POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

QUARTERBACKS - In '10 the QB's ret'd zero career pass att's at UT and Matt Simms (PS#20, 10 att at L'ville '08) beat out true frosh Tyler Bray (PS#17). Simms started the first 8 vs the brutal part of the schedule and threw for 1,460 (58%, 8-5). Bray got his first start vs Mem and threw for 325 then 323 vs Ole Miss, 354 vs UK and had 312 in the bowl and could easily have been 5-0 as the st'r (lost bowl in 2OT). He threw for 1,849 (56%, 18-10). Bray is 6'6" with a rocket arm and was the clear-cut starter in '11. He threw for a career high 405 vs Cincy and his 698 in the first 2 gms were a schl record. He inj'd his hand vs Georgia (gm 5) and did not return until the final 2 gms where he hit just 31-71-404. Bray threw for 1,983 (59.5%, 17-6). Simms st'd 2 (14-37-186) which happened to be vs the top two D's in the country (Bama and LSU) and threw for 319 (43.5%, 0-3). After Simms once again was beat up vs brutal competition, Justin Worley got 3 starts and threw for 604 (55.2%, 1-3). This year Simms departs but Bray should have better health and I look for much improved numbers.

RUNNING BACKS - In '09 the Vols had to replace their 20 rushers who had comb for just 958 (4.7). In '10 they had to replace their top 2 again but this time they had comb for 1,805 (4.7) with 16 td's. Tauren Poole (PS#51) became the workhorse and had six 100 yd gms earning 3rd Tm SEC despite running behind an inexp'd O-line. He led with 1,034 (5.1) while Rajion Neal (PS#45) was #2 with 197 (4.3). Both ret'd LY but Poole's numbers dropped to 693 (3.7) and Neal finished #3 with 134 (5.0). VHT True frosh Marlin Lane (PS#14) was #2 with 280 (3.7) and rFr Jaron Toney added 74 (2.4). TY they lose Poole and adding depth is Tom Smith (5'11" 207 So, PS#48). After LY's low production, they can only improve their stats.

RECEIVERS - UT had the reputation of being "WR U" as they've produced plenty of NFL WR's. In '09 they had an inexp'd group and once again LY had to replace their top 3 rec's (1994, 14.1, #4 & #5 DC's). The leading returnees were Justin Hunter (415, 25.9), Zach Rogers (207, 14.8) and Da'Rick Rogers (167, 15.2). Hunter had 314 yds (18.5) in 2 gms but was OFY (ACL) on the first series of the 3rd gm. Da'Rick had six 100 yd gms, one short of the UT record en route to 1st Tm SEC honors and finished #1 with 1,040 (15.5) which was the 5th best in UT history. TE Mychal Rivera was a distant #2 with 344 (11.9) and VHT true frosh DeAnthony Arnett (PS#9) had 242 (10.1). TY they only lose Arnett (trans to Mich St) and I think the Hunter, Rogers, Rivera combo make up one of the better units in the country.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '10 the Vols had to replace all 5 st'rs, had the 3rd fewest career sts returning (3) in the FBS and were learning their 3rd diff blocking scheme in 3 yrs. They then lost C Cody Pope after 2 gms (stinger/conc). As you would expect, the numbers dropped to 109 ypg rush (3.5, 41 sk, 9.8%). LY they only had to replace 1 st'r, had 50 car sts back and added in VHT ND transfer Alex Bullard (PS#28). I thought they would have one of the most improved OL's in the country. C James Stone had snap problems and lost his job after 6 gms and Bullard (1st 6 st LG), st'd the last 6 at C. The starters were still young with 3 soph and a frosh. TY everyone is back and they now have 105 car sts (T#3 in FBS) incl 4 projected VHT starters. LY's rushing numbers were poor (90, 2.8, lowest s/64) but they allowed just 18 sks (4.5%) and the Vols should have their best rush numbers s/04 (186 ypg, 4.7).

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 UT had to replace a #1 DC DT and one other st'r. They then lost DE Ben Martin (11 st '09, PS#1, RS, Achilles) and proj'd starting DT Marlon Walls (RS, Achilles) over the summer so they had just 1 st'r back. UT did add USC transfer Malik Jackson (PS#54), who started 12 and also got solid performances from a pair of true frosh in Jacques Smith (PS#16, nonstop motor) and Corey Miller (PS#12). DL cch Chuck Smith said that with those 2, they were going to bludgeon the SEC. The inexp'd unit was decent allowing 153 ypg (4.2) with 26 sks. LY they lost 3 st'rs got Martin back so it was like having 2 back. UT slipped to 163 ypg (4.4) with just 16 sks. TY they lose 1st Tm SEC DT Jackson (12 st, 56 tkl, 2.5 sk, 8.5 tfl, #5 DC DEN) and DE Martin (8 st, 18 tkl). They are switching to a 3-4 D and have 4 of the top 6 back with 3 who st'd 4+ last year. They also add in former Bama player turned JUCO Darrington Sentimore (PS#34JC). UT has their most experienced D-line in years and they'll allow under 4.0 ypc for the first time in 3 seasons.

LINEBACKERS - Last year the Vols lost a 3rd Tm SEC LB (#1 tkl'r), their #4 tkl'r and a bkp (14 tkl). Their only ret st'r, Herman Lathers, RS (ankle). LB coach Lance Thompson was recently at Bama and coached Rolando McClain and Dont'a Hightower but said in his 25 years coaching that Curt Maggitt was an elite frosh and had the skill set of a pretty incredible LB. No true frosh had st'd the opener for UT s/72 but Maggitt and AJ Johnson (PS#26) both accomplished that feat. This year they lose 3rd Tm SEC MLB Austin Johnson (12 st, #1 tkl'r, 5 tfl) and Daryl Vereen (2 st, 18 tkl, 1 sk). Not only are Maggitt and Johnson another year bigger, stronger, faster and more experienced, but they get Lathers back (12 st, #2 tkl'r '10) and the unit goes from 1 car start to 55.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - In '10 Tenn had to replace SS Eric Berry (Thorpe Award, #1DC KC), a starting CB plus my proj starting SS (dismissed over summer). Surprisingly, the Vols moved up to #19 (57%, 14-18). LY they appeared to have 7 of the top 8 back but 2nd Tm SEC FS Janzen Jackson was dismissed in Aug. CB Eric Gordon (6 st '10) had just 1 st and SS Brent Brewer was lost after 8 sts. UT had basically 2 st'rs back and slipped to #53 (58%, 14-9). TY they lose CB Art Evans (1 st, 10 tkl) and have 8 back who st'd LY, incl 5 w/8+ sts. This should be a much improved group that has 6 VHT's w/st exp.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Phillip Fulmer's ST units were almost always in my Top 50 including #19 in '07. In '08 and '09 they were just #86 & #96. In Derek Dooley's first year they moved up to #75. LY UT had to replace their P (36.4 tm net) and K (10-11, L/49). Punting was a problem all year (tm net 34.4). Interestingly vs MTSt, K Michael Palardy was hurt and bkp Chip Rhome was inj'd pregame. Dooley summoned Derrick Brodus from his frat house with a police escort and Brodus hit 1 FG (21 yds) and 3 xp's. Palardy finished 9-14 (L/52) and had 6 TB on 43 KO. They

were -2.1 on PR's but thanks to Devrin Young's 23.3 on KR's, were +4.6. UT finished #87. This year they only lose their LS and I'll call for them to have their best finish s/07.

COACHES - Phillip Fulmer was let go after a career record of 152-52 and Lane Kiffin departed after a one season stint in '09 making Derek Dooley the Vol's 3rd HC in 3 seasons. Dooley, son of legendary UGA HC Vince, was 17-20 in 3 yrs at LT and had to deal with many infractions here from the previous staff which has led to Tennessee's first B2B losing seasons s/1911! Jim Chaney (Purdue OC, '97-'05) was hired by Kiffin as the OC and is in his 4th season. DC Justin Wilcox went to Wash and the new DC is Sal Sunseri who was the LB coach the L3Y at Alabama and the NFL Panthers DL cch previously ('02-'08).

PHIL'S FORECAST

Phillip Fulmer was the HC here for 17 yrs and took home a Nat'l Title in '98 (13-0). Unfortunately in his final 10 yrs he had just 2 Top 10 finishes and 2 losing seasons. I had a very good pulse on Tenn throughout this past decade, often calling for them to finish either much higher or much lower than most folks' expectations and most times I have been right on the money. In '05 Tenn was the SEC media's choice to win the SEC Title (#3 AP). I had them #3 in the SEC East and they finished just 5-6. The Vols were on my Most Improved List in '06 and got as high as #7 going 9-4 despite playing five Top 13 tms. In '07 the Vols were fortunate to finish 10-4 and #12 AP (-33 ypg in SEC, 3rd worst). Most Vol fans saw them as a darkhorse Nat'l Title contender and playing in a Jan bowl at worst in '08. I did not make a lot of friends in Knoxville again when I picked them 4th in the East. UT finished just 5-7 and Fulmer was let go. In '09 expectations were light but I had them on my Most Improved List. New HC Lane Kiffin inherited 12 ret sts and UT went 7-6 getting to the Chick-fil-A Bowl. Kiffin used Tenn as a pit stop and headed off to USC. The Vols landed Derek Dooley who I felt did a good job at L'ville despite a 3 yr record of 17-20. Dooley had just 8 st'rs back (fewest SEC) and I called for them to open 2-6 but to win their last 4 and get to a bowl. Due to having 3 HC's in 3 yrs, UT was short on schlp players and lacked depth and their ssn went exactly as I projected starting 2-6 then winning their last 4 to get to a bowl. Twice during the yr, officials announced the gm was over and UT had won, but reversed those decisions and the opp won, including the bowl. LY I felt Tenn was a much stronger team than the '10 version but they faced the toughest schedule of any SEC tm as they drew Bama, LSU and Ark out of the West. Things started well when they blew out Montana (42-16) and Cincy (45-23) but they lost their top WR Hunter on the first series vs Fla. UT trailed 30-7 and lost 33-23. After an expected win vs Buff, they were tied with UGA 6-6 at the half. QB Bray was inj'd and they lost 20-12. LSU was ranked #1 and UT st'd bkp QB Simms and lost 38-7. They were pounded by Bama 37-6. UT hosted SCar and gave 3rd string QB Worley his first start and lost 14-3 to drop to 0-5 in the SEC. They shutout MTSt (led 24-0 half) but then were pounded by Ark 49-7. Just like '10, UT needed to win their last 2 to get to a bowl and they beat VU 27-21 in OT but this time lost to Kentucky for the first time s/84 (26 gm series win streak snapped) despite a 276-217 yd edge. That loss had them miss out on a bowl for the first time s/08. TY Tenn has 19 st'rs back and can only maintain better health at QB. They were -155 ypg in the SEC (3rd worst) and draw Bama out of the West but avoid LSU and Ark. UT is one of the MIT in the country and make my Most Improved List.

Tied 1-1 and the winner has pulled the shutout in each but their L/gm was in 1939 (ironically UT's L/gm). UT has started a ssn just twice away from Knoxville the L9Y dropping both gms vs non-conf BCS tms.

First meeting. Panthers are entering just their 3rd ssn as a FB program (9-13) and have been outscored 119-7 vs FBS tms (0-2). GSU HC Bill Curry was a SEC HC from 1987-'96 with Alabama and UK.

UT has dropped 7 str vs UF with the last 5 all decided by DD's. LY UT trailed 16-0 and never got closer than 9 pts the rest of the gm. LY UT had -9 rush yds and in '06's gm UT was held to -11 rush yds.

The last and only meeting in this series took place in 1989, UT won 52-9 in Knoxville. Entering 2012, the Volunteers are 48-5 hosting non-conference opp's (4-0 LY w/a avg score 38-12).

UT HC Dooley was a grad asst at UGA in 1996. LTH UT trailed 17-0 into the 2Q and could never recover. The visitor is 1-4 in this series. UT is actually 6-4 their L/10 trips to Athens (lost B2B).

Bonus: 2010 and 2011 marked the first time in B2B yrs that UT had non-winning seasons since 1977 (4-7) & 1978 (5-5-1). They went 7-5 in 1979.

UT has won 9 of 10 overall & 4 of 5 in Starkville. LTH ('07) UT only led 24-21 but held MSU to just 148 2H yds in the 12 pt win. The SEC split into divisions in '92 and UT is 36-23-1 vs the West (4-12 L5Y).

The UK loss LY not only snapped the nation's longest series winning streak at 26 but eliminated UT from bowl eligibility. LY down 10-0 UT cut it to 3 but their L/3 drives ended in 2 punts & int'd at the K46 w/1:27 left.
