations finishing at #11. They lose their P and top KR but a Top 25 finish here is becoming commonplace.

COACHES - In 6 short ssn Petersen has become BSU's career leader in wins (Tony Knapp 71-19-1, '68-'75) and has led them to 6 str 10 win ssn's (tied FBS longest active streak, VT). Petersen is the only HC to ever win the Paul "Bear" Bryant COY Award twice ('06 & '09) and added the Bobby Dodd COY in '10. OC Bryan Harsin left for Texas after '10 and Brent Pease took the Florida OC job TY. Robert Prince becomes the 3rd OC in 3Y and ret'd here LY (BSU '01-'03) as the pass gm coor. Prince was the WR cch at Colo ('10) and an NFL asst for 6Y. DC Pete Kwiatkowski is in his 3rd ssn after being promoted from DL cch ('06-'09).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Boise St joined the WAC in '01 and despite coming from the lower level Big West conf, they thoroughly dominated the league for their 10 yr stay. While the Broncos didn't win EVERY championship, they went a remarkable 75-5 (94%) in WAC play (+161 ypg). In my '06 magazine I projected Boise to earn a BCS bowl berth. I had to sweat out a couple of games but they ran the table then beat Okla in the Fiesta Bowl (#5 AP). In '07 I proj Boise's run of 5 str conf champs to end and that's exactly what happened (10-3, NR). In '08 they went 12-1 with their lone loss to TCU in the bowl (by 1) and finished #11. In '09 I listed Boise as the #1 non-BCS team despite having the fewest schlp Sr's in the FBS (4) and they did not disappoint going a perfect 14-0 topping TCU in the Fiesta Bowl while finishing #4. In '10 they had an amazing 19 ret sts. After they knocked off VT, not a day went by that Boise and the BCS Title game were not brought up in the same sentence. That all ended on a chilly night in Nevada when Boise missed a pair of key FG's and blew a 24-7 lead. They beat Utah 26-3 in the bowl and finished #9. In '11 they moved to the MW and only 2 of the 47 FBS tms that switched conf's s'/92 had made it through their new league unscathed but Boise was the consensus pick to win the MW. I had pegged Boise as my top rated non-BCS tm and they actually came within 1 play of playing in the National Title gm. They had 14 ret sts and were ranked #5 AP. As part of their contract they could not wear their blue uniforms at home for MW games. They beat Georgia, 35-21 in Atlanta. They beat one of the MAC's best (Toledo) on the road 40-15 then steamrolled one of CUSA's best (Tulsa) pulling QB Moore with 9:25 left in the 3Q (34-0). Revenge as on their mind and they led Nev 30-0 after 3Q's. Fresno didn't cross midfield until it was 30-0 (2Q). Boise waxed Colo St (schl rec 742 yds). Petersen surprisingly did not spend any extra prep time for the AF option and it showed as they gave up 26 pts and 408 yds and only won by 11. After a bye they were tied late 1H with UNLV (14-14) but went on to a 48-21 win. Boise missed the gm winning FG in a 1 pt home loss to TCU and their 66 gm reg ssn win streak was snapped. They beat SDSU 52-35. Vs Wyoming they had a 46 yd Hail Mary to pass with :00 left in the half to lead 13-7 and won 36-14. In Moore's FHG they shut out NM 45-0 and in the bowl they dominated Ariz ST 56-24. They go from having one of the most exp'd tms in the country the LY to having one of the least as they return just 7 st's including 2 on D and of course lose their legend, Moore. LY they were +174.9 ypg which was tops in the MW. The last time they had less than 10 ret sts was '96 and that tm went 2-10. The last time they lost their QB and had just 10 ret st's, however, they went 11-1 in '04 and Boise is my pick to win their first (and final) MW Title.
