

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2012

OUARTERBACKS - In HC Mike Sherman's first season in '08, Jerrod Johnson took over for incumbent senior starter Stephen McGee (shoulder). McGee was a #4DC. Ryan Tannehill was the team's #1 rec in '08 but lobbied Sherman to battle for the QB job. In '09 Johnson, despite dealing with a leaky O-line, set several schl records throwing for 3,579 (60%, 30-8, 506 rush). Tannehill hit just 4-8 (#2 rec). In '10 Johnson was the preseason Big 12 OPOY but after shoulder surgery struggled at times to even throw spirals. Due to TO's (9 int, 2 fmbl), he was pulled after he had become A&M's career passing leader. Tannehill took over in the 2Q vs KU (gm 7) and guided 6 straight wins while Johnson would not throw another pass. Tannehill threw for 1,638 (65%, 13-6). I pointed out LY that the last 3 Aggie senior QB's had all struggled however Tannehill had a record setting season throwing for 3,744 (61.6%, 29-15, 306 rush, #1DC MIA). He did have key TO's causing A&M to blow double digit leads vs Okla St and Texas. RFr Jameill Showers (PS#41, strongest arm) played in 4 (5 att). He will battle soph Matt Joeckel (PS#53), the athletic rFr Johnny Manziel (PS#26) and true frosh VHT Matt Davis (PS#6, Sumlin recruit, IFS). Despite going from a #1DC to a unit with 5 career att's, if the new QB cuts down on

turnovers, they could be just as productive. **RUNNING BACKS** - A&M had just one 1,000 yd rusher from 1999-'09 (Courtney Lewis 1024 in '03). The top rusher in '08 had just 406 (4.3). The leading returning rusher in '09 was Cyrus Gray (PS#13, 363, 4.8). Gray started 9 and rushed for 757 (4.8) while explosive true frosh Christine Michael (PS#6) led with 844 (5.1) incl a school rec 97 yd td run vs Baylor. In '10 I said the Aggies should finally produce a 1,000 yd rusher, but didn't know if it would be Michael or Gray. Michael was on his way with 631 (5.0) but he was OFY after 8. Gray, who had 195 yds in the first 6, became A&M's first RB s/88 to top 100 in 7 straight games. He finished with 1,133 (5.7). Last year expectations were high for both Gray and Michael to top 1,000 but once again Michael's season was cut short after 9 gms (899, 6.0, HM B12). Gray, in just 5 sts, had 1,045 (5.3) and is just the 4th Aggie to have multiple 200+ yd gms (2) joining Darren Lewis (3), Bob Smith (2) and Curtis Dickey (2). When Gray and Michael were inj'd, soph Ben Malena (PS#31) rushed for 83 (3.3) vs Texas and finished with 259 (3.9). Not listed below is Will Randolph (5'9" 188 So, PS#240, 37 yd LY). Hopefully this year Michael can stay healthy, plus they add in VHT Trey Williams (PS#4), but with the loss of 2nd Tm B12 Gray (#6DC KC), they figure to be down a notch or two.

RECEIVERS - Jeff Fuller (630, 12.6, A&M rec 9 td '08) was dominant in the spring of '09 but cracked his fibula and missed 4. He still finished #3 with 568 (13.9). True frosh Uzoma Nwachukwu (PS#43) led with 708 (17.7) and while only 6'0" catches passes at their highest point. In '10 Fuller shattered Bob Long's (19, '66-'68) career td record with 28. Surprisingly, A&M had never produced a 1,000 yd receiver (Robert Ferguson's 885 in '00 was tops) until Fuller led with 1,066 (14.8). Ryan Swope was #2 with 825 (11.5) and a banged up Nwachukwu had just 407 (11.3). Fuller turned down the NFL last year but was never really 100% and had "just" 828 (11.8, HM B12) Swope earned 2nd Tm B12 and reset Fuller's record with 1,207 (13.6). He is on pace to top Fuller for the career leader spot. Nwachukwu was #3 (639, 12.8). Despite the loss of Fuller 12 st) this is still a première receiving corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE - Last year A&M had to replace a 2nd Tm B12 C but had 9 of the top 10 back (86 car sts). Three managed to start all 13. As you would expect they improved to 199 ypg rush (5.1) and were #4 in the FBS allowing just 9 sks (1.7%). This year they lose OG Brian Thomas (12 st, 2Y st'r) and 4 bkps but have 4 strs returning incl 2x HM B12 RT Jake
Matthews and 2nd Tm B12 LT Luke Joeckel who are both high on many NFL draft lists. They will be taking on SEC D-lines so the stats probably will not go up as much as expected, but with 95 career sts they are even stronger.

DEFENSIVE LINE - In '10 A&M only had to replace one st'r and officially switched to the 3-4 under then new DC Tim DeRuyter. The more exp'd line helped A&M improve to allowing 130 ypg rush (3.5), their best s/01, with 30 sks. LY they had to replace 1 st'r then DE Jonathan Mathis was OFY after 3 sts so they basically had 1 st'r back. Still, A&M made great strides. They were #2 in the B12 allowing a paltry 102 rush ypg and just 2.6 ypc and led the NCAA with 51 sks! TY they lose 2x 3rd Tm B12 DT Eddie Brown (13 st, 29 tkl, 3 sk), 2nd Tm B12 DT Tony Jerod-Eddie (13 st, 56 tkl, 5 sk, 2 tfl) and Ben Bass (1 st, 26 tkl, 2 sk, 2.5 tfl). They do switch back to a 4-3, move in 3rd Tm B12 Joker LB Damontre Moore (72) tkl, 8.5 sk, 9 tfl) and Mathis was awarded a MedRS. However, with the loss of a couple of 300 lb DT's, I don't anticipate the Aggies matching LY's rush D or their lofty sack totals.

LINEBACKERS - With its "Wrecking Crew" defense, A&M used to be known as "Linebacker U" but they had a dry spell at the position with no former Aggie playing the position in the NFL in '10. The '09 group had 10 career sts with 3 of the 4 st'rs being a true frosh, a rFr and a soph. Von Miller led the FBS with 17 sks. In '10 A&M ret'd their #3, #4, #5, #7, #8 and #13 tkl'rs. Miller (1st Tm AA) led the B12 in sks again (10.5) and became A&M's first Butkus Award winner (all'd 21.9 ppg). LY they had to replace Miller (#1DC) but ret'd their #2 and #3 tkl'rs. A&M slipped to allowing 28.2 ppg. TY they lose 2x HM B12 ILB Garrick Williams (5 st, #10 tkl'r) and Moore moves to DE but return their #1, #3 and #5 tkl'rs and this unit looks stronger in '12.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - A&M has had some poor finishes in my PDR like #104 in '05, #84 in '07 and #103 in '08. In '09 their 4 st'rs incl a true frosh and 2 soph (comb 14 st '08). In the magazine I said while less exp, with a stronger front 7, I expected them to move up in my PDR and they did to #61. In '10 they only had to replace 1 st'r (#6DC) and I called for continued improvement and A&M moved up to #14. LY the entire 2 deep ret'd. Their top cover corner, CB Coryell Judie, only started 2 (inj, 22 tkl, 5 pbu) while SS Steven Campbell missed 6. It was surprising that A&M plummeted to #51 (62.4%, 19-7) and they were #109 in the FBS allowing 276 pass ypg. TY they lose Judie, 2x HM B12 CB Terrence Frederick (13 st, 54 tkl, 14 pd, #7DC PIT), 4x All-B12 FS Trent Hunter (13 st, 80 tkl, 2 int, 8 pbu) and CB Lionel Smith (7 st, 51 tkl, 8 pbu). While their ypg all'd will go down, now that they're playing in the SEC (from pass happy B12), this group is exp'd and probably will not improve much in my PDR.

SPECIAL TEAMS - A&M is famous for their "12th Man" ST unit (5 top 10 finishes). They were just #57 in '10. LY with all of the key players back, I called for their best finish in Sherman's 4 yrs and they accomplished that (#8). Dustin Harris (1st Tm B12 PR) was #1 in the NCAA in PR (18.6) and had a solid KR avg (23.4). Randy Bullock won the Groza Award hitting 29-33 FG incl a 52 yd'r into the wind vs Texas. Bullock became the new career pts leader with 365 (Kyle Bryant '94-'97, 325). He also had 32 TB on 96 KO. Sumlin's ST units at Houston finished #60, #29, #60 and #38. TY they lose 1st Tm AA Bullock (#5DC HOU) and it will be extremely tough to snag another top 10 finish.

COACHES - Kevin Sumlin was the Houston HC the L4Y piloting my MIT in the country LY to a 13-1 record. He was previously the co-OC at Okla (5Y, co-OC L2) and did spend 2 seasons here incl 1 as OC ('02). Sumlin brought 3 offensive coaches with him from UH incl Kliff Kingsbury who will be the sole OC after splitting the duties the L2Y. The DC is former Marshall HC ('05-'09) Mark Snyder who spent the L2Y as USF's DC. Marcel Yates is co-DC after being a secondary coach at Boise for 9 yrs.

PHIL'S FORECAS

In '08 A&M had just 10 st'rs back and a new HC in Mike Sherman. Their 4 wins in '08 tied the '03 squad for fewest in a season s/'72 (3-8). A&M was -147 ypg (2nd worst) in conf play and -10 in TO's. The '09 squad had 16 st'rs back and got to a bowl despite playing a schl record 18 true frosh (6-7). Interestingly, back in 90 they played 16 true frosh and in '91 followed that up with an SWC Title (10-1, only loss by 1 pt). In '10, coming off B2B losing seasons for the first time s/72-73, A&M made my MIT List but was picked 3rd in the South by the Big 12 media. QB Jerrod Johnson struggled and was replaced by Ryan Tannehill. With Tannehill cutting down on the TO's, A&M won 6 of their last 7 only losing the Cotton Bowl to LSU 41-24. Of their top 50 players, just 6 were Sr's. A&M was +58 ypg in the B12 (4th best) in '10 and got 5 B12 HG's in '11. They appeared poised for their first double digit win season s/98. A&M was picked 2nd in the B12 (highest s/99) and announced they would join the SEC in Sept which made had their opp's turn it up a notch when they played them. Even so, A&M could have easily had a much better record. They were +93.2 ypg (2nd best B12) but finished 4-5 in conf play. The defining moment happened early as A&M led Okla St 20-3 at half with a 301-185 vd edge. They blew their first DD lead of the season losing 30-29 with Tannehill turning it over much like Johnson did the previous year in the 2H. They led Ark 35-17 at half but blew another huge lead. At 5-2. they led Missouri 28-17 at half but suffered another DD blown lead and a 38-31 OT loss. Okla would be their only loss of the season where they did not have a DD lead as they dropped to 5-4 losing 41-25. They led K-St 31-21 in the 4Q. In the 3OT they dropped a td pass which would have given them the win and lost by 3. After destroying Kansas 61-7, it was the first time that neither Texas nor A&M was ranked for their matchup s/96. A&M jumped out to a 13-0 lead and 16-7 at the half but Texas got a 40 yd FG on the final play to beat them 27-25. After beating NW in the bowl, A&M finished 7-6. Kevin Sumlin takes over a team that perhaps should have been 12-1 and was -9 in TO's and had 4 net close losses. They have 13 st'rs back but take a step up to the SEC. Despite being less experienced, taking on a much tougher schedule and having a 1st year HC (which means a learning process on both off and def), the Aggies have a solid shot at a 4th straight bowl.
